



GOVERNMENT AWARD FOR LEMHANNAS RI



The government, represented by Vice President, Prof. DR. Boediono, presents an "unqualified opinion" award to Governor of Lemhannas RI, Prof. DR. Muladi, S.H., for Lemhannas' financial report

On Tuesday, July 27, 2010, the Governor of Lemhannas RI, Prof. DR. Muladi, S.H., received an award from the Government of the Republic of Indonesia for good quality financial statement, with an unqualified opinion, from the State Audit Board of the Republic of Indonesia. There were other 44 (forty four) Ministries and institutions that received the award. The Award was directly given by the Vice President of the Republic of Indonesia, Prof. DR. Boediono, on the opening of Rakernas (National Working Meeting) on Government Accounting and Financial Reporting of 2010 organized on July 27-28, 2010 in Borobudur Hotel.

This Award is given for the success in preparing and presenting Financial Statement of Fiscal Year of 2009 with the highest standard achievement in Government Accounting and Financial Reporting. It is the third time for Lemhannas RI to receive such award, namely in 2008, 2009, and 2010 consecutively after receiving audit findings of BPK/RI on June 8, 2010 with an unqualified opinion.

The achievement has proved that budget management of Lemhannas RI has strictly complied with the prevailing regulation and legislation, and implementation of internal control has been conducted effectively, efficiently and productively. There is no manipulative component and material misrepresentation in budget

and financial management. Financial Recording and Statement have conformed to government accounting standard and adequacy of evidence in data disclosure. The success of Lemhannas RI in program and budget management, which is materialized in accountability of financial statement, constitutes hard-working result of all members of Lemhannas RI, besides the contribution from other relevant parties engaged in various forums in terms of seminar, workshop, inspection, guidance, and coordination as well as consultancy. The award will be the pride of Lemhannas RI and all of its members.



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BUILDING POLITICAL ATTITUDE TOWARD LAW ENFORCEMENT

On Friday, July 30, 2010, the Governor of Lemhannas RI, Prof.DR. Muladi, S.H, gave a lecture to participants of PPRA XLV in Trigatra Building, Floor III West of Lemhannas RI, having the theme of “**Building Political Attitude toward Law Enforcement which Accomodates Justice for the Poor Citizens and other Marginal Groups and Expected Law Human Resources**”. Although the theme of lecture criticized unfairness in terms of marginalization (whether or not intentional in nature) of the poor and other marginal groups in law enforcement process, however the theme of lecture actually contains connotation of prohibition from discriminating against other people who are not included into “the poor” or other marginal groups, however, thinking target to attain is awareness to remove cleavage/encourage equal treatment between the 2 (two) groups either based on legal instrument of International Human Rights (Human Rights Charter of the United Nations/Universal Declaration of Human Rights-UDHR and International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights-ICCPR) or based on national law including the 1945 Constitution, we recognize a very fundamental principle namely equality before the law/equality under the law/legal egalitarianism, principle of equality before the law is simultaneously together with the right to recognition as a person before the law; the right to a fair and competent trial; constitute a part of general aspects of non-discrimination fundamental principle based on race, skin color, sex, language, religion, political aspiration, nation or origin, assets, birth or other status.

In his lecture, the Governor of Lemhannas RI said that law enforcement politics based on law supremacy and Human Rights Promotion and Protection constitutes consistent attitude toward core values/the root principles of democracy together with other core values of democracy such as: good checks and balances system, general election which is honest and fair; good governance principles; mass media freedom; power/authority decentralization (regional autonomy); democratic law; independence of the judiciary; civil society development; civil control toward military and others. The problem is the abuse of power that occurs in law enforcement, which has, due to certain reason which is discriminative in nature, hindered access to justice for poor people (vertical Human Rights violation) or other marginal groups may endanger the security of existence of law country (symmetric security danger), but it also tends to endanger “human security” namely human security either

individually, in group or society in general (asymmetric security), even it is potential to result in hybrid security threat which may endanger national defense.

In general, the abuse of power may cover anything so called “the protection of human rights in the administration of justice”. Therefore, it is necessary to have a renewal of law and recommendation such as: **first**, instilling a shifting from war making approach (harm creating) based on disconnected principle in instilling adversarialism to peacekeeping approach based on interconnection among humans principle (mutualism) **second**, promoting the use of alternative to imprisonment); **third**, promoting alternative efficient use of dispute resolution and arbitration including restorative justice program through mediation engaging society and victim (restorative justice); **fourth**, renewal in education and law training by promoting “sociological jurisprudence” and keeping away from law positivization; **fifth**; renewal and legal empowerment; **sixth**, legal information and public awareness; **seventh**, right to court and justice access; **eighth**, advocacy and legal aid; **ninth**, legal consultancy and aid free of charge (pro bono work); **tenth**, public interest litigation or class action; **eleventh**, increase of awareness toward ethic code and professionalism in law enforcers circle; **twelfth**, increase of awareness to good governance principle; **thirteenth**, always using accurately the law and policy as law integrative mechanism in social system, either law as tool of social control or as tool of social engineering.

ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION OF ECONOMY SECTOR

On Tuesday, July 13, 2010 in Meeting Room of Nusantara I, Trigatra Building of Lemhannas RI, a Round Table Discussion of economic sector was organized by the Directorate of Economic Sector Research and was opened by the Governor of Lemhannas RI, Prof. DR. Muladi, S.H, having the theme of **“Strategy of Increasing State Revenue from Tax Sector and non-Tax to Increase State Finance Stability in Supporting National Development”**.

In his welcoming speech, the Governor of Lemhannas RI said that increase of people’s prosperity needs not only high economic growth, but also inclusive and fair economic growth. To that end, the first significant challenge of development

in 2011 is creating fair economic growth which is able to create employment and decrease poverty. The second significant challenge is building good management to be able to increase effectiveness and efficiency of government expenses while the third significant challenge is to improve synergy between central and regional level.

As one of components of state revenue contained in State Budget (APBN) other than donation namely revenue from taxes, state revenue from non-taxes, in reaching national goal, both sectors are ones of dependable state revenues. However, in implementation thereof, a deviation occurred frequently between target and realization. To that end, the government

has frequently made adjustment based on change and expectedly the speakers

and responders in the Roundtable could give input or suggestion to improve the research script.

ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION OF DEFENSE AND SECURITY SECTOR

On July 14, 2010, in Meeting Room of Nusantara I, Trigatra Building of Lemhannas RI, the Governor of Lemhannas RI opened Roundtable Discussion of Defense and Security sector organized by the Directorate of Defense and Security Sector having the theme of **“Increasing Synergy of Securing Strategic National Vital Object to Maintain Security Stability in the Area of Strategic National Vital Objects in the Framework of Strengthening National Defense”**.

In his welcoming speech, the Governor

of Lemhannas RI said that national vital object has important role to state and national life either observed from economic, political, socio-cultural, defense and security aspects, since it relates to people’s necessities of life and national interest or state revenue source which are strategic in nature. Therefore, preparedness and readiness to avoid and prevent security disturbance in the national vital object should be implemented continuously (sustainability) even improved by board of management or security personnel.

Observing the influence of strategic environment development (global, regional, and national) in this globalization era, it can be forecasted that threat or disturbance against national vital object is getting increased either committed by surrounding people or certain groups (non-state actors) to sabotage the national vital objects and even it is possible to be the target of terrorists, under political crime and tends to be asymmetric

danger.

Factors triggering threat and disturbance in national vital object area could vary such as, among others, social jealousy, either with respect to recruitment of workers from surrounding people or implementation of construction or Community Development or Corporate Social Responsibility which is not yet performed appropriately, even the existence of the national vital object cannot be enjoyed by surrounding people. Occurrence of threat and disturbance against national vital object will certainly give negative impact either to national economy or public order as well as state security which will eventually give impact to state administration in reaching national goal, therefore securing of national vital object should be made synergistically and engage all state and national components.

ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION OF INTERNATIONAL SECTOR “INCREASE OF INTER-STATES COOPERATION IN ASEAN REGION TO OVERCOME TRANSNATIONAL ORGANIZED CRIME”

On July 27, 2010, in meeting room of Nusantara I, Trigatra Building of Lemhannas RI, a Roundtable Discussion was held regarding increase of inter-states cooperation in ASEAN region to overcome transnational organized crime in the framework of strengthening the materialization of ASEAN Political-Security Community.

In the National Medium Term Development Plan, the issue of conventional and transnational crime is one of eleven main issues that should be handled. In line with that, the government of Indonesia has ratified the Convention Against Transnational Organized Crime 2000 (Palermo Convention) on December 17, 2008, and already ratified the protocol thereof namely “the protocol

to prevent, suppress and punish trafficking in persons, especially women and children” on February 3, 2009. Indonesia has also ratified “The Protocol against the Smuggling of Migrants by Land, Sea and Air” which is directly regulating illegal migrants by virtue of Law No.15 of 2009.

In line with the technology development which is multi-borderless, the transnational organized methods are also developed more sophisticatedly, of which the method of its crime is no longer “traditional” in nature. Therefore, handling of transnational organized crime through in-conventional method and multi-discipline by engaging countries in the relevant region particularly ASEAN is urgently needed. At the regional level, ASEAN has grouped

issue of transnational crime in 10 (ten) issues, among others, terrorism, illegal distribution of narcotics, human inter-border crime, piracy in sea, money laundering, weapon smuggling and explosive substances, cyber crime, and international economic crime. ASEAN member states should have moral obligation to cooperate synergistically and comprehensively in overcoming transnational organized crime, in the framework of making Working Program successful to implement Action Plan of Combating Transnational Crime and ratify the treaty on mutual legal assistance in criminal matters among ASEAN member states. At the regional level, in handling transnational organized crime, the ASEAN member states still encounters various constraints, such as difference in system or law codification, joint cooperation, and joint task force which are not working down to technical level, difference in infrastructure and apparatus capability, as well as difficulty in unifying the understanding of “realization of extradition agreement” among ASEAN member states.

Vice Governor of Lemhannas RI said that transnational organized crime is a serious problem that requires immediate handling for survival of Indonesian development and expectedly this Roundtable Discussion will create critical thoughts, so as to create policy formulation embryos as basis for consideration in making decision.

POLICY AND STRATEGY OF MINISTRY OF INDUSTRY IN SUPPORTING THE ADVANCEMENT OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

Jn Friday, July 23, 2010 in Pancagatra Building, Floor III West, Lemhannas RI, the Minister of Industry, M. S. Hidayat, gave a lecture to participants of PPRA XLIV having the theme of "Policy and Strategy of Ministry of Industry in Supporting the Advancement

of Science and Technology".

The Presidential Regulation No.28 of 2008 regarding National Industrial Policy (KIN) regulates medium and long-term policy direction in accelerating industrialization process. The Presidential Regulation is anticipation toward negative impact of globalization and liberalization of world economy and its development in the future. As a long-term objective, the Minister of Industry describes Vision of Indonesian Industry in 2025 namely "Indonesia to Become Tough Industrial Country in the World", while the vision in 2020 would be becoming "New Developed Industrial Country".

The Minister of Industry said that Indonesian Industry keeps subjecting to challenges by, among others, rapid

development of technology, change of consumers preference and market segment, and competition which is getting tighter. In this respect, policy strategy is made in terms of simplified, medium and advanced technology development. The Ministry of Industry has made technological research and development such as accelerating application and development of industrial technology in industry sector, such as developing Nanotechnology, Biotechnology, Energy, Environment, and Food; developing innovation center and pilot project in region; establishing incubator of technology; developing technology toward zero waste industry, through 3R program (Reuse, Recover, Recycle), developing research and development to find alternative energy.

POLICY AND STRATEGY OF INCREASING SOCIAL WELFARE QUALITY IN SUPPORTING THE ADVANCEMENT OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

The Minister of Social Affairs of the Republic of Indonesia, Salim Segaf Al-Jufri, gave his description relating to Policy and Strategy of Increasing Social Welfare quality in Supporting the Advancement of Science and Technology before the participants of Regular Education of Group XLIV Lemhannas RI of 2010 on July 29, 2010 in Pancagatra Building, Floor III West. Development of Science and Technology can, on one side, improve welfare,

however, on the other side it can be misused and increase poverty, in this respect, Salim Segaf sees importance of application of Model of empowerment in handling poverty. Empowerment models is to empower/enable, which is to transfer expertise to the other party in order to live independently, and can expectedly bring change of attitude, increase of social participation, social solidarity, increase of economic condition of society, and increase of implementation of the poor family function.

Empowerment model approach is divided into 3 (three) clusters, namely, social protection program; empowerment program for strengthening, power in overcoming any issue; Business Credit Scheme (KUR); and development of Joint Business Group (KUBE) to manage productive and economic business activity/unit with various business units.

to establish comprehensive intelligent Indonesian people.

The objectives to reach shall be as follows: **first**, availability and affordability of quality PAUD (Early Education for children) service which is evenly distributed throughout provinces, districts and municipalities; **second**, security of certainty to obtain quality and equal basic education service throughout provinces, districts and municipalities; **third**, availability and affordability of quality, relevant and equal Medium Education Service throughout provinces, districts and municipalities; **fourth**, availability and affordability of quality, relevant high education service having international competitiveness which is equal throughout provinces; **fifth**, availability and affordability of quality, relevant and equal Adult Person Education which is equal, qualified and relevant to the needs of people; and **sixth**, Availability of reliable management system in securing organization of national education prime service.

In 2014, Ministry of Education has vision of **"organization of National Education Prime Service to Establish Comprehensive Intelligent Indonesian People"**.

Mohammad Nuh also describes the general strategy of national education development, according to vision of 2014 namely organizing prime service. The improvement made by Ministry of Education is by presenting educator and pedagogic personnel, learning component and evaluation, facility and infrastructure, funding and management.

DIRECTIVE MEETING OF DOMESTIC STRATEGIC STUDY (SSDN) PPRA XLV

PANEL DISCUSSION

"INCREASE OF POLITICAL PARTICIPATION OF WOMEN IN IMPLEMENTATION OF GENERAL ELECTION/REGIONAL HEAD ELECTION TO MATERIALIZE GENDER EQUALITY"

On Thursday, July 29, 2010, at 08.30-13.00 WIB, in Asta Gatra Building, Floor III West Lemhannas RI, a panel discussion was held regarding increase of political participation of women in the implementation of general election and regional head election to materialize gender equality within executive, legislative and judicative in supporting clean government and good governance program. This Panel Discussion was opened by Vice Governor, Air Marshal DR. Rio Mendung Thalieb and was also attended by Minister of Women Empowerment and Child Protection, Linda Gumelar.

Participation of Indonesian women throughout state and national life is a certainty for women in Indonesia which constitutes a part of national struggle and development process. Advancement of national development

cannot be separated from existence of women as state assets and its existence as human having solemnity of dignity and prestige.

Development of democracy in Indonesia has given wider space for women to participate particularly in politic development. Government commitment is reflected in a number of regulations which clearly binds participation of women in state and national life organization.

In 1999 Indonesia has shown significant advancement since the election of the first woman who becomes vice president, namely Megawati Soekarno Puteri, and further in 2001 she was elected as the President of the Republic of Indonesia. It has been followed by increase in the number of women who sit in legislative, executive bodies including National Army and National Police, as well as judicative body. The core purpose of gender equality is not to confirm as to who dominates and is being dominated, but rather to find corridor to share with each other fairly in any life activity irrespective whether they are men or women. Quota system is effectively aimed at improving traditional politics which was centralized to men and encourage women to participate in politics.

Therefore, short-term objective is to adopt quota system in relation to legal certainty and Law on general election to secure representation of women in

political development.

Meanwhile, the long-term objective is to encourage many young women to improve quality and to motivate them to be a driving force in politics and to be a prospective politician.

In the keynote speech of Governor of Lemhannas RI which was read out by Vice Governor, the Governor said that the urgency to increase capability of women in political sector needs to be supported by media, in addition to build strong network through women association. If Intellectual capacity of women has been built, then it is no longer necessary to impose quota as the privilege right to hold certain position or title. This is in line with the principle of gender equality, of which equality is principally not something given or gifted, but it should be fought for by women.

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
