Signing of MoU between Lemhannas RI & Constitutional Court

On Wednesday (19/6), Lemhannas RI and Constitutional Court signed a Memorandum of Understanding on the ground floor of the Constitutional Court's building. The Constitutional Court also concurrently signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Ministry of Youth and Sports and the Government of Riau Islands Province.

The MOU was signed by the Constitutional Court, which served as the first party, and was represented by its Secretary General Janderi M. Gaffar while Lemhannas RI, as the second party, was represented by its Principal Secretary Drs. Chandra Manan Mangan, M.Sc.

The signing of the MoU was witnessed by the Chairman of the Constitutional Court DR. H.M. Akil Mochtar S.H., M.H. and staff and the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. and several other officials. The event was also attended by officials from the Ministry of Youth and Sports and the Government of Riau Islands Province.

The Constitutional Court, in accordance with its main duties and functions, which, among others, include Pancasila education, is very much in line with those of Lemhannas RI. Both institutions organize programs for national values strengthening as contained in the four national consensus, namely Pancasila, the 1945 Constitution, Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia, and Unity in Diversity principle.

The MoU covered the issues of Pancasila education, Constitution and Procedural Law of the Constitutional Court, as well as Research, Study and Utilization of Information and Communication Technology Systems.

The signing of the MoU will be followed up by concrete activities related to national resilience, such as training or education of Pancasila, as well as other activities, including the utilization of information and communication technology systems (teleconference), so as to reinforce the concept of nationalism and to improve the role of law enforcement apparatus in supporting robust national resilience

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Utilization of Science and Technology Accurately, Efficiently and Effectively



“It is a global reality that the mastery of world science and technology has colored the universal standing of a nation in the world arena”

Said the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. when opening his keynote speech at the Roundtable Discussion on the “Mastery, Utilization and Promotion of Science and Technology for the Nation’s Glory in the Framework of National Resilience” on Thursday (13/6) on the 4th floor meeting room, West Wing of Astagatra Building, Lemhannas RI.

The governor’s statement brought to mind a similar call of President Susilo Bambang Yudhoyono during the commemoration of the National Technology Day on August 30, 2012, assuring that what drives Indonesia become an advanced nation is the mastery of technology, and accelerating of innovation that will lead to the nation’s self-reliance and competitiveness.

According to the governor of Lemhannas RI, there are four rapidly growing global technology in the world that are intertwined one another, namely: biotechnology, nanotechnology, materials technology and information and communication technology.

The roundtable discussion mode-

rated by expert lecturer in the field of socio-culture of Lemhannas RI Prof. DR. Njaju Jenny M.T Hardjatno featured several speakers, namely, the Director General for Informatics Applications from the Ministry of Communications and Information Dr. Ashwin Sasongko S, M.Sc, Expert Staff to the Minister of Research and Technology Prof. Dr. Ir. Benjamin Lakitan, M.Sc., and lecturer from the Bandung Institute of Technology (ITB) / Maritime Security Coordinating Board (Bakorkamla) Executive Secretary Dr. Ir. Dicky Rezady Munaf, MS., MSCE., Ph.D.

Meanwhile, the panelists at the event were the Director of the Center for Information System Studies from the Gunadarma University Prof. Dr. I Wayan Simri Wicaksana, S.Si, M.Eng, General Chairman of the Indonesian Internet Services Providers (APJII) Samuel Abrijani Pengerapan, Director for the Development and Services of Information System (PPSI) from the University of Indonesia Prof. Dr. Ir. Riri Fitri Sari, M.M., M.Sc., Expert Professional in the field of Natural Riches Prof. Dr. Ir. Dadan Umar Daihani, D.E.A.

According to the governor, there

are three important things needed to develop science and technology and to use them properly, efficiently and effectively. These things can sustain lives and livelihoods in the era of information globalization that are laden with changes and competition among nations, namely:

First, human resources with high quality, competitiveness, and national moral characters, that constantly innovate, are the main factors to win the global competition and improve the nation’s standing in international affairs. Second, building infrastructure to master science and technology is the second important factor that must be prepared, especially the infrastructure to develop information and communication technologies. Third, the need to encourage the implementation and optimization of the legislation related to the development of science and technology.

The event was also attended by the deputy governor, secretary of the governing board, principal secretary, expert lecturers, expert analysts, expert professionals and other officials of Lemhannas RI.

Civil – Military Synergy, the Key to National Coping Capability against Disaster Risks

The excerpt from the Indonesian first President Ir. Soekarno about geopolitics was quoted by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. when giving a presentation on the National Coping Capability against Disaster Risks in the Perspective of National Resilience at the National Seminar on the National Coping Capability in terms of Civil and Military Relations in the Perspective of Military Operations Other Than War against Disaster Risks” on Tuesday (18/6).

The governor explained that since Indonesia is located on the Pacific Ring of Fire, there will be a consequence that should be dealt with and addressed properly. It is impossible for the country to get rid of the disaster potentials and risks that will always haunt Indonesian people.

“In the perspective of Indonesia’s geopolitics and geostrategy, the geographical awareness is the key that needs to be understood and implemented in our daily life “, said the governor.

According to him, a comprehensive understanding of the geographical awareness, whether directly or indirectly, will contribute positively to the nation’s coping capability against disaster risk and reduce the resulting potential losses and social impacts.

In the perspective of national resilience, the tenacity and resilience of the nation must be nurtured from an early stage in the form of collective vigilance against catastrophic risk. The collective vigilance is needed so that the nation’s strategic components can participate actively and synergistically in minimizing or anticipating disaster risks, starting from mitigation stage up to the post-disaster rehabilitation activities.

The governor explained that the geographical awareness is a form of collective consciousness that must be built together so that the people can live together in harmony with its natural surroundings. It is then expected that the improved community’s coping capability will enhance national resilience.

Therefore, he continued, civilian and military synergy in building collective consciousness of the community is the key to successful development of national coping capability against disaster risks. The capability and the strength possessed by the military in carrying out military operations other than war, primarily those related to post-disaster management, will not be effective without community’s support at all levels.

“Logically, civilian and military constructive synergy, will create social solidarity and conducive social harmony that will enhance community’s coping capability against disaster risks. This will eventually lead to robust regional and national resilience,” he said.

The statement was made by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. when serving as a guest speaker at a roundtable discussion organized by the Presidential Advisory Council on Tuesday, (25/7) at the Office of the Presidential Advisory Council, Jakarta.

The closed-door discussion, which raised the theme “Strengthening the Management of Domestic Security in Order to Create Conducive Atmosphere for Supporting National Development Program”, was led by a member of the Presidential Advisory Council for Security and Defence Widodo A.S., S.I.P.

In his explanation, the governor conveyed that the democracy developed since the reform era, has gradually managed to create a democratic system of governance. However, the public’s political awareness is still not able to keep pace with the growing democracy, causing inter-community conflicts following the implementation of regional elections.

Besides that, according to the governor, the widening social gap, as shown by the higher Gini index (0.41 in 2011), has caused social jealousy which could leads to conflicts in the

society.

Today, there have been many corruption cases committed by public officials, and the policy-making process is considered to be prone to the influences of the capital owners..

All those things above are some of the many factors that can affect public confidence in the government and negatively affect the domestic security and stability, and hinder the implementation of national development.

Therefore, the governor hoped that all relevant parties work in synergy to restructure the democracy, organize national economic system, realize the rule of law and integrated management system of security threats.

Through these efforts, it is expected that the disturbances to the the country’s domestic security can be managed properly in accordance with the laws and regulations in the democratic system of government, so that conducive stability and security can be maintained in order to support the implementation of national development.

Turkey, Jordan, and South Korea were the destination countries for the participants of the Overseas Strategic Study of the 50th PPRA that lasted from July 13 to 19, 2013. It was one of the main activities in the educational course program of Lemhannas RI.

The Overseas Strategic Study, which was divided into three groups, aimed at providing an opportunity for the 50th PPRA participants to learn and observe firsthand the strategy, patterns and systems of national development in the destination countries, and later compared them to the conditions of Indonesian national resilience.

South Korea

Jordan

On Tuesday (16/7), Lemhannas RI held a roundtable discussion at the 4th floor meeting room, West Wing of Astagatra Building, Lemhannas RI. The roundtable discussion was opened by the Deputy for Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI Inspector General of Police. Drs. Herry Haryanto. The theme raised was the "Implications of Trans-Pacific Partnership Cooperation to Improve Indonesia's Role in ASEAN Region in the Framework of Regional Resilience".

The speakers at the event were Special Presidential Staff for Economic Affairs Prof. Firmanza, Ph.D., Vice Dean of the Social and Political Sciences from the University of Indonesia Edy Prasetyono, Ph.D., and Executive Director of ASEAN Foundation Dr. Makarim Wibisono. The panelists at the event were Indonesian Ambassador to ASEAN Ngurah Swajaya, Deputy VI for Economic Cooperation Coordination and International Financing from the Coordinating Ministry for Politics, Law and Security Ir. Rizal Afandi Lukman and Second Deputy for Foreign Politics from the Coordinating Ministry for Politics, Law and Security Agus Sriyono.

Nowadays, the changes in geoeconomic, geopolitical and geostrategic landscape are becoming more prominent as the developed countries continued their penetration for the sake of their interests while the world's economic centre of gravity has shifted from Europe to Asia.

Given the opportunity, ASEAN has also contributed to a change of global economic center of gravity to Asia. In addition,

the rapid regional economic growth, as seen in countries like China and India, has encouraged Americans to build synergic cooperation of Asia Pacific through the establishment of trans-pacific partnership.

In the keynote speech of the governor of Lemhannas RI, which was read by the deputy for strategic study, it was conveyed that Indonesia actually has a very strategic role in regional economic cooperation. The country also has an interest in maintaining the stability in the ASEAN region, as well as in preserving the solidity of ASEAN member countries, especially in creating ASEAN Economic Community by 2015.

The trans-pacific partnership will open up various opportunities for Indonesia to improve national and regional economy. This builds up a very important momentum for Indonesia in the eyes of the world. However, Indonesia's readiness should also be taken into account if it is to join the trans-pacific partnership.

The roundtable discussion is expected to contribute both ideas and conceptions related to Indonesia's measures and stance in facing the trans-pacific partnership, through in-depth analysis of its advantages and disadvantages as well as its short and long term strategic aspects, so that Indonesia can maintain its existence in the eyes of the world, and to benefit from such a regional cooperation.
