# Lemhannas RI Receives Indian NDC Visit

Some of Indonesia's cultures are actually not only similar to those of immediate neighboring countries, but are also to those of countries separated by oceans, such as India. Such similarities were expressed by the delegation of the National Defence College (NDC) of India during their visit to Lemhannas RI on Monday (12/5).

The visiting delegation, led by Major General VP Singh, was received by the Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Air Marshal Dede Rusamsi, S.E. in a courtesy call. The latter was accompanied by Senior Analyst in Diplomacy Air Vice Marshal Beng Tardjani, M.Sc., and Chief of Cooperation Bureau Brigadier General Sudibyo, S.E.

Following the courtesy call, a discussion was held between Lemhannas RI and the Indian NDC. During the discussion, the visiting guests expressed their astonishment at Pancasila, saying that the name of the philosophical foundation of the Indonesian state was derived from Sanskrit. Later, the participants of discussion from Lemhannas RI explained the contents and meanings of Pancasila that was closely linked to the ideals of independence as established by the Indonesian founding fathers. The Indian delegation praised Indonesia's success in maintaining a sense of unity and nationalism among its citizens. Besides focusing on the issue of pluralism and diversity, the discussion addressed the terrorism issues that hit Indonesia in recent years.

During the discussion, Lemhannas RI also described its institution's profile as well as its programs, highlighting its three main tasks, namely organizing educational programs for national leader cadres, conducting studies of which the output will be recommended to the president, and strengthening nationalistic values among the society. The discussion was ended with a handover of plaque and company profile from Lemhannas RI to India. It was hoped that the cooperation between the two institutions would continue to improve in the future.

In running a democratic system of government, it is important to embrace all the differences that arise from the country's diverse ethnics, customs, and religions, meaning that ones must be prepared to accept and manage all those differences, including differences in ideology which often lead to radical fanaticism and terrorism.

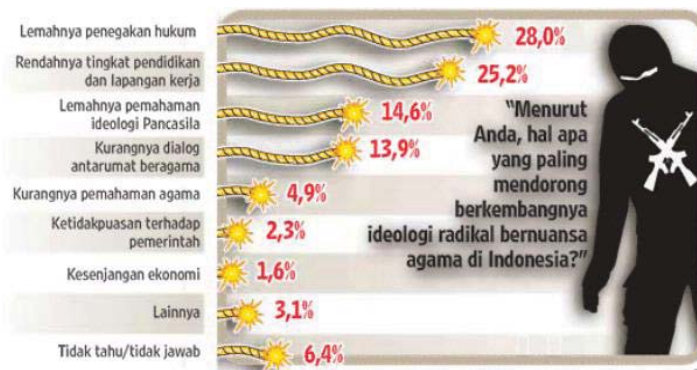
Given such conditions, Lemhannas RI, through the Directorate of Defence and Security Study, held a Focus Group Discussion (FGD) themed **"Improving Measures to Overcome Radicalism in Order to Realize National Security Systems in the Context of National Resilience"** on Tuesday (13/5) at the Meeting Room of Asta Gatra Building, 3rd Floor. The discussion was opened by Maj. Gen. Hari Mulyono, S.E., M.M. on behalf of the Deputy for Strategic Studies Inspector General of Police Boy Salamuddin. The FGD was moderated by Brig. Gen. of Police Drs. Bambang Sukamto, S.H., M.H.

This FGD featured four speakers, namely Maj. Gen. Agus Surya Bakti (Deputy I for Prevention, Protection, and Deradicalisation of Terrorism from BNPT), Prof. Dr. Hamdi Muluk from the University of Indonesia, Dr. Mamat S. Burhanudin, M.A. (Head of Sub-Directorate of Madrasah Diniyah Takmiliah of the Directorate of Diniyah Education and Pondok Pesantren of the Ministry of Religious Affairs, and a community leader named Ustad Abdul Rahman Ayyub.

In his presentation, Major General Agus SB put forth that radicalism could be classified into two types. First, static radicalism which was manifested in radical ideas; and second, destructive radicalism which used violence in achieving its objectives.

The panelists in the discussion were Prof. Dr. Adrianus Meliala (Criminologist from the University of Indonesia), Brigadier General Didi Sudiana (Director of National Vigilance of the National and Political Unity Office from the Ministry of Internal Affairs), Maj. Gen. Nasir Sudiana (Senior Analyst in National Resilience of Lemhannas RI), and Senior Analyst in Law and Human Rights of Lemhannas RI Inspector General of Police Drs. Djoko Prastowo, M.H.

The discussion lasting for 4 hours also discussed preventive measures and solutions to overcome radicalism that had penetrated into many aspects of life, from social to religious and economic aspects of life. The resource persons and panelists sought to find a workable applicative formula to solve these problems, of which the outcome will be recommended to the president and relevant government institutions.

# Lemhannas RI Holds Hearing with Commission I of the House of Representatives

In response to the invitation from the General Secretariat of the House of Representatives (DPR RI), Lemhannas RI held a hearing with the Commission I of the House of Representatives in order to discuss the 2014 revised state budget (APBN-P 2014) based on priority scales that were oriented towards the implementation of the tasks and functions of Lemhannas RI, namely educational programs, strategic studies, and strengthening program of nationalistic values. In the hearing held on Tuesday (21/5) at the meeting room of Commission I of the House of Representatives on the 1st floor of Nusantara II Building, the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. proposed three alternatives for additional budgets.

The three proposed budget alternatives supplied with their details of utilization were expected to be taken into account in decision-making process. At the hearing, the Governor explained the three budget alternatives which were expected to be approved by the Commission I.

The three budget alternatives were drawn up based on the situation that Lemhannas RI in for the rest of the fiscal year of 2014. **First**, the estimated time for budget disbursement and

execution capabilities; **Second**, the timely budget absorption rate and the schedule of audit of the State Audit Agency (BPK RI) in Lemhannas RI; **Third**, the main tasks and functions of Lemhannas RI in the organizing of educational course programs which cannot be postponed. Other things which influenced the drawing-up of the three budget alternatives for the 2014 revised state budget were the more increasingly intensive scope of work of Lemhannas RI that is no longer limited to the education programs held in its own campus, but also outside of Lemhannas RI.

After hearing the explanation from Budi Susilo Soepandji, all the members of the Commission I said that they accepted and understood the reasons and explanations for the proposed 2014 budget increase. They further said that they would consider it and discussed such needs in the next revised budget meeting.

## FKIP Students of Muhammadiyah University Purwokerto Visits Lemhannas RI

As a part of the implementation of compulsory activities in their educational programs, a group of students from the Civic and Citizenship Education (PPKn) of the Faculty of Education and Teacher Training (PPKn) from University of Muhammadiyah Purwokerto visited Lemhannas RI on Wednesday (21/5). Leader of the students group Banani Ma'mur, M.Si. said that the visit was one of a series of field study (KKL) of the PPKn study program of the Muhammadiyah University conducted in Jakarta and Bandung.

Being accompanied by four lecturers, the 30 students were received by the Chief of Public Relations Bureau of Lemhannas RI Commodore E. Estu Prabowo, M.Sc. along with the Head of Public Relations Division of Public Relations Bureau Ir. Yusita Pusparini, M. Sc. on the 3rd floor of Asta Gatra Building.

Although the visiting students were only in the fourth semester in their study, Banani Ma'mur said that they already had adequate theoretical basis to understand the nationalistic education organized by Lemhannas RI. Later, they will bring the results of

their field study to a seminar so that their capabilities in absorbing information during the field study can be assessed.

On the occasion, Estu Prabowo described the historical background of Lemhannas RI and its position in the government system. One basic thing that they should be aware of is the acronym of Lemhannas RI, which stands for the National Resilience Institute of the Republic of Indonesia, instead of the National Defence Institution of the Republic of Indonesia as it is wrongly assumed by many. "Defence concerns more with physical aspects, such as weaponry, while resilience is a thinking concept focusing on the nationalistic spirit," explained Chief of Public Relations Bureau of Lemhannas RI.

In addition to elaborating the history and development of Lemhannas RI, Estu Prabowo also shed light a little bit on the geopolitics, geostrategy, national archipelagic outlook and national resilience. Citing a statement from the Indonesian President Ir. Soekarno in his first lecture at the opening of the Regular Educational Course KRA (currently known as PPRa), Estu

Prabowo conveyed that national defense could only be properly implemented when national defense was based on geopolitical knowledge.

“There are three factors that make up the character of the Indonesian people, namely the birth of a nation, state, as well as the national ideals and ideology which produce national archipelagic outlook in achieving national goals,” he added. The visit was ended with a question and answer session and exchange of souvenirs between the two sides. Banani Ma'mur hoped that the warm welcome accorded to the visiting students by Lemhannas RI could be continued with other significant partnerships in the future.



## Indonesia Must Have Long-Term National Defence System

With regard to the health problems in Indonesia, dr. Untung Suseno Sutarjo said that the malnutrition condition in the Eastern part of Indonesia should be paid more attention to. East Nusa Tenggara is one of the provinces in the Eastern Indonesian region which has faced malnutrition problems.

Moreover, the eastern parts of Indonesian regions still have a shortage of medical and health facilities, especially in Maluku and Papua. One of the reasons for the maldistribution of medics is the reluctance of medics to work outside of the Java Island. “Given the decentralization program, the regions are actually expected to finance these basic needs.

However, the fact remains that all the regions currently still rely heavily on the central government for funding,” said Untung Suseno Sutarjo who served as a resource person in the first session of the Dialogue on Nationalistic Insight for National Leaders of Lemhannas RI for the Year 2014.

Drs. Sukendramartha, M.Sc, M.App.Sc. in his presentation explained that each citizen was expected to have a sense of patriotism wherever they were, even in border areas.

However, as Untung Suseno Sutarjo said, one of the barriers to the strengthening of nationalism was the not well-distributed health services. “Logically, if welfare is decreased, the sense of patriotism may get decreased too, especially in border areas,” said Sukendramartha.

Acting as the moderator in the first session of the Dialogue held on Wednesday (21/5) was Effendi Gazali, who managed to address the theme of border areas by incorporating refreshing humors in his elaboration. Acting as the moderator in the second session was Brig. Dr. H. Anton Charlyan, MPKN. The dialogue raised the theme “Improving nationalistic insight for the acceleration of national development in the field of national defense and security.”

In the second session, the Deputy Minister of Defense Sjafrie Sjamsoeddin asserted that the building of state defense system could not be approached only from a single management method, but also from multinational management method that could contribute to the state defense system. It was a fundamental foundation mandated by the constitution that concerns with legality and national interests. “We must have a long-term national defense system,” said Sjafrie Sjamsoeddin.

# Roundtable Discussion: Optimizing Relationship between Indonesia and Australia

The cooperative relationship between Indonesia and neighboring countries do not always go smoothly and conductively. The development of strategic environment related to various internal and external aspects has frequently led to conflicts. Therefore, Lemhannas RI, through the Directorate of International Relations Studies, Deputy Office of Strategic Studies, held a roundtable discussion with the theme **“Optimizing Indonesian and Australian Diplomatic Relations in Order to Strengthen Indonesia’s Foreign Policy in the Context of National Resilience.”**

The bilateral cooperation between Indonesia and Australia has been built on an established foundation. In the last decade, the relations between the two countries seem fairly harmonious. “We have many forms of partnership cooperation, such as in politics, security, or economy. In fact, both countries have more than 200 cooperation agreements in various fields. It indeed implies the interdependence between the two countries. In that regard, these two countries should have both political commitment and morals in order to maintain such a bilateral cooperation,” explained the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, DEA.

“Geographically, Australia is Indonesia’s southern neighbor. Given the strategic position, Indonesia should be able to act as a ‘counterbalancing partner’ in terms of economy, culture, and defense,” concluded Professional Expert in International Relations and Diplomacy of Lemhannas RI Rear Admiral (Ret.) Robert Mangindaan, who served as a moderator at the roundtable discussion.

Held at Kresna Room, 4th Floor, West Wing of Astagatra Lemhannas RI, on Wednesday (21/5), the roundtable discussion addressed the dynamics of the Indonesian and Australian relations. The dynamic relationship can be traced back to the Indonesian history when it was still under the Netherlands East Indies government, when many Indonesian students were sent to Australia to study. “The relations between Indonesia and

Australia are like a ‘roller coaster’. Their relations began to get worse since the independence referendum held for East Timor in 1990, and then it improved upon the adoption of Lombok Treaty in 2009,” said Nadjib Riphath Kesoema. Indonesia withdrew its ambassador to Australia some time ago as a response to Abbott government’s **boat turn-back policies** for asylum seekers. “This move is a part of the Indonesian government’s policy which reduces diplomatic ties between Indonesia and Australia,” added Nadjib Riphath Kesoema.

Meanwhile, Prof. Yanyan M. Yaniv, Mair, Ph. D., urged the Indonesian government to be more prudent when it comes to the relationship with neighboring country. “Indonesia should be wise in its dealing with Australia, **East Asia Summit and Australia’s Strategic Edge** in 2020. It is necessary to build a good political communication,” he said

Budi Susilo Soepandji hoped that the discussion would generate valuable and comprehensive insight, input, and suggestions that would help in formulating effective solutions related to the dynamic political relations between Indonesia and Australia. Therefore, these will, expectedly, become a basis for policy-making in order to strengthen Indonesian foreign policy which will lead to improved national resilience.

The discussion featured several resource persons, namely, Indonesian Ambassador to Australia Nadjib Riphath Kesoema, Professor in International Relations for the Doctoral Program from the Padjadjaran University Prof. Yanyan M. Yani, MAIR, Ph.D., Deputy for the Coordination of Foreign Policy from the Coordinating Ministry for Political, Legal and Security Affairs Agus Sriyono, Presidential Expert Staff in International Relations Teuku Faizasyah. Acting as the key panelists were Chairman of the State Cryptography Agency Major General Dr. Joko Setiadi, M.Si., and Expert Professional in International Relations and National Vigilance of Lemhannas RI Air Vice Marshal (Ret.) Syahrul Ansory.



# Enhancing Economic Added Value of Mineral Resources

Mineral and coal -- strategic commodities for the acceleration of national development -- have thus far been exported in the form of raw materials that do not have added value. Therefore, the government has issued a policy which restricts the export of mineral ores as set forth in the Law No. 4 of 2009. This policy has begun to bring many positive changes to various aspects of life in the country, despite of objections from the miners.

Held at the meeting room of Asta Gatra Building, 4th Floor, the Directorate of Economic Studies of the Office of the Deputy for Strategic Studies held a roundtable discussion with the theme **“The Impact of Mineral Resources Exploitation on the National Economic Added Value in the Context of National Resilience”** on Thursday (22/5). The event was moderated by the Professional Expert in National Resilience and Geostrategy Maj. Gen. (Ret.) Lumban Sianipar, S.I.P. and was opened by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A.

In this study, Lemhannas RI featured several keynote speakers who were experts in their fields, namely Deputy Minister of the Energy and Mineral Resources Susilo Siswoutomo, Deputy I for the Environmental Governance from the Ministry of Environment Imam Hendargo, Director General of Manufacturing-Based Industry Ir. Hanjanto, M.Eng.; President Director of PT. Freeport Rozik B.

Soecipto, and President Director of PT. Newmont Martiono Hadianto. In this study, the speaker described the economic added value that could be developed in various fields by processing mineral and coal resources at home.

In his opening remark, the Governor of Lemhannas RI said, “We must remember that the main goal of export controls is not to impede trade but rather to utilize national mineral resources for the greatest prosperity of the people through increased added value, which is expected to develop our domestic economy.”

The Lemhannas RI's economic study featured several resource persons, namely a representative from the National Energy Board Prof. Ir. Rinaldy Dalimi, M.Sc., Ph.D; Mining expert Dr. IR. S. Witoro Sularno, M. Sc., representative from the Indonesian Forum for the Environment (WALHI) Nur Hidayati, and Senior Lecturer in Natural Resources Wealth of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Jana Tjahjana Anggradiredja, MS. Apt. This discussion was also attended by the Deputy Governor Air Marshal Dede Rusamsi, S.E. as well as faculty members of Lemhannas RI.

“Together we must safeguard our economy which is currently on the right track. We must also utilize our natural resources so that they can be a blessing instead of a curse,” hoped Budi Susilo Soepandji.

# Indonesian Ambassador to Japan Visits Lemhannas RI

In the wake of the dynamic strategic environment in the Asia Pacific region, Lemhannas RI received a visit from the Indonesian Ambassador to Japan, Yusron Ihza Mahendra. The visit, which was intended for an exchange of views related to Indonesia's bilateral relations with Japan, was started with a courtesy call paid by the Ambassador to the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, DEA. During the courtesy call, the governor was accompanied by Deputy Governor Air Marshal Dede Rusamsi, SE and Inspector General of Police Boy Salamuddin on Wednesday (28/5) in Trigatra Building, 1st Floor, Lemhannas RI.

The issues being discussed ranged from short, medium and long-term security trend in the Asia Pacific region, the consequences of the development of political and security cooperation in the ASEAN region, to the efforts to improve cooperation and manage the changes in the regional security environment. The discussion, led by the Deputy for Strategic Studies Inspector General of Police Boy Salamuddin Assessment, was also attended by ten participants from the 51st and 52nd Regular Educational Course Program (PPRA) of Lemhannas RI. Some of whom will make a strategic study visit to Japan.

At the beginning of the discussion, Yusron Ihza Mahendra conveyed his views on the development of Japan's current political situation and the cooperation opportunities for Indonesia, one of which was in the field of defence. According to him, the development acceleration in the field of defence would bring a lot of benefits to Indonesia. "If our defence industry is strong, we will have three advantages. **First**, our defence will be stronger; **second**, our diplomatic activities will also be developed, and **third**, our economy will accelerate," said Yusron Ihza Mahendra.

Besides the defence issues, the ambassador also addressed questions from discussion participants regarding other areas of cooperation that could be established with Japan, especially in agriculture. The advanced technology which sustains Japan's agriculture can be utilized in order to develop farming and agriculture in Indonesia.





## Lemhannas RI and Permanent Mission of Thailand Delegation Discuss Security Issues

As one of big countries in Southeast Asia region, Thailand has the responsibility to maintain regional stability. Therefore, establishing a good bilateral and multilateral relationship with other countries in the region is required.

In that regard, Thailand, through the delegation of Permanent Mission of Thailand to ASEAN, visited Lemhannas RI on Wednesday (29/5). The Thai delegation, led by a representative of the Thailand's Ministry of Foreign Affairs Arthayudh Srisamoot, consisted of nine members from various agencies, including the Ministry of ASEAN Affairs, Ministry of Defense, the National Security Council, National Defence Studies Institute, ISIS Thailand and Mahidol University.

Having been received directly by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, DEA in a courtesy call, the visit was later continued with a discussion at the Nusantara I meeting room, Tri Gatra Building. The purpose of the visit, as expressed by the group leader, was to discuss issues related to short, medium and long-term security trends in the Asia-Pacific region, the consequences of development of regional political and security cooperation in ASEAN regions and efforts to strengthen security cooperation in order to cope with changes taking place in the region.

Recently there were a lot of changes that occurred in ASEAN region which, if not properly addressed, can affect the stability and security of the countries in the region. For example, Indonesia with its presidential election on July 9, 2014, military coup in Thailand, crisis in Myanmar, China - Vietnam conflicts, and many others.

"Considering the fact that the Indonesian resilience is also influenced by regional resilience, Lemhannas RI, in accordance with its duties and functions, seeks to constantly strengthen the tree determinant aspects or tri gatra (geography, natural resources wealth, and population) and five determinant aspects or panca gatra (ideology, politics, economy, social and culture, and defense and security)," said the Governor of Lemhannas RI. "The diversity of ethnicity, language and others in Indonesia can be united with the principle of Unity in Diversity and Pancasila," he added.

Indonesia and Thailand have a long history of cooperation dating back to the establishment of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) in 1967. Along the way, the two countries have much in common in terms of the desire to promote equality for their diverse citizens, good governance and reform.

In this courtesy call, the Governor of Lemhannas RI was accompanied by Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Air Marshal Dede Rusamsi, SE, Deputy for Strategic Studies Inspector General of Police Boy Salamuddin, Chief of Cooperation Bureau Brigadier General Sudiby, S.E., Chief of Public Relations Bureau Commodore E. Estu Prabowo, M.Sc. The courtesy call was ended with an exchange of souvenirs between the Governor and the group leader of the Thailand's delegation Arthayudh Srisamoot. Then, a discussion ensued between the two parties at the Nusantara I meeting room.

Moderated by the Inspector General of Police Boy Salamuddin, both parties discussed a variety of regional and national issues that the two countries currently faced as well as the solutions to overcome them. This discussion was of a great significance to both countries considering the fact that the ASEAN Community will be established in 2015.

With regard to the Indonesia's handling of local conflicts, such as what happened in Poso and Maluku, Boy Salamuddin explained the approach taken by the Indonesian government in resolving such conflicts, which was by bringing all parties to sit together and resolve their differences peacefully by seeking the root causes as well as their solutions. In addition, the informal leaders were also involved and mobilized in order to help mitigate and end the conflicts.

The Lemhannas RI officials who attended the discussion included Senior Analyst in Geography Maj. Gen. Endang Haerudin, ST, MM, Senior Analyst in Diplomacy Air Vice Marshal Ir. Beng Tardjani, M.Sc. and Chief of Cooperation Bureau Brigadier General Sudiby, SE. The discussion was ended with a group photo in front of the Trigatra Building of Lemhannas RI.

# Lemhannas RI Designs Nationalistic Insight Program for Elected Members of Parliament



Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. made a visit to the Office of the Speaker of the House of Representatives Dr. H. Marzuki Alie on Friday (7/6) for a consultation. On this occasion, the Governor was accompanied by Professional Expert in International Relations Air Vice Marshal (Ret.) Syahrul Ansory, Deputy for the Strengthening of Nationalistic Values Rear Admiral Ir. Leonardi, Chief of Public Relations Bureau Commodore E. Estu Prabowo, M.Sc, and Chief of Cooperation Bureau Brigadier General Sudibyo, S.E. The meeting held at the Parliament Chairman's office discussed Lemhannas RI's plan to conduct a short educational course on national resilience for the members of the House of Representatives voted in the 2014 legislative elections, who will be inaugurated this year.

The emergence of new faces voted in the legislative elections on April 9 has brought a big hope that the people's representatives will be able to bring changes for the better in their term of office. However, it is likely that these new members of the House may not fully understand yet the character of statesmanship which requires them to put the interests of the people first. On that consideration, Budi Susilo Soepandji followed up on the ideas and suggestions

from various stakeholders regarding the need to organize an educational program for the elected members of the House of Representatives.

There are three things that still need to be studied further in order to realize this program, which are the implementation mechanism, duration of education, and the material to be taught. It was these three things that were being consulted by the Governor with the Chairman of the House of Representatives.

Having heard the proposal from Budi Susilo Soepandji, Marzuki Alie, who was accompanied by the Secretary General of the House of Representatives Dr. Winantuningtyas Titi Swasanany, SH., M.Sc. and Deputy of Legislation K. Johnson Rajagukguk, SH., M.Hum. gave a positive response. "For these five years I feel that the recruitment, cadre-training program and education do not run well. Therefore, I think Lemhannas RI will be able to address these issues," he said. Positive response and consideration given by the House of Representatives is expected to lead to a better cooperation in the future, especially in the educational course program for elected members of parliament that is now being designed.

# Regeneration of Senior Lecturers, Senior Analysts and Structural Officials
