Lemhannas RI held a Coffee Morning event with editors-in-chief and journalists of mass media on Wednesday (24/9) which was opened by Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji. While it was a regular event held by Public Relations Bureau of Lemhannas RI, the Coffee Morning, this time, was a little bit different from the previous ones, as the media people were being asked for their views and perspectives about their roles.

With the theme “Direct and Indirect Local Leaders Election in the Perspective of Media”, Lemhannas RI tried to explore the insights of the media people on the issue of regional elections bill which was criticized by various groups of the people. Moderated by Maulana Isnarto from RRI, the discussion was opened with a brief presentation on Indonesia’s elections from the perspective of the media as delivered by Chairman of the Honorary Board of the Indonesian Journalists Association Tarman Azzam.

“The press is a tool of democracy which has a duty to oversee the product of democracy, which is the government. If the ‘product’ makes a mistake and abuses its power, then the ‘tool’ should immediately reprimand the government and defend the interests of the people. This is the task of the press, which is to educate the people and to always stand for the truth,” said Tarman Azzam.

On this occasion, the editors-in-chief and journalists gave their views on their reporting of the regional elections bill. Taking into account the advantages and disadvantages of each system (direct and indirect systems), Lemhannas RI and the mass media people were engaged in an active discussion regarding the steps to be taken in addressing the decisions to be made by the House of Representatives regarding the issue.

Lemhannas RI's Study Team Visits South Korea

The Delegation of Ongoing Study of the Directorate of International Study under the Deputy Office of the Strategic Studies made a visit to Seoul, South Korea for two days, from September 17 to 18, 2014. The team consisted of Prime Secretary Commissioner General of Police Boy Salamuddin, Professional Expert in Strategy and International Relations of Lemhannas RI Rear Admiral (Ret.) Robert Mangindaan, Acting Deputy of Strategic Studies Prof. Dr. Ir. Djagal Wiseso Marseno, M.Agr, Professor in International Relations of the Faculty of Social and Political Science from Padjajaran University Prof. Yanyan M Yani, MAIRS, Ph.D., and Head of Subdirectorate of Regional Studies Colonel Sus Dr. Ir. Rudy AG Gultom, M.Sc.

During the two-day visit in South Korea, the Lemhannas RI's Study Team went to two agencies, namely the South Korea's Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Korea National Defense University (KNDU). The purpose of the visit was to develop strategies for the central and local governments towards the ASEAN Community in 2015 in the context of national resilience.

On the first day of the visit on Wednesday (17/9), the Lemhannas RI's delegation went to the South Korea's Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and was received by Director General for South Asian and Pacific Affairs Bureau Mr. Suh Jeong-in and staff members. Suh Jeong-In conveyed general foreign policy of South Korean government regarding the implementation of the ASEAN Community in 2015 in the ASEAN region. He also extended his

high appreciation of Indonesia which had played an important role in maintaining the stability, security and peace in the ASEAN region.

The South Korean government admitted that it had prepared various proposals of cooperation in various fields, including in terms of funding, in order to promote good relations and cooperation between South Korea and ASEAN countries, especially Indonesia.

According to Suh Jeong-In, there were 31 proposals of joint cooperation funded by the government of South Korea, comprising cooperation in transnational crime, capacity building and e-government, ICT, disaster management, environment and climate change, people-to-people contact, social welfare/labor, and others.

On the next day, Thursday (18/9), the Study Team of Lemhannas RI visited KNDU and was received by Dean of the National Security College of KNDU Rear Admiral Prof. Park Moon Young, along with its academics and one representative of KNDU students from Indonesia Colonel Pnb Joko Takaryanto.

The visit of the Lemhannas RI's study team led by the Principal Secretary was a reciprocal visit following the KNDU delegation's visit to Lemhannas RI in September this year. Park Young Moon welcomed the visit of Lemhannas RI's delegation and hoped that a good cooperation could be established in strategic studies in the future.

Lemhannas RI's PPID Team Conducts Comparative Study to Three Ministries

In order to improve the quality of information provision services to the public as mandated by Law No. 14 of 2008 on Public Information Disclosure (KIP), the Documentation and Information Management Unit (PPID) of Lemhannas RI made a visit to three ministries, which was led by Head of Public Relations Division Ir. Yusita Pusparini, M.Sc. on Tuesday, (23/9). The activity was conducted to obtain information related to public information services.

The first visit was made to the Ministry of Communications and Information to which they were received by the Ministry's Secretary General Dr. Suprawoto, SH, M.Si. During the visit, Yusita Pusparini expressed the team's intention to learn as much as possible from the experiences of the ministry's PPID, especially about the implementation of the KIP law. Responding to the team's request, Suprawoto explained the chronology of PPID establishment in the Ministry of Communications and Information as well as the examples of cases that they had in fulfilling public request for information.

"The ministry is currently still processing requests for information manually, which is by writing them down, verifying and coordinating with PPID units that have been established. Not all data were uploaded to PPID server, which could be accessed automatically. We rely on a manual system as we want to minimize the problems that may arise in the provision of public information services due to power outage or server crashes," said Suprawoto.

After gaining information from the Ministry of Communications and Information's PPID and inspecting their PPID facilities, the Lemhannas' PPID team proceeded to visit the Ministry of Finance to which they were received by Head of Public Relations Communication Management Strategy Division Herry Siswanto. During the visit, Andy Siswanto gave a presentation on the Ministry's PPID and shared their experiences in the fulfillment of public information requests, information services strategy, frequency of information requests in annual basis, most requested information by the applicants as well as the achievements of the Ministry of Finance's PPID.

The last visit of Lemhannas RI's PPID was made to the Ministry of Religious Affairs. During the visit, the team was not only briefed about the Ministry's PPID which had been in operation one year earlier than Lemhannas RI's PPID, but they also got a chance to make a tour of inspection to the ministry's PPID facilities.

The comparative study was followed by 13 members of the main PPID of Lemhannas RI, comprising of representatives from all of work units. This activity was expected to broaden the insight of Lemhannas RI's PPID Team members into public information service system, which is more effective, efficient and focused, and is in accordance with the Law on the Disclosure of Public Information.

Expanding Industrial Zone without Agricultural Land Conversion



The Directorate of Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI, on Thursday (25/9), held a Roundtable Discussion with the theme "Expanding Industrial and Residential Areas Without Agricultural Land Conversion in Order to Maintain Sustainable Development in the Context of National Resilience," which was located in Kresna Room, 4th Floor of Astagatra Building, Lemhannas RI. It was part of the efforts to prepare for the ASEAN economic community of 2015.

In his keynote speech read by the Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Air Marshal Dede Rusamsi SE, the Governor of Lemhannas RI conveyed that the national industry was expected to be a driving force of national economic development, which will no longer be concentrated on the Java Island only, but also on the other islands throughout Indonesia.

The resource persons at the event were Director General of the Development of Industrial Zone from the Ministry of Industry, Dr. Ir. Imam Haryono, M.Sc., Ir. Muhammad Said M.M., from the Directorate of Management, Utilization and Tenurial System of Forest Areas from the Ministry of Forestry; Director General of Infrastructure and Facility from the Ministry of Agriculture Dr. Ir. Sumardjo Gatot Irianto M.SDAA., Director of Regions and Lands of the Directorate General of Public Administration from the Ministry of Home Affairs Dr Rizari MBA M.Si.

The panelists at the roundtable discussion were the Director of the Spatial Management and Lands from the National Development Planning Agency (Bappenas) Dr. Ir. Ozwar Muazin, Expert Staff of the Minister of Public Works for Inter-Institutional Relations Dr. Ir. Rukhiyat Deni Jaka Permanan M.Eng., Professional Expert in Domestic Politics of Lemhannas RI Dr. Ir. Siti Nurbaya Bakar M.Sc. The event was moderated by Prof. Dr. Miyasto SU.

Socialization of Whistleblowing System (WBS)

In an effort to prevent and eradicate corruption, Lemhannas RI, in cooperation with the Goods and Services Procurement Agency (LKPP) carried out a dissemination event on the Whistleblowing System (WBS), which was opened by the Prime Secretary of Lemhannas RI Commissioner General of Police Boy Salamuddin. Deputy for Law and Dispute Settlement from LKPP Ir. Ikak Gayuh Patriastimo, MSP. delivered a presentation on the "Whistleblowing System" on Monday (29/9) at the Gajah Mada Room.

The WBS is a complaint system that uses a web-based application, and can be used by a whistleblower to convey his or her complaints about alleged violations that occur within the goods and services procurement units of a whistleblower's internal institution.

In his presentation, Ikak G. Patriastomo conveyed that, "a whistleblower is a person within the organization who has information about indications of corruption within the organization and convey it through certain mechanisms in the WBS. "The information entered into the WBS will be handled by a verification team. If the results of the verification need to be followed up, then they would be forwarded to the Government Internal Oversight Body (APIP) that will perform assessments and collect evidence before the complaints were submitted to law enforcement body as a criminal offense.

At the end of his speech, Boy Salamuddin conveyed that, "This will obviously take Indonesia forward and there is no turning back for us. We are the backbone of government's program, and therefore, we must play an active role and fully commit to this and keep supporting the operation of WBS in the procurement of goods and services in order to create work environment that is clean and free from corruption."



Upgrading Course for Spouses of 51st PPRA Participants

On Tuesday (30/9), Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, DEA., opened the Upgrading Course for Spouses of the 51st PPRA participants at the Dwi Warna Purwa Building of Lemhannas RI.

The upgrading course, which lasted for six days, was aimed to improve the insight and knowledge of the spouses as the PPRA participants attended their courses in Lemhannas RI. Moreover, the activity was also aimed to strengthen the ties among the spouses of the PPRA participants and improve their insight and ethics as the spouses of national-level leaders.

During the upgrading course, the participants were provided with materials related to nationalistic insight so that they would be able to understand and implement such values in their daily life, either within their family, organization or community.

In addition to classroom activities, the participants of upgrading course also made a visit to garment and food industry in the Jababeka Industrial Estate - Cikarang. The visit was intended to better understand the production process in both industries and learn more about their products.

Workshop on National Resilience Measurement

The National Resilience Measurement Laboratory (Labkurtannas) of Lemhannas RI again organized a Workshop on National Resilience in the Provinces and Strategic Issues on Tuesday (30/9). The fifth annual workshop was opened by Prime Secretary of Lemhannas RI Commissioner General of Police Boy Salamuddin at Gajah Mada Room, Panca Gatra Building, Lemhannas RI.

According to the reporting from Labkurtannas Chairman Prof. Dr. Miyasto, SU, the number of provinces which took part this year had increased to 34 provinces, with the Province of North Kalimantan joining most recently. Miyasto also conveyed that the workshop was attended by the Regional Development Planning Agency (Bappeda), Central Statistics Agency (BPS), and the Center for Research and Community Outreach (LPPM) of the higher educational institutions from provinces throughout Indonesia with a total of 76 participants.

The purposes of convening the workshop were, first, to review and validate the national resilience measurement systems and public policies which had been developed by Lemhannas RI. Second, to address the issues of national resilience in the provinces. Third, to analyze strategic issues in the provinces. Fourth, to

formulate public policy recommendations in order to overcome strategic issues.

In his speech, Boy Salamuddin conveyed his high appreciation to the participants, who came from provinces across Indonesia, and were actively involved in the workshop. He said, "The existence of the National Resilience Measurement Laboratory heavily depends on your contributions. We, in Lemhannas RI, sincerely hope that each province can help support us in terms of data provision in order to produce more in-depth analysis."

Revitalizing School Curriculum for Character Development

Located at Kresna Room, 4th Floor of Astagatra Building on Thursday (2/10), the Office of the the Deputy for Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI, through the Directorate of Socio-culture Studies organized a Roundtable Discussion raising the theme "Revitalizing Curriculum of International Schools to Improve National Characters in the Context of National Resilience."

The growing concern over the condition of national character nowadays has created an urgency to improve the national character which will implement Pancasila values in the life of society, nation and state. Given the conditions, Lemhannas RI, in accordance with its duties in the field of strategic studies, carried out a study on the issue and recommend suggestions and efforts in a comprehensive, integral, holistic and systemic way in order to realize a prosperous and dignified society in the future.

In his keynote speech read by Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Air Marshal Dede Rusamsi S.E., Governor of Lemhannas RI explained the importance of character education as a part of national identity, so that the restructuring of education is needed in order to develop Pancasila-based citizens.

"I hope that this morning's roundtable discussion will contribute to relevant stakeholders, improving and building the ideal system of national education which is in line with

Eid al-Adha 1435 H Celebrations in Lemhannas RI

Celebrating the Eid al-Adha 1435 H, Lemhannas RI slaughtered sacrificial animals in the area besides the Sudirman Mosque, Lemhannas RI, on Monday (6/10). The event was begun with the reporting by the Organizing Committee Chairman Colonel Kes Saefullah, S.E., M.Sc., which was later continued with the reading of the Governor of Lemhannas RI's speech by Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Air Marshal Dede Rusamsi, SE.

In the event which was witnessed by entire officials of Lemhannas RI, the Perista management board and Lemhannas RI Alumni Association (IKAL), Dede Rusamsi conveyed that the Feast of the Sacrifice, which was held annually, was not just a form of social solidarity towards the people in need, but also a manifestation of piety to Allah Almighty.

This year, Lemhannas RI received sacrificial animals from IKAL members, alumni and PPRA participants, as well as from the

officials and members of Lemhannas RI with a total of 16 cows and 14 goats. The meat from the sacrifice was given to enlisted men, and civil groups class I and II of Lemhannas RI and the people living around the neighborhood.

Mental Revolution as New Paradigm in Achieving National Goals



Public Relations Bureau of Lemhannas RI conducted a talk show on Metro TV on Thursday (2/10), raising the theme “The Roles of Lemhannas and Mental Revolution”. Since the birth of the reform era in 1998 until now, there have been a lot of excesses, either negative or positive, in the process of achieving national goals. However, the country could not just stop the process which has been going on for more than ten years; what is needed is taking some corrective actions to implement a new and more humane paradigm.

According to Professional Expert in National Vigilance of Lemhannas RI Major General (Ret.) Dr. I Putu Sastra Wingarta M.Sc., the findings of Lemhannas RI’s National Resilience Measurement Laboratory revealed that the aspect of national life, especially in the field of ideology and socio-culture, got “yellow rapport.”

The national resilience is measured on a scale of 1 to 5. “A score of 5 indicates a very robust national resilience, while currently we only reach a scale of 2.4. So it needs to be improved urgently. The prominent indicator is tolerance. It is revealed that the rate of intolerance is currently very high. Therefore, we need to address human resources issues in the context of national character,” said Putu Sastra.

Sharing the views of Putu Sastra, lecturer of Faculty of Law from the University of Indonesia Dr. Agus Brotosusilo added that this nation needed to review the reform process. He further said that the country was left behind because of the excess of reform, which was just not

positive, but also negative. “The reform process might have been on the right track, but it might have gone in the wrong direction. Therefore, some breakthrough is needed,” said Agus Broto.

The breakthrough being raised during the event which was moderated by Chandra Dewi was Mental Revolution program. The concept was introduced by the next elected president to restore the direction of the reform so that it stays in the right direction. The role of Lemhannas RI in supporting the Mental Revolution program is quite needed.

Furthermore, Agus said that the intolerance problem is related to the nature of tolerance and identity. According to him, this nation has yet to reach the goal of the proclamation, which is to create a just and prosperous society. “The nation’s ideology has currently been tainted by liberalism”, he continued.

“It may start from the bureaucracy, but actually the mental revolution is needed by all Indonesian citizens. In this context, tevolution is not to be interpreted as a violent action, but rather as something related to mentality and character. So we do not just call on the leaders only, but also the people,” affirmed Agus.

Putu Sastra added that the efforts to change the character and mentality of the Indonesian people could not just be left to Lemhannas RI alone, but rather it was a shared responsibility among all national components. However, Lemhannas RI could serve as the leading institution for mental revolution. “We need the participation of all parties in order to make this big job (Mental Revolution) successful,” said Putu Sastra.

Inauguration and Swearing-in Ceremony of Echelons I, II, III and IV Officials

In October, Lemhannas RI again held an inauguration and swearing-in ceremony for senior lecturers, senior analysts, echelons I, II, III and IV officials on Thursday (9/10). Acting as the leader of the ceremony, Governor of Lemhannas RI inaugurated 11 general-level officers from the military and two general-level officers from the police as well as 6 officials of echelon III and IV who were posted in Lemhannas RI.
