Teaching Methods on National Character

Strategic Role of Teachers and Education Personnel in Instilling National Values

Educators are the key factors and strategically potential in promulgating national positive values to all nation's components," said Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A when opening a Refresher Course on National Character Teaching Method at Dwi Warna Building Lemhannas RI, Jakarta, Monday (16/3).

Furthermore, he continued saying "by joining this program, the participants are expected to improve their skills in utilizing the latest information technology and in delivering an interesting presentation by exercising verbal and non-verbal communication methods. They were also expected to play a multifactor role of national values in a persuasive manner while enhancing their sensitivity in choosing the right teaching methods based on the circumstances of the situation.

The refresher course was attended by 50 participants, consisting of 27 senior lectures, senior analysts and professional experts; 21 echelon I, II and III officials from Deputy Office for the Strengthening of National Values and 2 echelon II officials from the Deputy Office for the Education of National-Level Leaders.

The 3-day course, which was held from March 16th to 18th, 2015, was a part of a series of upgrading program aiming at improving the capabilities of the educators so that they could improve their roles and contributions in overcoming national problems.

The participants were provided with materials on teaching strategies for adults, teaching with heart, effective presentation by using information and technology tools, national character teaching methods, and etc.

The opening ceremony was attended by Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Vice Admiral Didit Herdiawan, M.P.A., M.B.A., Principal Secretary of Lemhannas RI Police Commissioner-General Drs. Lemhannas RI Governor Stresses on The Importance of Planning, Controlling and Evaluation of Work Program

On his speech during a flag-raising ceremony on the March 17th, 2005, Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A emphasized on the importance of planning, controlling and evaluation of work programs by work units in Lemhannas RI in a careful manner by closely adhering to the procedure.

“Those things need to be carried out considering the highly dynamic national strategic environment as well as the huge expectation that the people place on Lemhannas roles and performance. On the other hand, nearing the second quarter of the 2015 budget year, which coincides with the celebration of the 50th golden anniversary of Lemhannas RI, we are faced with a lot of dynamic activities that require our earnest attention,” said Budi Susilo Soepandji.

Furthermore, he continued saying that based on the summary of the budget utilization report of Lemhannas RI as of 13 March 2015, the institution’s budget utilization had only reached 4.63% of the total indicative budget ceiling for Lemhannas RI for the year 2015, which of course needed further evaluation.

“We have to learn from our past experiences in previous years that

the low budget utilization by the end of each quarter will later affect the budget utilization for the subsequent quarter. It is realized though that until today, Lemhannas RI is still waiting for the endorsement of Lemhannas RI’s work programs and budgets (RKAKL) concerning the revised 2015 state budget (APBN-P).

However, we have to do our best not to let this situation hinder us to carry out our programs and activities as scheduled in accordance with Lemhannas RI’s indicative budget ceiling. Therefore, all heads of work units in Lemhannas RI should make a careful evaluation to improve budget utilization in their respective work units,” said Budi Susilo Soepandji.

Information Event on Civil Servants' Wealth Report

Head of Accountability Policy Formulation Preparation from the Administrative and Bureaucratic Reform Ministry Ananda Juarsa asserted that the ministry would not hesitate to impose administrative sanctions on officials of echelon III, IV, and V as well as the military or police officers posted in civil government institutions if they were found to have unusual amount of wealth, which were not included on their wealth report.

"We will impose sanctions on civil servants who do not fulfill their obligations. If they were found to have unreported wealth, their positions will be reviewed and their appointment would be revoked. However, we will ensure the confidentiality of those wealth reports", said Ananda Juarsa at the event held at Gajah Mada Auditorium, Pancagatra Building, 3rd Fl., Jakarta, Monday (30/3).

The requirement for Civil Servants to submit their Wealth Report is aimed at developing civil servants who have integrity, honesty, trustworthiness, and ability to set an example for others. It is also expected to prevent or decrease the practices of corruption, collusion and nepotism while at the same time improving public trust.

According to Ananda, the civil servants' wealth report itself was regulated in the Regulation of the Minister of the Administrative and Bureaucratic Reform No. 1 of 2015 on the Evaluation Guidelines of Public Services Performance and it was one of the criteria in the assessment of Integrity Zone and Bureaucratic Reform Index.

With the enactment of the ministerial regulation, any officials of echelon III, IV, and V as well as military and police officers posted in civil government institutions are required to fill out the Civil Servants' Wealth Report forms through a Si-Harka application available on www.menpan.go.id. Furthermore, Ananda added that the inspectorate would monitor and verify the submitted wealth reports.

The event was also attended by Inspector of Lemhannas RI Police Brigadier-General Drs. Lutfi Lubihanto, Deputies, Directors, Chiefs of Bureaus and structural officials of Lemhannas RI.

Lemhannas RI Holds Information Event on “Corruption Free Area” and “Clean and Serving Bureaucracy” in Governmental Institutions



Principal Secretary of Lemhannas RI Police Commissioner-General Drs. Suhardi Alius, M.H, during an Information Event on Corruption Free Area (WBK) and Clean and Serving Bureaucracy Area (WBBM) conveyed that there were three main targets of the Regulation of the Minister of Administrative Reform and Bureaucratic Reform No. 52/2014 on Administrative Reform and Bureaucratic Reform on the Guidance of Development of Integrity Zone toward the Establishment of Corruption Free Area and Clean and Serving Bureaucracy Area in governmental institutions.

Those three main targets, he continued, were: first, the improvement in organizational capacity and accountability; second, clean government which was free from corruption, collusion and nepotism; and the last one was the improvement in public services.

“The implementation of Good Governance principles is something that we can no longer delay or postpone. All programs and activities should be accountable according to government service systems and standards, including public services. Doing so will improve public confidence in government apparatus and the development can be carried out as planned,” said Suhardi Alius at the event which was moderated by the Chief of General Affairs Bureau of Lemhannas RI Police Chief Commissioner Budi Setiadi, S.H, M.Si.. The event featured

two resource persons, namely Chief of Planning Bureau of the Ministry of Administrative Reform and Bureaucratic Reform Didit Noordiatmoko, Ak, M.M. and acting Director for Education and Community Services of the Corruption Eradication Commission (KPK) Guntur Kusmeiyanto in Gajah Mada Auditorium, Pancagatra Building, 3rd Floor, Lemhannas RI, Jakarta, Monday (6/4).

During the event, which was attended by senior lecturers senior analysts and professional experts as well as echelon officials of Lemhannas RI, Didit Noordiatmoko, Ak, M.M. stressed the importance of development of Integrity Zone toward the establishment of Corruption Free Area and Clean and Serving Bureaucracy Area.

“The Integrity Zone is a recognition given to governmental institutions whose leaders and staff members were committed to achieve Corruption Free Area and Clean and Serving Bureaucracy Area through bureaucratic reform, especially in corruption prevention and improvement in public services quality,” he said.

Meanwhile, in his explanation, Guntur Kusmeiyanto conveyed that civil servants or government officials played strategic roles in anti-corruption programs through their respective duties and functions in order to achieve good governance. “Public confidence in law enforcers, leaders or government officials and civil servants are diminishing, so this concern has become our priority,” Guntur Kusmeiyanto affirmed.

Grand Desain of Indonesia's Maritime Strategy

Lemhannas RI has three functions, which are to run educational programs for leadership cadres, conduct conceptual and strategic studies and strengthen national values. "With regard to the second function, we are going to discuss ways to develop Indonesia's maritime grand design," said Deputy for Strategic Studies Prof. Dr. Ir. Djagal Wiseso Marsono, M. Agr. in his opening remarks during a Roundtable Discussion themed "Developing's Indonesia's Maritime Grand Design amidst the World's Shifting Geopolitical Landscape for National Resilience" held in Gatot Kaca Room, Astagatra Building, 3rd Floor, Lemhannas RI, Jakarta, Wednesday (8/4).

The event moderated by Senior Analyst in National Archipelagic Outlook (Wawasan Nusantara) Rear Admiral Ari Sadewo, S.E. featured three resource persons, namely Deputy of Maritime Sovereignty from the Coordinating Ministry of Maritime Affairs Arif Hasfar Ugroseno, Expert Staff of Maritime Spatial Planning from the National Development Planning Board Dr. Ir. Arifin Rudiyanto, M.Sc., and Director of Sea Transport and Traffics of the Directorate General of Sea Transportation Ir. Budiarto.

In his presentation Arif Hasfar Ugroseno elaborated that Indonesia had to be alert and kept watching the dynamics taking place abroad when developing its maritime grand strategy, such as

the growing domination of China in Asia which was seeking greater strategic control over the Indian Ocean.

"The strategy to seek control over Indian Ocean was implemented by exerting control over Malacca Strait and Indonesian Archipelagic Sea Lanes (ALKI)," he explained.

Meanwhile, according to Arifin Rudiyanto, Indonesia, as a maritime country, needed to fully utilize its sea regions in order to develop its geopolitical power, military, economy and maritime power. "And all those things need to be backed up by political will, good strategies and adequate legal basis," he asserted.

In response to the issues, Senior Analyst in National Management System Rear Admiral Untung Suropati said that strong leadership, economic modernization and defense system were needed in order to protect Indonesia's natural riches.

Therefore, Head of Sub-directorate Division of Transnational Crime Prevention of the Directorate General of Multilateral Affairs from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs Faizal Cherysidharta affirmed that illegal fishing regulation needed to be followed up and the perpetrators be charged with criminal acts, instead of mere administrative sanctions.

Coffee Morning: Introducing Indonesia's Scenario 2045



Lemhannas RI, held a Coffee Morning of the top echelons of Lemhannas RI with the editors-in-chief of print and electronic media in order to introduce “Indonesia’s Scenario 2045” in Nusantara Room, Trigatra Building, Lemhannas RI, Jakarta, Thursday (9/4).

At the event, a study team from Lemhannas RI delivered a presentation on Indonesia’s Scenario 2045, which predicted the opportunities and challenges of development to be faced by Indonesia amidst the possible circumstances of situation by 2045. All those possible circumstances were explained using qualitative and inductive methods.

As explained by the study team consisting of Professional Expert in International Relations and National Vigilance Air Vice Marshal (Ret.) Syahrul Ansory, Senior Lecturer in Economy Prof. Dr. H. Didin S. D., S.E., Ms, D.E.A., and Dr. Timotius, the “Indonesia Scenario 2045” employed four approaches, which were water scenario, river scenario, archipelagic scenario and waterfall scenario.

According to Panutan, the water scenario was defined as a condition which indicated Indonesia’s new generation by the year 2045 who would have a different point of view from the previous generations due to technological development and their integrative functional interests that are considered to be more important than politics.

Meanwhile, the river scenario was explained by Timotius as something related to a more inclusive economic development. On the other hand, Syahrul Anshori elaborated that the archipelagic scenario indicated the people’s deteriorating nationalism spirit due to their ignorance of their own history and also due to the shift in people’s interests.

Didin S. Damanhuri stated that waterfall scenario concerned with the utilization of resources and all of its potentials, especially food, energy and water.

In his opening remarks, Lemhannas RI Governor Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A conveyed that the coffee morning was held nearing the 50th golden Anniversary of Lemhannas RI. Marking its 50th anniversary, Lemhannas RI will make some improvement and carry out assessment of the dynamic environment in order to solve the problems being faced by the country.

“In order to develop Lemhannas into a world class institution, a media center is set to be established in order to receive inputs, and in turn strengthen Lemhannas’ vision and mission in the future,” said Budi Susilo Soepandji.

International Conference on Terrorism and Deradicalization



Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, DEA opened an International Conference on Terrorism and Deradicalization between Lemhannas RI and the French Embassy at Syailendra Room, 3rd Floor, Astagatra Building, Lemhannas RI, on Monday (13/4).

According to Budi Susilo Soepandji, terrorism issues, nowadays, had grabbed the world's attention. Therefore, in order to prevent and eradicate any acts of terrorism, Indonesia had to cooperate with other countries, either bilaterally or multilaterally. "Indonesia has a strong commitment to eradicating terrorism," he affirmed.

The conference moderated by Professional Expert in Natural Resources Prof. Dr. Ir. Dadan Umar Daihani, DEA, featured five resource persons, namely Former High Ranking Official of French Police Commissaire Divisionnaire from the Ministry of Interior Patrick Ballardur, Former Head of French Division Nationale Anti Terrorist Roger Marion, Subject Matter Specialist on Deradicalization over The World Roseline Davido, Senior Expert in Psychology from the University of Indonesia Prof. Dr. Sarlito Wirawan, Former Head of National Police's Anti Terror Squad Detachment 88 Police Inspector-General Drs. HM. Tito Karnavian, MA, Ph.D.

Patrick Ballardur put forth that the phenomenon of terrorism, either separatism, state terrorism or faith-related acts of terrorism, were extremely complicated issues. "I think it is very important for us to have special well-armed forces to confront those terrorists," expressed Patrick.

Meanwhile, according to Roger Marion, although acts of terrorism were committed by different kinds of groups, they all shared three similar distinctive characteristics, such as the violence was committed against special targets, the attacks were intended to pressure the

governments and the attacks were intended to gain media attention.

Roseline Davido, who developed a projective test called Childhood Hand that Disturbs (ChaD), said that the ChaD test could be used to examine the underlying reasons or motives behind the acts of terrorism through images. "Each element of the CHaD addresses itself by a subject who hears what he wants to hear," Roseline explained.

She went on to say that the test demonstrated that some ex-terrorists had experienced an abusive family environment while growing up or they had experienced bullying from their environment.

Whereas Prof. Dr. Sarlito and his team planned to develop a deradicalization program, however, it was not intended to go as far as changing one's ideology. Meanwhile, Police Inspector-General Drs. HM. Tito Karnavian, MA, Ph.D elaborated on the four requirements to fulfill in order to eradicate terrorism, namely intelligence (detection) capability, scientific investigation, measuring power and strong rule of law.

The conference, which was preceded by a courtesy call of the First Counselor of the French Embassy in Jakarta Stephane Baumgarth to the Governor of Lemhannas RI, was a follow-up to the previous cooperation initiative between Lemhannas RI and the French Embassy in Indonesia.

The event was also attended by Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Vice Admiral Didit Herdiawan, MPA, MBA, top echelon officials from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Coordinating Ministry of Political, Legal and Security Affairs, Police's Anti Terror Squad Detachment 88, the National Counter Terrorism Agency (BNPT), Senior Lecturers, Senior Analysts and Professional Experts of Lemhannas RI.
