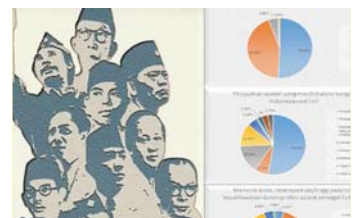

President Joko Widodo Briefs Lemhannas RI's PPRA LIV and LV Participants

President Joko Widodo gave a briefing to the group of participants of Lemhannas RI's PPRA LIV and LV who were led by Lemhannas RI Governor Lt. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo on Wednesday (2/11) at the State Palace, Jakarta.

At the beginning of the event, Lemhannas RI Governor reported to the President Joko Widodo on the backgrounds and statistics of the briefing participants, who consisted of 107 people of PPRA LIV alumni, and 103 active participants of PPRA LV.

All of the participants have followed a series of educational activities in Lemhannas RI, such as Domestic Strategic Studies (SSDN), Foreign Strategic Studies (SSLN), National Management System Simulation, Individual Working Paper (Taskap) and National Seminar.

The event was later continued with a presentation of the result of the National Seminar already conducted by the participants of

PPRA LIV and LV. In the first session, the representative of PPRA LIV Alumni Rear Admiral Oktavian delivered a presentation on tourism in Indonesia, while the second session was represented by PPRA LV participant Sempa Ari Sitepu who gave a presentation on Indonesia's energy sovereignty.

After the presentation, the event was continued with a briefing by President Joko Widodo, who addressed the issues of global competition for energy, food and water that Indonesia would have to deal with immediately.

If Indonesia, as the largest country in ASEAN, is unable to handle the challenges well, it will negatively affect the other ASEAN countries.

On the other hand, Indonesia will become a reference of the other countries, especially within the region of ASEAN, if it manages to respond to those challenges successfully.

"It will be our strengths, our potentials, if we can manage it. Otherwise, it would be a problem if we do not prepare ourselves

from now on", said Joko Widodo.

In the economic sector, there would be an issue of commodity price reduction. All these times, he said, Indonesia still focused on selling its natural resources and raw materials abroad, ignoring the importance of enhancing its production tools and downstream operations.

Furthermore, Joko Widodo also explained Indonesia's Competitiveness Index on ASEAN and global scale which was still far from the targeted level.

"It was a challenge that Indonesia should deal with in the future. The key lies in quality human resources. That is the key", affirmed Joko Widodo.

Indonesia, he continued, actually was not lacking compared to other countries in terms of quality human resources. However, there were other related issues that needed to be addressed too, namely political culture, economic culture and legal culture.

Another challenge that Indonesia needs to address is the large number of its population, despite of the reduction of population growth rates in 2016.

Indonesia needs to speed up the development of infrastructure in several parts of Indonesia and in border areas in order to catch up with other regions or areas.

The country is currently also improving its big and small airports and ports. With improved infrastructure and inter-island connectivity, Joko Widodo hoped that Indonesia would be better compete with other countries.

"We are now building a solid foundation of infrastructure. It may not be easy for us to do this right now, but it is fine, we will do it. I am sure that later in the future we will reap the benefits of all this development program", explained Joko Widodo.

At the end of the briefing, he also affirmed that his administration would carry out deregulation and, slowly but surely, develop tourism program.

The briefing event, which was later ended with a group photo taking session, was attended by Cabinet Secretary Pramono Anung, Coordinating Minister for Political, Legal and Security Affairs Wiranto, TNI's Chief of General Staff Vice Adm. Didit Herdiawan, M.P.A., M.B.A., and Police Deputy Chief Police Commissioner General Syafruddin.

National Management Course (NMC) Delegation Visits Lemhannas RI

A delegation of the Pakistan's National Management Course (NMC) led by Iram Adnan visited Lemhannas RI on Wednesday (2/11). The visiting delegation was received by Chief of Cooperation Bureau Brig. Gen. Ivan Ronald Pelealu, S.E. and Professional Expert in Diplomacy and International Relations Air Vice Marshal (Ret.) along with other Lemhannas RI officials at Gatot Kaca Room, Astagatra Building.

The NMC is an educational course held the Pakistan's National Management College which aims at building the capacity of senior officers of the federal and provincial civil services, friendly countries, armed forces and senior executives from the private sector in order to understand factors bearing on formulation and implementation of public policy, with a view to preparing them for assignments at national policy level.

The National Management College itself is a part of the Pakistan's National School of Public Policy (NSPP), which is an institution for education and training of civil servants in Pakistan.

The NMC delegation visited Lemhannas RI with a purpose to have a detailed briefing on Indonesia's history of social economy and security.

As the first presenter, Professional Expert in Economic Affairs Dr. Panutan S., SE, MT, Ak. shared a lesson learned from the Indonesia's economic history, particularly the development of the country's economy from the era of the struggle for independence until the post-independence era. "Unfortunately, after the independence, Indonesia was more focused on social political issues to the detriment of its economic development", he said.

From 1967 onwards, he continued, the economic situation was getting better despite of the country's dependence on commodities such as oil, wood, coals, and crude palm oil. There were lessons that could be learned from the history of Indonesia's economy in terms of three aspects, namely geography, economic openness, and institutional aspect.

The next session was filled with a presentation by Professional Expert in Diplomacy and International Relations of Lemhannas RI Ambassador Sebastianus Sumarsono, S.I.P. who highlighted the issues of Indonesia's security.

He elaborated on the history of Indonesia's security from the era of the struggle for independence until the establishment of the Indonesian National Military. "The struggle for Indonesia's independence was not only fought using physical force, but also through politics.

He further explained the roles of the Indonesia military in 5 (five) periods of Indonesia's post-independence, which were 1945-1950 period, 1950-1959 period, 1959-1966 period, 1966-1998 period, and 1998-present period.

The discussion was later ended with a sharing session regarding the organizing of educational course programs in both Lemhannas RI and NMC.

The event was also attended by Senior Lecturer in International Relations of Lemhannas RI Maj. Gen. Asrobudi, Director of Defence and Security Study of Lemhannas RI Air Commander Ade Dian Suryacandra, M.Sc. and other structural officials of Lemhannas RI.

Closing of the Regular Educational Course Program (PPRA) LV of Lemhannas RI

Lemhannas RI Governor Lt. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo officially closed the Regular Educational Course Program (PPRA) LV of Lemhannas RI for the year 2016 at Dwiwarna Purwa Room, Lemhannas RI on Wednesday (9/11). The event was attended by Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Air Marshal Bagus Puruhito, Deputy for Education Rear Admiral Dedy Yulianto, TNI's Chief of General Staff Vice Adm. Didit Herdiawan, former Governors of Lemhannas RI Ermaya Suradinata and Muladi, General Chairman of IKAL General (Ret.) Agum Gumelar, Secretary General of the National Resilience Council (Wantannas), Human Resources and General Affairs Director of the the Healthcare and Social Security Agency (BPJS Kesehatan), Defence Attaché of Papua New Guinea for Indonesia, and Defence Attaché of Timor Leste.

The closing event was begun with an oration by the 16th Indonesian Minister of Foreign Affairs Dr. Nur Hassan Wirajuda regarding the regional order and survival of a nation state.

He elaborated on the fact that globalization was inevitable and it had made countries increasingly dependent on each other. The technological advancement had also made the world become a small village with the borders being broken down between countries, or countries becoming borderless.

The globalization, he continued, could benefit Indonesia and at the same time posed new challenges to the country. Therefore,

Indonesia needed to strengthen its foreign and domestic (intermestic) factors.

Furthermore, the benefits of globalization could be gained by improving the country's competitiveness and innovation. If globalization was not dealt with properly, it would just put people further at a disadvantage.

Hassan Wirajuda further elaborated that the globalization had currently led to regionalism in various areas, such as through the establishment of economic organization involving several countries, or a trade commission which represented the interests of European countries.

Nowadays, no countries could opt out of the globalization, and therefore, Indonesia, had opened itself up to cooperate with other countries.

At the end of this oration, Hassan Wirajuda conveyed his expectations for Lemhannas RI to not only conduct studies on national resilience at the national level, but also in the context of globalization. He further hoped that the briefing that he provided would benefit the PPRA LV participants.

Lemhannas RI Governor, in his closing speech, conveyed that after completing the educational course in Lemhannas RI, the participants were expected to become statesmen who were reliable in solving strategic issues at the national, regional and international

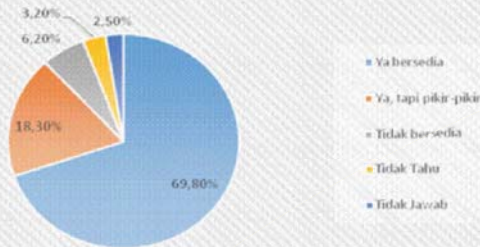
levels. He further added that when they returned to their institutions, they should be able to find solutions to any problems arose in their work environment.

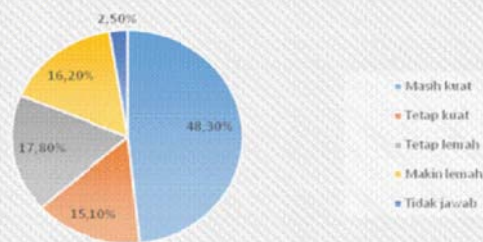

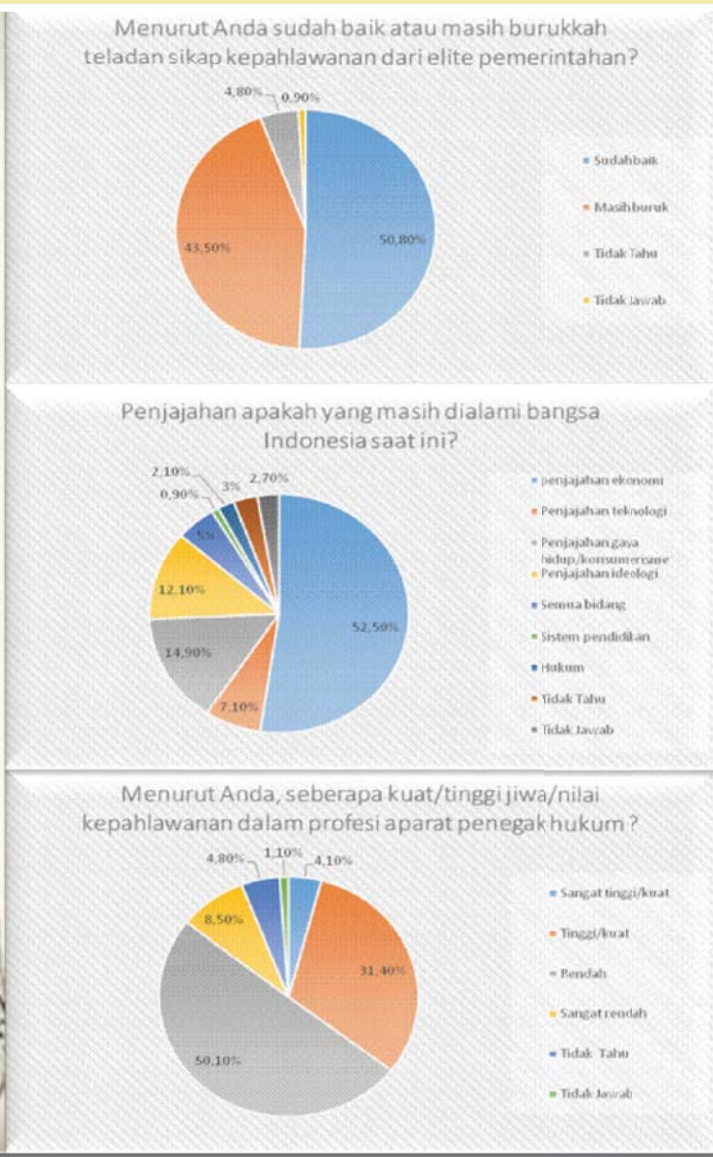

Lemhannas RI Carries Out Public Opinion Poll on Heroic Values

In the commemoration of the Heroes Day on 10 November 2016, Lemhannas RI carried out a public opinion poll on heroic values. The purpose of the poll is to assess the level of heroic values in the society amidst the nation's modernization and progress. It is indisputable that people need to keep alive the spirit of heroism while allowing the inward spiritual transformation to manifest itself in outward actions.

Based on the results of the opinion polls carried out by Lemhannas RI from October 22 to 24, 2016 there was a continuing deterioration in the spirit of heroism in the society as well as in public trust toward the political and government elites. On the other hand, there were also some concerns about the "new colonialism" in the areas of economy that continued to erode the country's sovereignty and economic self-reliance.



The weak heroism is also found in legal enforcers and political elites as indicated by 50.1% respondents, demonstrating the fact that the behaviors of legal enforcers still fall below public expectations.

However, on the other hand, it is also discovered that the people are now becoming more determined to report any criminal acts. 48% respondents said that they would not hesitate to report any violations of law to the enforces, i.e. corruption, drugs, crimes.

Unlike the deteriorated spirit of heroism in legal enforcers and political elites, the opposite result was shown when it comes to the determination to report any family members/relatives involved in corruptions to the authorities as indicated by 69.8% respondents. 50.8% respondents still considered the government elites as role models, which basically showed that the image of heroism in government elite in the eyes of the people was still relatively good. They still acknowledged the government's performance and work culture.

Furthermore, the opinion poll also revealed that 52.2% out of 437 respondents in 12 provinces believed that there was a modern form of colonialism today in Indonesia that manifested itself through economic domination by foreign entities or countries. 14.9% respondents also stated that the modern colonialism manifested itself in the form of lifestyle domination/consumerism, while 12.1% respondents considered Indonesia to be under the influence of ideological colonialism.

Based on the data from Lemhannas RI National Resilience Laboratory (Labkurtannas RI), there was deterioration of ideological resilience in 12 provinces in the year 2015 compared to the previous year in 2014. This only serves further to remind us to be more cautious in our daily life.

Therefore, based on the results of the opinion polls carried out by the National Resilience Institute of RI, there needs to be a more intensive role from the State in nurturing heroic values to all components of the society through a method well suited to the current times.

According the opinion poll results, there are some basic variables being measured, such as patriotism, nationalism, willingness to sacrifice, courage to defend what is right and to report any violations of law to the legal enforcers. All those variables serve to reflect the nature and values of heroism in the society today.

In general, the poll revealed the low level of heroic values assessed in political elites and parliament members as indicated by 46.2% respondents. Besides that, there is also a low level of heroic values in society as indicated by 50.6% respondents.

Lemhannas RI Commemorates Heroes Day

“**T**he spirit of heroism is the spirit of unity, an absolute unity, without excluding anyone or any groups in the society. It is what formed and established our country”, explained Minister of Social Affairs in her speech read by the Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Air Marshal Bagus Puruhito, S.E., M.M. when presiding over a ceremony to commemorate the Heroes Day on Thursday (10/11).

In her speech, the Minister of Social Affairs stated that every era had its own challenges. Therefore, in every era, we had to develop a heroic response specific to each era. After Indonesia seized its independence, the spirit of heroism should not be manifested in defensive patriotism only, but also in a more positive and progressive one.

Furthermore, in a bid to establish the life of the nation which is based on freedom, unity, sovereignty, justice and prosperity, the progressive patriotism should be aimed at strengthening national resilience so that the country will be independent in regard to its economy, sovereign in its politics, and distinct in its cultural character.

In line with the three noble goals (Trisakti), explained Minister of Social Affairs, the President Jokowi-Vice President H.M. Jusuf Kalla

government had offered a transformative vision, which was the realization of Indonesia as a sovereign independent country with a cultural character based on mutual assistance.

In an effort to achieve the vision, nine priority agenda (nawa cita) has been formulated, which can be categorized into three domains, mental-cultural, material (economy) and political.

Furthermore, one of the agenda of Nawa Cita, mental revolution, is expected to push for a new movement in life reform, such as in mindset, work culture, lifestyle, so that any obstacles to progress and advancement of a nation could be overcome. It is the kind of progressive patriotism that we must encourage in responding to challenges in our national development today.

The commemoration of the 2016 National Heroes Day is not only aimed at honoring the sacrifice of our heroes, but it is also expected to promote the spirit of nationalism, nurture heroic values and strengthen the love of homeland in the context of the unitary state of the Republic of Indonesia.

The ceremony held at the central courtyard of Lemhannas RI was attended by structural officials of Lemhannas RI, faculty members and entire staff of Lemhannas RI.
