# Entrepreneurs' Organization Join Strengthening of Nationalistic Values Program

# High Commissioner of Human Rights of United Nations visits Lemhannas RI

**H**igh Commissioner of Human Rights of United Nations (UN) Dr. Zeid Ra'ad Al Hussein visited Lemhannas RI on Tuesday (6/2) and was welcomed by Governor of Lemhannas RI Lt. Gen. (ret) Agus Widjojo. The visit was continued with a Courtesy Call in Executive Guest Room, Trigatra Building, 1st Floor, Lemhannas RI.

Dr. Zeid said during the Courtesy Call that one of the big challenges for UN in the past 70 years is the unsolved reconciliation problem in post-conflict countries such as what occurred in Mozambique and Lebanon. Dr. Zeid also conveyed that the post-conflict countries also suffered from difficulties in dealing with their past and solve the issues related to their internal conflict in the

past. Dr. Zeid expected Lemhannas RI can help to give its point of view in solving such problems.

In response to this, Agus Widjojo said that to deal with the past, countries that have experienced a dispute will face the memory of the past that still lingers. Solutions for reconciliation with their past will also differ from one country to another due to cultural influences so it will require

different approaches to achieve national reconciliation. "I believe there is a cultural influence in reconciliation so every country needs a different approach

to deal with the past," Agus Widjojo explained.

The Courtesy Call was continued with further discussion about national reconciliation issues for post-conflict countries. Also attended the Courtesy Call was Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Air Marshal Bagus Puruhito, Principal Secretary Commissioner General of Police Drs. Arif Wachyunadi and

## KPK hold e-LHKPN information event in Lemhannas RI

**C**orruption Eradication Commission (KPK) held an information event related to electronic wealth reporting (e-LHKPN) in Syailendra Room, Astagatra Building, Lemhannas RI on Thursday (15/2). This event was followed by Lemhannas RI Officials and was officially opened by Chief of General Affairs of Lemhannas RI Brig. Gen. of Police Drs. Triyono Basuki Pujono, M.Si. Triyono said that this information event means to inform LHKPN procedure to all Lemhannas RI Officials. "This event is important due to our responsibility as stated in KPK regulation Number 6 of 2016 related to LHKPN registration, announcement and examination," Triyono said.

The information event material delivered directly by the Head of Registration and Inspection of LHKPN of KPK Kunto Ariawan, Kunto Ariawan informed the audience the steps and rules of reporting assets. Reporting assets is intended to be one of the actions to prevent corruption, legal basis. There is also new reporting mechanism called e-LKHPN.

"There are things that drives corrupt behaviour; Need, Opportunity, Exposure and Greed," Kunto said. In this case, every state apparatus must report his or her wealth to prevent corruption. The wealth report must be in accordance with the applicable condition, in the right time supported with complete data.

The legal basis related the wealth report are Law No.28 of 1999 on the administration of a clean and Corruption, Collusion, and Nepotism-free state, KPK Decree Number 07 / KPK / 2/2005 on the way of registration, announcement and inspection of LHKPN and Law No. 30 of 2002 on Commission for Corruption Eradication.

The mechanism used in e-LHKPN means to ease the wealth report process due to its electronic-based system so it accessible through website [www.elhkpn.kpk.go.id](http://www.elhkpn.kpk.go.id) which make the data inputted by state apparatus automatically saved in KPK server. ●

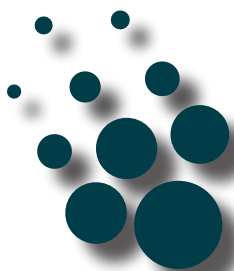

# Minister of Religious Affairs talk about religious tolerance



**M**inister of Religious Affairs Lukman Hakim Saifudin had the opportunity to give a lecture in front of all participants of the Strengthening of Nationalistic Values Program (Taplai) for Entrepreneurs' Organization (EO) in Lemhannas RI, on Wednesday afternoon (7/2). The material delivered in the class is about religious tolerance in Indonesia.

On the occasion, Lukman said that human beings as religious people who recognize differences in beliefs among citizens, should be more tolerant. "We should not have the authority to declare that I am right and the other (beliefs) are wrong," Lukman explained.

Lukman also said that the religion pluralities exist among us is not supposed to make our society judge a religion is better than another. "Because something so perfect comes from God Almighty, then it is interpreted by human beings. Do not compare one religion with another religion because each of it has diversity," Lukman said.

Lukman went on to say that the key to tolerance is to be humble, to respect, and to appreciate differences. "It is the beginning so we can be more tolerate," Lukman said. Religion, Lukman continued, becomes a very significant factor in maintaining the plurality of society in order to maintain the integrity of the nation and state.

In addition to tolerance and humility in religion, religion essentially aims to humanize human beings in order to maintain human dignity. "All religions teach

justice, respect, and protect human rights equality before the law," Lukman added.

Religion cannot be separated from politics. "Religion and politics should not be separated because we are not a secular nation. Characteristic of the secular state is they separate the issues of life with religion. They can be separated expressly and it does not matter you want to be religious or not," Lukman said.

Lukman advised the participants of the program not to abuse religion for a certain negative interest.●

## Yudi Latif: Pancasila makes Indonesia as a world miniature

**I**ndonesia can be seen as world miniature since world diversity is available in Indonesia which symbolized by the Five Principles of Pancasila,” Head of the Presidential Working Unit on the Implementation of the State Ideology of Pancasila (UKP-PIP), Yudi Latif, stated in his speech in front of the participants of Strengthening of Nationalistic Values Program (Taplai) for Entrepreneurs’ Organization (EO), on Wednesday (7/1) morning in Lemhannas RI.

“The Five Principles of Pancasila describe Indonesia as the multiculturalism heterogeneity of this nation,” Yudi Latif said. Yudi explained that Pancasila becomes an inspiration in not only individual achievement but a joint achievement. However, the problems faced this nation today tend to create individual achievements, and it is difficult to change it into networking achievements. “Our problem is when the personal achievements must be connected into a collective force,” Yudi Latif explained.

Yudi Latif then gave a brief description of the meaning of the Five Principles of Pancasila to the participants, as in the First Principle that implies

Indonesia as a multi-religious nation according to Article 29 of the 1945 Constitution, which states that the State guarantees the freedom of every citizen to choose their beliefs. Then, the Second Principle implies a pluralistic population based on the human race. While the Third Principle describes this nation as a diverse nation but at the same time aware of the existence of links of unity. The Fourth Principle that explains about political parties’ diversities and their flow, as well as the Fifth Principle which describes pluralism in terms of social class.

According to Yudi, to disseminate Pancasila in daily life, it is important to understand five strategic issues, such as understanding Pancasila, social inclusion, social justice, institutionalization of Pancasila, and Pancasila exemplary.●



# KemenPAN-RB Team evaluates Lemhannas RI performance accountability



**O**n Friday (9/1), Lemhannas RI welcomed the arrival of the Ministry of State Apparatus Empowerment and Bureaucratic Reform (KemenPAN-RB) Team in order to attend the Evaluation of Performance Accountability and Bureaucratic Reform meeting. The meeting held in Nusantara II Room, Gd.Trigatra Lemhannas RI, was led by Inspector of Lemhannas RI Brig. Gen. Drs. Immanuel Larosa representing the Principal Secretary of Lemhannas RI. Chairman of the KemenPAN-RB Team Ronald Andrea Annas who attended as the main speaker explained the importance of performance evaluation in Lemhannas.

Some important points presented by Ronald Andrea in his explanation include the need for change management by preparing a bureaucratic reform roadmap,

having a quick win associated to the regular education curriculum of PPRa, as well as making the National Resilience Measurement Laboratory (Labkurtannas) which can be used as benchmarking or comparison and data center for other agencies, and the last is appointing agent of change.

While recommendations that can be used is to continue to internalize work culture continuously throughout the organization, and increase the role of agent of change as a driver of bureaucratic reform in each working unit. Furthermore, Ronald explained about the legislation. According to him, the laws and regulations that are not harmonious should be processed through identification, analysis, and revision, having SOP related to the preparation of the Governor Regulation and keep continuing to make improvements to the preparation of legal products.

In addition, Ronald Andrea also emphasized that it is necessary to organize and strengthen the organization by completing the ongoing reorganization process and ensuring that the reorganization is also able to establish good performance measures. Regarding the strengthening of supervision, Lemhannas needs to conduct periodic monitoring and evaluation for handling existing supervisory policies, conduct development program for echelon 1 units to be submitted as working units towards WBK and WBBM and enhance the capabilities of the Government Internal Supervisory Apparatus or APIP (in this case, the Inspectorate).●



# Morning Roll Call : Capacity Building and Quick Response Upgrade through Academic Sharing

**G**overnor of Lemhannas RI Lt. Gen. (ret) Agus Widjojo accompanied by Deputy Governor and Principal Secretary attended Sharing Academic Forum (FBI) held in the Kresna Room, Astagatra Building, Lemhannas RI, on Monday morning (12/2). The event was held in order to discuss the establishment of Academic Sharing (FBI) which aims at improving intellectual capacity building of Lemhannas RI officials. In addition, this forum was formed to provide a forum of discourse for the formulation of solving real national problems that require short to medium term solutions.

"An institution must adjust to current development to maintain institution's regeneration. Regeneration can be considered through age and also qualitative dimensions if it is still relevant," Agus Widjojo said to the participants of sharing academy consisting of Lemhannas RI's Faculty Members.

The establishment of the Academic Sharing is expected to break the deadlock in the problems faced by our society and nation. In addition, the expected outcome of this forum is to contribute to the development of the nation and contribute to expedite the implementation of government functions. The expected additional outcomes or objectives through this forum are to generate quick response, as well as

a means of collecting materials in the study bank to complete the publication needs outside and within Lemhannas.

According to Professional Expert of Natural Resources and National Resilience of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Dadan Umar Daihani, D.E.A., the establishment of such forum is very appropriate to improve the knowledge of its members. However, Prof. Dadan assumed that to combine between improving capacity building and quick response will not be easy. "If we talk about improving capacity building, it can be both scheduled and thematic. Meanwhile, quick response is unstructured, unscheduled, and we do not know the theme. These two things are very difficult to combine," Prof. Dadan said.

Agus Widjojo then said that these two things should not be considered rigidly, but quick response should be more focused on. "Maybe we should not be too strict to solve between these two things. It can be one, and what we prioritize is a quick response to respond to the current situation," Agus Widjojo said. ●
