### Lemhannas RI Holds Seminar on Increasing Public Political Awareness Before the 2019 Election



emhannas RI held a seminar for Regular Education Program Batch (PPRA) 58 with the theme "Public Political Awareness as a Democracy Maturity Measurement" at the Dwiwarna Purwa Room, Lemhannas RI, on Monday (10/22).

The seminar entitled "Increasing Public Political Awareness to Succeed the 2019 Election" was opened by the Governor of Lemhannas RI, Lt. Gen. (Ret) Agus Widjojo, which was marked by gong beating.

In his remarks, the Governor of Lemhannas RI Lt. Gen. (ret.) Agus Widjojo said that the success of this seminar was an indicator of participants ability to absorb and understand various materials while enrolling their education in Lemhannas.

"The participants are expected to be able to express their knowledge in the form of strategic temporary results of the seminar by using their full, comprehensive and integrated abilities, especially in increasing public political awareness in order to succeed in the 2019 election," Agus Widjojo said.

According to Agus, the current public political awareness has not been optimal. "This can be seen from indicators of society involvement in the electoral process, involvement in pluralism and

respect for civil rights," Agus Widjojo said.

Indonesia's democracy index, Agus continued, based on data from The Economist Intelligence Unitt in 2017 is in the 68th position with score 6.39. Although the data from Indonesia's Center Statistic Agency (BPS RI) in 2017 reaches 72.11, the improvement in the process of democracy and pluralism, political participation, and civil liberties are necessary.

"I hope the results of the seminar that you will formulate in accordance with the suggestions and input from the seminar participants contain careful analysis based on real data that produces collective recommendations and includes new things. So that it can be beneficial in increasing public political awareness in order to succeed in the 2019 election, "he hoped.

The seminar which was attended by participants from various components of society, such as the Indonesian Military-Police, Institutions and community organizations, presented several competent speakers including, Chairman of DKPP Hardjono, Secretary General of the National Democratic Party (NasDem) Johny G Plate, Prof. Muhlis Hamdi, and Dr. Gun Gun Heryanto.

epeating the success of the 2017 Jakarta Geopolitical Forum, Lemhannas RI held the 2018 Jakarta Geopolitical Forum at The Ritz-Carlton Hotel, Jakarta, on Wednesday (24/10). The theme raised this year is "Mapping the Future of Geopolitics" with discussions on security and global peace, economy and development, as well as humanitarian issues.

The Governor of Lemhannas RI Lt. Gen. (ret.) Agus Widjojo at the press conference said that the Jakarta Geopolitical Forum (JGF) was a sharing session for world-class geopolitical experts in examining the regional situation in the world. The purpose of 2018 JGF, Agus Widjojo continued, is to provide opportunities for geopolitical practitioners, professionals and academics to exchange their ideas and views on the geopolitical future.

This year's JGF background was influenced by Chinese initiation with Belt and Road Initiatives (BRI), a trade war between the US and China and the weakening of the European Union which was marked by the release of Great Britain (Brexit). Agus Widjojo expressed his hope for the implementation of 2018 JGF "Hopefully the results of this discussion can have an impact on national and regional resilience in all regions of the world", Agus Widjojo said.

The 2018 JGF was held in three sessions by presenting seven speakers from around the world. The first session in the JGF was opened with The Geopolitical Overview delivered by Professor Dorodjatun Kuntjoro Jakti and continued the second session which discussed the Political Economic and Global Peace And Security I by presenting three speakers namely Lyle J. Morris (Rand Corporation / United States), Dr. Philippe Raggi (L'Orcadémie de géopolitique international / France), and Zhixing Zhang (Geopolitical Department - Asia Pacific at Stratfor / China).

The third session itself continued the second session which discussed the Political Economic & Global Peace and Security II. The speakers presented were Shigehisa Kasahara (UNCTAD / Japan), Natalie Sambhi, Ph.D. (Strategic and Defense Studies Center, Australian National University / Australia), Dr. Pang, Zhongying (Renmin University of China / China), and Kevin G. Nealer (CSIS / United States).

Indonesian Minister of Foreign Affairs H.E. Retno Marsudi also attended the 2018 JGF to give a welcoming remarks in front of 450 participants from ministries / institutions, academics, economists, national and international politics.



### Vice President of the Republic of Indonesia Jusuf Kalla Gives Lecture to PPRA 57 Alumni and PPRA 58 Participants

ocated at the Vice President's Palace on Thursday (25/10), Vice President of the Republic of Indonesia Drs. Jusuf Kalla gave lecture to PPRA (Regular Education Program Batch) 57 Alumni and PPRA 58 Participants. In the lecture, PPRA 58 participants also presented their seminar results as the final assignment of the educational program undertaken at Lemhannas RI.

In his report, Governor of Lemhannas RI Lt. Gen. (Ret) Agus Widjojo said that PPRA 57 and PPRA 58 lasted for seven months. PPRA 57 itself, Agus Widjojo explained, was completed on September 20, 2018 while PPRA 58 will be closed on October 30.

In addition, Agus Widjojo also reported that PPRA 57 and PPRA 58 was followed by 100 people each consisting of elected officials at echelon II / III level from the military, police, ministry, government agency, attorney general's office, legislature, political parties, community organizations, and several participants from friendly countries. At the end of his report, Agus Widjojo hoped that this lecture could be beneficial for the alumni and the education participants.

Jusuf Kalla said that there were many changes in the world including in Indonesia such as the occurrence of the Brexit incident and the election of Donald Trump as president of the United States. These facts, according to Jusuf Kalla, encouraged many people to focus more on domestic strength due the the negative effect of the globalization. Jusuf Kalla also stated that at this time the world was no longer controlled by politics but economy.

"We see now that we depend on big technologies like Apple, Microsoft, Twitter, Google. Then trading platform like Amazon, Alibaba. An extraordinary changes then exist. The communist state became economic liberal. The big change apparently also has an impact on increasing national enthusiasm, "Jusuf Kalla explained.

Jusuf Kalla also stressed the importance of improving the quality of human resources, especially in the field of technology because life can no longer be separated from technology, including in the political field. The current election for example, Jusuf Kalla explained, prioritizes the campaigns through social media.

In addition, Jusuf Kalla argues that the democratic system is not the best system, but it is considered better than other government systems. "Democracy is not a good system, but others are no better," Jusuf Kalla stated.

Regarding the upcoming 2019 election, Jusuf Kalla is optimistic that it will run well and smoothly compared to the previous years' elections due to the ideological similarities of the parties involved in the elections, nationalist-religious. However, Jusuf Kalla continued, the 2019 election must also be prepared carefully because it is carried out simultaneously.

In the public lecture, PPRA 57 alumni and PPRA 58 participants presentated their the seminar results which Jusuf Kalla considered those result as important recommendation for the government. The lecture was then followed by a question and answer session and closed with a group photo session.

The Governor of Lemhannas RI, Lt. Gen. (Ret) Agus Widjojo as the ceremony leader who read the remarks of the Minister of Youth and Sports of the Republic of Indonesia, said that the mental revolution launched by the President Ir. emhannas RI held a workshop on action plans for the Prevention and Eradication of the Misuse and Illicit Circulation of Narcotics and Narcotics Precursors (P4GN) on Monday (29/10) in Airlangga Room, Lemhannas RI. Present as speakers were the head of the National Narcotics Bureau of National Narcotics Agency (BNN RI) Emma Suryaning Tyas and Head of Evalap Subdivission Bentonius Silitonga, S.E., M.M., M.Sc.

The Head of Budget Planning, Marine Colonel (S) Trismawan Djonisajoko, S.E., M.M., representing the Head of the Planning and Finance Bureau of Lemhannas RI opened the event. "According to the tasks and functions of the Planning and Finance Bureau, the purpose of this event is to provide understanding, especially in the field of planning and event objectives of the P4GN action plan to all work units within Lemhannas RI," Trismawan said.

Based on the Instruction of the President of the Republic of Indonesia Number 6 of 2018, it is explained that each ministry / institution is required to participate in implementing efforts to prevent the eradication of illicit trafficking in narcotics and narcotics precursors (P4GN).

Trismawan also expressed the hope of Chief of Planning and Finan Bureau so that in this event all Lemhannas' work units could work together to implement the P4GN action plan so the Presindet's mandate in Presidential Instruction Number 6 of 2018 could be

emhannas RI held another Field Coaches Training as one of a series of Making Indonesia 4.0 Programs in the Constitution Room, Third Floor, Trigatra Building, Lemhannas RI, on Wednesday (31/10). The training held for 3 days is the last Training Coaches Program before the closing of Making Indonesia 4.0 on December 3, 2018.

Senior Learning Facilitator, Frans Sugiarta explained about how to form a Healthy Team by combining 4 generations such as the baby boomers generation, generation Y, generation X and generation Z.



Frans described that the Healthy Team consisted of Movers, Followers, Opposite, and Bystanders. Movers, Frans explained, are giving ideas to the team. Followers in the team play their role by in enriching the ideas. While Opposite, Frans continued, was in charge to challenge the idea. Whereas Bystanders have a role to place ideas and enrich perspectives.

Frans then explained that it is usually the baby boomers who act as Movers. However, now, Movers must be played by generation Z. This is because the generation Z has many new views and ideas.

Baby boomers generation, Frans continued, must provide the opportunity for generation Z to act as Movers. "For the past 10 years, the way baby boomers have done had been very good. But what if it is applied to the current situation? The baby boomers must provide the opportunity for generation Z to give their ideas and innovations," Frans explained.

In addition, Frans said that to form a Healthy Team, these 4 roles should be balanced. This balance is not the equation of the number of people but the balance of the contribution of each part.

The training was then followed by a discussion of improvements that must be made to several government ministries / institutions based on McKinsey's 7S as a basis for assessment.

#### **Lemhannas RI Wins an Award from KIP**

ocated at the Vice President's Palace, Lemhannas RI won an award from the Central Information Commission (KIP) at the 2018 Public Information Transparency Award. Head of the Protocol Subdivision Lemhannas RI, Marine Colonel (P) Eddy Tarjono representing Lemhannas RI to receive the awards directly from KIP Chairperson Gede Narayana witnessed by Vice President Jusuf Kalla on Monday (5/10).

The award was one of the KIP's task in monitoring and evaluating public information transparency to determine the implementation of Law Number 14 of 2008 concerning Public Information Transparency in public agencies (ministries / agencies, provincial governments, state universities, state-owned-enterprises, and political parties), so that the purpose of optimizing the duties and functions of the Information and Documentation Management Officer as the frontline in conducting excellent public information services to public can be well implemented

In his report to the Vice President, the Head of KIP said that the public agency participation rate seen from the return of the questionnaire in 2018 had increased, to be exact from 460 (four hundred and sixty) Public Agencies, there are 289 who returned the questionnaire or 62.83%.

Broadly speaking, Gede Narayana continued, it must be underlined that public information transparency in Indonesia is still far from the goal mandated by the KIP Law, because there are still many public agencies that have not implemented the KIP Law.

"This is our responsibility, by emphasizing the need for greater encouragement to make information transparency a culture to achieve good and clean governance. Moreover, we also realize that the Information Commission must echo the culture of public information transparency that must be supported by the government's commitment. However, on the other hand it can be seen clearly this year, the Public Agency's efforts to improve itself and it should be highly appreciated, "Gede Narayana explained.

While the Vice President on the occasion reminded the importance of information transparency in the public sector which is the main requirement for running a democratic government, safeguarding human rights and increasing public participation in supporting the government and the public institutions work programs.

KIP which monitors and evaluates public agencies has assessed and determined public agencies into 5 qualifications, namely informative, towards informative, quite informative, less informative and not informative. Lemhannas RI together with 5 other non-ministerial government institutions get quite informative qualification.

For Lemhannas RI, this achievement can be a motivation, especially for Lemhannas RI PPID in carrying out the mandate of Law Number 14 of 2008 concerning KIP to carry out better public information management and services.

#### Indonesia's Potential as a World Maritime Fulcrum

overnor of Lemhannas RI Lt. Gen. (Ret) Agus Widjojo attended a seminar called "The 2<sup>nd</sup> Germany-Indonesia Strategic Dialogue Center for Strategic and International Studies" organized by the Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS) and Konrad Adenauer Stiftung (KAS). The seminar with the big theme "Enforcement of Maritime Law: The Experience of Indonesia in Safeguarding Indonesian Waters" was held at the CSIS Auditorium, Tanah Abang, Jakarta, on Tuesday (6/11).

In the seminar, Agus Widjojo, as the Keynote Speaker, explained about Indonesia's potential in the world maritime fulcrum. Agus Widjojo also said that Indonesia is a country located between two continents and oceans that makes Indonesia a large, strong and prosperous maritime country.

To become a strong maritime country, Agus Widjojo explained, Indonesia must continue to manage and utilize its marine wealth and space by understanding various types of Indonesian sea, recognizing and respecting international rights over Indonesian waters, able to eradicate illegal practices and prevent all forms of violation of law in Indonesian territorial waters, able to establish and manage maritime borders with neighboring countries and maintain common security, and be able to maintain the safety of shipping through Indonesian waters.

Agus Widjojo then said that Indonesia currently ranks as the third largest country in terms of fishery products under China and India. But on the other hand, Indonesia cannot yet be said to have good maritime potential because there is no maximum utilization of marine potential.

In addition, Agus Widjojo also explained about some challenges Indonesia must face as the world's maritime axis. "Indonesia faces several challenges as a global maritime axis, such as in geography, demography, and maritime infrastructure," Agus Widjojo said.

On the other hand, according to Agus Widjojo, Indonesia has a lot of maritime potential if Indonesia build port and sea transportation to be more modern and easy to use by the society, maximizes the potential of marine biota as the largest archipelagic country, potential in the economic field, and potential in the oil field, marine gas and minerals.

At the end of his presentation, Agus Widjojo said that with all aspects owned by Indonesia, the challenge of making Indonesia as the world's maritime axis is very possible to be realized, and with cooperation with Germany, the maritime sector of the two countries is expected to be stronger. "With the potential of the two countries, it is expected to maintain maritime resilience and sovereignty, by utilizing maritime natural resources for the country," Agus Widjojo said.

In the seminar that presented several competent speakers, there were four discussion sessions that discussed four different topics,

namely a discussion of the rule-based approach to maritime security in the first session, the relationship between technological innovation, cyber security, and maritime security in the second session, challenges and opportunities in the South China Sea in the third session, and the need for close cooperation in responding to maritime security challenges in the last session.

With the potential of the two countries, it is expected to maintain maritime resilience and sovereignty, by utilizing maritime natural resources for the country.

While Yitno Pringgowijoyo, S.H, M.H, who led the UPY visit, in his remarks delivered that the visit were part of Field Work (KKL) that must be taken by fifth semester students.

In addition, Yitno said that UPY was already quite familiar with Lemhannas. "For us Lemhannas is a familiar institution. We feel Lemhannas is a close institution with UPY. We hope that the

material given today will be beneficial to the students so they can relate what they already got in the class with the material given here," Yitno said.

The visit was then continued with the explanation of the Effect of the World's Great Ideology on Nation and Country Culture by Kisnu Haryo, SH, MA. At the beginning of the material, Kisnu said that national insight was intended for two things, first, in order to build national identity because its values come from four national basic consensus and second, build a system from the center to the regions that must be obeyed by the society.

Then Kisnu Haryo explained further about the four national basic consensus, specifically concerning the first consensus that is the Pancasila ideology with its flexibility. "In real life we cannot escape the influence of the great ideology in the world. Theoretically, the growth and development of an ideology has reality and idealism dimensions.

Where the values of reality dimension grows gradually with the community and is believed and becomes the guidance of people's lives while the idealism dimension is the result of human thought / reflection and implemented in the real life of the community," Kisnu Haryo explained.

s a development form of educators and lecturers professionalism in educating, guiding, evaluating, and following up on the teaching and learning process on campus, UNS sent 110 people divided into five groups to participate in the Strengthening of National Values Programs and Leadership Training at Lemhannas RI on November 12 to 19, 2018.
