Malaysian Defense Attache visits Lemhannas RI

Validity test on the Scenario of Indonesia 2045

After launching the “Scenario of Indonesia 2045” in 2016, the writing team is now reporting back to the Governor of Lemhannas RI on Monday (7/10), in the Kresna Room, Lemhannas RI.

The report aims to review whether the scenarios published in 2016 are still valid or it probably require some updates and changes in accordance with the current dynamics in the community.

“This is as a socialization within the working group responsible for the implementation of the working group’s work,” Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret) Agus Widjojo said.

Agus also advised that the most basic thing was to equalize the perception regarding the definition of scenario planning. According to him, by having the same understanding, it will lead to equal roles to enrich the direction of working group task completion.

“The 2045 Scenario is what is likely to happen in 2045. It is neither a vision nor a plan,” Professional Expert for Domestic Government Drs. Edijan Tanjung, M.Sc. as the moderator.

Edijan further explained that the main actors in the 2045 scenario are bureaucrats, politicians, business people, community leaders and academics who are considered to represent the system that is moving and become a resource in the preparation of scenarios.

Furthermore, Professional Expert for Economics and Strategy of Lemhannas RI Dr. Panutan Sakti Sulendrakusuma, S.E., M.T., Akt., explained that the 2045 scenario that Lemhannas RI had been compiled since 2015 will be validated now in 2019 after being reviewed.

“This opportunity is used to report and at the same time discuss the objectives of the validity test,” Panutan said. He further explained that what Lemhannas

RI did was an external scenario, namely a description of various possibilities in the future. Therefore, the keywords in the 2045 scenario compiled by Lemhannas RI are “possibly happen”.

Lemhannas RI holds capacity enhancement for lecturers to improve the quality of education

Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo opened the Capacity Building for faculty members which was attended by 120 participants on Monday (28/10), in the NKRI Room, Lemhannas RI

The activity aims to equalize perceptions and deepen the understanding of individual scientific writing for lecturers which consist of Professional Experts, Senior Lecturers, Senior Analysts, and structural officials of Lemhannas RI.

"We must improve ourselves, explore and use our potential, stimulate creativity and activities that reflect changes in the teaching and learning process in accordance with current world developments," Agus said.

According to Agus, faculty members play

a strategic role in building the character of a leader who will takes part in the improvement of Human Resources (HR). Therefore, Faculty Members need to equate perceptions in guiding the participants.

Agus also considered that the development of science and technology is a challenge for faculty members because lecturers are required to keep up with the development of science and technology. The visit was aim to conduct a Courtesy Call on the Research on National Resilience that was being carried out by the Research Team of the Faculty of Psychology, Unpad.

The Research Team led by Professor of Faculty of Psychology, Dr. Zulrizka Iskandar, M.Sc. explained that the background of the research was their concern with the condition of the state.

"In 2014, there was a concern about the condition of the state sue to many conflicts happened at that time, the corruption increased and other various problems," Zulrizka said.

Therefore, Zulrizka along with the research team tried to make a diagnosis of about the condition of the state. The purpose of this research is to unite the state. "so we can be solid and will be able to

move forward together," Zulrizka explained.

In addition, this study also aims to prepare the next generation, therefore this study takes people age 15 to 35 years as the sample. Zulrizka explained that the it is a scientific based research. This research will diagnose problems in a region and find the solutions.

Responding to this matter, Agus Widjojo considerate whether this research can be implement well due to its broad scope. "The more extensive the research, the more difficult it is to reach its purpose," Agus said.

Then Agus explained that the biggest challenge of the research was to interpret the meaning of the data obtained. "What does the data mean? Why did the data occur? How to make the data better? Those are the challenges of doing a scientific based research," Agus said.

Agus also said that the research will be carried out should aim to educate and enlighten the nation to embrace the future. "I hope the research will result in concrete

findings and is useful for prepare the nation to face the future," Agus hoped.
