# Lemhannas RI conducts a fieldtrip enrich content of studies to East Kalimantan



**T**he Deputy Office of Strategic Studies Team led by the Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Air Marshal Wieko Syofyan Conducted a fieldtrip enrich content of studies to East Kalimantan which lasted for five days from Monday, March 9 to Friday, March 13, 2020.

the fieldtrip enrich content of studies aims to obtain real data and facts according to conditions on the site after holding a Focus Group Discussion (FGD) on "Revitalizing Sustainable Palm Oil Management Policies to Improve People's Welfare in the Context of National Resilience" at the end of February.

During the fieldtrip enrich content of studies, several FGDs

and hearings were held with various parties, including the FGD with the Governor of East Kalimantan Dr. Ir. H. Isran Noor, M. Si, the Regional Secretary of East Kalimantan and several regional apparatuses and other related organizations. The FGD was also carried out with the Assistant II of the District Secretary (Setkab) of Kutai Kartanegara H.M Sukhrawardi, the Heads of Services within the Kutai Kartanegara Regency, and other related organizations.

The election of the East Kalimantan as a locus of the fieldtrip enrich content of studies is based on the welfare factor and relatively large production of oil palm and the ongoing development of oil palm plantation. The East Kalimantan is also the sixth

largest oil palm center in Indonesia and has succeeded in improving the life of poor farmers. In addition, the province was chosen based on several considerations, namely the condition of national resilience which was adjusted to the title of the study by referring to the existing data and facts.

In addition to establishing East Kalimantan Province as the destination for fieldtrip enrich content of studies, North Sumatra Province is also become the destination for the fieldtrip. The reasons for choosing the North Sumatra Province, apart from being the second largest producer of oil palm in Indonesia, is it experienced many forest areas that turned into large-scale oil palm plantations, overlapping land issues, and environmental problems.

# Lemhannas RI implements e-Learning method to prevent the spread of COVID-19

Responding to the spread of Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) in Indonesia, Lemhannas RI continues the Regular Education Program Batch 60 (PPRA 60) through e-learning from Monday (23/3) until an unspecified time.

Implementing e-learning method is done by Lemhannas RI in preventing the spread of COVID-19 and also a form of Lemhannas RI's commitment to support government steps and prioritize mutual safety.

Lemhannas RI utilizes the development of information technology in implementing e-Learning method so that the learning process can run smoothly even though it is not conducted face-to-face. The implementation of e-Learning is done by the video conference method. During the video conferences, the lecturers could provide the material delivered through audio and visual directly to PPRA 60 participants.

The education programs organized by Lemhannas RI aims to prepare and strengthen the



cadres of national-level leaders who are able to think comprehensively, integrally, professionally, with national character, morals and ethics, and also understand the archipelago insight and having a universal point of view.

Therefore, all components in the implementation of Lemhannas RI's education program are always directed towards achieving the goals and objectives that had been outlined, and are required to have competitive advantages, comparability, strategic capabilities in anticipating and overcoming domestic crises and regional and international threats.

# Lemhannas RI holds COVID-19 Rapid Test for its officials

As one of the efforts in preventing the spread of COVID-19, Lemhannas RI conducted a COVID-19 Rapid Test for all Lemhannas RI's officials. The rapid test was carried out for more than two weeks starting on Monday (13/4) based on the schedule for each work unit written in the circular letter.

This Rapid Test, which is given by the DKI Jakarta Provincial Government, aims to find out the health conditions of Lemhannas RI's officials related to the COVID-19 pandemic so that Lemhannas RI's members who are stated positive after conducting a rapid test can be immediately referred to hospitals for further examination.

A few days before the implementation of the rapid test for all



officials of Lemhannas RI, the Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo had also taken a rapid test and the result came back negative.

In addition to the rapid test, Lemhannas RI has also carried out

some prevention of the spread of COVID-19 by spraying disinfectants into all buildings in Lemhannas RI and imposing Work from Home for most of Lemhannas RI's officials.

# Minister of Research and Technology gives lecture to PPRA 60 Participants

**M**inister of Research and Technology / Head of the National Research and Innovation Agency (Kemenristek / BRIN) Prof. Bambang Permadi Soemantri Brodjonegoro, Ph.D gave a lecture entitled "Good Governance, National Management Information System and Community Empowerment as Supporting Factors for National Management System" to the participants of the Regular Education Program Batch 60 (PPRA 60) through a conference call on Tuesday, (31/3).

Bambang gave an explanation of 5 presidential directives related to Indonesia's efforts to develop research and innovation that must be supported by excellent human resources and become the main topic of the Advanced Indonesia cabinet. The intended innovation is not only creating something new, but it must directly impacts Indonesia's economic competitiveness.

In addition, innovation is not merely about development, but also to solve equity issues. The equity issues are not only in economy, but also contributes to safeguard a more sustainable environment to encourage economic transformation.

To support this goal, one of the things to do is to integrate the research and development program that are currently exist in various ministries and institutions. According to Bambang, it is better if all the separate research and development programs can be integrated into the Ministry of Research and Technology / BRIN.

"However, we do not yet have a complete system of innovation which can be formed if there are three-strong-party-partnership called as triple helix," Bambang said. According to him, Triple helix is a partnership among researchers (academics), private sectors (business) as a party that utilizes research results,

and government that facilitates the innovation.

At the moment, the ecosystem is not going well because each party is still working independently and the government is not too intense to facilitate mutual understanding between the business sectors and the researchers. "Triple helix will continue to be the focus to strengthen the innovation system," Bambang said.

The Ministry of Research and Technology / BRIN also wants to make a greater contribution to the bureaucratic process in Indonesia so it is oriented towards the importance of bureaucratic reform instead of making new regulations "How to create a bureaucracy that can support innovation because only an innovative country can win the competition to be a developed country," Bambang concluded.

accordance with the applicable laws and regulations. The appointment will be followed up through a Governor of Lemhannas RI's Letter of Appointment regarding the appointment of the prime secretary's duties to a high ranking officer who will be determined by the Governor of Lemhannas RI.

# Lemhannas RI officially opens PPRA 61



In order to maintain physical distancing as an effort to prevent the spread of Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19), Lemhannas RI held the opening of the Regular Education Program Batch 61 (PPRA 61), on Thursday (2/4), through a conference call.

The Deputy for National-Level Leaders Education Maj. Gen. Karsiyanto in his report to the Governor of Lemhannas RI said that PPRA 61 will be held for seven months, starting Thursday, April 2, 2020 until Tuesday, October 20, 2020.

PPRA 61 was attended by a hundred participants from various backgrounds consisting of fifteen people from Ministries / Non-Ministry Government Institutions (LPNK), two people from Non-Structural Institutions, two people from State-Owned Enterprises, two people from Provincial Governments, one person from Public Figure, one person from Political Party, one person from Private University Coordinating Body (Kopertis), eight people from Community Organizations, forty people from The Indonesian Military, eighteen

people from the Indonesian police, and ten people from friendly countries namely Singapore, Myanmar, Laos, Malaysia, Sri Lanka, Saudi Arabia, Cambodia, Nigeria and Pakistan.

In the report, Karsiyanto also emphasized that the implementation of On-campus, Outbound activities, Overseas Strategic Studies (SSLN), Domestic Strategy Studies (SSDN), and National Management System Simulation were eliminated if the COVID-19 emergency conditions were still imposed by the Government.

"The opening ceremony today was held online with each participant in their respective places. This method is the most effective form of implementing the principle of preventing transmission, known as "work from home" and social or physical distancing," the Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo said.

Agus also said that this method was implemented for the first time, so many things would be learned during the process. Agus urged participants not to hesitate to mention any problems related to the e-learning process so

Lemhannas RI can help the participants to overcome the problems. "We all hope that this situation can get better, and we can return to the usual form of learning process in the class," Agus said.

Agus further said that as a cadre of national-level leaders, academic ability and having authority in the office were not enough to become national-level leaders. A national-level leader must have ethics, morals and honesty, which are other prerequisites that must be owned to form the character of a leader who has a mindset and attitude based on Indonesia's holistic, integral and comprehensive geopolitical and geostrategic views.

The teaching-learning process at Lemhannas RI does not aim to create competition among fellow participants. However, participants are given a challenge to compete with themselves and become an individual with better knowledge, analytical skills and excellent national insights after they finished their education program at Lemhannas RI. "We do not teach intelligence competitions among participants," Agus said.

# The Potential of the Indonesian Seas in the Industrial Revolution 4.0

**R**egular Education Program Batch 60 (PPRA 60), held a Panel Discussion with a topic "Managing Marine Potential into National Flagship Products in facing the Industrial Revolution 4.0" on Wednesday (8/4) using video conference application.

The Speakers at the panel discussion were the Minister of Maritime Affairs and Fisheries Edhy Prabowo, the Director General of Agro Industry of the Ministry of Industry Abdul Rochim, and the Head of the Human Resources Development Agency (BPSDM) of the Ministry of Home Affairs Teguh Setyabudi.

"The strategic position makes Indonesia blessed with natural resources potential on its very rich environment," the Minister of Maritime Affairs and Fisheries Edhy Prabowo said. Furthermore, Edhy explained that the total potential of Indonesia's marine and fisheries resources reached US \$ 1,338 billion / year, equivalent to five times the 2019 National Budget.

To maximize this potential, the Ministry of Maritime Affairs and Fisheries (KKP) developed strategies and policy directions for marine and fisheries development in accordance with President Joko Widodo's direction. The strategy is to improve communication with fishermen and optimize and strengthen aquaculture.

In line with Edhy, Director General of the Agro Industry of the Ministry of Industry Abdul Rochim explained the policy direction of strengthening the competitiveness of marine and fishery products. Some of the policies

undertaken are increasing business capacity through investment and access to finance, increasing the application of innovative processing and marketing technology by marine and fisheries businesses, and fostering the quality of small-, medium-, and large-scale fish processing businesses.

The Head of BPSDM of the Ministry of Home Affairs of the Republic of Indonesia Teguh Setyabudi said that the Industrial Revolution 4.0 raised people's demands on the government. Some of these demands are fast-paced services, cheap and efficient service costs, as well as accessible, accurate, easy, precise, transparent public information. Furthermore, Teguh said that in realize it, the collaboration of four development actors are very important.

The four actors in question are the Central Government with policies as well as the State Budget and other potentials, Regional Governments with its autonomy, OPD, regional budget and other potentials, Private Parties with all their potential, and Academics with all their potential. "to build something, we must need synergy and connectivity, and we must focus on programs and priority scale," Teguh said.

# The Governor of Lemhannas RI gives lecture to PPRA 61 Participants



**T**he Participants in the Regular Education Program Batch 61 (PPRA 61) of Lemhannas RI received a lecture from the Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo, on Thursday (9/4), through a video conference call to implement physical distancing as an effort to prevent the spread of Corona Virus Disease (COVID) -19.

During the lecture, Agus expressed his hope that the distance learning policy does not decrease the quality of PPRA 61, because the quality of education will be measured by how participants can take advantage of from the education they are enrolling in Lemhannas RI to enrich their knowledge. "Therefore, the active role of the participants is highly expected. Every participant's roles during the class session like being active will determine the quality of the graduates later," Agus said.

On this occasion, Agus explained the background of the establishment

of Lemhannas RI which was originally a National Defense Institute. Then Agus also explained Lemhannas core in carrying out their roles and functions known as Four National Basic Consensus consisting of Pancasila, the 1945 Constitution, the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia (NKRI) and Unity in Diversity as well as the National Paradigm consisting of Archipelago Insight, National Resilience, and National Vigilance.

"Becoming a leader is a lifelong process," Agus said. Agus further explained that Lemhannas RI is the final education for national-level leaders who had previously passed basic education, had fulfilled the requirements to occupy certain positions, and only needed the same paradigm of ways of thinking in dealing with national issues.

The biggest challenge faced is the ability to describe the legacy of concepts, ideas, and thoughts given by the predecessors. Moreover, the

struggle in the past was to seize and maintain the independence that is different from the current situation. Then it is necessary to find a form to implement the inheritance for the modern and democratic Indonesia.

According to Agus, a leader who is constitutionally prepared to formulate public policies, must have the knowledge to fill policies and have the competence to formulate policies. It would be a disadvantage if a public official only has the authority to formulate policies without the knowledge and competence to formulate them. "Knowledge and competence must be based on the basic consensus of the nation. Then the basic consensus of the nation must be kept until the end of our life," Agus said.

The lecture was not only attended by PPRA 61 participants, but was also attended by a number of Faculty Members and structural officials of Lemhannas RI.
