The education system in Indonesia needs a thorough assessment and review

Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo became one of the speakers for the Public Dialogue and Republik Forum Sahabat which raised the topic “Reflections on 75 Years: Republic and Us”, on Tuesday (25/8) virtually. According to Agus, we cannot analyze one aspect specifically, apart from other aspects, therefore one of the reflections of 75 years of independence is to realize that all aspects are one and influence each other.

Agus raised an example in the field of national resilience, there was an assumption that the source of [ib;ic welfare was in the economic aspect. But it turns out that the economy is determined by another aspect, such as health. The health aspect itself is also determined by the quality of the condition of each human being. It reflects that there are other factors outside the economy that affect the economy. “So we have to look at it comprehensively,” said Agus.

To see comprehensively, the relationship between one aspect and another needs to more attention,

especially on the quality of Human Resources (HR). “Any aspect that will be implemented and actualized by humans, we have to build and empower human resource first,” Agus said.

Then Agus conveyed that from the data released by various international institutions, it can be seen that Indonesia is still in an unsatisfactory position in the education sector. The next indicator is the result of the Programme For International Student Assessment (PISA) organized by the Organization for Economic Cooperation Development (OECD), which consists of 78 countries including 37 developed countries with a high human development index.

On the other hand, Agus views that character education is needed, especially in the midst of the complexities of globalization. Individual moral values is needed to maintain the consistency and commitment of an individual as social beings who is bound by social collectivism values in group bonds. “Character education must start from an early age,” Agus said.

The education system in Indonesia needs a thorough assessment and review,” Agus suggested. The assessment and review that is carried out not only look at technical aspects, but also other aspects such as the competence of teaching staff.

Agus said that on this matter, it was realized that it was undeniable that the influence of interrelation and sustainability had implications in the learning process. “This continuity line that we need to identify with a flashback from the history of 75 years of independence of what we have achieved, understand what we want to achieve and how we can achieve it by closing the deficiencies that we can identify during this journey.” Agus said.

Therefore, Agus said that it is necessary to formulate a road map in achieving human resource development as the basic to carry out development in all aspects of national and state life in order to meet the challenges of strategic environmental dynamics in the future.

Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo was the speaker in the Series 8 Opinion Webinar: Reflections on 75 Years of Indonesian Pluralism organized by the Research and Development Agency for Law and Human Rights (Balitbang Kumham) Ministry of Law and Human Rights, on Thursday (27/8) virtually.

On this occasion, Agus conveyed that pluralism is a nation's collective thinking built from the strength of unity in diversity.

Understanding the meaning of pluralism in the context of unity requires common views, attitudes, and thoughts. Agus also emphasized that there needs to be an awareness that as a nation, Indonesia needs unity.

Agus also linked pluralism to contemporary reality. According to Agus, the era of globalization does not always bring ease in achieving

solutions to national problems. Intense penetration of information that does not recognize regional boundaries is considered vulnerable in creating new problems that have a broad impact on national unity. Therefore, seeing pluralism in unity requires maturity in individuals as well as groups.

According to Agus, if the condition of national resilience is strong, pluralism should be able to be realized properly. "If the condition of national resilience is strong, pluralism should be well realized and used in overcoming threats, disturbances, obstacles and challenges," Agus said.

Agus explained that national resilience is a condition or outcome that is used to overcome threats, disturbances, obstacles and challenges in order to achieve national goals. National resilience, Agus explained, can be realized with ideological, economic, political, socio-cultural, defense

and security approaches, as well as geographic spatial elements through the circumstances of each province. If regional resilience in each aspect can reach a satisfactory level, then it can be assumed the national resilience has also reached a satisfactory level in a good situation. However, if there is one weak factor, it will affect the condition of national resilience.

Furthermore, Agus conveyed several thoughts in responding to the challenges of pluralism. According to Agus, the community's aspirations must be facilitated by forming a deliberation forum. Furthermore, Agus also suggested coaching various religious institutions and improving educational curriculum that include national culture, history and values. "Reactivating various activities containing the national values," Agus said.

Lemhannas RI and BIN strengthen cooperation



Prime Secretary of the State Intelligence Agency (BIN) Police Commissioner General Drs. Bambang Sunarwibowo, S. H., M.Hum. visited Lemhannas RI and received directly by the Governor of Lemhannas RI, Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo, on Friday, (28/8), in the Executive Guest Room of the Governor of Lemhannas RI.

During a visit that applied health protocols, the Principle Secretary of BIN was accompanied by several staff, namely the Governor of the State Intelligence College (STIN) Commodore Dr. Ivan Yulivan, M.M., SHRMP, M.Tr (Han), Head of the Research and Development Center (Kapuslitbang) of BIN Dr. Armi Susandi, MT, Head of Education and Training Center (Kapusdiklat) of BIN Brigadier General R. The visit aimed to strengthen the capacity for cooperation between the two agencies, especially cooperation related to the prediction of future national threats. "Lemhannas RI certainly has a more comprehensive database in this matter," Bambang said.

Furthermore, Bambang explained that the data owned by Lemhannas RI can enrich the national threat index compiled by BIN and create more specific and excellent national threat index. The index can later be used as a guide for agencies in working and maintaining Community Security and Order (Kamtibnas).

"We also hope that there can be cooperation related to improvements in education," Bambang said. In this case, Bambang conveyed the possibility that BIN's officials can be speaker and BIN

personnel can become educational participants in Lemhannas RI education program.

In addition, Bambang also conveyed the collaboration possibility in preparing studies so that it will improve the quality of data, analysis and study results. "This will definitely affect our performance, which in synergy between these institutions will be very important in the future," Bambang said.

According to Agus, Lemhannas RI is very open to further cooperation. The cooperation carried out is not only about mutually using the final results compiled, but from the discussion and preparation process as well.

"We are always open, especially related to the functions and roles of Lemhannas RI to participate in various educational programs at Lemhannas. We are always open to capacity building cooperation," Agus said.

need to have flexibility to adapt to the dynamics of change. “Current changes are so fast and so drastic. If we do business as usual, we can be left behind,” Agus said.

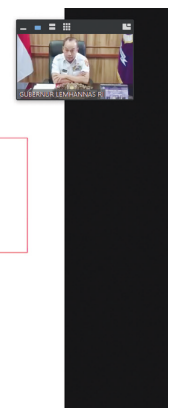

Rector of the Bandung Institute of Technology (ITB) Prof. Reini Wirahadikusumah MSCE, Ph.D., Head of the National Standardization Agency for Indonesia (BSN) Kukuh S. Achmad, and President Commissioner of PT. Len Rear Admiral (Ret.) Ir. Leonardi, M.Sc became a guest speaker at the panel discussion of the 61 Lemhannas RI Regular Education Program (PPRA), Wednesday (9/9), virtually.

Prof. Reini Wirahadikusumah in her presentation said that the development strategy that must be carried out is equal development of infrastructure and regional connectivity in Indonesia, the use of advanced technology to increase efficiency and productivity, and increase the quality of Human Resources and Science and Technology. "Improving the quality of human resources, especially in mastering science and technology is very much needed," Reini said.

Meanwhile, Kukuh explained

that the goal of standardization in downstreaming and innovation is the creation of more sophisticated, cheaper, safer, easy to use, and environmentally friendly product. The existence of a set standardization makes producers have a reference so that the goods or services produced can be accepted and used by the community.

The application of standardization can also support strategic transformation in increasing competitiveness. Standardization in Indonesia or better known as the Indonesian National Standard (SNI) was initially encouraged by the government, but currently, the application of SNI is in the process of becoming a public need and an industrial need as an boost for innovation.

Standardization due to mandatory enforcement of SNI is static, law enforcement-based, a minimum requirement, limited to the national market, and compliance-based. Meanwhile, standardization as a booster to innovate will be dynamic, based

on the development of science and technology, assessed by the public as a user, national based towards regional and global markets, based on the desire to prove suitability and gain trust.

Meanwhile, the President Commissioner of PT. Len Rear Admiral (Ret.) Ir. Leonardi, M.Sc. PT. Len Industri said that he had provided a number of fiber optics to increase bandwidth capacity which would support the optimization of the use of science and technology. It is also hoped that it will support the improvement of individual quality which will improve the quality of society.

Leo said that the importance of investing in research and triple helix partnerships. The triple helix partnership, namely among the government, the private sector, and academia is expected to absorb, understand, know, and master technology for future progress.

Agus Widjojo attended the inauguration of the establishment of the AB Susanto Center for the Internalization and Activation Center for National Service Management of the Jakarta Veteran National Development University (UPN VJ) and Book Review on National Service Management: A Modern Approach to Becoming a Great Nation by AB Susanto on Wednesday (9/9) at UPN VJ.

Reporting from upnvj.ac.id, Deputy Chief Editor of Kompas Daily, Tri Agung Kristanto, as the moderator, said the book emphasized that whatever is done and dedicated to the state can contribute to National Service. On page five of the book National Service Management, it is written "one form of refreshing the spirit of National Service is to expand the meaning of National Service". State

Defense is not only synonymous with the main weaponry defense system (alutsista) but it actually has a broader meaning.

One form of refreshing the spirit of national service is by expanding the meaning of national service itself. "If we look at national service, defending the country is not only related in defense or related to military interest. National Service is national interest," Agus said in his response.

According to Agus, the connotation of national service is synonymous with defense interests because the idea was born from the Ministry of Defense. So, communication and socialization that explains National Service with a proportional position in state administration functions as well as social, national and state life are needed.

"Actually, national service is a national interest, it should be born from

an a national level institute which is strategic and described according to its respective functions or to a functional agency," Agus said.

Therefore, Agus encourages the application and implementation of the idea of national service to be more balanced with the roles of non- military and non-police. According to Agus, the military and police can contribute to provide training in necessary fields such as training to build discipline.

However, a larger portion of the management of the organization is given to non-military and non-police institutions. Agus also conveyed the Ministerial Regulation issued by General (Ret.) Ryamizard Ryacudu, which stated that there were five elements of national service and only one was related to warrior competence, such as building initial capabilities for defense forces.

Governor of Lemhannas RI gives lecture to new students of UIN Syarif Hidayatullah

Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo gave lecture in the Introduction to Academic and Student Culture (PBAK) Academic Year 2020/202 of State Islamic University (UIN) Syarif Hidayatullah Jakarta. At the event with the theme "Together with UIN Syarif Hidayatullah Jakarta to Succeed in Studying and Working in Facing a New Era", Agus gave lecture on National Insights.

"If we talk about national insight, we need to understand what national insight means," Agus said starting his lecture. Agus conveyed that the national insight is a person's point of view regarding himself and his homeland as an archipelagic country and the attitude of Indonesia as a nation towards itself and the environment by prioritizing regional unity and integrity in the management of the nation, state and society life.

Agus emphasized the territorial unity and integrity considering Indonesia's geographical form which is an archipelago. In general, it is said that islands in an archipelagic country are separated by waters, but from the perspective of national insight, the waters will unite the islands and unify national values.

On this occasion, Agus conveyed that the national insight mandated all citizens to place unity and integrity and the interests of the nation above their own or group interests. The national insight develops Indonesian unity so that it can defend the Republic of Indonesia based on the principle of *Bhinneka Tunggal Ika* (Unity in Diversity). In addition, the national perspective also does not provide a place for rigid patriotism, which is patriotism with negative goals.

According to Agus, a united Indonesian state can create an



advanced, prosperous nation and equal to other nations in the world especially in the globalization where the boundaries among nations have faded away and competition between nations has become more open.

Therefore, the National Insight must always be based on Pancasila as the ideology of Indonesia and succeed in carrying out its mission amidst state life order in the world. "Only a nation that is ready in facing a competition will be able to become a great nation," Agus said.

Agus said that Indonesia as a nation was not determined by the composition of the majority and the minority. According to Agus, this is a very valuable value in the midst of diversity to maintain the survival of Indonesia. This value is not only strengthened by the national insight, but also through other national paradigms, such as archipelago insight and national resilience.

Socialization of Legal Awareness Development and Legislation related to **Covid-19 Control**



PENINGKATAN DISIPLIN DAN PENEGAKKAN HUKUM PROTOKOL KESEHATAN DALAM PENCEGAHAN COVID-19

Lemhannas RI held a Socialization of Law and Legislation Awareness Development related to the theme "Increasing Discipline and Law Enforcement of Health Protocols as Efforts to Control Covid-19" online, on Thursday (10/9) which presented Deputy for System and Strategy of BNPB Ir. Bernardus Wisnu Wijaya. M.Sc as a speaker.

Head of Legal and Cooperation Bureau of Lemhannas RI Commodore Budi Setiawan, S.T. in his remarks conveyed that currently, Covid-19 has spread to 34 provinces in Indonesia and has experienced a significant increase in the DKI Jakarta Province, which is the epicenter area with the highest confirmed cases of Covid-19. This, Budi Setiawan continued, was due to the density and mobility of the population and the low level of community discipline in implementing the Health protocol.

The number of confirmed patients with Covid-19, which is increasingly experiencing an increase become the urgency of the government in issuing

policies in the form of Presidential Instruction (Inpres) No. 6 of 2020 concerning Increased discipline and enforcement of Health protocol laws in the Prevention and Control of Covid-19. With this socialization, Budi Setiawan continued, it is hoped that it can provide understanding to the participants of the socialization and follow regulations related to increasing discipline and enforcement of health protocols.

In his presentation, Wisnu explained that the Government has issued Presidential Instruction Number 6 of 2020 to enforce discipline. However, these rules, said Wisnu, could not be fully applied under current threats and social conditions. It is because Indonesia is different from socialist countries such as China and Vietnam. In Indonesia, Wisnu continued, there

are more complex and interrelated problems, such as economic, social and it can develop into security issues.

"In Indonesia, all the problems are interrelated and cannot be resolved one by one. So we adjust the balance, when do we have to focus on the health factor and when will we focus on economic problems," Wisnu explained. In addition, the Government also issued Presidential Decree number 82 of 2020 which combines economic and health problems.

Wisnu explained that the BNPB's job is as monitoring and evaluation and reporting. Meanwhile, those who are in charge of socialization are the Ministry of Home Affairs and its staff to local governments.

Wisnu explained that since the beginning of the emergence of Covid-19 in Indonesia in March 2020, the government has issued various regulations to control Covid-19. Public compliance at that time was considered high and managed to slightly reduce the growth rate of the spread of Covid-19.

However, the deteriorating economic conditions led to an easing of economic activity which led to decreased compliance and resulted in an increase in current positive cases. Therefore, Wisnu explained, law enforcement efforts are deemed necessary in line with efforts to provide a means to carry out compliance.

In every presentation from the speaker, you must gain as much of the knowledge," Governor of Lemhannas RI, Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo said while giving lecture to the participants of the National Values and Outlook Training of Trainers (ToT), on Monday (14 / 9) virtually.

In this lecture, Agus said that the participants of the Training of Trainers (ToT) should get as much knowledge as possible during the activity, because this knowledge will be used when the participants return to their teaching duties. "It is also based on the duties of the participants who will be trainers, to provide participants with an understanding of the importance of the substance or material," Agus said.

According to Agus, if a trainer does not understand a substance or material it will be difficult for a trainer to provide an understanding to the training

participants. Therefore, all participants are encouraged to take the opportunity in the Training of Trainers (ToT) to be able to complete the knowledge needed by the trainer in continuing their duties.

Agus further explained that in delivering the material, the trainers had to determine the approach according to the students. Delivering materials to junior high school students, upper education students, and higher education students requires a different approach.

On this occasion, Agus also emphasized that the most important thing is how to convey the messages so that students can receive the message appropriately because this is an important part of a training. "There should be no deviation, no misinterpretation," Agus said.
