Lemhannas RI and DPR RI Commission I Discuss Lemhannas RI RKA for Fiscal Year 2021

Lemhannas RI and DPR RI Commission I Discuss Lemhannas RI RKA for Fiscal Year 2021



Lemhannas RI attended a Hearing Meeting (RDP) together with Commission I of the Indonesian House of Representative (DPR RI) on Monday (21/9), in Nusantara II Room which discussed the Lemhannas RI Work Plan and Budget (RKA) for Fiscal Year 2021.

Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo was accompanied by a number of Lemhannas officials, including Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Air Marshal Wiekto Syofyan, Prime Secretary of Lemhannas RI Police Commissioner Drs. Didid Widjanardi, S.H., along with other structural officials.

On this occasion, Agus explained the functions, duties, roles, and constitutional authority of Lemhannas RI, which were later elaborated in the RKA which was reflected in the budgeting process.

Agus stated that the basis of the duties and functions of Lemhannas RI

is the Presidential Decree Number 98 of 2016 on Lemhannas RI. "We are also in the process of compiling an academic paper to propose that the legal basis for Lemhannas RI, which is currently at the Presidential Decree level, can be upgraded to the statutory level", said the Governor of Lemhannas RI.

Furthermore, Agus also explained the task of Lemhannas RI. The first is to organize national-level leadership education which consists of Short Education Program (PPSA), Regular Education Program (PPRA), and the Strengthening Program for Regional Leader (P3DA). Second, carrying out the strengthening national values program through National Dialogue, Training for Trainers, and Strengthening National Values Program. Third, compiling a strategic study, both long and medium term studies, as well as a quick response. The fourth is to measure national resilience.

Then, Agus said that Lemhannas RI also supports government policies

in order to accelerate economic recovery and social reform in the midst of the Covid-19 pandemic, according to the allocated budget. "The work plan and budget of Lemhannas RI have been prepared in accordance with government policies and financial management regulations that lead to being effective, efficient, and supporting accelerated achievement of government programs," Agus said.

Commission I of DPR RI, led by Drs. Utut Adianto said that Commission I approved the budget allocation ceiling (definitive ceiling) of the 2021 Lemhannas RI budget allocation to Rp182,375,470 which is allocated for management relations programs and national defense development programs. "Furthermore, Commission I of DPR RI will convey to the DPR RI budget agency to followed up in accordance with statutory regulations," Utut said.

Lecture by the Governor of Lemhannas RI on Strengthening National Values Program via online



Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo gave lecture to 100 participants of the Online Strengthening National Values Program (Taplai) Batch I, on Tuesday, (22/9).

To the participants consisting of bureaucrats, academics, and community organizations from all over Indonesia, Agus explained that national resilience is the ability of a nation to be able to overcome threats, disturbances, obstacles and challenges and return to its original form as a whole society based on Pancasila in order to maintain integrity of the life of the nation and state.

Lemhannas RI itself concentrates on providing Four Basic Consensus of the Nation, namely Pancasila, the 1945 Constitution, the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia, Unity in Diversity, and implementing National Paradigm, namely Archipelago Outlook, National Resilience, and National Vigilance. In its journey, the Four Basic Consensus of the Nation and National Paradigm will always face threats, disturbances, obstacles and challenges. "Therefore we need to be vigilant, be prepared when facing these

threats, disturbances, obstacles and challenges," Agus said.

In addition, Agus also explained that national resilience is needed to overcome threats, disturbances, obstacles and challenges in order to achieve national goals. National resilience is a cumulative condition of the resilience of various elements, such as ideology, economic, politic, socio-culture, and defense and security as well as geographic, demographic, and natural resources.

If each element of national resilience is strong, it will produce a good condition of national resilience. So, it can be said that the science of national resilience is a combination of the disciplines of each element. "National resilience is not a single discipline," Agus said.

According to Agus, the disciplines of each element must be processed by making them concrete through the authority of officials to turn the theory of disciplines into policy. Policy formulating officers themselves must have knowledge and competence in formulating policies.

Therefore, Agus emphasized that every Lemhannas RI alumni is not expected to memorize the meaning of national resilience. However, each alumni is expected to have competence and consistent commitment to the Four Basic Consensus of the Nation. First, the alumni are expected to have reliable competence from a commitment to uphold the nation's ideology, Pancasila and are committed to implement it. Second, the alumni are expected to be committed to always sticking to the application of the articles contained in the constitution of the Republic of Indonesia.

Furthermore, the third, the alumni are expected to have the competence and commitment to prioritizing national, nation and state interests by maintaining territorial integrity and unity. Finally, the fourth, the alumni are expected to be competent and committed to always respect the differences of various cultures, religions, ethnicities, nations and groups. "It is expected that what is provided to the participants will be reflected in the attitude of the alumni's," Agus said.

National Management System Simulation of PPRA 61



A hundred participants of the Regular Education Program Batch 61 (PPRA) were divided into 13 Ministries / Institutions in a series of National Management Systems Simulation (Olah Sismennas) which opened on Tuesday (22/9), at Lemhannas RI.

The Olah Sismennas which lasted for four days, is one of the methods developed by Lemhannas RI in the teaching and learning process for PPRA Participants, which is a training to simulate cooperation, coordination and synchronization between institutions in producing and operationalizing a government policy, so that national development policies aimed at improving the people's welfare can be carried out in synergy, effectively and efficiently and can be beneficial to the community.

By holding the Olah Sismennas, the participants are expected to be able to apply all the fields of study given. Participants are also expected to be able to formulate policies, strategies and efforts to solve national problems. Furthermore, the participants are expected to be able to coordinate

across sectors through bureaucratic procedures and mechanisms to make the necessary decisions. Furthermore, the participants are also expected to be able to make decisions in limited conditions both from the aspect of time / available infrastructure.

With the theme "Cross-Sectoral Coordination of Government Officials and Related Stakeholders in the Context of Facing the Covid-19 Pandemic", the scenario of Olah Sismennas describes the assumed dynamics of national life, but remains logical. The situation that arises in the Olah Sismennas is built in such a way as to create a similarity in the scenario to the real situation.

In addition, dynamics that affect national life are presented, which are described by external and internal dynamics, so that national development organized by Indonesia becomes more dynamic in accordance with the planned scenario. "At Olah Sismennas this year, in order to obtain an objective and fair evaluation system, Lemhannas is trying to develop an evaluation pattern for Olah Sismennas which is taken from individual products," Deputy for National-Level Leader Education Major

General Rahmat Pribadi conveyed.

Furthermore, Rahmat explained that the implementation of the Olah Sismennas for PPRA 61 participants this time was very different compare to the previous PPRA. This difference is related to the Olah Sismennas method which was previously carried out face-to-face, but this time it was implemented via online due to the Covid-19 pandemic. "We are implementing the new online method for this time, and we hope that if this method is successful, it can be a model for us to develop in the next Olah Sismennas," Rahmat said.

Rahmat also conveyed to all participants to note important things so that the problems found during the implementation of the Olah Sismennas can be used as material for the next Olah Sismennas. To the organizers, Rahmat advised to immediately adjust to the Online Method of the Olah Sismennas. "Carry out this Olah Sismennas properly and sincerely, so that it can provide an overview to the participants in the right and strategic decision-making process in facing the Covid-19 pandemic," Rahmat said.

Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo was the keynote speaker at the 4th National Webinar of the Communication Forum of the FISIP (Faculty of Social and Politics) Deans / Chairman of the Indonesian STISIP PTS (Social and Political College, Private University) on Saturday (26/9) via online. The National Webinar takes the theme "Threats of Radicalism, Intolerance and Communism Against the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia from the Perspective of Social and Political Sciences".

"Similarities or common threads that we get from 3 aspects in the webinar this morning, get the main topic for discussion which are radicalism, intolerance and communism," Agus said. Agus further explained that intolerance is an initial condition which, if not handled properly, will lead to radicalism and communism.

Meanwhile, according to Agus, radicalism and communism are two ideologies that aim to instill their ideology or system itself by replacing the existing order based on a push or effort that reflects violence.

Viewed from the perspective of social and political science, there are several factors in the emergence of the phenomenon of radicalism, intolerance and communism. The first factor related to the tendency to change social relations within the scope of the state which contains social orders that are bound in a political system.

The second factor is social friction that results from differences in the truth claims of individual beliefs on the establishment of certain social values, which form a grouping based on beliefs in which different and contradicts to one another.

And the third factor is social pressure that is raised as an implication

of certain interest pressures that cause deviated movements or actions that deviate from or move away from the norms of collective agreement or which reject social order. Radicalism also overturns existing values, in the form of acts of intolerance towards groups with different understandings.

Then, Agus said that the social and political sciences are expected to be able to reveal aspects of the cause and effect process in a comprehensive analysis to find the root causes and effects of phenomena in the social and political fields and to reach comprehensive findings that are beneficial to the needs of society.

"This national webinar is expected to generate some strategic ideas and thoughts, in order to create the best recommendations as an effort to maintain the integrity of the Republic of Indonesia," Agus said while closing his explanation.

P3DA 11 Officially Opened



Lemhannas RI held a Strengthening Program for Regional Leader Batch 11 (P3DA 11). The P3DA 11 is planned to last for two months which will be opened on Monday (28/9) in the Dwi Warna Purwa Room, Lemhannas RI via online due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

The implementation of P3DA 11 is expected to be able to prepare regional level leaders with moral, ethic and have national characteristics, understand the Four Basic Consensus of the Nation which consist of Pancasila, the 1945 Constitution, the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia, and Unity in Diversity with operational perspectives, such as, archipelago outlook, national resilience and national vigilance, have the ability in solving regional problems, and able to provide advice to level I local governments regarding public policies and national values.

"The purpose of holding P3DA 11 is to strengthen regional leaders who have integrity, morality, ethics and character,

have a national perspective, think strategically and are able in solving problems of national development in the regions," Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo said.

To achieve this goal, Agus said that even though it was held in the midst of the Covid-19 pandemic, Lemhannas RI is doing its best to prepare and provide the best educational services without reducing the quality of education provided and will pay attention to health protocols during the education process.

"The participants at Lemhannas RI are expected to have the determination to carry out mental revolution in transforming attitudes and behaviors that reflect the figure of regional leaders with strong national character qualities," Agus said.

Agus further said that the participants need to have the ability to analyze, make decisions, think strategically, and have dignity and honesty which are the main prerequisites for individual character

as a regional-level leader. Therefore, Agus emphasized that ethics, morals and honesty must be the fundamentals for the participants and the participants must maintain the good name of the region where the participants serve.

At the end of his remarks, Agus reminded that Lemhannas RI did not teach or lecture the participants. However, the participants were at Lemhannas to equate the paradigm of national insight and to complete the achievements of the democratic process that the participants had achieved. "Lemhannas RI exists to help all participants to improve the quality of the participants' dedication in their capacity as public officials," Agus said.

P3DA 11, which is planned to end on December 9, 2020, will be attended by 26 participants consisting of 9 regents, 3 deputy regents, 4 mayors, 1 deputy mayor, 7 two DPRD members, 1 deputy chairman of DPRD, and 1 district regional secretary.

"Education at Lemhannas RI will create alumni who are expected will become leaders and become staff in the future," Agum said.

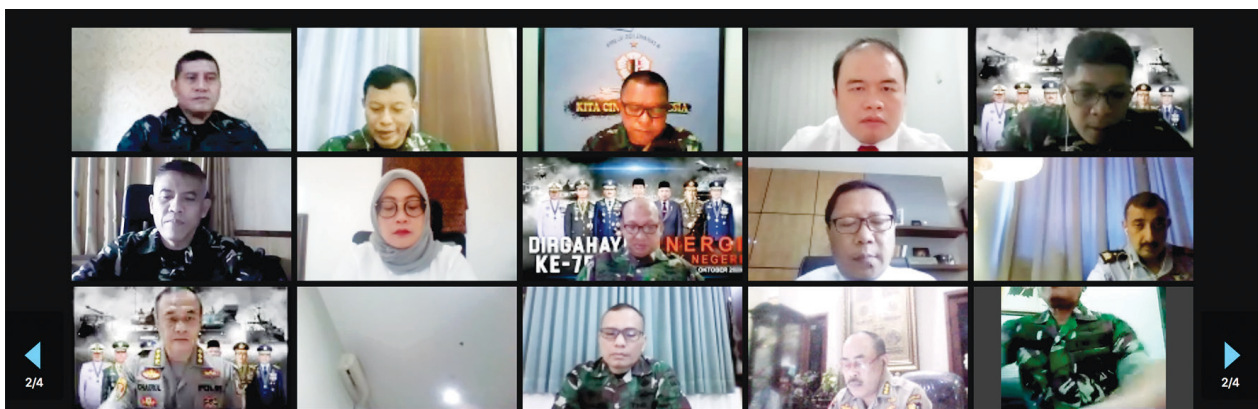

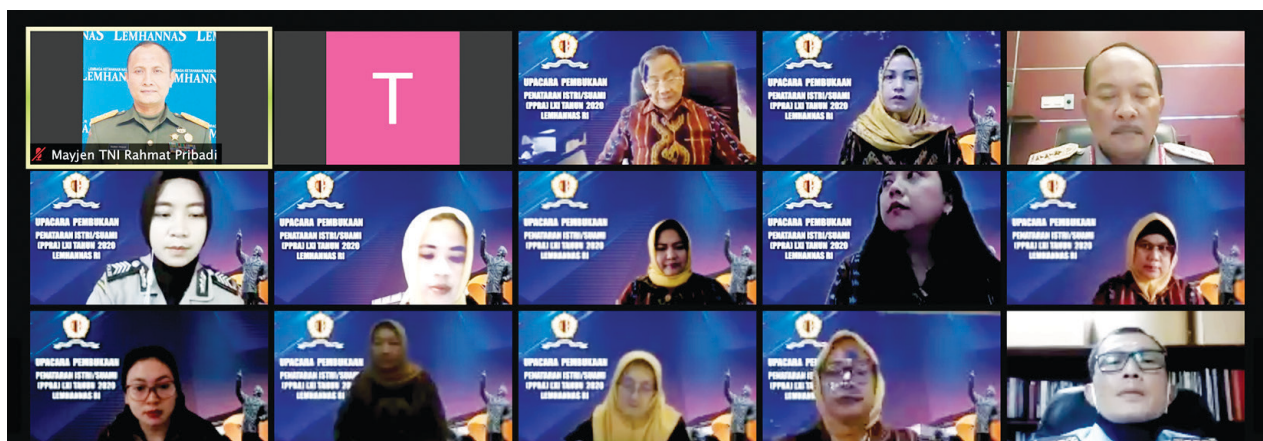

Head of KPK gives lecture at PPRA 61 Participant's Spouse Orientation Course

Head of the Corruption Eradication Commission (KPK) Police Commissioner General Drs. Firli Bahuri, M.Si. gave lecture to participants of the PPRA 61 Participants' Spouse Orientation Course, on Thursday (8/10) via online.

At the beginning of the lecture, Firli said that the success of PPRA 61 participants was the success of the participant facilitators because it is undeniable that someone's achievement is also by the help of other people. Therefore, Firli said that the orientation participants must continue to collaborate and build communication with everyone.

Firli also emphasized that in realizing national goals, the government compiled the National Long-Term Development Plan (RPJPN), the National Medium-Term Development Plan (RPJMN), and the Government Work Plan (RKP). Firli emphasized that even though the government changed, the goal of the country remained the same. "The government may change every 5 years, but the goals of the country never change," Firli said.

Then, Firli emphasized that what can an obstacle for a country in realizing its goals is corruption. "Corruption is an extraordinary crime," Firli stated.

It is said to be an extraordinary crime because corruption is not only a



crime that is detrimental to the state's money, but can have an impact on all development programs, the low quality of education, the low quality of buildings, the quality of education falls, and poverty is not handled.

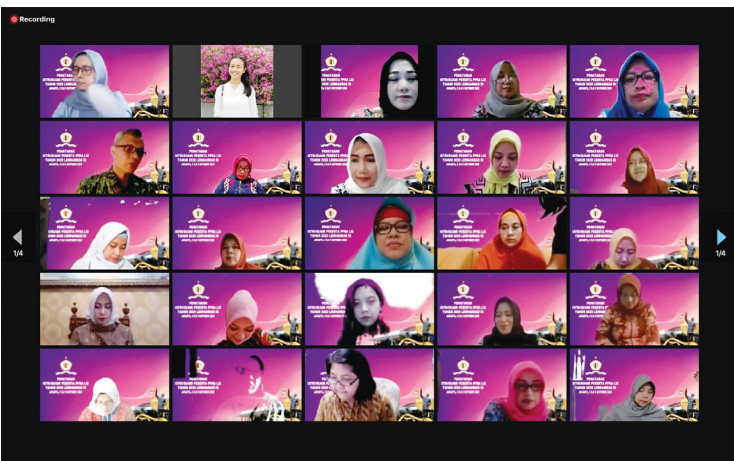
Firli continued, if state money is corrupted, then programs to realize the state's goals will not work and will result in the country failing. "Corruption is a crime that take away people of their rights, corruption also take away human rights, corruption is also against humanity," Firli said.

Therefore, KPK develops a corruption eradication strategy with three approaches. First, the Community Education Approach by providing insight and awareness to various parties, both the people, state administrators and the private sector so

that they do not commit corruption. Through education, KPK also spreads the dangers of corruption and defines corruption as an extraordinary crime. "Public education is important because we want to change a culture, a corruption culture into an anti-corruption culture," Firli said.

Second, the Preventive Approach that is taken because crime appears to be driven by a bad system, a weak system, and a failed system. In carrying out prevention, KPK coordinates with various parties so that there are no opportunities for corruption. One way is to make studies and recommendations to improve the system.

Third, the Approach of Action which is taken to instill a fear of committing corruption and raise awareness not to commit corruption. "These three approaches are carried out in a synergy, concurrent, simultaneous and sustainable manner," Firli said.
