PRESERVING THE NATION'S CULTURAL VALUES IN BORDER AREAS

The Directorate for the Social Cultural Analysis has conducted a roundtable discussion on “**Preserving the Nation’s Cultural Values in the Community in Border Areas in Order to Enhance National Security in the Framework of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia**” on August 18, 2011 on the 3rd Floor of West Wing of Astagatra Building of Lemhannas RI. Present on the occasion were the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A., the Vice Governor of Lemhannas RI Lt. Gen. Moeldoko, S.I.P., Secretary of the Governing Board Dr. Ardi Partadinata, M.H., M.Si., the First Secretary Drs. Chandra Manan Mangan, M.Sc., Acting

Sulistyowati Irianto, M.A. Acting as the main panelist was Prof. Dr. Mudji Sutrisno and Butet Manurung.

The roundtable discussion was organized as a response to the shifting conditions of the nation’s cultures, both in urban areas and border region. Such situation is caused, among other, by: **first**, socio-economic life of the communities in the regions bordered with more developed countries; **second**, rise in social ills in the community living in border regions, such as prostitution, gambling, etc.; and **third**, development process that ignores cultural factors. The situation has the potential to weaken national resilience. Concerns for the preservation of the nation’s culture and identity should be realized by further exploring, maintaining and strengthening the resilience of national cultures. It is done in order to counteract the penetration of foreign culture that has a negative impact while facilitating the process of adoption and adaptation of positive and productive foreign culture.

In his keynote speech the Governor of Lemhannas RI conveyed that the empowerment and strengthening of social based economy needs to be improved for the welfare of the community in order to enhance national resilience. The quality social based economic development is the responsibility and joint effort of the government, community and private sectors, through, among others: the development and improvement of the legal provisions, supporting facilities for social based economy, development and provision of funding scheme that are appropriate for the characteristics of the people's economy as well as

assistance and training for the economic players. Some points that need to be considered in the development of social based economy were also mentioned, namely: the process of economic development that is integrated with the implementation of regional autonomy.

Governor of Lemhannas RI also conveyed that there are two problems faced by the social based economy, which are the business environment and internal problems of the economic players. Therefore, the comprehensive and thorough process of social based economic strengthening is needed to solve the abovementioned two problems. Meanwhile in the implementation of regional autonomy, the local governments still have two main problems, namely: the capability to build and develop the resources. Therefore, they are required to develop people-based economy in their regions. The success of the strengthening of people's economy will foster economic activity, open up many job opportunities in the regions and can strengthen the regional economic structure so as to accelerate improvements in public welfare.

The Governor of Lemhannas RI hoped that the roundtable discussion will result in strategic thinking and ideas that will improve the result of the analysis report on the “**Social Based Economic Development with a National Identity in Order to Improve People’s Welfare in the Framework of National Resilience**”

ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION: THE GUARDING OF NATURAL RESOURCES IN ORDER TO SUPPORT NATIONAL DEVELOPMENT IN THE FRAMEWORK OF NATIONAL RESILIENCE



The roundtable discussion themed “the Preservation of Natural Resources in Order to Support National Development in the Framework of National Resilience” was held on the 3rd Floor of Astagatra Building of Lemhannas RI.

On Wednesday, August 24, 2011 the Deputy for Strategic Analysis of Lemhannas RI held a roundtable discussion on the 3rd Floor of Astagatra Building of Lemhannas RI. The roundtable discussion themed “**the Guarding of Natural Resources in Order to Support National Development in the Framework of National Resilience**” was opened by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. Present at the event were Vice Governor of Lemhannas RI, Secretary of the Governing Board, First Secretary, the Deputies of Lemhannas RI and other invitees.

In his opening speech, the Governor of Lemhannas RI conveyed that the natural resources is one of the basic capital for the survival of the nation and state. In Article 33 point 3 of the 1945 Constitution it is stated, that the earth, the waters and the natural riches contained therein shall be controlled by the state and exploited to the greatest benefit of the people. Therefore, the state should be able

to control and manage the natural riches, particularly those that have a strategic economic value or concern with the livelihood of the people.

The world has been experiencing an energy crisis which triggers a race for energy sources by certain countries toward other countries that have energy sources or natural riches, either through illegal actions and through cooperation (contract). Therefore, our country needs to immediately take strategic steps to secure its natural riches that are spread throughout the sovereign territory of the Republic of Indonesia.

In improving the guarding of natural riches, the approach, prevention, and action contribute a greater share in state revenues. The Governor of Lemhannas RI hoped that the strategic insights and ideas on the guarding of the natural riches can be produced in this roundtable discussion.

COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF'S LECTURE TO THE PPRA XLVI PARTICIPANTS

On September 5, 2011, the Commander-in-Chief Admiral Agus Suhartono, S.E. gave a lecture to the participants of PPRA XLVI on the 3rd Floor, West Wing of Pancagatra Building with the theme “**the Policy and Strategy of the Indonesian Military TNI in the Perspective of Use of Force to Ensure Sovereignty of the Law on National Jurisdiction in the Framework of National Resilience**”. Early in his lecture he explained about the development of the strategic environment which includes a global, regional and national dimension. It is a development scenario which is likely to affect the characteristics of threats, both potential and factual threats.

The Commander-in-Chief asserted that, irregardless of the circumstances and conditions, the Indonesian military TNI must always be ready to face threats in order to maintain the integrity and sovereignty of the Unitary Republic of Indonesia and the safety of the nation and state. This is due to the fact that 5 points-important mandate on June 7, 1946 of the Great General Sudirman is still attached to the spirit of the TNI, which are, **first**, believe in own power; **second**, continue your struggle, many have fallen victim; **third**, defend your homes and yards; **fourth**, our troops should never ever surrender to anyone who would colonize us again; **fifth**, hold on to military discipline completely.

Ensuring legal sovereignty in national jurisdictions within the framework of national resilience is largely determined by policy and strategy of the military in building the strength, capability, show and use of force. In the perspective of the use of military force, the TNI prioritizes **tridimensional integration** in carrying out military operations for war and military operations other than war, along with reserve and supporting components as a part of the total defense system in order to support the main duties of TNI effectively and efficiently. Togetherness in the responsibility to defend the homeland actually has created national resilience within the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia.

At the end of his lecture on the policy and strategy of the TNI in the perspective of the use of military force, the Commander-in-Chief opens a discussion and question and answer session.

ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION:**URGENCY OF THE FIFTH AMENDMENT OF THE 1945 CONSTITUTION IN ORDER TO STRENGTHEN THE CONSTITUTIONAL SYSTEM AND MECHANISM IN THE FRAMEWORK OF NATIONAL RESILIENCE**

Governor of Lemhannas RI opens a Roundtable Discussion “Urgency of the Fifth Amendment of the 1945 Constitution in Order to Strengthen the Constitutional System and Mechanism in the Framework of National Resilience”

In order to accommodate a variety of insights and views from various experts about the importance of the amendment to the 1945 Constitution so as to strengthen the constitutional system and mechanisms as part of efforts to consolidate democracy within the framework of national resilience, Lemhannas RI organized a roundtable discussion on “**Urgency of the Fifth Amendment of the 1945 Constitution in Order to Strengthen the Constitutional System and Mechanism in the Framework of National Resilience**” on 14 September 2011 on the 3rd Floor, West Wing of Astagatra Building, Lemhannas RI. The roundtable discussion was opened by Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A., and was attended by structural

and functional officials of Lemhannas RI.

In his opening speech, the Governor of Lemhannas RI conveyed that the amendment of the 1945 Constitution NRI aims to create a harmonious relation between state institutions and in the framework of the constitution. In addition, it concerns with the regulating pattern of the relationship and function between the central and regional governments in the context of decentralization. Therefore, Governor of Lemhannas RI delivered a few efforts that can be done, namely the managing of relationship between institutions and the work mechanism, including the accommodating of partnership with other institutions outside of the government for the effectiveness

of its function. These efforts will ultimately lead to an improved system as it is supported by compliance with laws and regulations, institutions with aspirational, accomodative and participative leadership as well as creative and productive work culture.

At the end of his speech, the Governor expressed his expectation that the amendment to the 1945 Constitution can serve a starting point for efforts to realize the vision and mission of the Republic of Indonesia in 2025, that is “independent, advanced, just and prosperous Indonesia”. Therefore, the Governor of Lemhannas RI hoped that roundtable discussion will produce strategic insights and outlook, and will be the beginning of a process for the fifth amendment to the 1945 Constitution.

GOVERNOR OF LEMHANNAS RI'S AUDIENCE WITH ASMAT REGENT

D on Monday, September 12, 2011 the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. received a visit from Asmat Regent Yuvensius A. Biakai, B.A., S.H. and his 4-member entourage. The Asmat Regent's visit was intended for an audience with the Governor of Lemhannas RI at the governor's guest-room in the 1st floor of Trigatra building. Present at the occasion was the Vice Governor, First Secretary, Acting Deputy for Strategic Analysis, and Acting Deputy for the Consolidation of National Values of Lemhannas RI as well as the Development Coordinator of Asmat Regency in Jakarta, and Director of Institute of Technology (Lemtek) of the University of Indonesia.

The Asmat Regency has a huge domestic potential and has been known to the world with its culture. Unfortunately in the economic development at the macro level, it is not included in the Indonesia Economic Corridor. Asmat Regency is very strategic as it is traversed by Indonesia's sea lane (ALKI 3). Asmat also has a very rich natural potential, and therefore, the Asmat Regent has a high hope that it is to be considered by the central government as a Special Economic Zone (KEK). Currently Asmat District has not been touched in the 2011 – 2025 Master Plan for the Acceleration and Expansion of Indonesia's Economic Development (MP3EI). What is needed in the Asmat regency today is the development of

infrastructure (transportation, electricity, clean water, telecommunications), agricultural economics, fisheries and tourism, as well as development in the education and health sector. With the development of the Strategic Area, international airport and international logistic ports are expected to be built, and the position of Asmat can be strengthened from the aspect of defense and security.

In the audience, the Asmat Regent expressed his desire for the Governor of Lemhannas RI to attend the International Festival of Asmat Culture on October 15, 2011, which will be preceded by a local seminar on the results of study of the October 13, 2011 in Timika. In addition, Asmat Regent also hopes

that Lemhannas RI to take part in the study of **"the Development of Asmat Regency's Economic Zone"** which will be conducted together with UI's Lemtek. The Governor of Lemhannas RI welcomed the invitation and gave his support for for Asmat Regency to be included in the 2011 – 2025 Master Plan for the Acceleration and Expansion of Indonesia's Economic Development (MP3EI) in order to support the acceleration of national development within the framework of national resilience. The Governor of Lemhannas RI Hope that the best youth of the Asmat regency can attend the education continuously in Lemhannas RI and participate in the roundtable discussion of actual analysis as the main panelist.

FLAG RAISING CEREMONY ON SEPTEMBER 19, 2011

The purpose of the bureaucratic reform is to form a professional government bureaucracy, with the following characteristics: adaptive, integrated, high performance, free and clean from corruption, collusion and nepotism, able to serve the public, neutral, prosperous, dedicated, holding fast to basic values and ethical codes of the state apparatus.

It was also conveyed in the speech of the Governor of Lemhannas RI, that as a good state apparatus, we must support the effort for bureaucratic reform. The indicator for the success of bureaucratic reform can be seen from

the absence of corruption, absence violations/penalties, the state budget is spent according to the procedure, all work programs well completed, good public communication, the use of effective and productive working hours, and the application of reward and punishment consistently and sustainably.

At the end of the Governor of Lemhannas RI's speech, he called on the members to improve discipline, vigilance, and sensitivity to the current situation and demonstrate the spirit of togetherness, both internally and externally within our respective community and environment.
