Governor Lemhannas RI:

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Urgent Need for In-depth Study of Nuclear Utilization

“Fossil energy sources that we have are already limited, therefore, we have to look for alternative energy sources”.

The statement was made by the Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Air Marshal Dede Rusamsi, S.E. when reading the keynote speech of the Governor of Lemhannas RI in a Roundtable Discussion on Actual Study on Tuesday, (26/3) at the Nusantara I Meeting Room, Trigatra Building of Lemhannas RI.

The roundtable discussion moderated by Expert on Natural Resource Wealth of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Dadan Umar Daihani, featured three resource persons, namely, Expert Staff of the Minister of Energy and Mineral Resources on Spatial Planning and Environment Dr. Marwansyah Lobo Balia, M.Sc., Head of System Planning Division of the State Electricity Company (PLN) Ir. Djoko Prasetyo, and Professor of Physics from the University of Indonesia Prof. Dr. Terry Mart. Aside from the speakers, there were also panelists at the event, namely, the Head of Green Peace Indonesia Longgena Ginting, Head of Nuclear Energy Regulatory Agency (Bapeten) as well as Ir. Timotius D. Harsono, M.Sc. and Dr. Drs. Harry Indradjit Soeharjono, S.E., M.M. from Lemhannas RI.

Apart from its use as a weapon of war, nuclear energy has been widely used in various fields, such as in energy, medicine, agriculture, industry, farms and so on. According to the deputy governor, petroleum (gasoline), gas and coal have thus far been considered as the mainstay commodities for foreign exchange sources in

the field of energy. However, those energy sources need to be reorganized in order to strategically adapt to the rhythm of national development.

According to him, on one hand, people’s demand for power energy will continue to increase, but on the other hand it must be admitted that the fossil energy sources that Indonesia possesses are extremely limited. “... We must find alternative energy sources. One of which is nuclear energy that could be used as a nuclear power plant”, he said.

He said there are several reasons as to why nuclear is used as an alternative energy source: first, the depletion of energy reserves contained within the Earth, especially petroleum (fossil). Second, although the new reserves being discovered, the ratio of the speed of reserve discovery to the amount of usage seems not balanced as reflected, among others, in the increasingly high market price of oil.

It is the reason for a number of countries to develop programs for alternative energy sources other than oil. One of which is nuclear energy. Nuclear is one energy source that is used by more and more countries around the world these days. Although it has a negative impact, it can be offset with proper methods and use.

MSMEs Needs to be Aligned with Corporate Condition, Behaviour and Culture



On Wednesday (26/3), Expert Lecturer in the Field of Economy of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Miyasto gave a presentation in an intellectual exercise organized by the Governing Board of Lemhannas RI, on the 3rd floor, East Wing of Asta Gatra Building of Lemhannas RI.

The Intellectual Exercise opened by the Secretary of the Governing Board of Lemhannas RI Dr. Ardi Partadinata, M.Sc. is one of the means to develop academic life through the fine-tuning of knowledge and skills of the expert lecturers, expert analysts and expert professionals of Lemhannas RI in accordance with the fields of expertise. The program was carried out as part of monitoring and evaluating efforts of the Governing Board of Lemhannas RI

in the implementation of its general policies.

In his presentation entitled “the Empowerment of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) in Improving Competitiveness of the National Economy for Public Welfare”, Prof. Dr. Miyasto conveyed, in his paper, that although the index of national resilience in the last 3 years is less robust (Labkurtannas Data: 2.43 (2010), 2.44 (2011), 2.43 (2012)), the economic aspect tends to improve during the period (Labkurtannas Data: 2.85 (2010), 2.86 (2011), 2.87 (2012)), and is quite robust to be on top of the rest of the aspects.

However, according to him, such a circumstance has not been enough to allow Indonesia to compete at the regional (ASEAN) or international levels since there are still many key

indicators in the economic aspect that is, in fact, in troubled or less robust position. It has resulted in a spillover effect upon the resilience of other aspects and national resilience as a whole. This condition will also hamper the achievement of national development vision.

The empowerment of micro, small and medium enterprises is one of the resource and knowledge-based national development strategies in achieving long-term development vision. The MSMEs are a specific phenomenon in Indonesia. Therefore, Prof. Dr. Miyasto is of the opinion that the empowerment of MSMEs should be carried out by taking into account the corporate condition, behavior and culture of MSMEs in Indonesia. Therefore, it is expected to minimize the constraints and obstacles, both in the economic and non-economic aspects.

In addition to Prof. Dr. Miyasto, Expert Lecturer in Domestic Political Affairs also delivered a presentation with the theme “Development of Border Areas and Small Islands at the Country’s Front Yard as an Integral Part of Strong Indonesia’s Defence in the Framework of National Resilience”.

The event was attended by Deputies, Expert Lecturers, Expert Analysts and Expert Professionals of Lemhannas RI as well as other invitees.



Development in Papua Needs to be Prioritized

“**P**hilosophically, the implementation of special autonomy is a strategic measure to improve people’s welfare and minimize socio-economic gap with other regions in Indonesia”.

The statement was made by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. in a Roundtable Discussion themed “Optimizing the Disadvantaged Areas in Papua in Order to Promote Social Welfare in the Framework of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia” on Monday (1/4) at the Nusantara I Meeting Room, Trigatra building of Lemhannas RI.

The special autonomy is a serious effort by the government to promote general welfare in Papua. Therefore, according to the governor, all national components must support the acceleration of development in Papua which will allow the people of Papua to develop and progress in their own land.

The speakers at the event were the State Minister for the Acceleration of Development in Underdeveloped Regions Ir. H. Helmy Faisal Zaini, Acting Governor of Papua drh. Constant Karma and Presidential Special Staff Member Dr. Velix Vernando Wanggai, S.I.P., M.Sc. While the panelists were the Unit Head of Acceleration of Development in Papua and West Papua (UP4B) Lt. Gen. (Ret.) Bambang Dharmono, Member of Parliament’s Commission I Maj. Gen. (Ret.) Tri Tamtomo, S.H., Professor of International Law from the University of Indonesia Prof. Hikmahanto Juwana, S.H., LL.M, Ph.D., and Researcher at the LIPI’s Center for Political Studies/Expert on Papua Dr. Adriana Elisabeth, M.Soc.Sc.

In his speech, the governor said that the acceleration of development in Papua needs to be prioritized every year on an ongoing basis. Some of the heavy challenges to be faced include the various underdeveloped regencies, infrastructure and human resources issues. Hard work is needed for the development in Papua region for the sake of the people, be it at the central or local governments.

In fact it can be perceived that the way the people in Papua adapt to the whole development in the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia is relatively slow and stagnant due to slow pace of development in all aspects. Therefore, there needs to be a synergy between central and local governments in the implementation of development programs which are supported by policies, and are aligned with the needs and characteristics of the Papuans. It will be a key factor in the development of a prosperous Papua. Besides, a serious and rational strategy is quite needed for the acceleration of development in Papua which is based on nationalism and strong, tangible and sustainable commitment for creating an autonomous, advanced and prosperous Papua in the framework of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia.

The governor hopes that the roundtable discussion will generate theoretical, conceptual and practical ideas in order to accelerate the development in Papua in a consistent manner to allow Papua to become a prosperous and competitive region by tapping into its vast potentials in the framework of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia.



Signing of MoU Understanding between Lemhannas RI and Mulawarman University

On Wednesday (3/4), a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between Lemhannas RI and the University of Mulawarman at the governor's guest-room in the Trigatra Building of Lemhannas RI.

The MoU was signed by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. as the first party, while the Mulawarman University, the second party, was represented by its rector Prof. Dr. H. Hasim Zamruddin S.E., S.U.

The MoU aims at maintaining and enhancing the ties between the two institutions. The agreed scope of cooperation under the MoU includes the education and strengthening of national-level leaders, strategic research and studies, strengthening of national values, measurement of national resilience and community service.

The MoU will later be followed-up by the two parties and laid down in a separate cooperation agreement which constitutes an integrated and inseparable part of the MoU.

The MoU, which is valid for five (5) years starting from the date of its signing by both parties, will be evaluated periodically, at a minimum of once per year.

The MoU signing ceremony was attended by the Deputy Governor, Principal Secretary, Deputies, Chief of Cooperation Bureau, Chief of Public Relations Bureau, Director of Strengthening and Development Program, Expert Analyst in the Field of Economy from Lemhannas RI. The University of Mulawarman's Assistant Rector I, Assistant Rector IV, Head of the Legal and Social Studies and the Head of Public Relations and Protocol were also in attendance.

Maritime Policy Formulation for Strengthening of Maritime Economic Development

The Deputy Office for Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI held a roundtable discussion with the theme “Maritime Resource Utilization to Improve National Economic Resilience” at the Nusantara I Meeting Room in Trigatra Building. The event, which took place on Tuesday (9/4), was opened by the Principal Secretary of Lemhannas RI Drs. Chandra Manan Mangan, M.Sc.

The speakers at the event were the Director-General for the Procurement and Marketing of Fisheries Ir. Saut Parulian Hutagalung, M.Sc., Director General of Oil and Gas Ir. A. Edy Hermanto and Lecturer of the Faculty of Economy and Management from IPB Prof. Dr. Akhmad Fauzi, M.Sc. While the panelists were the Chairman of Indonesian Fishermen Association Maj. Gen. (Ret.) Yusuf Solichien Martadiningrat, Expert Professional in the Field of Economy of Lemhannas RI Dr. Panutan Sakti, Expert Professional in the Field of Natural Resources Wealth of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Dadan Umar Daihani, D.E.A. and Expert Professional in the Field of Strategy and International Relations of Lemhannas RI Rear Admiral (Ret.) Robert Mangindaan.

“The maritime utilization requires political backing and real support from all components of the nation”, said the Principal Secretary reading the keynote speech of the Governor of Lemhannas RI.

He said the efforts are made in order to make the

maritime sector more competitive in strengthening the national economy.

Indonesia has specific characteristics of marine waters as it lies between two large oceans with a high diversity of sea biota types, such as reef fish, seaweed and various sea vegetation as well as other potentials, such as minerals, oil and gas.

Indonesia’s marine resource potentials are very high. If managed properly, they can increase domestic food supply and improve the economy of the people, as well as increase the food production and foreign exchange revenues due to its high economic value.

Therefore, according to the Principal Secretary, an integral and comprehensive maritime policy needs to be formulated in order to serve as a political umbrella for all state institutions in strengthening and developing maritime economy.

“In order to position the maritime as a leading sector in national development, the policies made should take into account the linkage between economic sectors within the marine sector,” explained the Principal Secretary.
