Neuro-Linguistic Programming (NLP) Training

Lemhannas RI held a personal development training incorporating Neuro-Linguistic Programming (NLP) principles and techniques on Friday (12/12), in Dwi Warna Building, Lemhannas RI. The event opened by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, DEA featured NLP motivator Endy Fatah Joesoef and Kartiko Adi Pramono.

Budi Susilo Soepandji in his speech conveyed that there were three important purposes behind the training, namely to facilitate a more effective coordination mechanism between leaders and subordinates, to motivate the training participants to refrain from taking any actions which would violate one's human rights or damage one's self-esteem, and to strengthen vertical and horizontal relationships in the workplace. This training was expected to improve participants' confidence and professionalism in carrying out their day-to-day tasks.

According to one of the motivators of the NLP Licensed Master Practitioners Kartiko Adi Pramono, the NLP training – employing a combination of methods, such as psychology, behavior, therapy, and visualization – was aimed at reprogramming one's conscious and sub-conscious minds. He emphasized the great importance for one to have goals or desired state in life, adding that without a clear purpose of life, it would be difficult for humans to advance or move forward. Furthermore, in order to achieve his or her goals in life, one needs to adequately possess these important factors, such as knowledge, skills, and good attitude.

The training followed by the structural officials of Lemhannas RI encouraged the participants to realize that their minds and emotions were valuable resources that they were supposed to manage, so that it would result positively in their performance and improve their soft skills.





National Workshop: “Strengthening Lemhannas RI Role for National Development”

Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, DEA opened a national workshop with the theme “Strengthening Lemhannas RI’s Roles in the Context of National Development” on Tuesday (16/12) in Dwi Warna Purwa Building, Lemhannas RI. The workshop organized by Lemhannas RI featured keynote speaker Coordinating Minister for Human Development and Culture Puan Maharani.

The event moderated by Deputy for Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Djagal Wiseso Marsono, M. Agr. featured four speakers, namely Head of the State Civil Apparatus Committee Prof. Dr Sofyan Effendi, Prof. Dr. Muladi, S.H. from Faculty of Law of the Diponegoro University, Indonesian Ambassador to the Philippines Lt. Gen. (Ret) Johny J. Lumintang, and Deputy Minister for Politics, Law, Defense, and Security Affairs of Bappenas (National Development Planning Agency) Ir. Rizky Ferianto, MA. Panelists at the event included Expert Staff Member for Political and Security Affairs Drs. Heru Tamtomo and Special Staff Member for International Cooperation from the Administrative and Bureaucratic Reform Ministry Dr. Rudianto Sumarwoto.

Budi Susilo Soepandji, in his address, emphasized that professional human resources imbued with a spirit of patriotism

are crucially needed in building Indonesia as a fully self-sufficient and sovereign nation with a distinctive national character. Mental revolution, as one of nine priority agendas in national development, or known as “Nawacita” (nine priority agendas), should be fully understood and implemented by all national components. The active participation and engagement of the speakers, panelists and participants at this event were needed in order to enrich Lemhannas RI’s preliminary draft being currently prepared.

Meanwhile, Coordinating Minister for Human Development and Culture Puan Maharani in her keynote speech conveyed that a nation would not be able to survive without having a strong ideology. Therefore, comprehensive studies on ideology, politics, economy, socio-culture, defense and security needed to be carried out in order to develop a mental revolution program, which is the paradigm of national development focusing on national character strengthening.

The workshop affirmed that Lemhannas RI held strategic roles in providing educational course programs for future leaders. In terms of policy-making, Lemhannas RI was also expected to accelerate national development within the framework of a mental revolution in synergy with other relevant ministries or agencies.

Lemhannas RI Holds Workshop on Information Technology and Nusantara Cyber Fortress

Lemhannas RI held a workshop entitled “Information technology and Nusantara Cyber Fortress “ in Mini Studio, Syailendra Room, Astagatra Building, Lemhannas RI on 17-18 December 2014. The event opened by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A., featured five speakers, namely Director of Sharing Vision Dr. Ir. Dimitri Mahayana, M. Eng, Head of Research and Development Center of Coastal and Marine Resources from the Maritime Affairs and Fisheries Ministry Dr. Budi Sulisty, S.T., M.T., IT expert from Sharing Vision Fran Suwarna Sjam, S.T., M.M., IT and telecommunications expert from Sharing Vision Eduardus Primus de Rosari, S.T., M.T., and Head of Control Systems Laboratory and Computer from STEI ITB Dr. Ir. Agung Harsoyo, M.Sc., M. Eng.

Budi Susilo Soepandji, in his address, conveyed that the socialization event was organized in follow up to the action of information technology audit, conducted in preparation of the information technology master plan for Lemhannas RI. Meanwhile, the Nusantara Cyber Fortress is developed in order to collect and analyze a variety of data and information from the internet in order to support Labkurtannas activities.

Some of the materials presented by the speakers included IT audit and benchmarking, gap analysis and recommendations as well as roadmap implementation of the IT master plan. This event was

expected to equip Lemhannas RI’s personnel with monitoring and supervising skills in the implementation of information technology, provision of accurate information as an early warning tool in decision-making in the field of national resilience, and giving of input to relevant stakeholders.

“All the brainstorming sessions, that were filled with suggestions and constructive criticisms from all the speakers and workshop participants, are a valuable input that is expected to support the idea of setting up the Nusantara Cyber Fortress,” concluded Budi Susilo Soepandji.

The event, which lasted for two days, was closed by Chief of Telematics Bureau of Lemhannas RI Air Commander Baskoro Alrianto, M.Sc. In his speech read by Baskoro Alrianto, the Governor of Lemhannas RI mentioned four important things to be borne in mind: first, carrying out IT evaluation for the development / improvement of information technology services; second, implementing IT master plan in a focused, effective, and efficient manner; third, making the best use of information circulating in cyberspace through Nusantara Cyber Fortress as input and references for Labkurtannas in policy formulation intended for the government, and fourth, using IT supports to improve the performance of Lemhannas RI in its pursuit of developing into a world-class institution.

Year-End Evaluation of PR Bureau's Publication

Public Relations Bureau of Lemhannas RI again held a regular program of Coffee Morning on Tuesday (23/12) at Gatotkaca room, Trigatra Building, Lemhannas RI, which was led by Chief of Public Relations Bureau of Lemhannas RI Commodore E. Estu Prabowo, M.Sc. Featuring Maulana Isnarto, a broadcaster from Radio Republik Indonesia (RRI), as the resource person, one of the issues being discussed was the evaluation of publication related to Lemhannas RI's coffee morning activities.

In his remarks, Chief of Public Relations Bureau of Lemhannas RI Commodore E. Estu Prabowo, M.Sc. conveyed that the coffee morning program, after two years, still needed to be further improved. According to him, the mass media, as a medium of publication, played an important role in publicizing all Lemhannas RI's activities.

Maulana Isnarto himself admitted that the activities of Lemhannas RI did not look very "sexy" in the eyes of journalists. However, they, he added, deserved to be covered as all those activities were filled with nationalistic values that would help contribute to the integrity of the unitary state of the Republic of Indonesia.

Therefore, Estu Prabowo hoped that the Lemhannas RI's



journalists forum could be established soon. Apart from improving the quantity of Lemhannas RI's publication outputs, it would also strengthen ties between Lemhannas RI and mass media.

The event attended by 42 journalists from various print media, online media and television was aimed at getting feedback and suggestions from journalists themselves, with a hope that the media coverage of Lemhannas RI's activities could be further improved in coming years.

Year-End Evaluation of PPID



Towards the end of 2014, Public Relations Bureau of Lemhannas RI held a meeting to evaluate the performance of the Documentation and Information Management Unit (PID) on Monday (29/12) in Arjuna Room, Astagatra Building, Lemhannas RI. The event chaired by Head of Public Relations Division of Lemhannas RI Wahyu Widji P. S. Kom., MM was attended by members of PPID units of Lemhannas RI.

The evaluation meeting addressed the PID activities of the year 2014 and PID's action plans for the year 2015. In his presentation, Wahyu Widji conveyed that the PID activities throughout the year 2014 had, in general, run well. However, a thorough evaluation was needed for future improvement.

There are several PID activities which have been carried out in order to achieve the 2014 targets, including PID organizational benchmarking and manning, information identification and mapping,

preparation of the list of exempt information and the list of public information, self-assessment of public information services, and a follow-up to action plan of Corruption Prevention and Eradication. However, the list of public information currently being prepared still needs to be further discussed.

Meanwhile, the PID activities planned for the year 2015 included the follow-up action to the discussion of DIP preparation, and the revamping of the information and documentation management, as well as the improvement in public information services. The PID revamping included the availability and accessibility of public information in each PPID unit as well as the improvement in public information services, such as manning, infrastructure and public information desk.

In addition, the year-end routine programs, which will be continually carried out, are the monitoring and evaluation activities of the currently ongoing PID programs.

Presentation on the Eagle Awards Documentary Competition 2015 (EADC-2015)

A team of the Eagle Institute Indonesia (Metro TV) delivered a presentation on Monday (29/12) regarding the cooperation with Lemhannas RI in the “Eagle Awards Documentary Competition 2015” (EADC-2015) program in Arjuna Room, Astagatra Building 3rd Floor, Lemhannas RI. At the meeting, the team of Lemhannas RI was led by Deputy for Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Djagal Wiseso Marsono, M.Agr.

The Eagle Awards Documentary Competition (EADC) is a program, pioneered by Metro TV, which has been carried out for approximately 8 years by the Eagle Institute Indonesia. This program is intended to stimulate the national film industry. Through this program, the quality of young Indonesian filmmakers are expected to improve without having to abandon the nation’s distinctive national values. In that regard, the Indonesian Eagle Institute seeks to produce films from various regions across the country which promote local wisdoms.

This year, EADC-2015 raises the theme “Knitting Indonesia”, which is based on the country’s vast geographical spread -- an archipelago with more than 17,000 islands stretching from Sabang to Merauke. Moreover, the country has various ethnic and religious groups, which makes it vulnerable to exploitation, leading to national disintegration.

The theme was expected to inspire young Indonesian filmmakers with nationalistic values and perspective in doing their works, which in turn will evoke the same nationalistic sentiments in other youth groups.

The theme of EADC this year is in line with one of the government’s nawacita (nine priorities agenda) programs, which is to bring about a revolution of the national character, or commonly known as a “mental revolution”. Therefore, for this year’s EADC program, the EADC-2015 Team deems it appropriate to collaborate with Lemhannas RI which has duties and functions in the strengthening of nationalistic values. Meanwhile, Lemhannas RI considers the strengthening of nationalistic values among the youth as a strategic challenge, especially amidst deteriorating nationalistic values and ideology of Pancasila.

Several representatives of Lemhannas RI at the meeting included Deputy for the Strengthening of Nationalistic Values, Deputy Coordinator of Senior Lecturers, Deputy Coordinator of Senior Analysts, Deputy Coordinator of Professional Experts, Chief of Public Relations Bureau and Chief of Planning and Finance Bureau of Lemhannas RI. While the team of the Eagle Institute Indonesia was represented by, among others, Deputy GM for Sales Handy Pulungan, SAS Manager M. Efendi, Event Manager Specialist Bambang Hamid and Account Manager Syailindra Trama Salim.

Muhammadiyah University of Purwokerto Visits Lemhannas RI

Lemhannas RI received a visit of a group of students from Muhammadiyah University of Purwokerto (UMP) on Tuesday (6/1) in Syailendra room, 3rd Floor of Astagatra Building, Lemhannas RI. The 40 students and 5 lecturers of the Pancasila and Civics Education Study Program were led by Prof. Dr. Tukiran, MM. The visiting group was received by Head of Protocol and Documentation Division Navy Captain (P) Maghoni and Head of Public Relations Division Wahyu Widji Pamungkas, S.Kom., MM.

During the visit, Prof. Tukiran conveyed his hopes that his students be provided with knowledge and discussion related to national resilience and nationalistic perspective, so that they would later become professional teachers with a profound loyalty to Indonesian values. In addition, he also expected cooperation between UMP and Lemhannas RI.

Meanwhile, Wahyu Widji in his remarks welcomed the expectations, adding that Lemhannas RI as an institution, which was responsible for the education of national-level leaders, strategic studies and strengthening of nationalistic values, was very concerned about matters related to national resilience and nationalistic perspective.

Therefore, a presentation was delivered on the issues by Senior Lecturer of Politics and Citizenship Kisnu Haryo, S.H., M.A. The students were expected to benefit from the subjects as it would equip them, as young intellectuals, with important insight and knowledge as the nation's future educators, especially in the subject of Pancasila and civics.

In his presentation, Kisnu Haryo conveyed that the national resilience and nationalistic insight were fundamental aspects that had to be continually nurtured in the era of globalization, otherwise it might pose a threat to national integration. In addition, the four national consensuses, namely Pancasila, the 1945 Constitution, the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia, and Unity in Diversity principle was also an important matter to be fully understood in order to achieve the national goals.

Indonesia Should Take Control of Flight Information Region (FIR) in Riau and Natuna

Radio Republik Indonesia (RRI), in cooperation with the Alumni Association of Lemhannas RI (IKAL) of the 51st PPRA batch, held a discussion on Flight Information Regions (FIR) of Riau and Natuna which were currently controlled by Singapore on Monday (9/1) in RRI Jusuf Ronodipuro, 2nd Floor. The discussion, which was broadcast live by RRI Pro 3, was moderated by RRI Broadcaster Maulana Isnarto and attended by Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, DEA., RRI President Director Rosalita Niken Widiastuti, Chief Air Marshal (Ret) Chappy Hakim, Commander of the National Air Defence Sector Command I (Pangkosek Hanudnas I) Air Commander Fahru Zaini, Patron Board Chairman of Tirta Amarta Dr. Makarim Wibisono, and IKAL alumni of the 51st PPRA batch.

The discussion was held as a response to the Air Asia flight QZ8501 incident in late 2014, which did not only raise questions about the causes of the accident, but also questions of the Flight Information Regions (FIR) management of Riau and Natuna airspace which are currently controlled by Singapore.

At the beginning of the discussion, former Air Force Chief of Staff Chappy Hakim said that there were three Indonesian regions that were included in Singapore's FIR, namely Tanjung Pinang, Riau, and Natuna. The fact has forced Indonesia to ask Singapore first for clearance to fly through the airspace of those particular regions.

Such a situation shows the problems being faced by Indonesia with regards to its air sovereignty, where it has no absolute authority over its own airspace.

Meanwhile, Makarim Wibisono conveyed that the airspace above Riau and Riau Islands was included in Singapore's FIR since 1946, as Indonesia at that time was considered as incapable of managing and providing air navigation services for the particular regions.

Furthermore, the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, DEA said that Indonesia had to immediately take control of its airspace above Riau Province and Natuna Islands which were currently managed by Singapore. Failure to do so would just harm Indonesian sovereignty, in terms of security, political, and economic aspects.

Similar views were also conveyed by Fahru Zaini who said that Indonesia's national sovereignty was at stake if the airspace navigation, especially those above Riau and the surrounding area, was still managed by Singapore. He further added that Indonesia's dignity would be harmed if its domestic airspace was controlled by foreign parties instead. Therefore, he called on all relevant agencies to work together to push the government to reclaim the management of the Indonesian national airspace.

The event, which was also attended by the General Chairman of the Supreme Council of Taman Siswa Association Prof. Dr. Sri Edi Swasono, Budi Susilo Soepandji raised the theme, “Taman Siswa, Character-Building and Patriotism”. According to him, the young generation who would lead the country in the future was getting increasingly distanced from the national identity of Pancasila.

As a pioneer organization devoted to the improvement of education quality of the children’s nation, Taman Siswa has very strategic roles and functions in preserving and developing distinctive national characters and patriotism for the sake of the intellectual life of the nation.

Taman Siswa has proven itself as an educational organization promoting Indonesian values and identity in accordance with basic principles of its founder, Ki Hajar Dewantara, “Ing Ngarsa Sung Tuladha (“in the front showing paragon), Ing Madya Mangun Karsa (in the middle burning the spirit), and Tut Wuri Handayani (in the back giving a support). All those principles remain a guiding force in Indonesia’s education sector.

According to Budi Susilo Soepandji, in pursuit of its vision, mission and commitment, Taman Siswa, as a pioneer in education for character-building and patriotism, must develop education and teaching patterns which are oriented toward Indonesian native cultures. Taman Siswa students, looking ahead, are expected to fulfill the need for more quality, competitive human resources with strong characters.

Urgency of Knowledge Management System for Subject Matter Experts in Government Institutions

Lemhannas RI organized a socialization event of the Knowledge Management System Application for Lemhannas RI Subject Matter Experts on Wednesday (14/1) in the Syailendra room, Astagatra Building, 3rd Floor, Lemhannas RI. The event opened by Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Air Marshal Dede Rusamsi, SE, MM featured Triyono Hadi from PT Multi Trans Data as a resource person.

As a research-focused institution, it is incumbent on Lemhannas RI to dedicate its knowledge in service of the national interest through use of the knowledge management system. Knowledge, as a result of thinking, is the main driving force behind any policy-making, of which Lemhannas RI is responsible for its development, distribution and enrichment, both in terms of quality and quantity. The emphasis was made by Lemhannas RI Governor in his speech read out by Dede Rusamsi.

Triyono Hadi conveyed that knowledge management program covered the following activities: identification of needs, acquisition, management, storing and utilization of knowledge, in order to support institutional goals.

According to him, the knowledge management program was very useful to improve the performance of institutions and individuals as well as to enhance the capacity of knowledge. "The lack of knowledge management program will result in difficulty in finding documents, data errors, incompetence and wasteful printing costs," he asserted.

It is stated in the Regulation of the Administrative and Bureaucratic Reform Minister No. 14 Year 2011 on the Guidelines for the Implementation of Knowledge Management Program that knowledge management is an obligation of all government agencies.

Lemhannas RI, as a non-ministerial government institution, is the only central government institution which has undertaken a pilot project, since three years ago, to implement the knowledge management system.



Labkurtannas Formulates Recommendations on National Strategic Issues

The National Resilience Measurement Laboratory (Labkurtannas) held a discussion on National Resilience Measurement System (Siskurtannas) and Simulation of Public Policy on Thursday (15/1) at Labkurtannas discussion room in the Astagatra Building, 8th Floor, Lemhannas RI.

The event moderated by Prof. Dr Miyasto, SU was attended by Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, DEA, Principal Secretary and Faculty Members of Lemhannas RI.

Siskurtannas has a great importance in giving recommendations to national leaders with respect to strategic issues being faced in order to establish strong national resilience. This system is one of the solutions to address strategic issues in the society by determining their root causes. In addition, the system can also serve as a simulation framework for political policies for the sake of the nation's future interests.

Prof. Miyasto explained that the national resilience could be measured using relevant data and indicators in the Siskurtannas. Such a system employs two types of benchmarking systems, namely static and dynamic ones.

Both approaches are used to portray the state of national resilience through the movement of parameter values (indicators, variables, determinants, aggregates, provinces), such as quality of education, poverty, unemployment, inequality, nationalistic values and linkages of each indicator.

Meanwhile Budi Susilo Soepandji expressed some important issues to be noted with regards to Siskurtannas, namely: Lemhannas RI management, IT master plan and audit, and Labkurtannas. "The National Resilience Measurement System needs to be further discussed for future improvement," he said.
