Bagus Puruhito Assumes Post as New Lemhannas Deputy Governor

State Intelligence Synergy in Supporting National Security

“Despite of a common misunderstanding of the roles of intelligence services, they actually play an important role for a country as far as the country’s national interests are concerned, especially amidst an ambiguous situation in which it is very difficult for the government to make the best decision for the sake of the country and state’s interests”, said Lemhannas RI Governor Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. when opening a roundtable discussion on Wednesday (4/11), which raised the theme “Developing State Intelligence Synergy to Support National Security for National Resilience”.

The speakers at the event included Deputy Army Chief of Staff Lieutenant General Moh. Erwin Syafitri, Director of State Security from the Police Intelligence Unit of the Police Headquarters Police Brig. Gen. of Police Drs. S. Harunantyo and Expert Staff in Defence and Security from BIN Brig. Gen. CH. Halomon Sidabutar. The primary responders at the event were Professional Expert in National Leadership and National Management System of Lemhannas RI.

Later, Director of State Security from the Police Intelligence Unit of the Police Headquarters Brig. Gen. of Police Drs. S. Harunantyo conveyed in his presentation that, “There are several aspects which cause non-optimal intelligence synergy in the area of security and defence, such as regulations,

policies, budgets, infrastructure and technology”.

The State Intelligence Agency (BIN), which serves as a coordinator in state intelligence affairs, has primary duties and functions to safeguard the national interests and security from all kinds of threats, challenges, obstacles and disturbances. As the state will continue to be faced with issues such as political problems, separatism, foreign subversion, terrorism, cyber war, transnational crimes, national conflicts and others, BIN is expected to provide its users with an assessment in the form of early warning, forecasting and problem-solving.

Deputy for Strategic Studies Prof. Dr. Ir. Djagal Wiseso Marseno, M.Agr. conveyed that there were several factors that caused the nonoptimal synergy of state intelligence, including regulation, management, infrastructure, sectoral ego and budget issues. Therefore, he mentioned that smart intelligence and intelligence functions need to be improved in order to optimize the roles of intelligence units in dealing with any threats.

Additional regulations for the strengthening of the intelligence units need to be established by taking into account the dynamic development of hybrid war, proxy war and cyber war. It is also considered important to establish a leading sector which will manage the entire intelligence activities for the sake of the nation and state’s interests.

“Competition and mounting frictions are now becoming very obvious,” he said when receiving the participants of the Regular Educational Course Program (PPRA) LIII and Short Educational Course Program (PPSA) XX of Lemhannas RI, at the State Palace (4/11).

Just before the briefing, Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Budi Susilo Soepandji, DEA reported that the PPSA XX had completed their course in 5.5 months, which was begun on May 11 and closed on November 5. The PPSA XX, he further continued, was attended by 79 participants, consisting of Echelon 1 and 2 officials from military, police, ministries, non-ministry government institutions and academic institutions. Lemhannas RI also received participants from foreign countries, namely Myanmar, Cambodia, Algeria, Zimbabwe and Malaysia.

Meanwhile, the number of PPRA LIII alumni was 117 people in total, consisting of government officials of the Echelon II level and those from military/police, ministries, mass organizations, political parties, community figures. There were also 11 representatives from other countries, which were from Singapore, Thailand, Myanmar, Cambodia, Sri Lanka, Timor Leste, Papua New Guinea, Australia, Algeria and Zimbabwe.

Lemhannas RI Strengthens Its Commitment to Pursue World-Class Status

On Thursday (5/11), Governor of Lemhannas RI opened a discussion with the theme “Refocusing Lemhannas RI’s Goal to Become a World-Class Institution for 2015-2024 Period”.

The event, which was filled with presentation by WCI Working Group Team”, was intended to strengthen the commitment made by Lemhannas RI in 2011 to become a world-class institution by establishing a common perception of the strategic goal.

There are three main areas for change in order to reach the goal; **first**, educational curriculum (modules, participation of foreign countries, quality and public access to the outcome of Lemhannas’ studies, publication of Lemhannas RI journals, quality of faculty members and resource persons); **second**, non-physical infrastructure (related to human resources, political building, political will, and budget availability); **third**, physical infrastructure (concerning areas, buildings, information and technology facilities).

“In order to achieve a world-class status, Lemhannas needs to develop a clear curriculum reference and enhance its institution’s grand design and organization by setting its main priorities.

The world-class status could only be achieved with a strong and consistent commitment from the leaders as well as active supports and participation from all members of Lemhannas RI. Given the challenges of the strategic environment, there are specific targets that must be met in each stage of the roadmap to become a world-class institution.

Therefore, Lemhannas RI, in its effort to become a world-class institution, should be able to compete in the increasingly competitive global arena by paying special attention to important aspects, such as human resources, teaching-learning process, study outcomes, quality of graduates, cooperation network and people’s perception.



Socio-Cultural and Ideology Aspects Need Serious Attention

Tuesday (10/11), despite of the increase in the composite index of national resilience until the year 2014, it is, however, shown that the Indonesia's national resilience in general is still less robust in the last five years. The strategic aspects of socio-culture and ideology still need serious attention due to the fact that their composite indexes are the lowest among the other aspects.

On the other hand, at the national scale, the economic growth would certainly affect the prosperity. "A nation will be prosperous only if it is able to manage its natural resources as assets for development", stated the Deputy for Strategic Studies Prof. Dr. Ir. Djagal Wiseso Marseno, M.Agr.

With regard to the strategic issue of validation, he further explained that any chaos caused by injustice could be attributed to wrong priorities, which were not oriented toward the national interests.

Director of Institute for the Development of Economics and Finance (INDEF) Enny Sri Hartati, who served as one of the speakers at the event, conveyed that the indicators of economic problems being faced included global economic uncertainty and economic integration issues, economic slowdown, declining economic growth, inflationary pressures on volatile food, exchange rates instability, unmet state revenue targets, unemployment, poverty and increasing inequality.

Based on the issues that developed throughout the year 2014, it was concluded that there are still various issues that need immediate attention, including weakening macro-economic performance, poor quality of human resources, poverty, unemployment, inequality among social groups and regions.

In addition to those, the problems related to national values, food, energy and water security, policy synergies, bureaucracy, regional infrastructure, environment, capacity and quality of natural resources should also be addressed immediately.

On that occasion, Professional Expert in Natural Resources Prof. Dr. Ir. Dadan Umar Daihani, DEA explained the methodology and results of the Indonesia's national resilience measurements from the year 2011 until 2014 in terms of the aspects of geography, natural resources, demography, ideology, politics, economy, socioculture, defence, and security. The data were presented in the form of indexes and images showing resilience indexes of each province.

The discussion held in Gatot Kaca Room, 3rd Floor, Astagatra Building was attended by principal secretary, deputies, faculty members of Lemhannas RI and responders. It was moderated by Brigadier General (Ret.) Agus Susarso, M.Eng. Sc., M.M.

Preparing Strategic Steps for MSME to Face AEC 2015

Thursday (12/11), Micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSME) require some strategic steps to establish economic independence in facing the Asean Economic Community (AEC) 2015. Adopting a multi-dimensional approach, those steps will include improving the knowledge of players of the MSME and broadening business opportunities, increasing efficiency in production processes and business management, increasing market shares of the MSME, improving the capacity and quality of human resources, providing supports for capital access, and establishing conducive business climate on the basis of synergy and mutual cooperation in order to promote national interests.

The issues of MSME and the AEC were raised at the Roundtable Discussion, Third Actual Study, concerning the Strengthening of MSME in Improving Economic Independence for National Resilience. Held in Kresna Room, Astagatra Building, 4th Floor, Jakarta, the discussion was opened by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A., who was accompanied by Deputy for Strategic Studies Prof. Dr. Ir. Djagal Wiseso Marseno, M. Agr. as well as structural officials of Lemhannas RI.

The MSME obviously plays an important role in various economic sectors. It opens up job opportunities, develop local economy and empower local community. It also creates new markets and promote innovation. As proven during the crisis in 1998, MSME was the only economic sector which survived from the collapsed Indonesian economy.

The problems being faced by the MSME currently include the unconducive business climate, limited access to technology and research and development institutions, lack of attention given to MSME, lack of incentives for MSME, undeveloped economic partnership and administrative issues related to micro-credit loans.

“There is no point in praising MSME if we do not do anything to improve its access to the market”, said Director of Institute for the Development of Economy and Finance (INDEF) Dr. Enni Sri Hartati.

The speakers at the event included Secretary of the Ministry of Cooperatives and Small and Medium Enterprises Ir. Agus Muharram, M.SP, Director of Institute for the Development of Economy and Finance (INDEF) Dr. Enni Sri Hartati, Chairman of MSME Association of Jakarta Region Mochammad Ichsan, S.E., and Chairman of the Commission for Business Competition Supervision (KPPU).

Deputy Chairman of Commission VI of the House of Representatives Dodi Reza Alex Noerdin, Lic Econ, M.B.A., Chairman of Posgraduate Program of Planning and Public Policy from the Faculty of Economics and Business, University of Indonesia Dr. Telisa Aulia Falianty, S.E., M.E., SME player / Chairman of the cooperative Koperasi Sejahtera Bersama Iwan Setyawan served as primary responders at the discussion. The event was moderated by Professional Expert in Domestic Political and Economic Affairs from Lemhannas RI.



Indonesia Needs to be Cautious, yet Optimistic in Facing Global Economic Crisis

Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji opened an international seminar with the theme “Strengthening ASEAN Economic Community Resilience in Facing Global Economic Crisis” at Gajah Mada Auditorium, 3rd floor, Panca Gatra Building. Some of Lemhannas RI top officials, namely Deputy Governor Air Marshal Bagus Puruhito S.E., M.M., deputies, faculty members and other structural officials were in attendance.

The international seminar was filled with notable speakers, namely Prof. Wai Ting from the Hongkong Baptist University, Masahito Ambashi from the Economic Research Institute for ASEAN and East Asia, Professor Iwan Jaya Aziz, M.Sc., Ph.D from the University of Indonesia and Cornell University and Director of ASEAN Cooperation from the Ministry of Trade of the Republic of Indonesia Dr. Ir. Donna Gultom, M. Sc.

“We need to be cautious, yet optimistic, in facing the global economic crisis so that we will not be easily affected by it. We will never know for sure what would happen in the future. We should be careful as not to let ourselves controlled by other people’s agenda. We should always put our people’s interests first. Therefore, entering a free trade zone requires good preparation in each sector”, affirmed economic expert Prof. Dorodjatun Kuntjoro Jakti.

The global economic crisis has hit some of ASEAN countries, resulting in economic slowdown in the region.

The strengthening of the regional economic resilience has inevitably become the focal point to create the economic stability for both the region and the countries belonging to the region.

“No one really knows how to cope with the global recession. But one thing for sure is that flexible monetary policy will help”, said Cornell University professor, Iwan Jaya Aziz.

In order to establish regional economic resilience, a common understanding of the parties involved is definitely required. Various forms of economic cooperation, such as Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC), Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RECP), or Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP) have been growing rapidly in order to develop and strengthen the regional economic resilience.

The outcome of the seminar was the conclusion that there were four aspects that needed to be paid attention to and addressed immediately, namely, **first**, the strengthening of the regional economic resilience which will affect the regional political and economic stability; **second**, the global economic powers which could cause global economic crisis; **third**, a global crisis is a multidimensional one which requires a cross-sectoral synergy and multidisciplinary knowledge; and **fourth**, ASEAN and ASEAN Plus Three (APT) should evolve and develop to be one of global economic powers.





Government's PR to Optimize the Management of Public Communication

The Administrative and Bureaucratic Reform Minister Yuddy Chrisnandi conveyed the important roles of the government's public relations (PR) in communicating the government's strategic policies. "It is high time for all government's public relation practitioners to work together to build a synergy in optimizing the management of public communication", uttered Yuddy at the opening ceremony of Bakohumas (the Governmental Public Relations Coordinating Board) at Dyandra Convention Center, Surabaya (17/11).

Furthermore, Yuddy explained that the optimizing of the public communication management was especially required to communicate the government's strategic policies to the people, including the National Movement of Mental Revolution of the State Civil Apparatus (ASN) as a collective national movement.

More in-depth discussion regarding the Mental Revolution was continued to the Panel I Session and Question-Answer Session of the Bakohumas seminar featuring a resource person from the Mental Revolution Working Group Yudi Latif and Staff Expert of the Presidential Chief of Staff Charisma Aryani Albandjar. The event was moderated by Head of Information and Public Relations of the Communications and Information Ministry Ismail Cawidu. In his presentation on government PR roles to support mental revolution movement, Yudi Latif stated that the current social changes had be oriented toward the achievement of national goals. Charisma Aryani Albandjar added that the government public relations had always been at the forefront of every government policy. "The government's targets cannot be achieved if they are not communicated well to the public," uttered Charisma who believed that a real PR practitioner should always be available for 24 hours a day.

Previously, the acting Director of Information and Public Communication from the Communication and Information

Ministry Djoko Agung Harijadi put forth that the Bakohumas gathering, which was held on November 17-19 and attended by around 800 participants from various government institutions, consisted of government PR officials and practitioners. Besides the seminar and discussion, the event was also invigorated by Bakohumas Expo 2015, PR Awards (Anugerah Media Humas) 2015, the inauguration of Bakohumas management board for 2015-2019 period, folk performance festivals and stand-up comedy.

In his remark, Djoko Agung described that the implementation of government public relation concepts required supports from all parties involved at all levels: central, provincial, regencial, municipal governments and public relations community. The relationship between the government and PR community is very important for successful implementation of government policies, hence the convening of the Bakohumas gathering with the theme "the Implementation of Government Public Relations by Government PR practitioners and community for the Acceleration of Mental Revolution Movement".

Other speakers at the event included Member of Commissioner Board from the Financial Services Authority for Consumer Education and Protection Dr. Kusumaningtuti S. Soetiono, S.H.,LLM, Presidential Communications Team Member A.A.
