## Lemhannas RI Governor Conveys Appreciation for the Organizing of Lemhannas Fellowship Program Batch I

**M**onday (23/11), Based on the outcome of the selection process of the Lemhannas Fellowship Program (LFP) 2015 Batch I, 10 participants out of 325 registrants were finally chosen. LFP is a program designed to disseminate national values for all national components, including academics, researchers, military/police officers and others who meet the required qualifications in terms of competence, provincial representation and expertise.

The participants would first attend in-class lectures for 2 weeks at Lemhannas RI before they visited the Institute of Southeast Asian Studies (ISEAS) in Singapore for a more in-depth study. Later on when they returned to Lemhannas RI, they would have to prepare a study paper to be presented in front of the structural officials of Lemhannas RI.

Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. hoped that the first batch of the LFP would become a model for the subsequent batches. "As potential young generations selected from various disciplines and provinces, you are expected to become thinkers who have the ability to shape public opinion in maintaining the unitary state of Indonesia", said Budi Susilo Soepandji.

The Chairman of the Organizing Committee, Deputy for Strategic Study of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Djagal Wiseso Marseno, M.Agr., stated that the LFP would last for one month, and upon the completion of the program, the participants were expected to produce their study paper. "The outcome of the study must be publicized in print or electronic media", he said.

With their newly gained insights, ideas, thinking and conceptions, the LFP participants would write a paper focusing on national resilience. Djagal furthermore added that the alumni, as a critical mass, would serve as the extension of Lemhannas to disseminate national values to the public.

The opening of the event was attended by Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Air Marshal Bagus Puruhito, S.E., M.M., Secretary of the Governing Board of Lemhannas RI Dr. Ardi Partadinata, M.H., M.Si., deputies, chiefs of bureaus and other structural officials of Lemhannas RI.





# Revision of PPRA 2016 Curriculum

**T**uesday (24/11), Lemhannas RI again held a meeting to restructure the curriculum of its 2015 Regular Educational Course Program (PPRA). The meeting agreed on some changes, including the change made to the PPRA duration. Originally lasted for 7.5 months, the program's duration would be reduced to 7 months in order to maintain an effective educational process while achieving the educational targets of Lemhannas RI.

"The curriculum of the year 2016 needs to be restructured while the materials be adjusted according to the development of the knowledge and technology. The participants are expected to develop a holistic way of thinking which allows them to grasp the core of the problems. They are also expected to implement the knowledge that they gain in Lemhannas", said Deputy for the Education of National-level Leaders Maj. Gen. M. Nasir Majid during the meeting.

The meeting also suggested that the qualifications for speakers, tutors, resource persons and anyone engaged in the PPRA program, as well as the requirements for PPRA educational materials, be refined and improved further in order to reflect the competence based curriculum, which consists of knowledge, skill and attitude.

Nasir Majid continued that the assessment grading of the characters also needed to be improved as it was one of the benchmarks of the educational program. "No matter how smart someone is, it means nothing if she or he is not equipped with a good character", he said.

The meeting held at the Kresna Room, 4rd Floor, Astagatra, which discussed the curriculum of PPRA 2016, was attended by Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Air Vice Marshal Bagus Puruhito, S.E., M.M., deputies, senior lecturers, senior analysts, professional experts and structural officials of Lemhannas RI.

# Media Plays Important Role in Building National Resilience

**I**n its routine communication forum with media people, Lemhannas RI, through the Bureau of Public Relations, again held a coffee morning with the editors-in-chief of several media outlets on the Mezzanine III floor, Tri Gatra Building, Monday (30/11).

Chairman of the Press Council Bagir Manan, who served as one of the speakers at the event, expressed that the press could not be left out in the effort to build national resilience. "It is important to have an established national order in which the press could position themselves well as it is one of important pillars in the society", said the holder of the doctoral degree in Constitutional Law from the Padjajaran University.

On the occasion, Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji put an emphasis on the importance of the roles played by the media in building national resilience. "With their coverage of various events at national level, media definitely play an important role in national unity, and therefore, they should take reasonable care to ensure that the information they disseminate was not false or misleading.

The coffee morning was an informal forum for Lemhannas RI leaders to discuss relevant issues with mass media people, allowing them to gain more convergent views on the roles of media in building national resilience.

Other than Bagir Manan, the event was also attended by editors-in-chief from several media outlets, including Budiman Tanuredjo from Kompas, Syukri Rahmatullah from Okezone.com, Arifin Asyhad from Detik.com, Arif Zulkifli from Tempo magazine as well as RRI News Head Agung Susatyo, Radio Station Manager Benedictus Herminanto, Deputy Director of Media Indonesia News Reporting Gaudensius Suhardi and Kompas TV Deputy Editor-

in-Chief Yogi A. Nugraha.

On the opportunity, Budiman Tanuredjo made an interesting statement regarding the function of media in strengthening national resilience when saying that, "As far as the national resilience is concerned, the media functions as an early warning system for imminent events".

Meanwhile, Syukri Rahmatullah talked about the new challenges for national resilience that most people are unaware of. "As around 7.71 million Indonesian people are using the Internet, we need to pay more attention on the security of our digital media industry. We should exercise caution about the misuse of Internet to spread messages of radicalism and to do illegal activities, including hacking", said Syukri.

Some cautions are required in order to prevent the negative consequences of the Internet from occurring, including using systems and equipment that ensure the security of communication and information system, using Indonesian products and having an encrypted system in order to prevent information thefts.

Cooperation between or among countries should be carried out for the mutual benefits of all parties practicing it. In fact, it should also encourage the engaging parties to safeguard their constitution, dignity and national interests instead. Therefore, sometimes we need to be careful with our competitive instincts", said Professor in Economics from the University of Indonesia Prof. Dr. Ir. Sri Eddy Swasono when serving as a speaker in a roundtable discussion of the continued Study on Indonesia' Strategies as Driving Force in the Implementation of the Asean Economic Community for National Resilience" held at Kresna Room, 4rd Floor, Astagatra Building, Lemhannas RI, on Tuesday (01/12).

During the discussion, Chairman of the Presidential Advisory Board Prof. Dr. Sri Adiningsih put forth that Indonesia needed to be well-prepared to face the MEA, otherwise it would face a serious consequence.

Unfortunately, the Indonesia's economic development in the last several years had not shown a favorable trend toward improvement in national resilience. Therefore, the government is

required to prepare some strategic measures to face the MEA by restructuring its national policies. With the right measures in place, the competitiveness of Indonesian human resources and industry can be improved and robust economic development can eventually be achieved.

Furthermore, in order to ensure that the MEA is not positioned toward competition, there are some aspects that need to be paid a serious attention when a country engages in bilateral and multilateral cooperation. Engaging parties should not only improve its local efficiency, national productivity and synergy, they should also show mutual respect for tradition, culture and sovereignty of each other without sacrificing their own self-identify and culture.

Mass media also plays an important role in educating the people on relevant issues. "In the case of MEA, the media needs to inform the people of any strategic issues related to this program", said Assistant President Director of Metro TV Shanti Retno Ruwyastuti.

# National Values Required in Provision of Health Services

**W**ednesday (02/12), Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A in his remark during the opening ceremony of the Strengthening Program of National Values for the Indonesian Medical Council (KKI) and the Healthcare Social Security Agency (BPJS Kesehatan) stated that the strengthening program of national values was very important to encourage and motivate the growth of nationalism.

**W**ednesday (02/12), a delegation of the National Management Course (NMC) from Pakistan, which was led by Naeem Aslam, paid a visit to Lemhannas RI. The visiting guests were received by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. at Nusantara II Room, 1st Floor, Trigatra Building.

During the discussion session, the NMC received a general explanation on Lemhannas RI duties and functions, including organizing educational course programs for civilians, military and police officers who would be projected as future national leaders. Lemhannas RI has two educational course programs, namely the 7.5-month Regular Educational Course Program (PPRA) and the 5.5-month Short Educational Course Program (PPSA).

The main activities in both programs included the Introduction of Strategic Objects, Domestic Strategic Studies (SSDN), Overseas

Strategic Studies (SSLN), Optional Programs, Simulation of National Management System, and Individual Working Paper (Taskap). Through the SSLN, the participants would be able to visit certain destination countries in order to learn more about their objective conditions in terms of certain strategic aspects and use them later as materials for their study paper.

The educational curriculum of Lemhannas RI also contains seminars to discuss various strategic issues.

Professional Expert of Economic Affairs Dr. Rosita S. Noor, M.A. said that, apart from educational course programs, Lemhannas RI also provides Strengthening Program of National Insight for Government officials in the Regions, ranging from governors, mayors to regents with the purpose of developing a strong 'sense of being Indonesian'.

“We are supposed to have only one single management system as far as central and regional governments are concerned,” said Professional Expert of Lemhannas RI Dr. Kausar A.S., M.Si. when giving a lecture to the visiting students from the Faculty of Economics, Tarumanagara University in Trigatra Building, 3rd Floor East, Constitution Room, Lemhannas RI on Thursday (3/11).

Dr. Kausar A. The freedom euphoria that still engulfs many places in Indonesia has resulted in inconsistent policy making and failure to fulfil ones’ basic obligations and responsibilities. Therefore,

a sense of togetherness, which is based on the spirit of nationalism, is needed to strengthen the national unity and integrity.

Furthermore, Dr. Kausar explained in his lecture that mental revolution was a government policy reform which sought to generate individuals with strong characters, advanced and modern-thinking who would run the country with strong integrity, work ethics and with a principle of mutual cooperation.

“Through this lecture on national insight, the students would be able to learn more about national archipelagic outlook”, said the Lecturer of Faculty of Economics Ronnie Resdianto Masman, S.E., M.A., M.M. who led the students’ visit to Lemhannas RI.

On the occasion, Chief of Public Relations Bureau of Lemhannas RI Commodore E. Estu Prabowo, M.Sc. also delivered a presentation on the general introduction to Lemhannas RI. The lecture was ended with a question-and-answer session and group photo.







# Projection of Indonesia 2045

**T**uesday (8/12), “There will always be imbalance in government policies” stated Lecturer in International Relations from the University of Indonesia Drs. Makmur Keliat, Ph.D. during a discussion on the theme “the projection of Indonesia 2045” at the National Resilience 2045 Seminar held in NKRI Room, Pancagatra Building, 3rd Floor, Lemhannas RI.

The seminar opened by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. in Gadjah Mada Auditorium was attended by Principal Secretary of Lemhannas RI Police Commissioner General Drs. Suhardi Alius, M.H., deputies, faculty members and structural officials of Lemhannas RI as well as other invitees.

The seminar was divided into two classes, Class A and Class B. Class A, which was held at Bhinneka Tunggal Ika Room, discussed issues related to aspects of geography, demography, natural resources and economy, while Class B in NKRI room addressed issues of ideology, politics, socio-culture, defense and security.

A member of the House of Representatives from Commission VII Dr. H. Kurtubi, S.E., M.Sc. conveyed that based on the current situation, human resources, productivity and infrastructure were the key for successful national development. Furthermore, he explained that a serious attention also needed to be given on the issue of population. Indonesia should be able to take advantage of its demographic bonus, labor supply, savings and human capital.

According to Prof. Dr. Hartono, D.E.A., D.E.S.S. from the Faculty of Geography of the Gadjah Mada University, Indonesia had huge potentials due to its strategic location, however, such potentials had not been fully utilized due to lack of synergy among all relevant sectors and stakeholders.

Deputy III to the Presidential Chief of Staff for the Assessment of Economic Affairs Denni P. Purbasari, S.E., M.Sc., Ph. D. added that based on the data of the year 2014 and the previous years, the aspects of demography, education, investment, and productivity were shown to be improving until the year 2045, despite of the weak economic technocracy, legal uncertainty and less favorable policies.

## Lemhannas and BNN Join Hands in War on Drugs

**M**onday (21/12), "We need to urgently tackle the widespread drug abuse in the society in any of its forms, whether they are of natural or synthetic origin, or any other new types", said the Chief of National Narcotics Agency (BNN) Pol. Comr. Gen Drs. Budi Waseso, S.H. during the signing event of the MoU between Lemhannas RI and BNN at Nusantara Room, 1st floor of Tri Gatra Building.

There are now 348 new types of synthetic drugs in the world. 36 types of the professionally made drugs have entered Indonesia. According to a survey conducted by BNN, it was revealed that during 2014 there were around 4 million children in Indonesia who had consumed drugs. This figure shows that Indonesia is already in a state of drug emergency which requires a serious attention from all elements of the nation in order to solve it.

The MoU signing between Lemhannas RI dan BNN was a part of the efforts to enhance Lemhannas RI role in the development of a national strategy for the eradication of the abuse and trafficking of the illicit substance known as P4GN and make Indonesia free from the threats of illicit drugs.

Governor of Lemhannas RI furthermore explained that the MoU was a joint effort between Lemhannas RI and BNN to

collaborate in enlightening and strenghtening the society so that they could contribute to the establishment of robust national resilience.

The effort was also intended to make the implementation of the P4GN a success in terms of reducing the number of drug abuse victims so that a healthy society could be established.

On the occasion, Budi Waseso said that Lemhannas and BNN were expected to work together in the campaigns to disseminate information on the dangers and impacts of drug abuse and trafficking. "The dangers of illicit substances should be classified as one of the indicators in measuring the national resilience so that the people will be aware of its dangerous impacts on the nation", added Budi Waseso.

The agreement between Lemhannas RI and BNN includes, first, the cooperation on the improvement of human resources quality through education and training programs, exchange of expert staffs and strengthening program of national values; second, exchange of information, joint strategic studies.

The MoU signing event was also attended by Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Air Marshal Bagus Puruhito, S.E. as well as structural officials of Lemhannas RI and BNN.

## Lemhannas RI Strengthens Cooperation with IHEDN France

**L**emhannas delegation, led by Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A, attended the third bilateral seminar between Lemhannas RI and L'Institut des Hautes Études de Défense Nationale (IHEDN), at IHEDN office in Paris, France, on 15-16 December 2015.

In the visit, Governor was accompanied by several professional experts and officials of Lemhannas RI, namely Professional Expert of Natural Resources Prof. Dr. Ir. Dadan Umar Daihani, D.E.A., Professional Expert of Leadership Maj. Gen. (Ret) Albert Inkiriwang, Professional Expert of National Management System Rear Admiral TNI (Ret). Soemindiharso, Professional Expert of National Management System Dr. Avanti Fontana, Chief of Public Relations Bureau Commodore E. Estu Prabowo, and Chief of Cooperation Bureau Brig. Gen. Ivan R Pelealu, S.E.

The 2-day seminar was a continuation of the two previous seminars that were held on 26 November 2012 in Paris and 6 Mei 2014 in Jakarta, respectively.

In the first day of the program, the two parties exchanged their thoughts and perspectives in a seminar on the dynamics of strategic environment in their respective regions. Lemhannas RI delegation conveyed a presentation on the theme "Indonesia and its Regional Security Environment", while the IHEDN delivered a presentation on the theme "France and Its Regional Security Environment".

Governor of Lemhannas RI pointed out, in his remarks, that the discussion on the current strategic issues of the respective region, was expected to deepen a mutual understanding of the geopolitical dynamics that would be beneficial for the national interests of both parties. Furthermore, he also elaborated on the significance of the bilateral dialogue that would be held on the second day. "The bilateral dialogue has great strategic importance for closer relations between both countries, especially between Lemhannas RI and IHEDN", he added.

The bilateral dialogue between the government of the Republic of Indonesia and the Republic of France, which was held on December 16, 2015 was then ended with the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding by both parties on cooperation in the field of education and strategic studies.

The signed MoU will serve as a stimulant for both parties to establish closer relations, i.e., through government-to-government diplomacy, which is expected to develop later to people-to-people diplomacy.

It is also reported that both parties have agreed to convene the 4th Bilateral Seminar between Lemhannas RI and IHEDN in Jakarta in 2016. In addition to that, it is also agreed that both parties will carry out an exchange of their faculty members and course participants as the implementation of the MoU.
