# The Governor of Lemhannas RI Gives Speech to Participants of Training for Trainers

Participants of the Training of Trainers Lemhannas RI listened to the speech given by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo on Tuesday (16/11) virtually. On this occasion, the Governor emphasized that it is important for the participants to be able to play their role as the actor of change.

The participants that consist of trainers and teachers have the function to transform students who have yet understood or whose understanding were weak into people who fully understand the values of national insight so that later they could become agents of the values of national insight by transforming the core of the Four Basic Consensus of the Nation to their respective students.

In addition, the participants of the Training of Trainers held by Lemhannas RI are expected to be able to implement

educational or training methods that optimize student participation during the training. "The trainers and teachers will later carry out their duties to provide students with a student-centered methodology," said the Governor of Lemhannas RI.

According to the Governor, conventional procedures that allow students to play a passive role must be abandoned. Currently, students must play an active role in thinking and they have to be trained to have the ability to think and analyse critically. "Critical thinking is one of the foundations that Lemhannas RI uses to provide comprehension to students," said the Governor of Lemhannas RI.

The Governor hopes that the participants who take part in the Training of Trainers Lemhannas RI can be consistent with their commitment to the Four Basic Consensus of the Nation.

The trainers who later become alumni of Lemhannas RI are expected not only to memorize or verbalize the understanding but also to be able to reflect it in daily behaviour.

Later, the alumni are expected to be committed to upholding Pancasila and be able to implement it and be responsible for always adhering to the articles contained in the constitution of the Republic of Indonesia. In addition, in the context of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia, alumni of Lemhannas RI are expected to have the competence and determination to prioritize the nation and state interests by maintaining territorial integrity and unity. The alumni are also expected to have the competence and commitment to always respect and appreciate the diversity in cultures, religions, ethnicities, languages and groups.

# Socialization of the Implementation of Public Information Openness

As a form of commitment to improve the quality of information services and transparent government administration, Lemhannas RI held a socialization on the Implementation of Public Information Openness on Wednesday (17/11) virtually. The socialization was carried out to support the commitment of Lemhannas RI to implement a transparent government administration and to socialize the urgency and importance of understanding Public Information Openness.

The Prime Secretary of Lemhannas RI, Police Commissioner General Drs. Purwadi Arianto, M.Si, who opened the socialization event, in his speech said that public information openness is one of the important characteristics of a democratic nation that upholds people's sovereignty to realize good governance.

The speakers present at the event were Commissioner of the Central Information Commission (Komisi Informasi Pusat/KIP) Arif Adi Kuswardono and KIP Expert Agus Wijayanto Nugroho. The Commissioner of KIP said that the

term Public Information Openness is often misunderstood because many parties think that Public Information Openness is only related to the duties of public relations or information division, and press freedom. However, the scope of this term is much broader and deeper. "Public Information Openness is the fulfilment of the public's right to information through transparency in the management of public organisations through information management mechanisms," explained the Commissioner of KIP.

Furthermore, the Commissioner of KIP emphasized that the information management mechanism is the duty of the Information Management and Documentation Officer (Pejabat Pengelola Informasi dan Dokumentasi/PPID). Therefore, the duty of PPID is more complex than that of general public relations, because it must create a synergy of all stakeholders and policies in the public agency. "Information from public agency is important because information openness is regulated in Law Number 14 of 2008, concerning open government and good governance functioning as the government

platform that is modern, democratic and prioritizing people' welfare," he explained.

In line with this, KIP Expert Agus Wijayanto Nugroho explained that in the PPID organisational structure regulated in the Information Commission Regulation No. 1 of 2021, the duties PPID can be attached to the main PPID and the Acting PPID can be assigned in each Echelon I work unit. "The management of information services can be assigned to the Acting PPID, but the coordination must always be led by the main PPID," said the KIP Expert.

In his speech during the closing of the socialization, the Head of the Public Relations Bureau of Lemhannas RI, Brigadier General A. Yudi Hartono, S.Sos., M.M., M.Han., stated that Lemhannas RI continues to make innovation and collaboration in order to improve the quality of the implementation of public information openness. "All efforts that are made need to be accompanied by high commitment and support from the leaders and all personnel of Lemhannas RI," he concluded.

# FGD Intellectual Exercise Ahead of 2024 Simultaneous Regional

Lemhannas RI held a Focus Group Discussion (FGD) Intellectual Exercise (IE) with the title "Questioning the Appointment of Temporary Heads of Regions Ahead of 2024 Simultaneous Regional Election", on Thursday (18/11). Four speakers were present at the FGD, including the Director of Facilitation for Regional Heads and Legislative Council (DPRD) of the Ministry of Home Affairs (Kemendagri) Drs. Andi Bataralifu, M.Si., Deputy Chairman of Commission II of the Indonesian House of Representatives (DPR RI) Dr. Junimart Girsang, S.H., M.B.A., M.H., Founder of the Indonesian Public Opinion Study and Discussion Group Survey Institute (KedaiKOPI) Dr. Hendri Budi Satrio, CIGS, and Researcher from the Department of Politics and Social Change at CSIS Arya Fernandes, M.Si.

The Governor of Lemhannas RI, Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo, stated that the theme of the study was exceptionally motivating because it contained a very broad scope horizontally and vertically. Horizontally, it is related to the references to various laws and regulations regarding objects viewed from various stakeholder perspectives. Vertically, in the end, the issue of appointing temporary regional heads needs to be based on a national perspective which leads to the national interest.

Furthermore, the Governor also conveyed several reasons for selecting the issue to be studied. First, there is more than one statutory regulation that can be used as the basis for the same object and situation. Second, the time range available for temporary officials can be used, within their authority, to make policies that could potentially conflict with national interests.

Third, considering the political practice to date, vacancies to be filled as temporary officials can be a tug-of-war for various partisan political interests. Fourth, conditions like this can produce to conditions of stability that are not

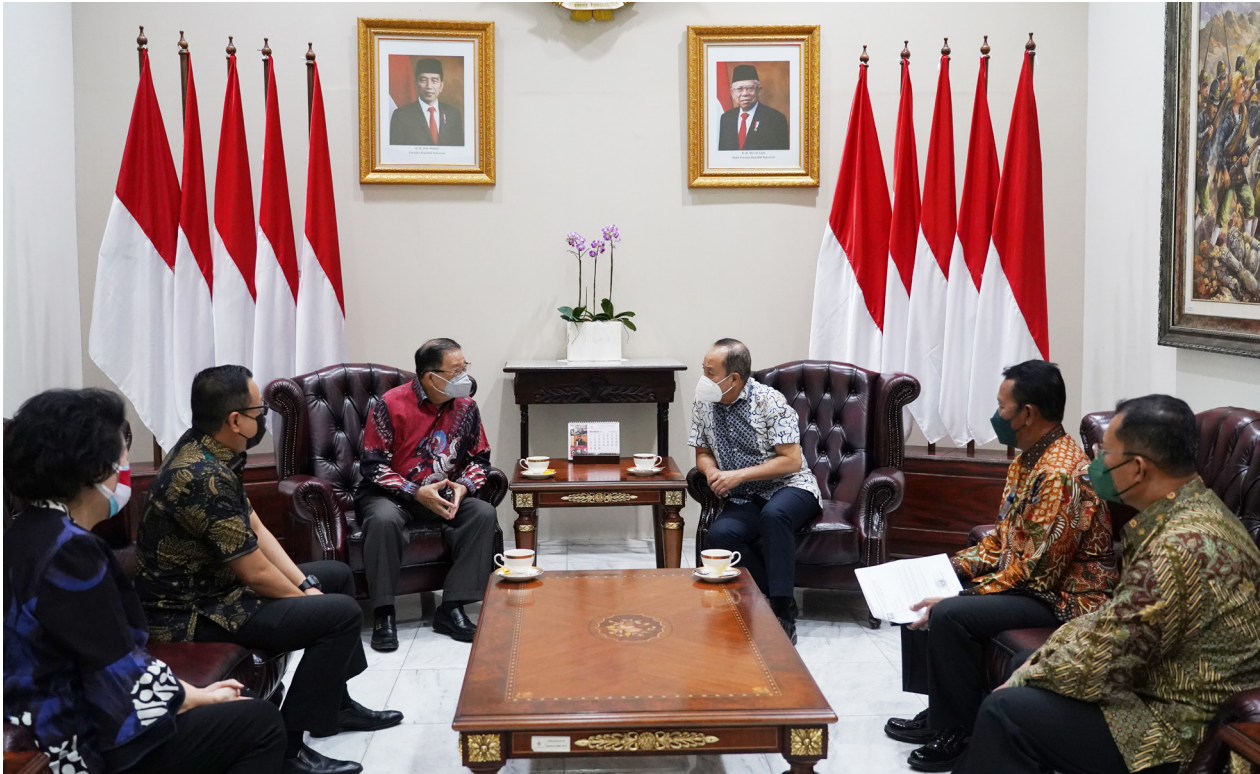

conducive in various aspects in order to realize the sustainability of the leadership baton at the central and regional levels.

# Socialization of Techniques for Regulations Drafting in Ministries and Institutions

Lemhannas RI held a Socialization of Fostering Legal Awareness regarding Techniques for Regulations Drafting in Ministries and Institutions on Tuesday (23/11). The Head of Academic Manuscript Drafting of national Law Development Agency The Ministry of Law and Human Rights of the Republic of Indonesia, Adharinalti, S.H, M.H., was present in the occasion.

"The success of a ministry and/or institution in producing a legal or

regulatory product can be seen from the extent to which the process of drafting a legal or regulatory product is carried out through the correct mechanism in accordance with the technique of establishing regulations," said the Head of Cooperation and Legal Bureau of Lemhannas RI, Commodore Sri Widodo, S.T., CHRMP while opening the socialization.

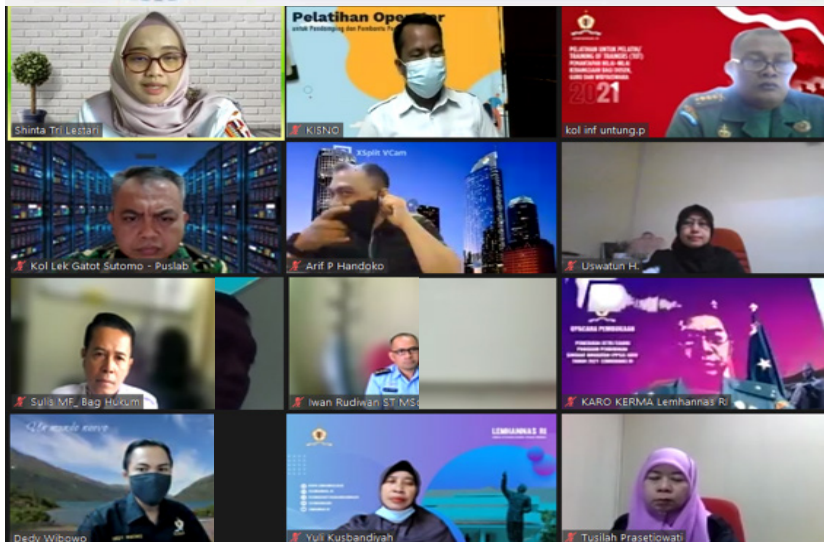
Until now, Lemhannas RI has produced many legal or regulatory

products in the form of governor regulations that regulate internal institution. However, related to the quality of the legal or regulatory products, a more comprehensive and in-depth learning process is still needed, especially in the process or technique of drafting laws and regulations.

In this regard, the Socialization of Fostering Legal Awareness regarding Techniques for Drafting Regulations in Ministries and Institutions was carried out. "It is hoped that the personnel of Lemhannas RI will gain knowledge that can be used as a reference in drafting laws and regulations within Lemhannas RI," said the Head of Cooperation and Legal Bureau of Lemhannas RI.

Meanwhile, in his explanation, the Head of Academic Manuscript Drafting of national Law Development Agency The Ministry of Law and Human Rights of the Republic of Indonesia, Adharinalti, S.H, M.H., said that the guideline during the drafting of laws and regulations at the planning, drafting, discussion, ratification, announcement, even monitoring and review levels was the 1945 Constitution of the Republic of Indonesia.

Meanwhile, the Head of Academic Manuscript Drafting of national Law Development Agency the Ministry of Law and Human Rights of the Republic of Indonesia explained the stages of drafting laws and regulations, namely the preparation of Draft Bill (RUU) proposed by the President and the House of Representatives of the Republic of Indonesia (DPR). Based on Law Number 12 of 2011, the power to make laws is within the authority of the DPR, but the President has the right to submit Draft Bills to the DPR. It is also explained that in making a Draft Bill, one must follow the Attachment II of Law Number 12 of 2011 concerning the procedures to formulate a Draft Bill and its implementation regulations.





# The Governor of Lemhannas RI as Speaker at ALPI

The Governor of Lemhannas RI, Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo, was present as speaker at the Accelerated Leadership Program for Pelabuhan Indonesia (ALPI) on Tuesday (23/11) at the Indonesia Maritime Museum. On this occasion, the Governor conveyed to all participants to focus on improving leadership effectiveness after the merger of Pelindo I to Pelindo IV.

In his presentation, the Governor of Lemhannas RI mentioned the effectiveness of leadership that can improve the performance in the context of developing an output-oriented culture. According to him, this needs to be done immediately to build competitiveness in competing with similar companies from other countries in the world.

In addition, the Governor also stated that in an organisation consisting of members with different backgrounds, it must be united in a vision and mission of the organisation and can be achieved through proper communication. "When it comes to leadership, the conducive condition development for a process of change can not only be demanded from members of the organisation, but also be built by leaders. That's what makes

communication effective," he said.

The Governor also revealed that leaders must be able to build trust within the organisation. With proper and effective communication, every leader must also be able to consider the place, time, and with whom to communicate. Because every situation requires a different way of communication. Through communication, concrete leadership practices will be built. "We have to learn to search for concrete forms, don't talk only at the idealistic level, at the jargon level, at the tagline level," he said.

Regarding the competitiveness that was mentioned earlier, the Governor explained further that one thing that can raise competitiveness is to do self-introspection and to study the self-potential. "The most important thing is the ability to justly do self-introspection," he said.

The Governor emphasized that it is uncomfortable to do introspection on one's shortcomings. However, according to him, the more honesty in introspection and self-assessment, the greater the opportunities to overcome the shortcomings and lead to the

creation of competitiveness. "Building competitiveness, although the orientation is to compete with other countries, the first step is to conduct an inventory of your own strength, weakness, opportunity, and threat," he concluded.

# Socialization of Public Service Complaint Management Through SP4N-Lapor!

Lemhannas RI held a Socialization of Public Service Complaint Management Socialization Through the National Public Service Complaints and Management System – the People's Online Aspiration and Complaint Service on Wednesday (24/11) virtually. The speakers for the socialization were the Assistant Deputy for Public Service Information System at The Ministry of State Apparatus Empowerment and Bureaucratic Reform (Kemenpan RB) Drs. Yanuar Ahmad, MPA and Public Complaint Analyst Kemenpan RB Alfian Afan.

"Lemhannas RI as one of the government institutions, is obliged to manage SP4N-Lapor! as a form of accountability for the implementation of public services," said the Prime Secretary of Lemhannas RI, Police Commissioner General Drs. Purwadi Arianto, M.Si., when opening the socialization. This obligation is mandated in Articles 36 and 37 of Law Number 25 of 2009 concerning Public Services which require every public service provider to provide a means for complaints and assign competent personnel to manage complaints.

On this occasion, Assistant Deputy for Public Service Information System at The Ministry of State Apparatus Empowerment and Bureaucratic Reform (Kemenpan RB) Drs. Yanuar Ahmad, MPA explained that SP4N-Lapor! has the principle of "no wrong door policy" which

means that it is the right of the people to have their complaints in get to the correct authorized public service providers. Until now SP4N-Lapor! Is managed by five parties, namely the Ministry of State Apparatus Empowerment and Bureaucratic Reform, the Ministry of Internal Affairs of the Republic of Indonesia, the Ministry of Communication and Information Technology of the Republic of Indonesia, The Executive Office of the President of the Republic of Indonesia, and Ombudsman of the Republic of Indonesia.

"Complaint management aims to perform better public services," said the Assistant Deputy for Public Service Information System at The Ministry of State Apparatus Empowerment and Bureaucratic Reform. Furthermore, he said that complaint management is only an aspect of public services.

"Many think that complaint management is the end of the implementation of public services. However, complaint management is the main component to improve the quality of public services," said the Assistant Deputy for Public Service Information System at The Ministry of State Apparatus Empowerment and Bureaucratic Reform. There are three things that can be observed with complaints from the community, namely the rights of the community, evaluation, and clarification.

Meanwhile, Public Complaints Analyst Kemenpan RB, Alfian Afan who was also a speaker in the socialization, explained the action plan for the complaint management at the institution level. The Public Complaints Analyst of the Kemenpan RB emphasized that each institution, in accordance with the mandate of the SP4N-Lapor! roadmap, must prepare an action plan in accordance with the ideals of the roadmap to realize a complaint management system that has fast and reliable responses and solutions.

"This goal will certainly be the cumulative efforts from all institutions that manage SP4N-Lapor!. It is not the responsibility of the central admin or 5 institutions alone, but is a shared responsibility of all institutions that manage SP4N-Lapor!, including Lemhannas RI," said the Public Complaints Analyst Kemenpan RB.

The Head of the Public Relations Bureau of Lemhannas RI, Brigadier General A. Yudi Hartono, S.Sos., M.M., M.Han. who closed the socialization said that Lemhannas RI as a public service provider continues to improve the quality of public services. One of the efforts made is to improve the management of public service complaints through SP4N-Lapor!. "Of course the good management of public service complaints through SP4N-Lapor!. can be achieved with the support and commitment of the leaders and all personnel of Lemhannas RI," he concluded.



# Closing of the Strengthening of National Values Program and Training of Trainers (TOT) Lemhannas RI in 2021 Virtually

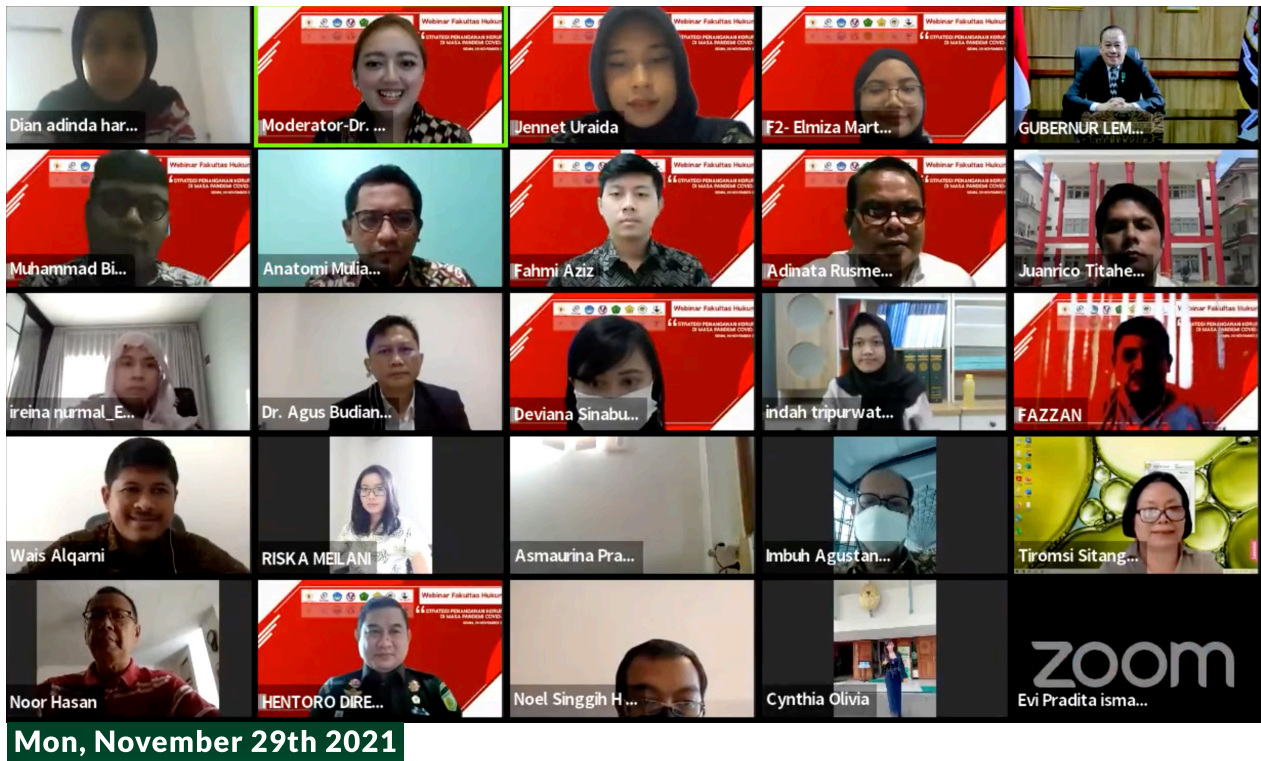

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## Webinar on Corruption Handling Strategies during the Covid-19 Pandemic

The Governor of Lemhannas RI, Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo, was present as the key speaker at the Webinar held by the Faculty of Law, Esa Unggul University, with the theme "Strategies for Handling Corruption during the Covid-19 Pandemic", on Monday (29/11) virtually.

In his presentation, the thing that is of concern of the Governor was the phenomenon of corruption that had entered the lives of people to the point that many corruption practices occur during the pandemic. Emergencies resulting from the pandemic require a quick emergency response. Quick emergency response is carried out by using discretionary authority in a conscious and planned manner which is carried out without heeding administrative order. This emergency is then used as a pretext for prioritizing speed over transparency, which indirectly opens up potential gaps for corruption practices. The survey results from the Indonesian Survey Institute (LSI) show that the trend of corruption cases during the Covid-19 pandemic is increased to 39.6%.

The Governor considered that the strategy for dealing with corruption during the Covid-19 pandemic is no different

from handling general corruption. However, handling corruption during the Covid-19 pandemic still needs to pay attention to the special characteristics that apply in handling corruption during the Covid-19 pandemic. "This situation has becoming difficult because the policy to handle the Covid-19 pandemic contains two-sided challenges in dealing with the Covid-19 pandemic, namely health and the economy which cannot be prioritized one over another," he said.

Then, the Governor explained that the strategy for dealing with corruption in general, especially in the aspect of law enforcement, always gives a repressive impression. Parties involved in corruption eradication are considered to have yet put their preventive efforts to the maximum. In this case, the essence in question is the supervision of the funds being distributed in accordance with the applicable regulations. "Corruption prevention and eradication efforts during the Covid-19 pandemic is extremely important and urgent so that corruption cases stop increasing and the government programs can be carried out on target," he explained.

Prevention of corruption should not only become a slogan. It is necessary

to build an anti-corruption system that can detect corrupt behaviour early on and facilitate anti-corruption education to build integrity and trustworthiness in various groups. "I hope this activity is beneficial in conveying comprehensive and concrete views and thoughts in efforts to handle corruption during the Covid-19 pandemic," the Governor concluded.



# Lemhannas RI Attends the Commemoration of the International Day of Persons with Disabilities

**H**ead of the Public Relations Bureau of Lemhannas RI, Brigadier General A. Yudi Hartono, S.Sos., M.M., M.Han., representing the Prime Secretary of Lemhannas RI, Police Commissioner General Drs. Purwadi Arianto, M.Si, attended the 2021 International Day of Persons with Disabilities (HDI) virtually. The event, which was held for four days, was opened on Wednesday (1/12) and broadcasted live from the Aneka Bhakti Building, Ministry of Social Affairs of the Republic of Indonesia.

Reported from kemensos.go.id, the annual HDI commemoration is to answer the challenges and problems faced by persons with disabilities. This commemoration aimed to increase public awareness about disability, to eliminate stigma against persons with disabilities, and to provide support to increase independence and equal rights of persons with disabilities in various aspects of life. The objective is in line with the 2021 HDI's theme, "Leadership and Participation of Persons with Disabilities Towards an Inclusive, Accessible and Sustainable World Order Post-Covid-19".

In the series of 2021 HDI commemoration, various events were held, namely publications and socialisation, webinar series, exhibitions, handing over of Social Rehabilitation Assistance (ATENSI), inclusion celebrations, social counselling and painting, and the HDI peak event in 2021, namely the inauguration of the National Commission for Disability (KND) commissioner.

"International Day of Persons with Disabilities is not only a ceremony," the Minister of Social Affairs of the Republic of Indonesia, Tri Rismaharani, stated at a press conference. According to her, International Day of Persons with Disabilities can be commemorated by displaying works produced by persons with disabilities because they are able to create more.

The Minister of Social Affairs hopes that in the future there will be no more discrimination against persons with disabilities, in any sector of life. It is hoped that there will be easier accessibility and that people with disabilities will be provided with facilities that are adapted to their conditions of disability. "My dream is that there is no longer a difference, give them a chance," she hoped.

"I believe that behind the limitations that God gave them, surely God will also give them other advantages," said the Minister of Social Affairs. It is hoped that every level of society will start to see that if persons with disabilities are given equal opportunities, they will also be able to shine.

"International Day of Persons with Disabilities is actually a momentum for all of us to remind ourselves of the importance of how we respect, fulfil, and protect the rights of persons with disabilities," said General Chairperson of the Indonesian Association of Persons with Disabilities (PPDI), Gufroni Sakaril, who was also present at the press conference.

Furthermore, the General Chairperson of PPDI stated that the challenges in disability issues are not only regarding social problems. There are other problems as well, one of which is the low level of education. Many people with disabilities have very low school participation rates. "This is a problem of our country, if good education is not obtained, it will be difficult to be independent in the future," he said.
