## Lemhannas RI Won the Excellent Category in the Evaluation Results of Public Services

The Deputy for National-Level Leaders Education of Lemhannas RI has been named a Public Service Provider Unit in the Excellent Category for Ministries/Institutions in 2021. The award was presented in the Submission of Evaluation Results and Public Service Awards for Ministries, Institutions, and Local Governments in 2021 in Jakarta, on Tuesday (8/3/22).

Previously, in 2021 the Ministry of the Evaluation Results of Public Services (PANRB) had monitored and evaluated 548 local government agencies, both district/city and provincial as well as 84 ministries/agencies. The performance evaluation of public service providers is carried out by assessing six aspects, namely, service policies, HR professionalism, infrastructure, public service information systems, consultation and complaints, and innovation.

The results of the monitoring and evaluation show that the public service index (IDP) of ministries and institutions on a national scale is at 4.00 or in category B (good). Meanwhile, the local

government's public service index as a whole achieved a score of 3.58 which was also included in category B (good).

Deputy for Public Service of Ministry of PANRB Prof. Dr. Diah Natalisa, MBA. in her report stated that the monitoring and evaluation of IDP aims to determine the extent to which the service provider unit is able to fulfil various aspects of excellent service as a form to improve comprehensive and even public services for all public service users.

On this occasion, the Minister of PANRB conveyed the direction of the President of the Republic of Indonesia who wanted every government apparatus to have the spirit of serving and helping the community. "Let's be proud to serve the community, absorb the aspirations of the community in order to make it easier for the them to take care of various problems because every government apparatus must have the same orientation, which is to provide the best service to the community," he concluded, inviting all parties to be proud to give excellent service.

## The Governor of Lemhannas RI Visits the Ministry of PUPR

The Governor of Lemhannas RI Andi Widjajanto visited and had a discussion with the Minister of Public Works and Public Housing (PUPR), Dr. Ir. M. Basuki Hadimuljono, M.Sc. at the same time strengthening good relations between institutions on Thursday (10/03/22) at the PUPR Ministry Park.

The meeting discussed the study between Lemhannas RI and the Ministry of PUPR regarding the resilience of the New State Capital (IKN), Nusantara. One of the ideas that emerged was the readiness to face threats, obstacles, and disturbances that might be faced in the future. "The preparation of future concepts is expected to be able to project and adopt new technologies in the development of the new capital city which will also be followed by the emergence of new challenges and vulnerabilities due



to the adoption of technology," said the Governor.

The governor also assessed the importance of collaboration between relevant ministries/agencies in IKN development. "Hopefully, Lemhannas RI together with the Ministry of PUPR and the IKN Authority can prepare the main pillars to strengthen the resilience of the New Capital City early, so that strategic vulnerabilities due to the emergence of the capital city, both in terms of defense, security, demographic dynamics, economy, as well as technology adoption can be mitigated quickly," he said.

The initial stage of IKN development begins with the construction of major infrastructure such as the Presidential Palace, MPR/DPR RI Building, also includes the initial stage of ASN (State Civil Apparatus) housing.

In addition to the Governor of Lemhannas RI and the Minister of PUPR, also present in the discussion the Secretary General of the Ministry of PUPR Ir. Mohammad Zainal Fatah, Expert Staff to the Minister for Technology, Industry and Environment Mr. Endra S. Atmawidjaja, S.T., M.Sc., D.E.A., and several Special Staff of the Minister.

## Lemhannas RI Receives the Visit of French Defense Attache

The Governor of Lemhannas RI Andi Widjajanto received a Courtesy Call from the French Defense Attache Colonel Sven Meic, Ph.D. who was accompanied by Deputy French Defense Attache Colonel (Eng.) David Cordier and Assistant French Defense Attache Fitrie Djohardin on Friday (11/3/22), in the Executive Guest Room of Lemhannas RI.

During the hearing, the French Defense Attaché conveyed a plan for a visit to the Institute of Advanced Studies

in National Defense (IHEDN) to be held in May. The French Defense Attache explained that the participants of the visit were IHEDN participants majoring in economics, defense equipment, and defense technology.

"We are very happy if we can strengthen relations between France and Indonesia, as well as between Lemhannas and an institution equivalent to Lemhannas," the Governor of Lemhannas RI said. It is hoped that both institutions can exchange strategic

ideas, share ideas on national defense and defense strategies, and discuss geopolitical issues. "With this cooperation, the relationship between Indonesia and France will be even closer," the Governor continued.

Furthermore, the Governor conveyed several things that could be discussed in the upcoming IHEDN visit. First, the two institutions can learn from each other, one of which is about the structure of military education in each country such as curriculum development and the use of technology. "We can learn from each other about institutional structure, strategic plans, institutional development for the next 10-20 years," the Governor said.

Second, Both Institutions can discuss defense economy, especially regarding the acquisition of defense technology. Third, both Institutions can discuss strategic issues such as views on new military technologies in the next 20-30 years. Fourth, both Institutions can review geopolitical issues such as the impact of the Russia-Ukraine conflict on the defense industry.

# Perista Lemhannas RI Holds regular meeting

The Association of Wives of Lemhannas RI Employee (Perista Lemhannas RI) held a regular meeting for Perista Lemhannas RI Board, members and Lemhannas RI female employee on Tuesday (15/3/22) in the Dwi Warna Purwa Room Lemhannas RI. With the theme "Protecting Adolescents in Puberty and Educating Children According to Machine Intelligence and Character", Perista Lemhannas RI invited the Founder of SMPS Life Changing Institute, Reni Murni, CMHA, CBA, CHT, CT.NLP as a speaker.

Having been a parenting practitioner for decades, The Founder of SMPS Life Changing Institute said that parents must put themselves in a position to provide solutions for their children and avoid judging them. According to her, when talking to children, parents must equalize the frequency and align themselves to their children. "The house should be the place where they (teenagers) feel safe," She continued. It is important for children to continue to feel the love of their parents. The results of the research show that 90% of parents intentionally hurt their children's hearts with their words and actions so that their children will grow up strong and independent. She then continued that being loud and being firm are to children



are two different things.

The Founder of SMPS Life Changing Institute also emphasized that every parent should avoid violence. "The main key in educating children is to avoid violence," she said. Children must be protected from at least four types of violence. First, verbal abuse, namely violence through words and harsh tone of speech. Second, emotional abuse, namely violence in which children's emotions are underestimated and not appreciated. Third, physical abuse or physical violence such as hitting, slapping, kicking children. Fourth, sexual abuse is degrading, insulting, harassing, and/or attacking the body, and/or reproductive function.

Furthermore, she said that during the puberty phase there will be some changes in a child's psyche. First, unstable emotions where children are more easily offended, angry, and aloof. Second, the

child's curiosity will be getting bigger so they ask a lot of questions and need to be noticed. Third, children will start looking for identity where they like to express themselves more. Fourth, children will begin to be attracted to the opposite sex and feelings are easy to change. Fifth, children increasingly do not want to depend on their parents and want to be recognized as mature individuals.

On that occasion, The Founder of SMPS Life Changing Institute also said that one of the things that can be done to understand children is to know the intelligence machine and the child's character. To find out this can be done through personality, character, and intelligence tests such as through the Multiple Intelligences Test, DISC Personality Classification, MBTI 16 Personality Types, Graphology and Handwriting Analysis, and the STIFIn Intelligence Engine.

The Governor of Lemhannas RI Andi Widjajanto was present at the Coordination Meeting of Deputy V of the Presidential Staff Office on Tuesday (15/03/22) at the Pullman Hotel, Jakarta. Reporting from the Presidential Staff Office, the coordination meeting was aimed at synergizing government work in the fields of Politics, Law, Defense, Security, Human Rights, Anti-Corruption and Bureaucratic

Reform, Religion, and Eastern Indonesia/ Papua Region.

According to the Governor, there are several important issues in the fields of politics, law, and human rights that need more attention, such as the implementation of the construction of the New Capital City (IKN) Nusantara, the Russia-Ukraine conflict, the transfer of the G20 presidency to other member countries and the end of the tenure of seven governors including

the governor of DKI Jakarta at the end of 2022. "We have to pay attention to how in the future we will implement policies that do not create public distrust. The objective for determining the governor's official can be monitored," he explained.

"Lemhannas RI has a duty to provide strategic studies to the President through the Coordinating Minister for Political, Legal and Security Affairs of the Republic of Indonesia and will be very delighted if the synergy with the Presidential Staff Office to strengthen strategic studies issued by Lemhannas RI can then immediately provide benefits," the Governor concluded.

# The Governor of Lemhannas RI Highlights Indonesia's Geographical Position as a Strategic Vulnerability

The Governor of Lemhannas RI Andi Widjajanto attended the Military Command XVI/Pattimura Leaders Meeting which was a follow-up to the 2022 TNI-Polri (The Indonesian Military-The Indonesian Police) Leaders Meeting on Wednesday (16/03/22) at Makorem 151/Binaiya, Ambon.

Reporting from RRI.co.id, the meeting with the theme "Kodam XVI/Pattimura Prosperous and Professional Soldiers as Pillars of the Indonesian Army in Supporting Economic Recovery and Structural Reform in Maluku and

North Maluku" was opened directly by the Commander of the XVI/Pattimura Military Command Major General Richard Tampubolon. In his remarks, The Commander of XVI/Pattimura said that the leaders meeting was a follow-up to TNI Leaders Meeting and The Indonesian Army Leader Meeting in order to better understand and describe the policy points of TNI Commander and Army Chief of Staff.

Present as a speaker, the Governor of Lemhannas RI highlighted the geographical location of Indonesia, which is located between two continents, two

oceans and two major military powers. According to him, Indonesia's current location cannot be said to be in a strategic position anymore. Instead, It has strategic vulnerabilities.

"Why strategic vulnerability? Because it is located between two continents, two oceans, located between the Marine Base in Darwin and nuclear-powered submarines, the deployment of troops at the British Indo Pacific naval base and the deployment of troops in the South China Sea which could threaten Indonesia at any time, " the governor concluded.

# PPRA 64 is Officially Opened

The Governor of Lemhannas RI Andi Widjajanto officially opened the Regular Education Program Batch (PPRA) 64 on Tuesday (22/03/22) in the Dwi Warna Purwa Room, Pancagatra Building, Lemhannas RI.

In his remarks, the Governor of Lemhannas RI said that for the next seven months, Lemhannas RI would try to assist and serve the participants in improving the quality of strategic leadership. "Our job, I as governor, Mr. Sugeng as deputy, later there will be other deputies, is to serve ladies and gentlemen, so that seven months here, ladies and gentlemen, can gain understanding to become strategic leaders in the next 3-4 years," he said.

On this occasion, the Governor advised the participants to always maintain the dignity and authority of Lemhannas and show studies and leadership characteristics at the level of strategic leaders. During their education, participants are expected to be able to carry out the five things conveyed by the Governor of Lemhannas RI.

First, the participants must realize that they will soon become strategic leaders. Second, the strategic leader resulted is a lembayung (violet) color. "Lembayung means calm in action. No matter how harsh the situation, in any crisis, remember Lembayung, calm in acting," the Governor of Lemhannas RI explained.

Then the third thing, the participants must be able to get the rules for making policies. Fourth, the participants need to develop networks starting from



themselves, teams, organizations, communities, and nations. Finally, they must raise awareness by continuously deepening knowledge, experience, and strategic instincts.

"I congratulate you on being a participant of the Regular Education Program Batch 64, congratulations on being our family at Lemhannas RI. We are colleagues, we are friends, we are brothers to all of you," the Governor of Lemhannas RI said in front of a hundred of PPRA 64 participants.

PPRA 64 itself will be held from March 22–October 18 2022 with participants from various backgrounds, including 12 people from State Institutions, 9 people from Ministries, 9 people from Provincial and Regency Governments, 3 people from Political Parties, 1 person from DPR RI, 8 people from Community Organizations, Business Entities 4 people from business entittes, 40 people from the Indonesian Military, and 15 people from The Indonesian Police.

This year Indonesia is the host of the G20 presidency and next year will be the president of ASEAN, and coincidentally it is also the 50th anniversary of ASEAN-Japan relations, so this 2nd year in a row is very important for Indonesia-Japan relations," said the Japanese Ambassador. According to

him, hosting the G20 presidency is a very difficult thing. To achieve tangible results in the G20 presidency, good leadership from the host country is required.

Meanwhile, the Governor of Lemhannas RI expressed his gratitude for the congratulations conveyed and thanked the Japanese Ambassador to Indonesia for the visit to Lemhannas RI. "As governor, I hope that the cooperation between Indonesia and Japan, especially in the field of national resilience, can be further deepened," he said. Regarding Indonesia hosting the G20 and becoming the president of ASEAN, the Governor hopes that the cooperation between Indonesia and Japan will be closer to multilateral forums such as the G20 and regional communities.

Furthermore, the Governor also explained five main issues that will be the focus of Lemhannas RI in the next three years. The first issue is the green economy and the second issue is the blue economy. The Governor of Lemhannas RI views that

with these two points, Indonesia will be able to analyze the country's food security. The third issue is digital transformation that focuses on cyber security. The fourth issue relates to the National Capital. And the fifth issue, namely the consolidation of democracy because Indonesia will hold a General Election in 2024. "We hope that Indonesia's relations with Japan can be focused on these five big issues," the Governor of Lemhannas RI concluded.

He hopes that the situation will improve soon and return to normal so that participants from friendly countries can rejoin the PPRA 65 in 2023.

One of the targets for accepting prospective participants from friendly countries in PPRA 65 of Lemhannas RI is to strengthen cooperative relations between Indonesia and various countries in other parts of the world. So far, the countries

that have sent their representatives to take part in the education program at Lemhannas RI are still dominated by participants from Southeast Asia, South Asia, Africa, the Middle East and the Pacific Islands. "We also provide opportunities for other countries that have never sent their representatives to enrol Lemhannas RI education program at Lemhannas RI," the Chief of the Legal and Cooperation Bureau said.

Through the socialization, information related to the admission process was explained by Acting Head of the Foreign Cooperation Division, Colonel Sus. Ratih Pusparini. She explained the registration process to acceptance which was followed by the curriculum and learning methods that would be applied to PPRA 65. "PPRA 65 Participants from friendly countries will receive Indonesian language courses, take an introduction to local culture, and pre-course before joining PPRA 65," Acting Head of Foreign Cooperation Division said.

The introduction of local culture aims to introduce Indonesian Culture to prospective PPRA participants by visiting regions in Indonesia so that they can directly learn from those areas. While in the pre-course, participants will get an explanation of the education mechanism that will be followed by participants.

On that occasion, the Chief of the Legal and Cooperation Bureau of Lemhannas RI also reminded that prospective participants should prepare everything related to the nomination and completeness of the requirements for PPRA 65 candidate participants. Some of the requirements that must be prepared include the results of the medical test, passport, and TOEFL test results. Present at the socialization were representatives of friendly countries including Timor Leste, Vietnam, Laos, the Philippines, and India, as well as several representatives from other agencies such as the Indonesian Military and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
