## FGD on Defense Industry

Lemhannas RI held an Urgent and Prompt Focus Group Discussion (FGD) with the topic “Building an Advanced, Resilient, Independent and Competitive Defense Industry” on Tuesday (20/9/2022) in Kresna Room, Astagatra Building 4th Floor, Lemhannas RI.

“President Jokowi requested us at Lemhannas to make a prompt study of defense industry,” stated Governor of Lemhannas RI Andi Widjajanto in the opening the FGD. Furthermore, Andi Widjajanto conveyed President Jokowi’s message to conduct studies that are practical and focused on industry. The defense Strategic Plan (Renstra) has been prepared until 2024, but it does not cover the industry yet. Previously, Lemhannas RI discovered several quick findings obtained from discussions with many parties regarding strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats in the national defense industry.

From the data, there are four weaknesses highlighted by Andi Widjajanto. First, the stagnation of the defense budget allocation which is constantly only 0.8% of the GDP. Second, the dominance of SOEs in the Indonesian defense industry ecosystem which has shown little existence of a helix and supply chain in the Indonesian defense industry. Third, the small allocation for research and development in the defense industry makes it impossible for adoption and even technological leaps to be carried out. Fourth, the absence of economies of scale

in several defense equipment which is Indonesia’s key aspiration to grow.

“Our task until next week is to seek a quick recommendation for the President of the Republic of Indonesia. Hopefully it will be a breakthrough on how to build a defense industry with countless models possibly offered,” said Andi Widjajanto. It is hoped that through the FGD, Lemhannas RI will obtain significant suggestions to be summarized into a final policy recommendation to build Indonesia’s defense industry.

## Governor of Lemhannas RI Attends Inspirational Talk **BUMN Legal Summit**

**T**he Governor of Lemhannas RI, Andi Widjajanto, was present as a speaker at the Inspirational Talk at the BUMN Legal Summit on Friday (23/9/2022) at Hotel Merusaka Nusa Dua, Bali. On the occasion, Andi Widjajanto stated that Indonesia must pay attention to the dynamic conditions related to the Indo-Pacific Economic Framework (IPEF) initiated by the United States, the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) by China, and the North-South Corridor by Russia.

Andi Widjajanto stated that today the world has entered the era of Geopolitics V. “Essentially, Geopolitics V is connectivity,” he said. He also highlighted the rising stocks in the large defense industry due to

the conflict between Russia and Ukraine. The conflict created a huge demand for the need for war, causing the rising stock of almost all the defense industries in the world. However, unfortunately according to Andi Widjajanto, the similar condition is not experienced in Indonesia, either by PT Pindad, PT DI, or PT PAL.

This shows that the rotation of money does not enter Indonesia, partly because Indonesia is not a part of the global supply chain in the defense industry. “We are not part of the connectivity,” said Andi Widjajanto. To overcome this, he considered that products from Indonesia should be interpreted in something bigger, such as

how to link them with the global supply chain. However, Indonesia must also be aware of its current position as a middle-income country.

Andi Widjajanto also explained the competition of the influence of the United States-China in the Asia-Pacific, the stability of the United States-China relationship, the instability of energy trade, and the threat of food resilience. Responding to these matters, Andi Widjajanto also conveyed several scenarios that had been prepared by Lemhannas RI in dealing with future crises.

## PPRA 64 Participants Attend National Management System Simulation

**A**cting Deputy for National-Level Leaders Education of Lemhannas RI Air Vice Marshal Andi Heru Wahyudi opened the 52nd National Management System Simulation (Olah Sismennas) of PPRA 64 2022 with the theme “Cross-Sectoral Coordination of Government Apparatus and Associated Stakeholders in Utilizing Blue Economy” on Tuesday (28/9/2022) at Dwi Warna Building Purwa, Lemhannas RI.

“Olah Sismennas (OS) is a simulation exercise of cooperation, coordination, and synchronization between ministries or institutions to produce and implement a government policy, so that national development policies aiming to improve people’s welfare can be implemented in a synergistic, effective, and efficient manner and bring most benefits for the community,” said Andi Heru Wahyudi.

A total of 99 PPRA 64 participants

were divided into three groups of the Coordinating Ministry for OS, namely the Coordinating Ministry for Political, Legal and Security Affairs OS Group, the Coordinating Ministry for Maritime and Investment Affairs OS Group, and the Coordinating Ministry for Economic Affairs OS Group. The Coordinating Ministry for Political, Legal and Security Affairs OS Group consists of the TNI Headquarters OS, the Ministry of Home Affairs OS, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs OS, and the Police Headquarters OS. Furthermore, the Coordinating Ministry for Maritime and Investment Affairs OS Group consists of the Ministry of Marine Affairs and Fisheries OS, the Ministry of Investment and BKPM OS, the Ministry of Energy and Mineral Resources OS, the Ministry of Tourism and Creative Economy OS, and the Ministry of Transportation OS. Then the Coordinating Ministry for Economic Affairs OS Group consists of the Ministry of Trade OS, the Ministry of Manpower OS, the

Ministry of BUMN OS, and the Ministry of Cooperatives and SMEs OS.

In the implementation of this Olah Sismennas, a scenario is described. The scenario depicts various dynamics in strategic policy making that are assumed logically, the arisen situations are made in such a way that they create similarities to the actual conditions and dynamics. The various dynamics described, both externally and internally, will affect national life, especially regarding national development being carried out to become more dynamic in accordance with the planned scenario.

The implementation of Olah Sismennas aims to train participants in the process of state administration, so that they are able to understand and make decisions in critical conditions and to make strategic policies in order to solve factual national problems in a comprehensive, integral, systemic and holistic manner.

# Attending the Defense University Public Seminar, Governor of Lemhannas RI Discusses **Geo X**

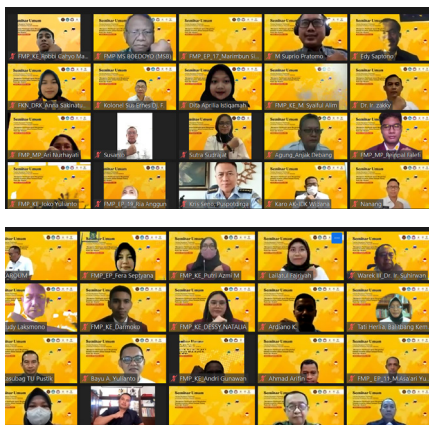
The Governor of Lemhannas RI, Andi Widjajanto, was present as a speaker at the Public Seminar of the Faculty of Defense Management of the Defense University (IDU) of the Republic of Indonesia which discussed defense management in facing the escalation of global threats due to the war between Russia and Ukraine, on Wednesday (28/9/2022) virtually.

“Readiness to manage national resources in the defense sector is a strategic step so that a universal national defense system can be realized in order to face various military and non-military threats that can disrupt national stability,” said Rector IDU, Vice Admiral Prof. Dr. Ir. Amarulla Octavian, S.T., M.Sc., DESD.,

ASEAN Eng while giving his speech. The event that was moderated by a lecturer at the Faculty of Defense Management, Prof. Dr. Ir. H. Surachman Surjaatmadja, M.M also presented two other speakers, namely Senior Advisor for Politics, Defense, and Security of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. H. Dadan Wildan Anas, M.Hum discussing “National Resilience Management in Facing Dynamic Geopolitical Conditions as the Impacts of the Russia-Ukraine War” and Minister of Marine Affairs and Fisheries of the Republic of Indonesia (2001-2004) Prof. Dr. Ir. Rokhmin Dahuri, MS. discussing “Blue Economy as Geopolitics and Geostrategy as the Realization of the World Maritime Axis and Strengthening of National Defense”.

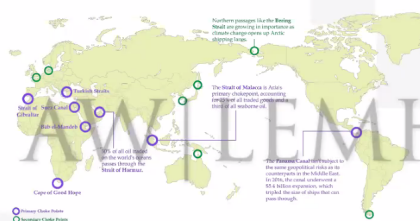
Meanwhile, on the occasion, Andi Widjajanto gave an explanation about “Factual and Potential Defense Threats as the Impacts of the Development of the Strategic Environment of the Russian and Ukrainian War” with the title Geo X. Andi Widjajanto stated that the evolution of maritime control in the era of colonialism relied on resources, especially during the exploration of Spain and Portugal, then in the British Empire and continues until the geomaritime power dominated by the United States. “Then today, the X factor is that we see the big geopolitical revolution, the emergence of connectivity, the emergence of new technologies, the emergence of global infrastructure and supply chains,” he said.

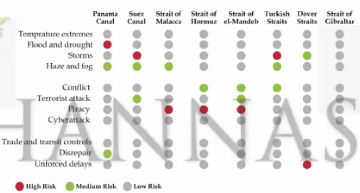


## Global Logistics Risks

### Risks to Global Trade Choke Points



Approximately 80% of global trade is being shipped by sea which describes the essential role of maritime transport. Global Intelligence Services (GIS) identifies eight of world's major choke points. In the context of maritime trade, these are usually straits or canals located at strategic locations and have a high volume of traffic. In practice, these vital points pose several risks, both structural such as the recent Suez Canal blockage, and geopolitical risks. The data above represent threats at eight global choke points which vary in terms of type and degree depending on the location.

**T**he Governor of Lemhannas RI Andi Widjajanto attended this year Commemoration Ceremony of Pancasila Sanctity Day at the Pancasila Sakti Monument, Lubang Buaya, Jakarta on Saturday (1/10/2022). The ceremony which was carried out in a hybrid method was led directly by President Joko Widodo as the ceremony inspector.

The Chief of Staff of the Permanent Garrison Command I/Jakarta Brigadier General Novi Helmy Prasetya acted as ceremonial officer and the Commander of the Infantry Brigade Para Raiders Infantry Division I of Army Strategic Reserves Command Colonel infantry Fendri Nafianto Raminta acted as the ceremony commander. **Lemhannas RI Supports Acceleration of  
 Domestic Product Spending**

**T**he Prime Secretary of Lemhannas RI Police Commissioner General Drs. Purwadi Arianto, M.Sc. attended the Business Matching Phase IV "Accelerating the Realization of Domestic Product Spending by Ministries/Institutions, Regional Governments, and State-Owned Enterprises (SOEs)" on Thursday (6/10/2022) at the Bali Nusa Dua Convention Center, Bali.

The purpose of the two-day activity is to accelerate the realization of domestic

product spending by the end of 2022 and to bring together domestic business actors with Ministries/State Agencies, Regional Governments, and SOEs to prepare for the procurement of goods and services in 2023.

Purwadi Arianto's presence in this activity is a form of commitment, readiness, and support for Lemhannas RI in spending for domestic products. In this activity, there were 76 domestic business booths that introduced their respective products.

Coordinating Minister for Maritime Affairs and Investment Luhut Binsar Pandjaitan, in his speech said that the activity was an excellent event to show the real commitment of the government's alignment with domestic products, MSMEs, and cooperatives. These activities is expected to accelerate the realization of domestic product spending.

"I hope that our meeting this morning will continue to encourage our nation to become a more unified nation, a more dignified nation, a nation that believes in itself more that we can make Indonesia better in the future," Luhut Binsar Pandjaitan said during the activity.

Meanwhile, the Minister of Industry, Agus Gumiwang Kartasasmita, who was also present, expressed his appreciation for the implementation of Business Matching Phase IV. According to Agus Gumiwang Kartasasmita in his speech, one way to overcome global dynamics is to strengthen Indonesia's resilience and economic resilience, one of which is through spending on domestic products. "Let's make our industry the king of our own country," he concluded.

The Governor of Lemhannas RI Andi Widjajanto officially opened The Lecture for PPRA 64 participants' wife and husband on Monday (10/10/2022) at the Gajah Mada Auditorium of Lemhannas RI. According to Andi Widjajanto in his speech, the lecture which lasted for six days was carried out to ensure that the wives and husband of future national leaders understand the responsibilities and duties that must be carried out after PPRA 64 graduate from Lemhannas RI Education Program.

Andi Widjajanto also emphasized that the preparation process must be carried out in stages, starting from the preparation at the individual level, then at

In addition, Gathut Setyo Utomo explained the duties of the three deputy offices in Lemhannas RI. The first is the Deputy Office of National-Level Leader Education of Lemhannas RI that is responsible in organizing three education programs namely Short Education Program (PPSA), Regular Education Program (PPRA), and Regional Leaders Strengthening Program (P3DA). The second is the Deputy Office of Strategic Studies who is in charge of preparing long-term strategic studies, medium-term strategic studies, short-term strategic studies, and recent strategic studies (quick responses). The third is the Deputy Office of Strengthening of National Values who is responsible in implementing the strengthening of national values program, training for trainers, national dialogue, and impact evaluation.

The purpose of the activity, which was attended by 94 people consisting of 90 wives and 4 husbands, was to equip and strengthen the wives/husbands in their role as companions to national-level leadership cadres, increase insight into ethics for wives/husbands who can be role models in work units and community, and strengthen relationship among husbands and wives of PPRA 64 Participants and Lemhannas RI.

## President Joko Widodo Gives Direction to PPRA 63 and PPRA 64 Participants

**T**he President of the Republic of Indonesia Ir. H. Joko Widodo gives to the participants of the Regular Education Program Batch (PPRA) 63 and 64 of 2022 Lemhannas RI in a hybrid method on Wednesday (12/10/2022) at the Presidential Palace, Jakarta.

In the occasion, the results of the seminar conducted by PPRA 63 and 64 participants were presented in front of

President Joko Widodo. The presentation of the results of the PPRA 63 seminar was delivered by Police Commissioner General H.M. Sabilul Alif, S.H., S.IK. which deliver a recommendation to reduce identity politics ahead of the 2024 general election. regarding the anticipation and mitigation of global crises, including food, energy, and financial crises. "The President asked Lemhannas RI to conduct studies that covers macro and micro combined and must also be detailed in recommending the President for future policy directions," Andi Widjajanto said after the direction.

Andi Widjajanto also revealed that according to the President's direction, Lemhannas RI should remain focused on conducting studies on democratic consolidation, digital transformation, green economy, blue economy and the New Capital City "Nusantara" (IKN). According to him, related to the consolidation of democracy, the results of his studies have been reported regularly to the President.

Also attending to accompany President Joko Widodo in the briefing were Coordinating Minister for Political, Legal and Security Affairs Mahfud MD and Minister of State Secretary Pratikno.

## Governor of Lemhannas RI Visits East Timor

The Governor of Lemhannas RI Andi Widjajanto together with the Governor of NTT (East Nusa Tenggara) Viktor Bungtilu Laiskodat who are members of the Indonesian government delegation made a working visit to the City of Dili, East Timor, on Saturday (15/10/2022).

The visit was conducted as a result of President Joko Widodo mandate to accelerate the development of the free trade zone area in order to improve the economy in East Timor and the people on the island of Timor, NTT.

After arriving at Nikola Batu Airport, Dili, East Timor, Andi Widjajanto along with

other Indonesian government delegations met the Prime Minister of East Timor Taur Matan Ruak and a number of East Timor ministers.

Continuing their visit, the Indonesian government delegation visited the office of the President of East Timor and was received directly by the President of East Timor, José Ramos-Horta. The meeting discussed the potential for cooperation on the border economy between Indonesia and East Timor.

Collaboration between countries located in one geographic area can strengthen the geopolitical resilience of the region. In addition to fostering national

resilience, Lemhannas RI continues to strengthen regional geopolitical resilience through cooperation between countries.
