Governor of Lemhannas RI Visits China

Governor of Lemhannas RI Lt. Gen. (ret) Agus Widjojo accompanied by Principal Secretary of Lemhannas RI Commissioner General of Police Drs. Arif Wachyunadi along with Lemhannas' board paid a working visit to China on March 27 – April 3, 2018.

This governor's visit to China is in order to meet the invitation of the China Institute for International Strategic Studies (CIISS) to discuss strategic issues, both at the regional level between China and ASEAN countries, as well as the global scope between China and global world. Some of the issues discussed are economic, defense, energy, cyber security, climate change, water availability, and social media usage.

On the first day in Beijing, China, Agus Widjojo and Lemhannas Board paid a visit to an Internet Security 360 company committed to solve various security problems faced by Internet users in China by providing free high quality security services. 360 believes that Internet security, such as searching (browsing), e-mailing, and instant messaging, are basic Internet services and should be free.

The next day, Lemhannas' board had the opportunity to visit China Electronic Technology Corporation (CETC), the only large-scale technology company in China covering all areas of electronic information.

While related to one of Lemhannas RI's main functions of organizing education for national-level cadres, Lemhannas also visits Tshinghua University along with representatives from Unity In Diversity (UID).

On that occasion, there was an exchange of academic information between the two institutions that were used as the basis for the development of cooperation in the future.

China Aerospace Long-March International Trade (ALIT) industry, which is an exporter and importer of aerospace-related equipment and technology, and China North Industry Group Corporation (NORICO), which is the main body of research and development of weapons and equipment of ground forces, become one of destination of the visit.

On the last day in China, Lemhannas' Board visited several well-known tourist sites and became the icon of Beijing and Shanghai China, such as Olympic Stadium, Tiananmen Square, Forbidden City, Beijing National Museum, Shanghai Pearl Tower and Exhibition Hall. ●

Head of Department of Master of Science of RSIS Give Lectures Related to the South China Sea

Participants of PPRA LVII and LVIII of 2018 received a public lecture from the Head of Department of Master of Science Program of S. Rajaratnam School of International Studies (RSIS) Bernard Loo Fook Weng who raised the topic “China and the Rejection of Anti-Access Areas (A2AD) in the South China Sea (LCS) and Its Implications for Southeast Asia” at the Gajah Mada Auditorium, Pancagatra Building Lemhannas RI on Tuesday (3/4).

In the discussion, Dr. Bernard described China’s claim in the LCS as Asymmetric Operations involving coast guard and artificial island development and ongoing militarization. Related to asymmetric Operations, Dr. Bernard conveyed China’s efforts in claiming the LCS including the imposition of the Air Defense Identification Zone, the military action in the sea, as well as the asymmetrical tactics at sea. Dr. Bernard also spoke of the history of the armed clashes at the LCS.

Dr. Bernard described the asymmetric tactics of China in the LCS region by redesigning the former PLAN (Chinese navy) ship to be used as a Chinese coast guard vessel. In addition, this tactic is also supported by maritime militant ships, armed fishermen known as the “Little Blue Man” and are considered parallel to the Russian-owned vessel “Little Green Man” in the Crimea. Since 2014, the

militant ship has been growing and often recruits PLAN retired personnel.

Dr. Bernard later described another Chinese effort in making claims against LCS by building artificial islands in China since 2014, which is claimed to protect fishing vessels during the hurricane season. Evidence shows that artificial islands are being militarized. In addition, Dr. Bernard also describes China’s strategy of controlling the LCS region known as cabbage strategy by gathering strengths gradually around the South China Sea.

This lecture was then continued with a question and answer session involving PPRA LVII and LVIII participants and closed with group photo session and handover of souvenirs.●

Participants of PPRA LVII Have a Discussion Related to Terrorism with US Army War College Students

Prof. Zachry Abuza along with his education participants from US National War College travel to Lemhannas RI to have a discussions and exchange opinions with some PPRA LVII participants. The discussion raised two big topics namely Terrorism and Transnational Crime which was held at Trigatra Building, Lemhannas RI Pavilion, Monday (9/4) afternoon.

This discussion aimed to present Indonesia's success in law enforcement in combating terrorism, as well as Indonesia's strategy to face Transnational crime. The discussion was guided by Professional Expert of Leadership of Lemhannas RI Major General (ret) Albert Inkiriwang as Moderator, and Inspector General. of Police Dr. Drs. H. Anas Yusuf, Dipl.krim., S.H., M.H., M.M. as a speaker.

In his presentation, Anas said that Indonesia has been recognized by friendly countries as a country that successfully overcome terrorism cases such as Bali Bombings, JW Marriot Hotel Bombing, the Australian Embassy in Kuningan Jakarta Bombing, and other terrorism incidents.

According to him, the achievement is due to the close support and cooperation between all stakeholders and related institutions. Indonesia has several agencies

namely BNPT (National Counterterrorism Agency), BIN (State Intelligence Agency) and TNI (Indonesian Military). Anas also explained about Indonesia strategy in tackling acts of terrorism by practicing two approaches, soft power and hard power. Other cases are human trafficking, money laundering, corruption, cybercrime, environmental crime, and endangered animal trade, as well as transnational economic crimes.

While Prof. Zachry Abuza said his appreciation to Indonesia achievements in coping with terrorism. "I came here to appreciate what Indonesia has accomplished so far in tackling terrorism, democracy, law enforcement, and human rights enforcement. So I bring the education participants here," he said. He argues that Indonesia has various institutions that are able to work well in countering terrorism.

"Terrorism is strongly influenced by global trends. What to think about is what will happen after Syria collapses. What is the future trend? What should we focus on? Should we focus on the ISIS?" Zachry said to the participants of the discussion. According to him, Indonesia needs to think about the latest trends that will happen, such as problems that occurred in Myanmar, and Bangladesh.

Zachry hopes all components in Idnoensia can play an active role in managing the nation, especially in border areas. "I ask my friends here in Indonesia to take an active role in leading the region, especially in border management. You need to work with other countries like Malaysia, Thailand," he said.●

Perista Has a Great Discussion About Batik with Didi Budiardjo



Association of staffs' wives of Lemhannas RI (Perista) organized regular meetings of its members and female employees of Lemhannas RI as a gathering event and share knowledge by presenting a renowned designer as the speaker, Didi Budiardjo, to give introduction about Batik, in Dwiwarna Purwa Room, Lemhannas RI on Wednesday (4/4).

Perista Chairman Herlina Agus Widjojo at the opening of the meeting, remind the audience about the struggle of R.A Kartini as a hero who advancing the civilization of Indonesian women, one of them by teaching to make batik. "She gathered women around her to make batik, and today we have the presence of someone who is young and know much about batik, Didi Budiardjo," Herlina said. She also advised Perista members to be able to take advantage of this meeting to increase knowledge about batik.

Didi Budiardjo then introduced in detail about the philosophy of batik, while showing his batik collections. According to him,

batik itself is a technique that developed in Indonesia by using wax-resist dyeing coloring technique. Didi repeatedly asserted that there is a difference between batik and batik motif textile that is batik motif textile using printing methods, in contrast to the real Batik that uses the wax color barrier in the making process. "It is called as batik when it went through wax-resist dyeing coloring technique, whether hand-drawn batik or printed batik," Didi said.

While listening to Gending Pakurmatan, the Gending which is played when the King welcomes his guests, Didi Budiardjo who showed his batik collection can change the atmosphere in the Dwiwarna Room feels like in the palace. Batik is divided into two parts, namely Batik Keraton and Batik Pesisiran. He explained that in the palace there are 11 motives that are not allowed to wear, among which the most famous is Parang motif. "If the Javanese visit to the palace (keraton), they should not wear the Parang motif because it is only for the King and his family" he explained.

In addition, Didi also told about the beginning of the existence of batik that coming from agrarian society. "The ancestors of this nation is an agricultural nation, they grow crops and have not entered the palace. Batik Pangbangan is the forerunner of batik, which is red. When entering the palace, batik becomes more diverse," he said.

Batik has been crowned as one of the Humanitarian Heritage for Oral and Intangible Culture by UNESCO since October 2, 2009. Since then, every 2nd of October is known as National Batik Day.●

Former Minister of Defense, Prof. Purnomo Yusgiantoro, Ir. M.A., M.Sc., Ph.D. became one of the participants in the panel discussion which was attended by PPRA LVII participants and raising the topic of National Resilience Implementation in facing China aggression in South China Sea to support RI Defense Development at NKRI Room, Pancagatra Building, Lemhannas RI on Wednesday (11/4) morning.

At the beginning of the material presentation, Purnomo explained the related issues that occurred in the South China Sea (LCS) such as the sovereignty dispute between the People's Republic of China (PRC) with five other countries ; Vietnam, Philippines, Malaysia, Brunei Darussalam, and Taiwan. “The issue of the LCS dispute is the sovereignty dispute between PRC againsts five countries, especially ASEAN because China made a claim known as the nine dash line or nine broken lines, then these countries also make claims,” he said.

According to Purnomo, China made claims on LCS based on its past history, and mainly on the islands of Spratly and Paracel. The implication for Indonesia is

that there are sea lines of communication (SLOC) where the South China Sea is a vital trade route for China, Japan and South Korea so that many Indonesian ships pass through the LCS area.

Purnomo who is also an alumnus of PPRA 50 of Lemhannas RI explained that Indonesia is required to follow the legal principles that have been established on the LCS dispute. He emphasized the basic principle held by the Indonesian people that the sea is not a separator of the island, but Indonesia is a sea that is sprinkled by the island.

The total area of Indonesia experienced an expansion of 3.5 times when compared to the early independence, from the original 2.13 million kilometers is now 7.39 million kilometers. Purnomo explained that the expansion of Indonesian territory was due to the International Sea Law Convention or the Sea Treaty Law (UNCLOS), the Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ), and the continental shelf.

Purnomo revealed the interesting fact that NKRI (the Untary State of the republic of Indonesia) is the world's largest Archipelago State, which in its management is more complex when it

is compared with continental countries. “Because it is related to infrastructure, transportation, communications, control and protection, such large areas, are matters of national resilience, they needs special attention especially prosperity and security,” Purnomo said.

According to him, a transformation of geopolitical perspective, insight into the archipelago, and the geostrategy of Indonesia in this case national resilience are needed. “The sea should be seen as a unifier, the approaches are through prosperity and security because the culture of society is still oriented to the mainland. Then the management sea sources, ZEE and continental shelf is still not maximized. In addition, there must be an affirmation of territorial boundaries with the presence of Indonesian military troops,” he concluded.●

Head of BNPT Speaks Terrorism and Radicalism in Attendance of PPRA LVII Participants

Participants PPRA LVII welcomed the arrival of Head of National Counterterrorism Agency (BNPT) Commissioner General of Police Drs. Suhardi Alius, M.H. in order to give a lecture Related to the influence of radicalism movement of the global era against the nationalism and the existence of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia, Tuesday (10/4) in NKRI Room, Pancagatra Building, Lemhannas RI. In his speech, Suhardi explained about the development of radicalism towards terrorism.

According to him, the idea of radicalism changes completely and is revolutionary by overturning the values that exist. There are several factors that motivate the change of international factors such as global injustice and arrogant foreign policy. The second is domestic factors such as the perception of injustice to revenge, as well as cultural factors such as a superficial understanding of religion and narrow interpretation of scriptures.

Suhardi said that recently, BNPT managed to secure 18 small children who have the potential to become terrorists. "There are 18 peoplerecued by BNPT who have the potential to become terrorists for engaging in military training in Syria," he said. Suhardi stressed to change the view of terrorism that relates to the stigma of religion. "Do not relate terrorist with religion, I am a Muslim. It is a cruelty in the name of religion," he said.

In BNPT, Suhardi said, there are tools used to analyze the events of radicalism around the world. New patterns of terrorism are cyber jihad and khilafah, self radicalizaton, online indoctrination, recruitment and online slaughter and lone wolf.

Therefore, BNPT recruits peaceful ambassadors from the younger generation because the targets of brainwashing from radical groups are young people. Radical groups coose young generations tobe the targets because they are still looking for identity, emotionally unstable and easily influenced. "The target of brain washing is 15-25 years. They are smart, self-seeking, and emotionally stable. That's where we come in. They must spread anti-radical and peaceful message with millennial language, do not use our language," he said.

Suhardi who is also an alumnus of PPSA 17 advised the participants of PPRA LVII as national leader candidates to take advantage of the opportunity to study in Lemhannas as well as possible. "You have see the current situation, moral responsibility, this nation belongs to our children and grandchildren, globalization changes the world. Because the development of digital technology affects the dynamics of geopolitics. We give it to PPRA from 5 to 10 years ahead. You've got a chance, do your best in enrolling your study in Lemhannas because it has its own pride," he said.●

Prof. Muladi Shares His Thought on How to be Excellent Leaders

Former Governor of Lemhannas RI Dr. Muladi, S.H visited PPRA LVII participants in order to give a lecture on “How to choose a Leader in Leadership Practice to Support Sustainable Development” in NKRI Room, Pancagatra Building, Lemhannas RI, Wednesday (18/4).

A good leader should be someone who is able to think rationally rather than emotionally. “The super power leader must be cold-blooded and kind, having a rational rather than emotional thinking. The leader was chosen because of its promising vision and mission,” Prof. Muladi said.

Leaders should see policy as an integration mechanism, regard technological progress, economics and others as the resource, not a problem, but the most important is the goal portions or political goals that a country wants to achieve. “The state must maintain the culture, we should not think fragmentically, but systemically, and oriented to a big goal or grand strategy,” he said.

A leader has to be able to see the whole peoblem because each subsystem is related to each other. “It’s not just about personal or group goals but it is a comprehensive matter. If we change something, the other will change as well and there should be transparency among subsystems that must not be covered up,” he said.

For Prof. Muladi, the leader figure should be able to control life, both small and national organizations, where people can motivate their followers to do something in achieving common goals. “The essence of leadership there is a vision of sympathy. Clear vision of life, and generate sympathy, both internal and external among countries,” he said.

Prof. Muladi also explained some of the characteristics of a good democratic system such as the centralization of authority, the promotion and protection of human rights, the freedom of the press to be professionally guarded, the respect for civil society such as the existence of various NGOs and civil society groups, and civilian control of the military. Leadership is divided into four groups, namely Leadership, Managerial, Statesmanship (Negarawan), and Geo Leadership.●

Foreign Minister Retno Marsudi Shares Indonesian Diplomacy Efforts to PPRA LVII Participants

Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Indonesia Retno L.P. Marsudi present as a lecturer in PPRA LVII class to discuss Foreign Policy in Facing International Geopolitical Development, in NKRI Room, Lemhannas RI on Friday (20/4). Retno told about various diplomacy conducted by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs during the last few years, as in the year 2017 as many as 10 thousand legal cases involving Indonesian Citizens (Citizens) successfully solved by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, from 15,454 cases occurred. "In a year, we can complete 10 thousand cases, the rest of them are severe cases that cannot be resolved quickly within a year," she said.

According to her, the cases occurred decreased from 2016 to 2017, and there is an increase in percentage for the settlement of cases. "In 2016, out of 18,452 cases we had solved as many as 12,969 cases, a significant decrease in cases was good for us, and an increase in percentage for case settlement, which is also good for us," she said. Like the case of hostage taking place in the southern Philippines, where most victims are Indonesian citizens. "There are many cases of hostage taking place in Southern Philippines, in Sulu Sea and its surroundings, and Indonesia is the most victimized country. The hostage taken from Indonesia is 32, we have been able to release 29 people. I am still working on three people in the southern Philippines so they can be released," Retno said.

Recently Kemenlu launched a "Safe Travel" application that can be used by Indonesian people when travelling abroad. It

can find out if there is a problem in the country being visited. "The application can be used when we travel to other countries. By inputting personal data and destination country through safe travel application, we will get information from the system we build, and know where to ask for protection. This latest application is owned to enhance the protection of Indonesians traveling abroad," she said.

Another diplomatic effort recently undertaken by Retno Marsudi as Foreign Minister is visiting migrant workers who work in oil palm plantations abroad, to directly listen to their complaints. "Sometimes the complaints are not when they work abroad, but when they arrive in Indonesia. When they bring cash money back to Indonesia, they are being interfere in the airport. We have to change, corruption mental must be eradicated until it is gone, our prejudice becomes our priority," she said.

The last, Foreign Minister Retno Marsudi told the PPRA LVII participants about her success in fighting for the ASEAN Consensus on the Protection and Promotion of the Right of Migrant Workers in the context of ASEAN. Retno concludes that Indonesia will continue to play an active role in the global world, both to foster the national interests of Indonesia and to contribute to the promotion of world prosperity and peace.●

Expert Staff of Work Culture of Ministry of State Apparatus Empowerment and Bureaucratic Reform (Ministry of PANRB) Drs. Teguh Wijnarko provided relevant information about the improvement of Government bureaucracy employee as state apparatus for the participants of PPRA LVII in NKRI Room on Monday (16/4) morning.

At the beginning of his presentation, he talked about the national management system of state governance, in which there are four elements in it that are divided into external arrangements (governance of public life and national political order), and inner regulation (governance). "The national management system is the governance of our state, there are social aspect, governmental aspect, national politics aspect, and state administration aspect," Teguh said.

According to him, without seeing a good bureaucracy, the development will not work properly. Therefore, bureaucracy has always been a government development priority. Work culture becomes a difficult part to change because it deals with the mental model.

As mentioned in one of the Jokowi's Nine Goals (Nawacita) which say how to create the presence of the government is by building a clean, effective, democratic, and reliable governance. One of the aspects related to the Nine Goals (Nawacita) is by using bureaucratic reform.

Teguh explained that the Ministry of PANRB has three main objectives contained in the bureaucratic reform roadmap: building a clean and accountable bureaucracy, then creating an effective and efficient bureaucracy, and presenting a bureaucracy with excellent public services.

Talking about the improvement for human resources of the State Civil Apparatus (ASN), Teguh stated that the key of the bureaucracy is its human resources, if the human resources are not qualified, then the bureaucracy will not be qualified. According to him, 60 percent of government personnel are currently filled by public servants associated with administrative tasks, and 40 percent related to technical duties.

With regard to improving ASN's insights, Lemhannas has contributed to the training of 1000 technopreneurs in preparation for the industrial revolution 4.0. "We must prepare to face, to adjust our electability to technological development. Lemhannas is also involved in training 1000 techopreneurs, including in national-designed processes and training. Lemhannas as its technical implementer," he said.●

Agus Widjojo Talks About Indonesian Military Reform at RSIS of Singapore

Besides the signing of Memorandum of Understanding, Governor of Lemhannas RI Lt. Gen. (ret) Agus Widjojo gave a public lecture at Singapore's S. Rajaratnam School of International Studies (RSIS) related to Indonesian Military (TNI) Reform on Friday (27/4).

In his lecture, Agus Widjojo explained that in the early independence of Indonesia, TNI had a function not only in defense but also in politics. The TNI's involvement in politics at that time was due to the enormous role of the TNI in the struggle for Indonesian independence and also after independence during the communist rebellion in 1948. Moreover, the cause of the political function within the TNI was also because the long tradition of culture.

TNI reform, Agus Widjojo conveyed, was done very well. This is because the reforms are initiated by TNI itself. The reforms began in the end of President Suharto's era when there was a power vacuum and a change of political system that would be used to replace the political system of the previous era.

This makes TNI more focused on its role to face the democratic political system that will be imposed in the future. The TNI's own reforms, explained Agus Widjojo, were conducted in 1998 until 1999 before the constitutional amendment was made between 1999 and 2002. "The TNI reform was conducted before the political reforms and the TNI's reforms were initiated by TNI itself," Agus Widjojo said.

Furthermore, Agus Widjojo discloses the strategic value of TNI reform. The value is TNI reform supports the



democratization process in Indonesia. It can be said as a support because by not involving TNI in the political system, the political system can run more smoothly.

The TNI reform is not a structured initiative but done by using the opportunity at that time accompanied by strong motivation and innovation. Reforms, Agus

Widjojo said, faced several challenges because of the political system dynamics from 1999 to 2004 which directly demand that TNI continue to adjust to the dynamics. ●

"We want young generations and all components of the nation to have a high sense of nationalism in their heart and their mind. It is not always about weapons but what more important is to run their function and roles in order to defend the nation and state's interest," Kisnu said●
