Lemhannas RI Signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Ministry of Religious Affairs of the Republic of Indonesia and Semarang University

The Governor of Lemhannas RI, Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo delivered his remarks during the signing of a memorandum of understanding between Lemhannas RI and the Ministry of Religious Affairs of the Republic of Indonesia and Semarang University (USM) in the Trigatra Building, 1st Floor, Lemhannas RI (15/3).

“The Memorandum of Understanding between Lemhannas RI and the Ministry of Religious Affairs of the Republic of Indonesia and Semarang University is a joint commitment to establish cooperation,” Agus Widjojo said.

The memorandum of understanding covers several fields, such as improving the quality of human resources through education and training; conducting studies, research and information exchange in the framework of measuring national resilience; exchange of experts and strengthening of national values; and other fields as needed, agreed upon by the parties.

With the signing of the memorandum of understanding, Agus Widjojo hoped that the programs which are consistently related to the fields within the scope of cooperation will be soon implemented.

Meanwhile, Minister of Religious Affairs, Lukman Hakim Saifuddin hoped that the three institutions could exchange speakers as an effort to add broader and deeper insight and knowledge related to national insight by signing of this memorandum of understanding. Lukman Hakim Saifuddin said that religious activists need to be equipped with strong national insight.

Semarang University Rector Andi Kridasusila also said that Lemhannas RI, Ministry of Religious Affairs, and Semarang University, have the substantial factors in disseminating moral values to the society.

In the near future, Lemhannas RI will implement the Strengthening of National Values Program for 100 participants from Ministry of Religious Affairs. This program will be held by The Deputy Office of Strengthening of National Values of Lemhannas RI.

Regarding the cooperation with Semarang University, Lemhannas RI will conduct the same strengthening program for lecturers, students, and faculty members of Semarang University. This strengthening program will also be followed by other institutions to meet the available quota.

The Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI leads the Flag-Raising Ceremony in Lemhannas RI

Lemhannas RI held a Flag-Raising Ceremony on Monday (18/3) at the Lemhannas RI's Central Field. The Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI, Air Marshal Wieko Syofyan representing the Governor of Lemhannas RI, Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo who was unable to attend as the Inspector of the Ceremony.

In the Governor's speech which was read by the Deputy Governor, stated that all members of Lemhannas were called upon to be able to examine the political dynamics related to the presidential election and the legislative election which will be held simultaneously. Therefore, Agus Widjojo in his speech said that all Lemhannas Officials were expected to be neutral as state servants while anticipating various negative accesses that would probably emerge in the society

Towards the end of the first quarter, Wieko Syofyan, read the Governor's speech, said that the amount of the budget absorption of Lemhannas had exceeded the targets set from the total budget. Therefore, the Governor of Lemhannas RI in his speech expressed his gratitude to all work units and he hoped these achievements could be maintained.

Related to the tasks and functions of Lemhannas in the current education program, the participants of the Regular Education Program Batch (PPRA) 59 have entered the on campus program, after

previously carrying out off campus program and outbound. Therefore, all participants are expected to focus on all the material provided and maintain their discipline, ethics, and health in enrolling the education program.

Related to the Short Education Program Batch (PPSA) 22 which was opened on March 26, 2019 and lasted for five and a half months, Agus Widjojo in his remarks conveyed that the Deputy of National-Level Leader Education had prepared ten components of education to support PPSA 22 program.

In addition, related to strategic studies, Lemhannas RI has initiated a series of strategic studies that began with the implementation of the Focus Group Discussion (FGD), until it produce good quality studies used as policy recommendations to support the programs and policies set by the government.

Before concluding his remarks, the Governor through his speech hoped all Lemhannas RI Officials to continue to support BPK RI (Indonesia's Supreme Audit Agency) audit and he hoped Lemhannas will still be able to get the "Reasonable Without Exception" title.

The Flag-Raising Ceremony held every month was attended by the deputies, Faculty Members, Structural Officials of Lemhannas RI, PPRA 59 participants, and all Lemhannas' Officials.



Toward Election, Lemhannas RI has a discussion with Editor-in-Chiefs of several mass media

Responding to the situation ahead of the 2019 Election, Lemhannas RI held a Communication Forum of the Governor of Lemhannas RI with Editor-in-Chiefs of Mass Media on Wednesday (20/3), in the Constitution Room, 3rd Floor, Trigatra Building, Lemhannas RI.

This forum is a routine program of Lemhannas RI to equalize perceptions with mass media as a provider of mainstream information in the society that has a role in the democratization process and also to provide a place for Lemhannas' Leaders and Editor-in-Chiefs of mass media to meet.

By raising "Criticizing the Dynamic ahead of the 2019 Election" as the theme, the Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo said that Lemhannas is now reviewing an estimated level of vulnerability ahead of the 2019 Election, especially from the national resilience perspective.

"Lemhannas uses three analytical approaches, namely the comparison of the condition of 2014 presidential election final, the 2018 national resilience measurement which are relatively final even though it is still under monitoring, and the dynamic reality conditions with adjustments and situation updates," Agus explained.

Based on the three approaches, the national resilience during the presidential election was quite conducive which was considered similar to the conditions in 2014, although there were some areas that were in a less conducive condition such as Aceh, North Maluku, West Java, East Nusa Tenggara, East Java, and North Sumatra.

Furthermore, Agus expressed his concern about the shifting occurs in the meaning of the word "volunteers" and the role of civil

society as a middle power group. "An independent region of civil society will be taken by political actors. It will cause polarization in the society. Volunteers are sometimes partisan or non partisan. Volunteers are sometimes more forward than political party members," Agus Widjojo said. According to him, it is necessary to develop the power of the middle group to prevent disunity.

In the forum moderated by Haryanto Saputra, several Editor-in-Chiefs expressed the role of an independent and credible media in reporting the current situation. Like Kompas Editor-in-Chief, Ninuk Pambudy who stated that even though it is under the editorial staff, the Research & Development division of Kompas remains independent. "Even though the budget is from the editorial staff, Research & Development division of Kompas composes the methodology and selects its own surveyor staff," Ninuk said.

Meanwhile, Aryo Ardi from INews TV stated that even though the owner of INews TV is politically active, Inews TV is committed to report the election-related information independently. "As a mass media, we are balanced. We do not air more TV programs related to the party of the owner of this television station," he said.

Nezar Patria, from the Jakarta Post also added that the balance element, for any professional mass media, is an obligation. "Indeed, the media cannot be neutral, but balance element is required to find the accuracy of the news," he concluded.

In addition, the representatives of TV One, IDN Times, RRI, and MNC TV expressed the need to embrace the millennial generation who have different characters from previous generations, especially related to their view on national issues.

The Governor of Lemhannas RI Inaugurates a Number of Officials

Lemhannas RI inaugurated a number of Echelon Officials on Thursday (21/3), in Nusantara Room, Trigatra Building. The inauguration is a part of the efforts to improve organization performance to maximize institution performance. The selecting of a number of echelon officials had been through a mechanism and consideration process based on organization's needs by paying attention to their qualifications, competencies, and performance.

Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo stated that the inauguration and appointment of officials in an organization were not merely an honor, but also a mandate, and challenge.

"I hope the newly installed officials can carry out this mandate sincerely, and give their best for the Lemhannas. You have to have willingness to identify your weaknesses and try to improve your performance in your respective fields of duty," Agus Widjojo said.

Agus Widjojo continued, "Every task should be carried out seriously, everyone must know their responsibilities and tasks that must be carried out in their respective positions. You have to try to fulfill your position competencies."

The inauguration was based on the Decree of the Governor of Lemhannas RI No. 38, 39, 41 and 44 of 2019 concerning the positions replacement and appointment within Lemhannas.

A number of echelon officials replaced were four Officials consist of Two-Star retired General and One-Star General who move to their respective institution. Meanwhile, 39 officials were appointed as echelon I, II and IV, senior lecturers and senior analyst.

In his remarks, Eddy Tarjono said that during this visit, students were expected to be able to obtain useful knowledge about national values which will be delivered. "Pay attention to the materials which will be delivered today so everyone can gain new insights from your visit to Lemhannas today," Eddy Tarjono said.

Meanwhile, Efy Miftah, S.Pd, M.Pd, expressed his gratitude for the remarks given to the students of Muhammadiyah Purwokerto University. Efy Miftah said that a visit to Lemhannas RI had been carried out by Muhammadiyah University Purwokerto since 2015.

This visit, Efy Miftah explained, is expected to provide knowledge and enlightenment for the students and also prepare the students to be future lecturers and teachers.

Edijan Tanjung at the beginning of his presentation said that Pancasila is the basic identity of the state which contains national moral principles. Pancasila is also a guide to the life of Indonesian people. Edijan also added that Pancasila is a foundation for the unity of Indonesia as a nation and a legal source of all legal sources in Indonesia.

Edijan then conveyed that Pancasila underlined Indonesia as a religious nation but Indonesia do not adheres to a particular religion. The state, Edijan explained, does not provide a place for non-religious people.

In addition, Indonesian people have a system of mutual cooperation or togetherness called as "gotong-royong". However, with the advances in technology, the spirit of mutual cooperation declined. "With the advance of technology, our cooperation and togetherness have been increasingly eroded," Edijan Tanjung explained.

The material delivery session was then followed by a discussion on the process of determining Pancasila as the basis of the country. The event was then closed by souvenirs exchange and a group photo session.

Risma shares knowledge to PPRA 59 participants

Mayor of Surabaya, Tri Rismaharini, had the opportunity to be a speaker in front of Regular Education Program Batch (PPRA) 59 on Monday (03/26), at the NKRI Room, Pancagatra Building, 3rd Floor, Lemhannas RI. Risma, with her serious but relaxed style, explained the work performance of Surabaya Administration during her leadership, especially the closing of "Gang Dolly", the red-light district of Surabaya which had become a national issue and also the success of smart city program in Surabaya.

According to Risma, to close down the red-light district of Surabaya is not an easy matter. There was a lot of opposition parties and even a bomb threat addressed to her. "Moral damage to children (in Gang Dolly) is far more dangerous than anything. I have to take the risk, even though I might die," Risma said to PPRA 59 participants.

To handle the ex-red-light district children, Risma has also made a comprehensive program. These children are sent to school for free in any state elementary school. They also get counseling assisted by psychologists and psychiatrists on a regular basis. "In order to make this counseling to be on target, screening was implemented. Children with worse mental condition are separated and sent to the shelter. Others that are in a better mental condition are monitored. Fields and

playgrounds were built. There are also volunteers who monitor these programs," Risma explained.

Regarding the smart city program carried out by the Surabaya Administration, Risma said that all the software used are made by State-Civil Apparatus in Surabaya Administration so it cost less than it normally costs.

"All softwares are made by State Civil Apparatus. We do not have the budget to buy such softwares and if we could buy those programs, the source program itself cannot be easily developed. You have to hire other people to do it. That is the reason we create them by ourselves," she added.

Risma also conveyed that because of this strategy, Surabaya has a CCTV (Closed Circuit Television) system in a number of places equipped with e-tickets, face recognition, voice or loudspeakers that are directly connected to the Surabaya Intelligent Transport System (SITS) control room.

The Governor of Lemhannas RI officially opens PPSA 22



Short Education Program Batch (PPSA) 22 of Lemhannas RI in 2019 was officially opened by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo on Tuesday (26/3) in Dwiwarna Purwa Room, Lemhannas RI.

The opening which was attended by the structural and functional officials of the Lemhannas RI, began with a report from Deputy for National-Level Leader Education Maj. Gen. Karsiyanto. In his report, Karsiyanto reported that PPSA 22 was held for five and a half months in two systems, the first system is orientation, outbound and distance learning (off campus) for a month. While the second system is on campus held in Lemhannas RI for four and a half months which consists of lectures, discussions, Overseas Strategic Studies (SSLN), Domestic Strategic Studies (SSDN), Writing of Individual Scientific Paper Work (Taskap) and Seminar.

The PPSA 22 In 2019 were followed by eighty participants which consist of 16 people from the Indonesian Armed Forces, eight people from the Indonesian Navy, six people from the Indonesian Air Force, 15 people from the Indonesian National Police, 19 people from Ministries, five people from Private Higher Education Coordinator (Kopertis), three people from The Indonesian Chamber of Commerce and Industry (Kadin), five people from mass organization, and three people from community leaders.

In his remark, Agus Widjojo congratulated all participants accepted in PPSA 22 this year. "Your acceptance as PPSA 22 participants is a blessing from God that we must be thankful for," Agus Widjojo said.

On the other hand, Agus Widjojo also said that this education is not just a formality. "I hope all participants joining this program can increase their leadership skills and also becomes more responsible," Agus Widjojo said his hope.

Agus Widjojo also reminded all participants that this learning process is not a place to compete with other participants but to challenge themselves and the result can be seen after completing the learning process.

"All participants are expected to be a better individual with broader knowledge, better analytical skill, and more qualified national insight after joining PPSA 22. Lemhannas RI do not prioritize the participants score or intelegency but how they use their knowledge in their respective institution," Agus Widjojo said

Also attended the opening of PPSA 22 were former Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Drs. Ermaya Suradinata, SH, M.H.,M.S. and Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, DEA, representative of Indonesian Military Commander, representative of The National Police Chief, representative of Military Chiefs of Staff, representative of participants' respective Ministries and Agencies.

Annual Members Meeting of Lemhannas RI's Primary Cooperative

Lemhannas RI's Primary Cooperative held a 28th Annual Members Meeting for 2018 Budget which was attended by all cooperative members in the Dwiwarna Purwa Room, Lemhannas RI on Wednesday (27/3).

The annual meeting was begun by a remark of the Chief of the General Affairs Bureau of Lemhannas RI, Brigadier General of Police Drs. Triyono Basuki Pujono, M.Sc., followed by a report from the Chairman of the Lemhannas RI's Primary Cooperative, Priya Jakarsih, S.E., M.Sc.,. On this occasion, Priya Jakarsih explained about cooperative membership and the net profit achieved in 2018.

In his report, Priya Jakarsih said that the Business Revenue Residu (SHU) in 2018 decreased to 76.64 percent compared to Business Revenue Residu in 2017. The decrease was due to the reduced income from third parties, the budget revisions for goods expenditure, food, and others managed by the primary cooperative, Dwiwarna Purwa Room rental services, and also from the result of secondary goods services sale.

In general, general administrative activities can be carried out according to the instructions and regulations that apply in the cooperative itself. In addition, Lemhannas RI's Cooperative also the distribute the secondary goods which is relatively large, and the cooperation with other parties to improve cooperative's members prosperity.

The meeting was then continued with insurance and housing socialization, and giving away some prizes to the meeting participants.



Maktab Pertahanan Angkatan Tentera (MPAT) of Malaysia visits Lemhannas RI

Lemhannas RI welcomed the arrival of Maktab Pertahanan Angkatan Tentera (MPAT) or Armed Forces Defence College delegates when visiting Lemhannas RI as a part of MPAT's education program batch 39, on Tuesday (2/4) at Lemhannas RI.

The visit was begun with a Courtesy Call between the Leader of MPAT Delegations Commodore Mohd Fadzil Kamal bin Mohd. Mohaldin with the Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo who was accompanied by the Chief of Public Relations Bureau Brig. Gen. Sugeng Santoso, S.I.P., and the Chief of Cooperation and Legal Affairs Bureau Commodore Budi Setiawan, S.T ..

The visit was one of the efforts to strengthen cooperation between the two Institutions and the two countries, followed by discussions among the MPAT delegations and representatives of PPRA 59 participants in Airlangga room, Astagatra Building, 3rd Floor, Lemhannas RI.

The discussion was opened by the Chief of Cooperation Bureau Commodore Budi Setiawan, S.T .. and continued with an introduction to Lemhannas RI delivered by the Chief of Public Relations Bureau Brig. The presentation was continued with a discussion between the speakers, participants of PPRA 59 and MPAT education participants batch 39. "The transformation of the word 'defense' into 'resilience' changed the broader aspects of the field, not only military aspects, but all elements related to the resilience of a nation which is summarized into Astagatra," Sugeng Santoso said.

The Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo gave leadership lecture to PPRA 59 participants on Wednesday (27/3), at the NKRI Room, Pancagatra Building, 3rd Floor, Lemhannas RI.

On the occasion, Agus Widjojo presented the leadership lecture with the theme “Indonesian Leaders with National Character” for PPRA 59 participants who consist of various elements and educational background.

Agus Widjojo hopes that the lecture will not only deliver the leadership material but also become a place for discussion for PPRA 59 participants. Agus Widjojo also conveyed that Lemhannas RI is the highest educational institution, therefore PPRA 59 participants were expected to have their own leadership experience to be shared in the discussion.

Agus Widjojo said that leadership is a process where a leader can encourage all people he leads in carrying out institutional tasks. In addition, according to him, leadership can also be interpreted as a dynamic core that motivates and coordinates an institution to achieve its goals.

To become a leader, Agus Widjojo explained, we must know what to do to create togetherness in an organization. Leadership should not be absolute. In facing the uncertain changes in a leadership, a leader must understand and be able to identify the situation at that time so he can take the right decision for the current situation.

Before closing the lecture, Agus Widjojo concluded that strategic thinking can be interpreted as the ability to predict the future especially the external situation to maintain the effective communication.

Lemhannas RI holds an introduction to Lemhannas RI for Civil Servant Candidates

Lemhannas RI held an Introduction to Lemhannas RI for 2018 civil servant candidates (CPNS) in Syailendra Room, Astagatra Building, Lemhannas RI, on Thursday (28/3). The introduction was delivered by the Staff of Information and Documentation Subdivision of Lemhannas RI, Ni Made Vira Saraswati.

In her presentation, Vira explained that Lemhannas was established on May 20, 1965 which was conceptually urged by the existence of a national and international political situation which caused some groups, especially the Indonesian Military (TNI) felt that the life of the state was threatened by communist ideology.

Lemhannas RI, Vira explained, was initially established to educate and prepare prospective national leaders from the military and non-military to maintain the integrity of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia (NKRI) and is also expected to foster potential leaders so that national objectives and ideals of national independence can be achieved and will not influenced by communist ideology .

Vira then said that Lemhannas RI's vision is to become a quality, credible and World Class Institution in the field of national resilience. Lemhannas has some functions such as to conduct national education for prospective leaders at the national level, carry out strengthening of national values program, and conduct strategic studies.

At the end of her presentation, Vira said that the Lemhannas RI is a civil institution consisting of three elements such as Civilian (PNS), Indonesian Military (TNI) and National Police (Polri). Therefore, CPNS are expected to be able to adjust to the existing institutional culture. “It is expected that civil servant candidates can adjust to the different institutional culture between TNI, Polri, and PNS because basically we all want to give our best for Lemhannas,” Vira explained.

The introduction which was attended by 57 CPNS was then followed by question and answer session.

Lemhannas RI and Kemitraan conduct a discussion on TNI Reform

Lemhannas RI together with Non-Governmental Organization (NGO) Partnership for Governance Reform, also known as Kemitraan, conducted a discussion on Indonesian Military (TNI) reform which is still continuing on Thursday (28/3), in Kresna Room, Astagatra Building, 4th Floor, Lemhannas RI. This discussion forum called as intellectual exercise discusses the history of the TNI, the reform process, and the current problems of the TNI reform agenda.

The Executive Director of Kemitraan, Monica Tanuhandaru, said that colleagues from civil society want to understand the problems and challenges of TNI reform in the future. "Kemitraan has been helping the government in the process of democratization in Indonesia. Civil society cannot decide this issue independently. TNI's concern is also our concern. we can find a solution together," Monica explained.

Monica hoped that from this initial discussion, an understanding will be achieved to continue to advance Indonesia's democracy. Besides Kemitraan, there were also representatives of other civil society organizations including Amnesty International and Imparsial. "We want the democratic space to be maintained. Kemitraan also invite some people from civil society who concern about seeing Indonesia and the TNI itself as a part of it," he added.

Meanwhile, Lt. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo was appointed as the keynote speaker to explain comprehensively about the history and dynamics of the TNI. "The TNI was established based on the existence of Indonesian freedom fighters. Since its establishment, it has been in contact with politics. This development is in accordance with the 1945 Constitution and the context of the national political system at that time," Agus Widjojo said.

Agus added, "The change in government in the New Order by attracting military power into political power was not in accordance with the 1945 Constitution. By choosing democracy as a political system in 1998, the TNI reformed its roles and authorities different from the its roles and authorities from previous period."
