Labkurtannas holds Integration of National Resilience Measurement Data in Maluku

Vice Governor of Lemhannas RI Air Marshal Wieko Syofyan and Head of the Lemhannas' Central Laboratory First Marshal Ade Dian Surya Candra MSc departed to Ambon for the Integration of National Resilience Measurement Data of Regency / City in Maluku province in 2019 from Wednesday to Thursday (7-8 / 8) at the Santika Premiere Hotel, Ambon, Maluku.

The activity is the work program of the task of the National Resilience Measurement Laboratory Center (Labkurtannas) in 2019 to develop the ability to measure the National Resilience Index to the district / city level in the Maluku province.

The activity also involved the Ambon Regional Development Planning Agency (Bappeda), the National Unity, Politics and Community Protection Agency (Kesbangpolinmas), the Central Statistics Agency (BPS) of Maluku Province, and all Regency / City Regional Development Planning Agencies (Bappeda) under the Maluku Provincial Government. Also present at the activity were Regional Secretary of Maluku Province, Hamin Bin Tahir.

The Lemhannas RI's National Resilience Laboratory (Labkurtannas) has been pioneered since 2006 and started functioning in 2010. For



information, in 2018, Labkurtannas won the Esri Special Achievement in Geographic Information System (SAG) Award. The SAG Award is an award to agencies that have used Geographic Information System (GIS) technology creatively in order to improve the quality of people's lives.



Lemhannas RI holds animal slaughtering to commemorate Idul Adha 1440 H

Lemhannas RI held animal slaughtering (qurban) to commemorate Idul Adha 1440 H on Wednesday (14/8) in Lemhannas RI. Several structural and functional officials, Perista, several representatives of PPSA 22 and PPRA 59 Participants, and officials of Lemhannas RI attended the event.

The meat was distributed to 1550 people consisting of residents and cleaners in Kebon Sirih and Medan Merdeka Selatan, as well as all Lemhannas' Officials as told by the Chairperson of the Slaughtering Committee, Colonel Adm Arif Purwo Handoko, S.I.P.

In his remarks, the Governor of Lemhannas RI, Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo said, the series of Hajj and Animal Slaughtering are two activities which become the guidance for Muslims to fulfill the last Pillar of the Five Pillars of Islam.

In addition, Idul Adha is also a very historic day for mankind, because Prophet Ibrahim, Siti Hajar, and Prophet Ismail have laid the foundation of a fundamental example of sincerity in worshipping God. The daily implementation of this event is to work responsibly.

The theme raised in the Idul Adha commemoration is "With the Wisdom of the Sacrifice, We enhance the devotion to God Almighty and the Solidarity among Religions". Agus stated that this theme is

important because it contains the wisdom of animal slaughtering in ritual and social.

Agus also said that devotion, which is sourced of animal slaughtering, encourage people to share, to strengthen the relationship between the rich and the poor, and also to strengthen the kinship between tribes, religions, races, and groups. In addition, it also practices the values of social care in social and national life.

A total of 13 cows and three goats were slaughtered during the commemoration of Idul Adha 1440 H in Lemhannas RI.

In his remarks, Agus Widjojo said that the participants of PPRA 59 were expected to be able to implement their understanding towards the four national basic consensus, the national paradigm of the archipelago insight, national resilience, and the material given in carrying out their task to make and implement public policeies.

“Lemhannas RI hopes the alumni of PPRA 59 will be able to implement all the knowledge and insights gained during education through comprehensive, integral, holistic, and systemic understanding and ways of thinking,” Agus explained.

As said by Jack Ma, Agus continued, the Founder of Alibaba Group, in the World Economic Forum that the skills needed in the future is soft skills such as independent thinking, value systems, and the ability to work together.

The education process, Agus continued, is an individual and institutional investment stage to improve the quality of service of the alumni in their respective institutions. Agus stated that graduation is the beginning of dedication. “In western countries, graduation

is referred to “Commencement Day” which means the beginning of devotion, compared to the meaning of “Graduation” which we often interpret as the end of the educational program,” Agus explained.

In addition, Agus hoped the PPRA 59 alumni would be able to be an example and role model for people with consistent mindset, attitude and behavior in line with the national basic consensus, increase their concern for the development of social conditions in their respective institutions, as well as keep the good name of the alma mater.

In addition, Lemhannas RI also gave four awards to the PPRA 59 alumni, namely an Award for The Best Academic Results which was given to Col. Inf Tatan Ardianto, S.IP., an Award for The Best Individual Scientific Paper which was given to Dr. Dwiaryani MKM, an Award for The Best Academic Results for participant from friendly countries which was given to Captain Mohamad Norizal Bin Fahrudin from Malaysia, and a Special Award for The Best Paper for Individual Scientific Paper which was given to Colonel Anand S / O Sathi Kumar from Singapore.

The closing ceremony was also attended by the President Commissioner of PT. KAI Jusman Syafii Djamal who also gave a scientific lecture, as well as invited guests and Lemhannas RI’s Officials.





The Secretary of the Ho Chi Minh City Party Committee visits Lemhannas RI

The Secretary of the Ho Chi Minh City Party Committee H.E. Nguyen Thien Nhan and his delegations made a visit to Lemhannas RI which was welcomed by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo on Friday (23/8), at the Trigatra Building, Lemhannas RI. The visit aims to strengthen bilateral cooperation between the two countries, Vietnam and Indonesia.

At the beginning of the discussion, Professional Expert for Economics and Strategy of Lemhannas RI, Rosita S. Noer, M.A. talk about Ho Chi Minh City which is the economic center and became the first city in Vietnam with high productivity. The problems faced by Ho Chi Minh City, Rosita said, are almost the same as those faced by Jakarta. Jakarta, with 12 million inhabitants, has experienced a 10 centimeter land subsidence each year and there are severe congestion problems that have yet to be overcome. In addition, Rosita also said that Jakarta also faces bad air pollution.

Nguyen Thien Nhan began the discussion by asking about the market economy that is being implemented in Vietnam and also the lifelong learning system implemented in Indonesia with the internet. "In the past, there was no internet and we learn through books. Then how is the application of lifelong learning with the internet?" Nguyen Thien Nhan said in the forum.

In addition, Thien Nhan also asked about how Indonesia applies

its national values in facing global openness and the effects of the internet and market activities in family life. Thien Nhan also explained that in some countries such as Japan and Korea, moral values in the family began to be degraded. As many as 40 percent of adults in Japan and Korea remain unmarried and it is undeniable that it affects the sustainability of human resources in both countries.

Professionals Expert for Economics of Lemhannas RI, Ending Fajar, S.E., M.A. said that the economic base in Indonesia is market economy, but if the system does not run as it planned, the government will intervene. Indonesia, Ending further explained, had experienced a period of crisis in 1997 to 1998. Since then, Indonesia has carried out deep reforms that had improved the economic sector in Indonesia.

One of the reforms being carried out is the separation of the Central Bank and the government so that the Central Bank has authority to manage the economic stability. With the separation of the Central Bank and the government, Ending explained, Indonesia's economy grew more stable with an increase up to three percent in the economic level.

Related to education, Rosita revealed that the Government requires 12 years of education from basic education to higher education. Meanwhile, the Deputy for National-Level Leader Education of Lemhannas RI revealed that Lemhannas also played a role in educating cadres of national-level leaders to be able to adapt to globalization and continue to maintain the basic values as Indonesian.

Indonesia's 74th year of Independence: "Excellent Human Resources, Advanced Indonesia"

Commemorating Indonesia's 74th year of Independence, Lemhannas RI held Indonesia's 74th year of Independence Ceremony in Lemhannas's central field, Saturday (17/8). The ceremony which was attended by all Lemhannas' officials was led by Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Air Marshal Wieko Syofyan.

Wieko began his speech by stating that during its 74 years of independence, Indonesia had experienced various dynamics in national leadership era. Every leadership era, Wieko said, always focus on achieving national goals and interest as mandated in the Opening of the 1945 Constitution. Wieko also encourage the participants of the ceremony to continue to keep their spirit to create Indonesia as an independent, sovereign, and equal to other countries.

Then Wieko said that in this momentum, the Government raised the theme "Excellent Human Resources, Advanced Indonesia". "Today, Indonesian must be brave to accept universal openness and face an increasingly fierce interstate competition era without losing their sense of unity, and keep being more creative and innovative not," Wieko continued. Furthermore, Wieko said that Lemhannas RI must be respond to the rapid flow of information dissemination quickly and does not allow technological advances to be used by other parties who can threaten the National Consensus.

As part of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia, Lemhannas RI has vision that is in line with the Great Vision of Advanced Indonesia. Related to the role and function of Lemhannas RI with the theme "Excellent Human Resources, Advanced Indonesia", Lemhannas RI embraces various components of the nation as a an effort to create excellent human resources to achieve national goals and interest. "Lemhannas RI have been participating in creating excellent human resources and to achieve great vision of advanced Indonesia through Lemhannas' mission," Wieko said.

Lemhannas RI holds Socialization on Bureaucratic Reform

The Chief of Planning Bureau of Lemhannas RI, Air Vice Marshal Julexi Tambayong as the secretary of the bureaucratic reform team gave a presentation related to bureaucratic reform after the morning call at the Gajah Mada Auditorium, Lemhannas RI, Wednesday (8/28).

Julexi explained that this bureaucratic reform aims to create a professional government bureaucracy with characteristics, integration, high performance, corruption, collusion, and nepotism free, be able to serve the public, being neutral, being prosperous, dedicated, and uphold the basic values of the state apparatus code of ethics.

In his presentation, Julexi explained, there are eight areas of change, such as the field of change management, regulatory structuring, organizational structuring and strengthening, management structuring, arrangement of human resources management system, Strengthening of Supervision, strengthening of work accountability, and improving public service quality.

To realize the bureaucratic reform in Lemhannas RI, Lemhannas RI bureaucratic reform team and work units have carried out various activities such as conducting coordinating events among coordinators of the bureaucracy reform Team to prepare the steps in the framework

of evaluating bureaucratic reform by the evaluator team from the Ministry of State Apparatus Empowerment and Bureaucratic Reform (Kemenpan RB), conducting entry meetings related to evaluation of bureaucracy reform in 2019 with the evaluator team of Kemenpan RB, facilitating an internal survey with 100 PPRA and PPSA participant as respondents related to integrating positions, and others.

Julexi also emphasized that bureaucratic reform is highly related to an institution and also individuals. “The value of bureaucratic reform has an impact both on Lemhannas RI and personal reputations such as the increase of the performance allowance, so we must be concerned about it,” Julexi said.



RTD of Lemhannas RI discusses the development acceleration of archipelago province

The Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo said that currently, the development in the province with land characteristics is relatively much more advanced compared to the archipelago province which consist of several islands. "The current development orientation is not yet oriented towards an archipelagic approach, so it is unlikely that the archipelago province will not be able to optimally catch up with development in their regions," Agus Widodo explained in his opening remarks at the opening of the Round Table Discussion (RTD) on Monday (2/9), in Kresna Room, Astagatra Building, 4th Floor, Lemhannas RI.

The RTD with the theme "Accelerating the Development of the Archipelago Province in Improving People's Welfare" which was attended by four speakers namely Minister for Transportation of the Republic of Indonesia Ir. Budi Karya Sumadi, Director General for Regional Development of the Ministry of Home Affairs Dr. Ir. Muhammad Hudori, M.Sc., Deputy for Regional Development of Ministry of National Development Planning (PPN/Bappenas) Ir. Rudy Suprihadi Prawiradinata, M.C.R.P., Ph.D., Director of Harmonization of Laws and Regulations I of the Ministry of Law and Human Rights Bunyamin S.H., M.H. .

Budi Karya Sumadi conveyed that infrastructure development, such as airports, needed to be built to other regions outside Java in order to achieve inter-island connectivity that would have a positive impact on the development of the archipelago province. "We as a ministry pointed by the President to build airports and ports, must be check whether the airports and ports built have brought benefits for the regions, in the past they were all built in Java to cut the costs. Besides, the consumers were mostly in Java. Therefore, the vision

of Indonesia's to be Indonesia centric to spread development in particular in the archipelago province is now becoming our concern," Budi explained.

While Rudy Suprihadi Prawiradinata said that to encourage connectivity between regions up to the archipelago provinces, the development planning must be regional-based. A good city, Rudy explained, must have some factors as trigger for economic development. In addition, local governments must prepare human resources for cities or special economic areas that have been built and also develop tourism areas to encourage the people's welfare.

Related to the acceleration of the development of the archipelago province, Bunyamin explained, it can be done more easily and quickly if all relevant ministries and local governments cooperate. "The accelerated development of the archipelago province can be done quickly and easily. For example, the Ministry of Education and Culture provides schools for people's education, the Ministry of Tourism build infrastructure for natural resources such as beaches to be used as tourism destination, the Ministry of Health provides health facilities," Bunyamin explained.

The Round Table Discussion was then continued with a presentation from the fourth speaker, Dr. Ir. Muhammad Hudori, M.Sc., and the responders namely Pattimura University Lecturer Dr. Johanis Leatemia, S.H., M.H., Lecturer of University of Indonesia Berly Martawardaya, M.Sc., The Draft Act on Political Law and Human Rights of House of Representatives (DPR RI) Yudarana Sukarno Putra, S.H., LL.M., Senior Analyst for Law and Human Rights Affairs of Lemhannas RI Inspector General of Policel Drs. Sam Budigusdian and continued with in-depth discussion.

The President of Korea National Defense University visits Lemhannas RI

and 61 will begin in January and March 2020 and the course for Bahasa Indonesia (Indonesian) for PPRA 60 and PPRA 61 is currently taking place in Lemhannas RI.

Agus Widjojo also conveyed the possibility of cooperation with KNDU. This was responded positively by Lee Seok-Gu by saying that the possibility of collaboration can be carried out and KNDU provides an international program for participants with English-speaking class and lecturers.

The visit was followed by further discussion about educational programs in each institution and closed with a visit to various educational facilities in Lemhannas RI such as participant Dormitory, National Resilience Measurement Laboratory, Gadjah Mada Auditorium and language classes for participants from friendly countries.

The Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo held a *Ngopi Bareng* with social media influencers in the Constitution Room, Lemhannas RI, Wednesday (4/9). The event, hosted by Indra Bekti, aims to form synergy in supporting national development and increasing public awareness, especially millennial generation towards the Four National Basic Consensus.

Agus Widjojo said that *Ngopi Bareng* event aims to gain inputs from young generations and equalize the perception across generations, especially related to technological developments and social media. "We need to equalize our perception by listening to some inputs from millennial generation related to the development of information and communication technology which is now in the hands of millennials," Agus explained.

In the midst of the warm and friendly atmosphere during the event, several influencers mentioned some inputs for Lemhannas RI. A stand-up comedian Rony Imanuel, known by the stage name "Mongol Stress", said that civics should be taught from early stage of education because the formation of identity begins in childhood. "Millennials are now losing their identity because they did not go through the phases that I experienced before. I couldn't go to middle school if I didn't take civics as one of my subjects at school," Rony explained.

Meanwhile, Moammar Emka, an author, said that Lemhannas must be active in social media such as Twitter and Instagram. Moammar

Emka also mentioned that national resilience will be a very interesting discussion on Twitter or Facebook. In addition, Emka also suggested that this event can be carried out routinely. "*Ngopi Bareng* should be routinely held. It doesn't have to be too serious. It can be held with more relaxed ambiance, and varied topics like a kind of FGD with influencers. We really need material related to national values to be used as a discussion topic. If there is further discussion, it will be very interesting," Moammar Emka explained.

Talking about the latest issues, Henry Manampiring, an author, also suggested that Lemhannas RI be more active in the role of communication in terms of quantity and quality because of the threats faced nowadays is in the form of religious messages and related to the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia.

One of the influencers, Habib Husein Ja'far, said that the threats faced by Indonesia were attacking emotional side rather than rational to threaten the unity of the state. With this *Ngopi Bareng*, Habib Husein hopes that national values can be spread to millennials through social media. "I support this event, it needs to be continued, but with a more millennial ambiance," Habib Husein explained.
