# The Governor of Lemhannas RI Attends a Webinar on Urgency of National Service Curriculum Development at Higher Educational Level

Wed, April 7<sup>th</sup> 2021

The Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo was one of the speakers in a National Webinar themed “Urgency of National Service Curriculum Development at Higher Educational Level”. The webinar was organized by the State Defence Study and Research Institute, will be held online on Wednesday (7/4).

Starting his presentation, Agus quoted President Joko Widodo’s definition of national service; national service covers a very broad spectrum including political, economic, social and cultural fields. National Service can be actualized by every citizen in the society in accordance to the role and profession of citizens.

On this occasion, Agus stated that defending the country is an idea with a national scope and love for the country is the ultimate view. State defence is not only about the use of weaponry, but more than that, it embraces intelligent minds in all sectors and lines in order

to protect national sovereignty and dignity. “National service is not only the duty of the army, but also the duty of all citizens,” Agus said.

Furthermore, Agus conveyed the basic values of national service including loving the country, developing awareness of the nation and state, believing in Pancasila as the state’s ideology, willing to sacrifice for the nation and state, and having the initial capability of state defence. Agus argued that, only one of the five values stemmed from TNI membership, namely having the initial capability to defend the country. The remaining values includes citizenship, national insights, national and state knowledge which are not the main focus of the Ministry of Defence.

According to Agus, the four out of five basic values of national service are in the educational and social domain. Therefore, it is important to provide a balance to all interrelated institutions, in order to be able to foster the national

service awareness through formal and non-formal education lines.

Agus stated that there needs to be a mutual understanding in the interpretation of the definition of national service before compiling a curriculum at the higher educational level because the function of structuring the national service system has yet provided a meaning that can be carried out in a concrete, comprehensive, and final manner. “In fact, there are many interpretations regarding national service,” Agus said.

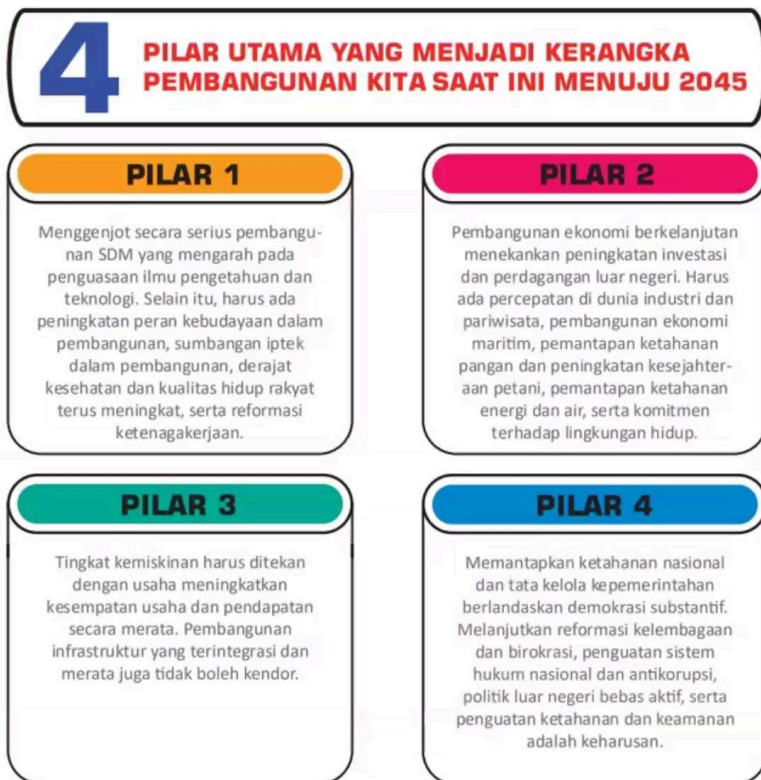
According to Agus, the curriculum at higher educational level should contain the topics the awareness of love for the country and how to be good citizens. In essence, national service is loving the country and being a good citizen. In order to achieve this, one of the supporting means is through civics and national history. “If we are not familiar with our own national history, we are unable to respect our own nation,” Agus said.

Regarding this point, Agus then conveyed the four main pillars proposed to plan the development framework towards Golden Indonesia 2045. The first pillar is to earnestly enhance human resource development regarding the mastery of science and technology. “In addition, there must be an increase in the role of culture, health status, quality of life, and labour reform,” Agus said.

The second pillar is sustainable economic development emphasizing the increase in investment and foreign trade. According to Agus, there must be acceleration in industry and tourism, maritime economic development, stabilization of food security, farmers’ welfare improvement, energy and water security, and commitment to the environment.

The third pillar is that the poverty level must be suppressed with equal effort and income. Integrated and equitable infrastructure development must also be advanced. Finally, the fourth pillar is to strengthen national resilience and governance based on substantive democracy. Agus emphasized that institutional and bureaucratic reform, strengthening the national legal system and anti-corruption, free and active foreign policy, and strengthening resilience and security are all essential.

Attending the National Webinar “Realizing Golden Indonesia 2045” held by the Doctoral Laws (Program Studi Hukum Program Doktor /PSHPD) University of 17 August 1945, Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo was presented as a speaker on Thursday (8/4) online.

In his presentation, Agus quoted from the UN’s Human Development Report 2020, stating that life expectancy in Indonesia, 71.7 years, is still below that of the world average of 72.8 years. This has a correlation

with the availability of doctors per 1000 Indonesian people which is at the average of 0.4, while that of the world is at the average of 1.6.

From the same report, Indonesia’s Gross National Income (GNI) per capita is stated at USD 11,459 and is still below the world average at USD 16,734. This puts Indonesia in the 103 position out of 189 countries. This clearly reveals that there is still much improvement to make to realize Golden Indonesia 2045 that is on par with other developed countries.

# Second Dose of COVID-19 Vaccination at Lemhannas RI

Two weeks after the first COVID-19 vaccination, Lemhannas RI held a vaccination for the second dose on Wednesday, (31/3) at Dwi Warna Purwa Room Lemhannas RI. The participants were the personnel of Lemhannas RI who had received their first shot and were under 60.

The two-dose vaccination was given with the aim to maximize the immune system development against the SARS-CoV-2 virus. The COVID-19 vaccination held in Lemhannas RI was expected to help breaking the chain of COVID-19 transmission. Several personnel and education participants

in Lemhannas RI who had received the first dose testified that the COVID-19 vaccination is safe and there is nothing to fear and worry about it.

COVID-19 vaccination in Lemhannas RI was held in cooperation with National Institute of Health Research and Development Indonesian Ministry of Health, Directorate General of Health Service Indonesian Ministry of Health, Directorate General of Disease Prevention and Control Indonesian Ministry of Health, Data and Information Center Indonesian Ministry of Health, Agency of Health Human Resources Development and Empowerment Indonesian Ministry

of Health, The DKI Jakarta Provincial Health Office, and a number of facilitators from Gambir Health Center, Republic of Indonesia State Intelligence Agency Polyclinic, Sawah Besar Health Center, and Medistra Hospital.

# Lemhannas RI Conducts a National Resilience Measurement Dissemination in Central Sulawesi

**T**he Head of Central Laboratory Lemhannas RI, First Marshal Suroto, S.T., M.A.P and several officers visited Palu, Central Sulawesi, on Thursday (8/4), to conduct a National Resilience Measurement Dissemination in Central Sulawesi.

The dissemination aimed to explain the benefits of the national resilience measurement for national development plans and evaluation in regions. If the benefits of the measurement results are well understood, it will give good impacts on the data inputting into National Resilience Measurement System (Siskurtannas). "National resilience possess a very strategic value for the sustainability of our nation," Suroto said.

Currently, Indonesia is facing countless threats, disturbances, obstacles, and challenges, including poverty, unemployment, inequality,

separatism, terrorism and radicalism, intolerance, and COVID-19 pandemic. "If we don't have a strong resilience or survival power, the threats might be putting our nation in danger," Suroto said.

Therefore, Suroto emphasized that the national resilience condition of the Republic of Indonesia must always be supervised to keep the national resilience condition of the Republic of Indonesia stays in the safe category, even when faced by upcoming various potential threats.

Suroto stated that by understanding the national resilience condition, Indonesia can make strategic steps, efforts, and anticipation by strengthening certain aspects that are considered weak, by implementing the national development programs in the central level, provinces, and regencies.

Social media, according to Wieko, possess a great power to disseminate information about the values of national insights, so that it can encourage people to anticipate values that are detrimental to the nation and to adopt a mental attitude that supports the realization of national unity.

The Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI, Air Marshal Wieko Syofyan with several high officials and personnel of the Deputy for Strategic Studies Lemhannas RI conducted a study locus visit to Riau Islands Province on Wednesday and Thursday (7-8/4).

The locus visit to Riau Islands Province was one of the strategic study activities Lemhannas RI aiming to collect data and information to deepen the Long Term Study materials entitled "Role Optimization of Social Media to Develop National Insights."

Riau Islands Province was selected as a study locus because Riau Islands has the highest Human Development Index (IPM) throughout Sumatra Island and has the score of 75.48, ranked four nationally.

"Nowadays, social media has become an addiction for the community. Almost all urban residents are exposed

to social media," The Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI, Air Marshal Wieko Syofyan said.

Widely accessible information stream comes with numerous threats, challenges, hindrances, and disturbances for the country. Additionally, Wieko stated that the hardest challenge is when Pancasila as the state ideology and national philosophy stops being the guidance for the life of nation and state. "Pancasila is the ideology of life implemented in the society that must be constantly maintained," Wieko said. The unity of Indonesia as a unitary state depends on how the citizens maintain Pancasila values as the national philosophy.

Wieko explained that one of the methods to maintain Pancasila values is by broadly presenting knowledge of national insights to the society so that the people get further knowledge and information about the major mission of the state and possess a solid foundation

# Opening Ceremony of PPSA 23 Lemhannas RI

Agus believes that the participants have unquestionable academic abilities and background experiences. However, having academic abilities and authority in positions is insufficient to become the national-level leaders. Ethics, morals,

and honesty are other prerequisites that must be possessed to form a character of a leader who has mind, attitude, and action reflecting an understanding of the basic consensus of the nation.

In line with this, the presence of the participants at Lemhannas RI must be accompanied by a determination to carry out a mental revolution, attitude transformation, and behaviours reflecting the figure of a cadre of national level leaders with strong national character qualities. Agus also said that the education program at Lemhannas RI serves to sharpen and increase leadership capacity and effectiveness. “The participation of the participants in the education is a form of rejuvenation and an investment to enrich leadership capacity when it is necessary to return to work in the field

after graduating from Lemhannas RI,” Agus said. Therefore, Agus emphasized that the participants should make the best of this learning opportunity.

PPSA 23 which is held in the midst of a pandemic suffers unavoidable limitations. Regarding this, participants are required to implement health protocols all the time as an effort to prevent and break the chain of the COVID-19 virus transmission. One of the efforts that have been made by Lemhannas RI is to conduct COVID-19 vaccination for educators and other interrelated work units. “Therefore, in an effort to complete the study assignments properly, health protocols against COVID-19 must remain as a major concern,” Agus concluded.

Lemhannas RI is committed to prohibiting state apparatus (ASN) from engaging in any activities as the forms of supporting banned community organizations. Following this commitment, Cooperation and Legal Bureau of Lemhannas RI held internal socialization on "Prohibition of ASN Involvement on Supporting Banned Community Organizations" on Tuesday (30/3) online.

The socialization was opened by the Chief of Cooperation and Legal Bureau of Lemhannas RI, Sri Widodo, S.T., CHRMP, presenting a resource person Rosdiana, S.E., one of the Associate Expert Policy Analysts on the Integrity of Human Resources for Apparatus of the Ministry of State Apparatus Empowerment and Bureaucratic Reforms.

Sri Widodo in his remarks revealed that the era of openness and abundant unverified information could create

problems for Indonesia. Furthermore, he said that the arisen problems will be complicated for Indonesia as a pluralistic nation.

"These kinds of threats, challenges, obstacles, and disturbances are very likely to occur in other countries around the world. For the Indonesian nation, with its pluralistic condition, the upcoming problems will certainly be greater and more complex," Sri Widodo said.

Meanwhile, Rosdiana as the resource person explained the basis for prohibiting ASN involvement on supporting banned community organizations. Rosdiana then discussed the Joint Circular Number 2 of 2021 and Number 2/SE/1/2021 regarding the prohibition of ASN to be affiliated with and or support banned organizations and or mass organizations whose legal entity is revoked. Rosdiana said

that ASN's behaviour is regulated not only during working hours. "ASN have 24 hours a day responsible for their profession, rules, and behaviour," Rosdiana stated.

In addition, Rosdiana explained eleven types of violations according to the Joint Decree (SKB) of eleven ministers and heads of institutions. The decree highlighted ASN's behaviour regarding the use of digital communication tools. Six of the eleven points of violation in the decree contain the term "social media".

Based on the applicable mechanism, if a public complaint concerning violations of ASN behaviour on the *aduanasn.id* page arises, the complaint will be followed up by a team of 11 ministries/agencies task force to make recommendations to handle the violation of the reported ASN through the Civil Service Officer.
