Wiranto: “Indonesia is the driving force for ASEAN”



Since the establishment of ASEAN, Indonesia's role has not diminished. Indonesia always participate in pioneering the settlement of every problem occurs in ASEAN which makes Indonesia the driving force in ASEAN” Coordinating Minister for Political, Law and Security of the Republic of Indonesia, General (ret) H. Wiranto, S.H. said in a lecture to participants of PPRA LVI and PPSA XXI Lemhannas RI with the theme “The Role of Indonesia as the Driving Force of Political Stability and Security of ASEAN”, in Gadjah Mada Auditorium, Lemhannas RI on Friday (11/8).

Wiranto in his speech conveyed that Southeast Asia before ASEAN formed is a region which was full of conflict and turmoil. Southeast Asia nations were still in the early stages of nation building that was full of internal dynamics as newly independent countries. Even though Thailand was not part of a colonized country, but the area was still a dispute for external forces influences due to the Cold War.

ASEAN's ability to create and maintain stability and peace in

its region has been able to promote some progresses in various fields, especially in economic development. Therefore, ASEAN is considered as a successful regional organization compared to other regional organizations.

Then, how about Indonesia's role in ASEAN? According to Wiranto, since ASEAN establishment, Indonesia's role has never diminished, Indonesia always participate in pioneering the settlement of every issue occurred in ASEAN which makes Indonesia the driving force in ASEAN.

“Indonesia must continue its role in ASEAN, considering the future of Indonesia is also the future of ASEAN, and vice versa.. The progress depends on our efforts as Indonesians who are integral part of ASEAN community “ Wiranto said

The general lecture was enthusiastically followed by participants of PPRA LVI and PPSA XXI in Gadjah Mada Auditorium. After the question and answer session, the event ended with token of appreciation giving to Wiranto and group photo session. ●

The courtesy call later followed by a discussion with experts and officials of Lemhannas RI and moderated by Professional Expert of Diplomacy and International Relations of Lemhannas RI Air Vice Marshal TNI (Ret.) Surya Dharma, S.I.P. with resource person Professional Expert for Defense of Lemhannas RI Rear Admiral Agung Pramono, S.H., M.Hum.

In his speech, NDC of India delegation leader Shri Abhay said that NDC of India Visit to Lemhannas RI each year is to broaden the insight for NDC Indian participants. "The discussion with Lemhannas RI is not only broaden our knowledge on security issues, defense and security of the region, but also the increasing understanding and cooperation relationship between Indonesia and India in the future," said Shri Abhay in the opening of the discussion with Lemhannas RI in Airlangga Room, Astagatra Building 3rd floor, Lemhannas RI.

"I am certainly delighted to carry out this visit to Lemhannas RI, because through this visit we can exchange ideas, knowledge, and comprehensive experience with experts and education participants in Lemhannas RI," Shri Abhay stated. The discussion then continued with a presentation Professional Expert for Defense of Lemhannas RI Rear Admiral Agung Pramono, S.H., M.Hum. titled "National Security of Indonesia" which addresses Indonesia's national interests, security postures, objectives, the concept of Indonesia's security capability planning, President Joko Widodo's doctrine on the World Maritime Policy, and security issues such as the South China Sea conflict, ASEAN and regional security, terrorism, and illegal fishing.

In addition, Rear Admiral Agung Pramono stated that the national security of Indonesia is implemented based on the national interest of Indonesia as stated in the fourth paragraph of the Preamble of the 1945 Constitution of the Republic of Indonesia which is to protect the whole nation, to advance the nation welfare, to develop the intellectual life of the nation, to contribute towards the establishment of a world order based on freedom, peace, and social justice. Lemhannas RI discuss National Resilience System with Professor Forum of ITB



Lemhannas RI and Professor Forum of Bandung Institute of Technology (FGB-ITB) held a discussion on National Resilience Measurement System and public policy simulation on Monday (15/8) at the National Resilience Measurement Laboratory (Labkurtannas), Astagatra Building 8th Floor Lemhannas RI.

This discussion was begun with introduction from the members of Professor Forum of ITB led by Prof. Ketut Wikantika. With this discussion, Prof. Ketut hoped ITB can contribute in the development of national resilience measurement system. "I hope ITB can make a real contribution in the development of system built in Lemhannas RI," Prof. Ketut said in his speech.

Furthermore, Head of Labkurtannas of Lemhannas RI, Prof. Dr. Miyasto, S.U. explained the main tasks of Labkurtannas, which are to develop a national resilience measurement system and public policy simulation in order to find out the national resilience situation of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia (NKRI), and also to create a portrait of

national resilience at provincial level.

"The function of national resilience measurement system and public policy simulation developed by Lemhannas RI was to strengthen the implementation of Lemhannas RI's main tasks, which are to educate the cadres of national leaders, conduct strategic and conceptual studies, and strengthen national values," Prof. Miyasto added.

The implementation of this discussion aimed to be a place to respond to the progress of science and technology, as well as the growing issues to unleash the space and time constraints that bring it to new civilization and life and play a role in the development of civilization as well as solving the problems faced by Indonesia and also the world.

The participants of the discussion hoped the system built can be an early warning towards the condition of national resilience. While Prof. Ketut himself hoped for further constructive discussion meetings in the development of national resilience measurement system and public policy that can support national resilience measurement. ●



With “gotong royong”, Lemhannas RI Responsible to Strengthen Indonesia’s Moral Values

Gotong royong (hand-in-hand to accomplish a task/mutual cooperation) itself is a Indonesian culture since a long time ago which realized the importance of being a social creature that lives side by side and interact with other individuals,” said Deputy of Strengthening of National Values Rear Admiral Dedy Yulianto in delivering Governor’s of Lemhannas RI’s speech in the 72nd Indonesia Independence Day Commemoration in Lemhannas RI on Thursday (17/8).

Dedy Yulianto also said that the 72nd Indonesia Independence Day Commemoration with the theme of “Gotong Royong” is such

a right choice. “This moment should be able to be utilized wisely to strengthen the noble values in the society so that it can be the nation’s great foundation to achieve national goals,” Dedy Yulianto said in the speech.

With the theme “Mutual Cooperation”, Lemhannas RI which was formed based on the Four National Basic Consensus has moral obligations to contribute in strengthening the noble values = through its roles, duties and functions by embracing various components from various aspects in education, strategic assessment and strengthening of national values.

Fiji High Commissioner visit Lemhannas RI



Air Vice Marshal (ret) Surya Dharma, S.I.P. welcomed a visit from Fiji High Commissioner led by Commodore H.E. Esala Teleni at Nusantara II Room, Lemhannas RI on Wednesday (16/08).

This visit discusses how cooperation between Indonesia and Fiji in various national aspects which focuses on regional challenges and global threats as well as handling natural disasters. The meeting was opened by the remarks of Air Vice Marshal (ret) Surya Dharma, SIP, who said, “President Jokowi’s priority in regional challenge is to build equal infrastructure in every region in Indonesia and also equal economy so there is no difference prices in every region in Indonesia especially in the eastern part which is very close to Fiji. Equal infrastructure and economic development in each of these areas is expected to build better education, way of thinking and awareness that we are Indonesian and also address the threat of regional inequality.

After speech delivering, the discussion was officially opened by former Indonesian Ambassador to Myanmar Sebastianus Sumarsono, S.I.P. who stated “Since 2015, Indonesia is already join The Melanesia Sparhead Group (MSG) so Indonesia will be treated equally compare to other MSG member. With this cooperation, I hoped Indonesia and Fiji can support each other and accept new paradigm to strengthen peace and prosperity in both Indonesia and Fiji’.

MSG is an international organisation which consist of four Melanesian Countries namely Fiji, Papua News Guinea, Solomon Islands, and Vanuatu, and Kanak and Socialist National Liberation Front from New Caledonia. In June 2015, Indonesia was accepted to be a colleague member. The Melanesian Sparhead Group was established to focus on increasing economic growth between Melanesian Countries.

Discussion was continued by discussing regional security strategy which mostly talked about operational level because the upcoming threats are related to global security and its effect to current regional situation. Vice Admiral Agung Pramono, S.H., M.Hum. explained that Fiji and Indonesia should identify and determine the same threat faced like illegal fishing, human trafficking and then create the same strategy to face those threats. We also cooperate to face Malawi threats where Indonesia held Trilateral cooperation with Malaysia and Philippines. Then, it was continued with discussion related to what action that Indonesia and Fiji can take.

Commodore H.E. Esala Teleni then closed the discussion by saying, “My concern is how Indonesia and Fiji can cooperate in facing global threats, and I am sure if we already identify threat and create a common strategy to face the threat, then we can solve it.” ●

Minister for Women's Empowerment and Child Protection Discusses “Women's Empowerment in National Development”



Minister for Women's Empowerment and Child Protection of the Republic of Indonesia Prof. Dr. Yohana Susana Yembise, Dipl. Apling, M.A. presented material on “Women Empowerment in National Development” to the participants of the Short Education Program (PPSA) Batch XXI in Bhineka Room, Pancagatra Building, Lemhannas RI on Tuesday (22/08).

The event was opened with the introduction of Minister Yohana, who is the first Professor from Papua throughout the history of Indonesia. Minister Yohana explained that the goal of the Ministry of Women Empowerment and Child Protection RI is strongly committed in human resources development, especially qualified women to meet the Gender Equality Planet 50:50 in 2030. Gender Equality Planet 50:50 is a campaign initiated by the United Nations which aims to equalize women to get equal rights with men in all aspects, without diminishing norms and natures as women.

Furthermore Minister Yohana discusses the importance of women and children's role to a nation. In 2015, President Jokowi gathered with all heads of state in the world to discuss gender equality. Out of 17 indicators, women become one of the world's attention today. Indonesia is appointed as the top ten countries to reach Gender Equality Planet 50:50 in 2030, as Indonesia is the largest Muslim country, has high tolerance and Indonesian women are now getting. Minister Yohana said, “Almost in all over the

world, women are still considered to have different level compare to men and are still become victims in various forms of violence. This is still a developing country. It will not be free from poverty if women are not on the safe line. This is one of our main tasks from the Ministry for Women's Empowerment and Child Protection to prepare women for the success of global commitments.”

Yohana further explained about Indonesia Human Development Index (IPM) which is still in rank 113 of 188 from countries in the world, then the Global Development Index (IPG) is still quite challenging because it is now in rank 108 from 187, and the last is the Gender Inequality Index in Indonesia which is in rank 103 out of 187 countries in the world. Currently, Indonesian women are still struggling in facing various problems such as domestic violence, family problems, sexual violence, and also economic disparities. Therefore, the Ministry of Women's Empowerment and Child Protection is intensively coming to regions and providing material to the regional heads to emphasize how important women's empowerment and child protection are. Minister Yohana continued in her statement that it was because people are somehow do not realize that women and children are very important pillars for a nation.

Yohana in the end of her lecture stated, “The world are now changing and so is economy. Therefore, we have to be independent, build independent family because Indonesian women are already capable of doing that and we also have to be proud to have those great women in this nation”. ●

Vice President Jusuf Kalla to Brief Lemhannas RI Education



We need to know where we stand and what we should do to achieve the (national) goal,” said Vice President Jusuf Kalla in the briefing of PPRA LVI and PPSA XXI participants at the Vice Presidential Palace on Monday (28/8).

In the briefing that begins with the report of Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieutenant General (Ret.) Agus Widjojo, Jusuf Kalla convey that all the countries have almost the same goal. Indonesia, Jusuf Kalla continued, has four national goals listed in the constitution that is to advance the country, advance the nation welfare, develop the intellectual life of the nation, and achieve world peace. To achieve these goals, the Indonesian nation must be aware of the position of each role and what must be done to achieve that goal.

Jusuf Kalla also said that Lemhannas RI as the highest formal educational institution for the national leaders should be able to formulate the steps that must be done to achieve the goal.

In addition, Jusuf Kalla stated that national goals can be dynamic but still based on main points. Call it, to measure the progress of a country, according to Jusuf Kalla can be seen from the economic growth although it is still inseparable from the national, political, and social problems that occur in society.

Economic growth should be the main focus because it is closely related to the problems that arise today, one of which is the problem of injustice. The problem of injustice in Indonesia

since the era of independence, Jusuf Kalla continue, has caused 15 major conflicts. The conflicts are called to be major conflicts for having more than 1000 victims such as the PKI in Madiun, Permesta, DI TII, the Uprising in Aceh, and the Uprising in Ambon.

Regarding the government system, Jusuf Kalla explained that Indonesia uses autonomous government system so that it should maximize regional or regional government and not only focus on the central government.

Moreover, to encourage economic growth, education and technology must also be addressed. To address this, leaders serving in government ministries and agencies must work together through cross-sectoral coordination and should disengage their institution’s ego.

Jusuf Kalla hopes that the participants of PPRA LVI and PPSA XXI can become broad-minded leaders after attending the education in Lemhannas RI and can cooperate among agencies to solve the nation’s problems so as to support the achievement of national goals and ideals.

The briefing then followed by discussion between Vice President and PPRA LVI dan PPSA XXI participants. The briefing is also attended by the Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Air Marshal Bagus Puruhito, Principal Secretary of Lemhannas RI, Police Commissioner General Drs. Arif Wachyunadi, Deputies, Structural Officers of Lemhannas RI, Senior Lecturers, Senior Analysts, and Professional Experts.

The two hour event ended with photo session. ●



Overseas Strategic Study Report of Lemhannas RI Reguler Education Program Batch LVI

Lemhannas RI Reguler Education Program Batch LVI (PPRA LVI) participants presented Overseas Strategic Studies (Studi Strategis Luar Negeri/ SSLN) report to the Governor of Lemhannas RI and Lemhannas RI officials. This year's SSLN activity to South Korea was attended by 26 participants of PPRA led by Senior Analyst in the field of Demographic Rear Admiral Ir. Yuhastihar and accompanied by Professional Expert in the field of Strategy and National Vigilance Major General TNI (Ret.) Abdul Chasib.

The purpose of SSLN is to get an insight and input to improve the relationship's prospect of Republic of Indonesia with Republic of South Korea in national development perspective. Places visited by PPRA LVI Lemhannas RI participants are the Embassy of Indonesia in South Korea, Government Agencies, tourism centers, and some strategic industries in South Korea. During the visit to South Korea, the participants got an overview of South Korea in Astagatra's perspective, South Korea's development history, and the bilateral relations' prospect between Indonesia and South Korea.

In the report presentation, PPRA LVI Lemhannas RI participants also conveyed the history of South Korea. The region was a territorial seizure of conflict between the forces of the

West and the East. During its journey, the country managed to get out of the economic crisis because of mental strength and government attention to improve human resources capabilities. The country's economic growth is also supported by Japan and the United States in terms of technological growth, human resource development, and financial support.

In 2017, the relationship between Indonesia and South Korea has reached the age of 44 years. The problems of relations between Indonesia and South Korea are the weak law enforcement, lack of infrastructure support, lack of information, and weak government in initiating cooperation between the two countries.

According to the participants, SSLN visit provide several benefits, one of them is that participants were able to directly observed the activities of strategic objects visited and obtained accurate information. Such information may then be used as a strategic review of political, economic, socio-cultural, defense and security developments concerning South Korea. Participants also gain a wider and deeper experience of development in the destination country. The experience that enabled participants to enhance and broaden their insights and knowledge in order to support the implementation of the seminar at the end of education program. ●

Lemhannas RI to Increase Sense Solidarity through Eid al-Adha Celebration



The celebration of Eid al-Adha 1438 H, Lemhannas RI held a feast of sacrifice on Monday (4/9) in Lemhannas RI East Parking Area.

In the opening of the celebration, Colonel Cba Iyan Supriyana as the Chairperson of the Event Committee reported that Lemhannas RI received 14 cows and 3 goats from Lemhannas RI officials and staff to be sacrificed. The meat will be distributed to Lemhannas RI staff and the neighborhood around Lemhannas RI office.

The Governor of Lemhannas RI Lt. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo in his speech said that the sacrifice that is held every year is the essence of the story of Prophet Ibrahim and Prophet Ismail about animal sacrificial rituals. The story contains several meanings, namely the obedience to Allah SWT, dignity, and sacrifice. The essence of the sacrifice, said Agus Widjojo, is solidarity and pure sincerity to expect the blessings of Allah SWT.

“The celebration of Eid al-Adha 1438 H by Lemhannas RI family this year is titled “Increase solidarity in Lemhannas RI from Eid al-Adha significance”. The feeling of togetherness, unity and sympathy can be interpreted as a feeling formed by common

interests in the society that everyone is connected to one another. Therefore, the theme must be understood not only in the social context of everyday life, but must also be understood in the context of the life of the nation and the state, “he concluded.

Closing his speech, Agus Widjojo hope with this Eid al-Adha celebration, Lemhannas RI family will always perform obligations to Allah SWT and fellow human beings in balance. Lemhannas RI attend hearing with Commission I of DPR RI



Lemhannas RI attended a hearing with the House of Representatives (DPR) Commission I on Ministry Work Plan and Budget (RKA K/L) 2018 on Monday (4/9) at Nusantara II Building DPR RI.

In the hearing led by Chairperson of Commission I of DPR RI Abdul Kharis Almasyhari, S.E., M.Si., Akt., C.A., Police Commissioner General Drs. Arif Wachyunadi as the Principal Secretary of Lemhannas RI conveyed two things: Lemhannas RI Budget Ceiling in 2018 and Lemhannas RI Budget Work Plan of 2018.

Based on the letter of Minister of Finance of the Republic of Indonesia and National Development Planning Agency (Bappenas RI) on July 25, 2017, stated that Lemhannas RI Ceiling in 2018 amounting to Rp 277,698,000,000 has been set forth in the Budget Work Plan in three programs namely Management Support Program and Other Technical Task Implementation, Program Supervision and Accountability Apparatus Enhancement, as well as the National Resilience Development Program.

The National Resilience Development Program itself is divided into three deputies, namely the Deputy for Education of National-Level Leaders, the Deputy for Strengthening Nationalistic Values, and the Deputy for Strategic Studies, including to support the National Resilience Measurement Laboratory (Labkurtannas).

Arif Wachyunadi said that the results of the three-party meeting (trilateral) between Lemhannas RI, Bappenas RI, and the Ministry of Finance of Indonesia on 23 May 2017, Government Work Plan (RKP) Lemhannas RI budget year 2018 has a priority program of mental revolution program that will be implemented through the Strengthening of Nationalistic Values Program that focus on eastern Indonesia.

In addition, related to the proposed program of Jakarta Geopolitical Forum (JGF), Lemhannas RI received recommendation from Bappenas RI that the program can become a priority program in budget year 2018.

The hearing was then continued with further discussion with Commission I of DPR RI. ●
