School for Nationalism, Attitude Development and Character Building of the Youth



“A balance between the three factors is expected to influence pupils’ and students’ behaviors so that they can have high academic results and that they continually uphold morals, ethics, honesty and nationalism”.

The statement was made by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. when delivering a speech at the inaugural event of National Movement of School for Nationalism at the Balai Prajurit Jenderal M. Yusuf Building (Manunggal) in Makassar, South Sulawesi.

The event taking place on Friday (21/12) was organized jointly by the Centre for Politics, Security and Defence Study of the Social and Political Sciences of the Makassar Muhammadiyah University, Lemhannas RI, the Ministry of Education and Culture, the Makassar Government and Institute of Political Studies of the Makassar Government.

The inauguration of the National Movement of School for Nationalism which was attended by over a thousand participants was a reflection of the concerns and commitments of the people of South Sulawesi with regard to the nation’s survival within the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia.

In his speech, the governor of Lemhannas RI gave a high appreciation to the idea of national movement of school for nationalism that he viewed as having a very strategic value

for the development of attitude and character building of the nation’s young generation.

“The youth, especially the pupils and students, actually have a vital and crucial role in determining the nation’s future”, he said.

Therefore, he conveyed his high optimism and hope for the National Movement of School for Nationalism to be the national vanguard that will thrive and spread across the Indonesian archipelago.

The inauguration of the National Movement of School for Nationalism is a breath of fresh air in the effort of developing and strengthening nationalistic viewpoint of the nation’s youth. Therefore, the governor delivered core messages at the end of his speech to, first, understand the national history, culture and identity that are rooted in the noble values of Pancasila; second, develop the values of honesty, ethics and moral (attitude and character) and national values; third, rebuild collective consciousness and awareness among the pupils and students regarding the values and behaviours which can erode a sense, spirit and understanding of nationalism.

The event was also attended by Makassar Mayor Ir. H. Ilham Arief Sirajuddin M.M., Vice Rector I and IV of Unismuh Dr. H. Abd. Rahman Rahim, S.E., M.M. and Ir. Rakhim Nanda as well as several other Unismuh officials.

Paradigm Changes in Organizational Culture

In order to interpret reform and bureaucracy that have, thus far, been implemented by Lemhannas RI, emphasis needs to be put on a change of mindset, work culture and organizational culture. To that end, a workshop was held with the theme “Building Organizational Culture and Performance in the Framework of Reform and Bureaucracy” on Wednesday (26/12) at the Auditorium of Lemhannas RI.

The bureaucratic reform is basically aimed at creating a professional government bureaucracy with adaptive and integrative characteristics as well as high performance. It should also be clean and free of corruption, collusion and nepotism, and is capable of serving the public. A professional government bureaucracy should also be neutral, dedicated, and uphold the basic values and ethics of the state apparatus.

To that end, there needs to be a paradigm change that allows for the possibility of finding a breakthrough or

a new idea out of the routine. Besides that, an emphasis needs to be put on a change of mindset, work culture and organizational culture in the bureaucratic reform policy.

The workshop, which was attended by all members of Lemhannas RI, is expected to pump up the spirit for changes as mandated in the reform and bureaucracy policies in order to create a government with work and organizational culture in Lemhannas RI.

The event, which was moderated by Brigadier General of Police Drs. Johnny M. Samosir, M.Sc. featured Chief of Public Relations and Foreign Affairs of BPK RI Bachtiar Arif, Ak., Deputy for Bureaucratic Reform Program of the Ministry of State Apparatus Empowerment and Bureaucratic Reforms DR. Ismail Muhammad, M.B.A., and the Director for Business Supervision of Enterprises in Transportation, Tourism, Industrial Estate and Other Services of the BPKP Bambang Utoyo, Ak., M.Sc. as speakers.

Performance Approach with Output Orientation

A budgeting system that combines performance planning with annual budget will demonstrate a connection between available funds and expected results.

The issue was the theme in the workshop held by Lemhannas RI which was attended by all members of Lemhannas RI on Thursday (27/12) at the auditorium of Lemhannas RI.

The budgeting which uses the performance approach is arranged with output orientation, where the ideas about the purpose of the activities should be included in each stage when preparing the budget.

Therefore, the benchmark of success of the budget system is performance or achievement of the goal or outcome of the budgeting where the funds are used efficiently.

The workshop themed Performance-Based Budgeting Process and Acceleration of Budget Absorption featured three resource persons, namely the Director of Budgeting System from the Ministry of Finance Drs. Rahmat, M.A., Director of Budget Implementation from the Ministry of Finance Tri Buwono and the Director of Government Inspection for Defence and Security from BPKP Sihar Panjaitan, Ak. Meanwhile, Brigadier General Bambang Haryanto acted as the moderator.

The workshop is expected to encourage the participants to better understand the performance-based budgeting process and the efforts to accelerate the absorption of the budget. It is hoped that the budgeting can be prepared effectively and optimally using performance approach with output orientation.



Environmentally Sound Utilization of Natural Resources

On Monday (7/1), a National Seminar and Workshop were held on the Managing of Natural Resources in East Kalimantan at the Grand Senyur Hotel, Balikpapan.

The event was initiated by the alumni of the Regular Course (KRA) XXV in cooperation with the East Kalimantan provincial government. It was attended by the Governor of East Kalimantan Province Awang Faroek Ishak, Regional Leader Coordination Forum, members of Alumni Association of the KRA XXV as well as other invitees.

Lemhannas RI Governor Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. who acted as a speaker at the event expressed his high appreciation of the concern and initiative to organize the seminar and workshop.

"I consider this activity as having a strategic value for the sustainable management of natural resources and for the prosperity of the nation, especially for the people of East Kalimantan," he explained.

According to him, the East Kalimantan province has a great potential to manage the available food and energy in order to contribute to the economic development and welfare of the nation, which will further enhance both the regional and national resilience.

He said there are several strategic steps to ensure environmentally sound utilization of natural resources, **First**, in terms of management and utilization, the natural resources should not be viewed merely as a commodity, but also as a source of welfare for the nation as well as an environmental buffer.

Second, the utilization of natural resources should be defined as the managing of the natural resources by providing added values to them while ensuring its environmentally sound utilization.

Third, develop the nation's competitiveness through competitive advantage, which is based on comparative advantage.

Fourth, conduct mapping of the suitability of available potential land for the development of various sub-sectors of agribusiness that will be transformed into agroindustry in order to improve food security.

Fifth, as the national energy barn, East Kalimantan should not just produce primary energy for trade commodities, but it should also need to develop secondary and tertiary energy in an effort to improve energy security.

Sixth, conduct evaluations of natural resources or develop natural resources accounting which should

be taken into consideration before implementing the management of natural resources.

The governor hopes that the national seminar and workshop will produce strategic steps and breakthroughs as well formulas for environmentally sound management of natural resources, unification of vision and perception of all national elements in managing natural resources, which later can be used as a national reference in the management of natural resources in other provinces.

Intellectual Exercise of Governing Board **“Honing Experts’ Knowledge and Skills”**

In order to monitor and evaluate the implementation of its general policies, the Governing Board of Lemhannas RI held an Intellectual Exercise on Thursday (10/1) in the 3rd Floor, West Wing of Astagatra Building of Lemhannas RI in Jakarta.

“... Lemhannas RI has made an effort to accelerate the process in preparing the 2012 Financial Statements. It will be completed faster than in the past years”, said the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. in the initial briefing of the Supreme Audit Board (BPK RI) on the audit of Financial Statements of Lemhannas RI at the Nusantara I meeting room, Trigatra building of Lemhannas RI, on Monday (14/1).

Lemhannas RI, based on the coordination between BPK RI and the Ministry of Finance on the preparation process of financial statements of each ministry/institution, has accelerated the preparation process of the 2012 Financial Statements, which is faster than in the past years.

Therefore, the governor expected all work units, which are subject to the audit, to fully help in ensuring smooth auditing process by BPK RI by providing documents

and information that fall into the scope of audit by BPK RI team with regards to the budget implementation and accountability in a comprehensive, quick and communicative manner.

The audit team is also expected to make an objective conclusion and assessment and give its opinions appropriately to what extent Lemhannas RI has been managing state finances properly in accordance with the applicable regulations. It is one of the manifestations of good cooperation between Lemhannas RI and BPK in the auditing process.

The initial briefing was attended by the Deputy Governor, Secretary of the Governing Board, Principal Secretary and Deputies of Lemhannas RI, Senior State Financial Auditor I of the BPK RI Gatot Supiartono and the audit team of BPK RI.

Governor Of Lemhannas RI Comes To The Rescue Of Flood Victims

On Friday (18/1), after performing Friday prayer, the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A., accompanied by Principal Secretary, Chief of General Affairs Bureau, Head of Domestic Affairs Bureau, Head of Domestic Affairs Division, Head of Administration Division as well as other officials and staff members of Lemhannas RI visited the flood victims at the Graha Prima Housing Complex in Tambun, Bekasi, which was one of the areas hit by the recent floods. It was inhabited mostly by members of Lemhannas RI. Towards the evening, the governor and his entourage arrived at the scene.

They were welcomed by dozens of Lemhannas RI members and residents of the neighborhood whose houses were affected by the flooding caused by heavy rains.

The governor inspected the residence of Lemhannas RI's member, civil servant Siti Khotimah, by wading through waist-deep floodwater.

He was quite concerned about the situation as the house which was supposed to be a gathering place for the family and a place take a rest can no longer be occupied; the entire home had been submerged by floodwater.

He further asked all the members of Lemhannas RI who were affected by the floods to be patient and to hold firmly to God, as this may be a test from Him in the form of natural disaster which must be faced patiently.

Then, he continued the inspection to the residence of other Lemhannas RI members which were also affected by the floods. He hoped that the flood disaster can serve as a lesson for all of us that we should use science and technology to prevent flooding from reoccurring and gave his advice specifically to one of the children of Lemhannas RI members that he should study and learn how to cope with all the flooding challenges in the future.

At the end of the inspection, the governor handed over cash aid to all victims of floods of Lemhannas RI as expressions of concern and sympathy over the unfortunate situation. All the victims were very happy given the fact that the highest top leader of the institution in which they work had visited them wading through the high floodwaters and provided them with cash assistance and moral support.
