# Commemorating National Awakening Day with Mental Revolution Message

**Y**oung generation nowadays have to be aware of the impacts of social media which can pose a potential threat in the future, stated Lemhannas RI Governor Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A in a special edition of “Indonesia Menyapa” program on National Awakening, which was broadcast live from Jusuf Ronodipuro Studio, Radio Republik Indonesia (RRI), Thursday (21/5).

“I call on the young generations to exercise caution and restraint when using social media as the viral power of social networks might be manipulated to cause considerable damage to them,” said Budi Susilo Soepandji.

He further said that the young generation of the 2000s was totally different from that in 1908. The generation of the 1908s played an important role in the momentum of National Awakening. They were known for making contact with each other and often read textbooks, which was quite different from the young generation of today who were more into social media rather than making real contact with each other or read books. Therefore, Lemhannas RI plays an important role in strengthening the identity of the next generation so that they will have a strong sense of national unity.

Meanwhile, Professor of Anthropology from the University of Indonesia Prof. Dr. Meutia Hatta Swasono added that the young generation had to have a filter against the powerful influence of the social media. Indonesia’s people today actually face the same challenges as experienced by those during the Budi Utomo Era, which is to get rid of an invasion, even though it is a different form of invasion now

that people have to deal with, i.e. economic, social, and cultural invasion.

“If we stand by the values which we have been inculcated with since a long time ago, and adhere to the Pancasila and the 1945 Constitution which become the sole principles in our national and state life, our young generation or young intellectuals will not be so easily dictated by foreign powers,” said Meutia Hatta in the program hosted by RRI announcer maulana Isnarto.

On the other hand, a board management member of the National Committee of Indonesian Youth (KNPI) Beni Pramula stated that the condition of the young generation nowadays was quite worrisome due to the influence of drugs and free sex and other vices. The youth today is like being at a crossroads. “Therefore, they need to develop their own viewpoint of what to do in the future,” he said.

Meanwhile, the chairman of the “Indonesia Scenario 2045” Team Dr. Panutan Sakti Sulendrakusuma, S.E., M.T., Ak. explained that in the Indonesia Scenario 2045, the condition of the youth would be very much different from that of the preceding generations. The nationalism values that they believe in would be more oriented toward the concepts of equitability and prosperity instead of unity and sovereignty.

The Indonesia Scenario 2045 is one of the studies conducted by Lemhannas RI illustrating the possible scenario of what may happen in the future, serving as early warning signs for the people.

## Lemhannas RI Convenes Roundtable Discussion on National Defence Industry

“One of the determining factors for the success of realizing a robust national resilience is having a good and strong national defence system,” expressed Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Suepandji, D.E.A. in his remarks when opening the Roundtable Discussion event themed “The Self-Reliant Issues of the National Defence Industry in Supporting National Security System for National Resilience” held at Kresna room, 4th Floor, Asta Gatra building, Lemhannas RI, on Wednesday (27/5).

According to the Defence Law No. 3 of 2002, the national defence system is based on a total people’s defence and security, which involves entire people and territorials, as well as other national resources, as prepared earlier by national leaders, and it is carried out in a total, integrated, focused, and continued way in order to prevent any threats being posed to the territorial integrity of the nation.

The discussion, which was moderated by Senior Analyst in Leadership Maj. Gen. Harry Mulyono, S.E., M.M., was attended by several resource persons, namely Head of National Development Planning Agency (Bappenas) Andrinof Chaniago, Parliamentary Member of Commission I Maj. Gen. (Ret) Dr. TB Hasanudin, former Defence Minister Prof. Dr. Ir. Purnomo Yusgiantoro, and Director of Sari Bahari Ltd. Ir Ricky Hendrik Egam.

In his presentation, Andrinof Chaniago put forth that the country had a good potential to produce its own primary weaponry defence system for self-reliance. However, there were lingering problems that had to be dealt with immediately, such as the lack of supporting infrastructure in order to produce the primary weaponry defence system, and one of which was electricity supply.

Whereas, Purnomo Yusgiantoro argued that the main problems being faced by the national defence industry included the issues of budgets, policies, institutions, and R&D management. This statement was further shared by T.B. Hasanudin who explained that the extent of threats, standard of deterrence, and finance / budget supports, as provided by the state, were among the main factors which shaped the defence industry.

Meanwhile, Ricky Hendrik Egam put forth that the lingering problems to be dealt with immediately were the lack of government’s will, budget, R&D on primary weaponry defence system and the long process of production and contract.

This event was also attended by Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Vice Admiral Dr. Didit Herdiawan, M.P.A., M.B.A., Deputy for Strategic Studies Prof. Dr. Ir. Djagal Wiseso Marsono, M. Agr., faculty members and structural officials of Lemhannas RI.

conveyed that Lemhannas RI was a center of excellence for the training of future national leaders while providing a platform for them to meet with each other.





"The key idea of the IGMF is to foster the country's maritime identity and reassert its long-standing archipelagic outlook," said Albert Inkiriwang during a discussion session at Airlangga Room, Astagatra Building, 3rd Floor, Lemhannas RI.

The Indonesia's Global Maritime agenda includes five main aspects, namely rebuilding Indonesia's maritime culture, developing maritime infrastructure and connectivity, maintaining and managing maritime resources, engaging in maritime diplomacy (through cooperation and elimination of conflicts at sea), and developing its maritime defence forces.

There are at least three basic aspects that concern with demographic development, namely population quantity and growth, population quality and population mobility. Therefore, it is important to escalate the implementation of those three aspects in order to realize maritime development in Indonesia.

The above statement was made by Ratna Dewi in her lecture titled "Supporting Maritime Development through Population Distribution" in front of the 53rd PPRA participants at NKRI Room, Panca Gatra Building, 3rd Floor, Lemhannas RI, on Monday (8/6). On the occasion, Ratna Dewi represented Villages, Disadvantaged Regions and Transmigration Minister.

One of the visions in the National Mid-Term Development Plan (RPJMN 2015-2019), in terms of Maritime Policy, aims at realizing national security which maintains territorial sovereignty and support economic self-reliance by properly managing maritime resources, while maintaining the identity of Indonesia as an archipelagic nation. This indirectly shows the great importance given to the aspect of population

distribution.

Furthermore, the gap in growth rates among regions as a result of uneven distribution of population has yet to be resolved. This problem is caused by differences in geographic condition, natural resources and infrastructure. It is further worsened by certain socio-cultural conditions, inadequate infrastructure networks that providing linkages between economic regions, limited investments that tend to concentrate on certain regions, centrally concentrated asset ownership and weak local economic institutions. All of these problems need to be resolved immediately in order to optimize the maritime development.



# ACSC Explores Cooperation Possibilities with Lemhannas RI



**T**he leader of the UK's Advanced Command and Staff Course (ACSC) Col. Murchison said that he hoped to establish a closer cooperation relationship with Lemhannas RI. He also sought to share and exchange information with Lemhannas RI regarding current issues, including in the handling of terrorism.

The intention was expressed by Col. In his explanation, Albert said that Indonesia was the largest archipelagic country in the world with a long maritime history, dating back to Srivijaya maritime empire in the 10th and 11th centuries. Indonesia has now made efforts to revive the once

vibrant maritime spirit of this country in order to assert itself as a maritime power.

“The Global Maritime Fulcrum (GMF) doctrine promotes the national vision and development agenda to rebuild the country's maritime culture and expand its economic base,” said Albert during a discussion session held at the Gatotkaca Room, Panca Gatra Building, 3rd Floor, Lemhannas RI.

President Jokowi has given a great emphasis on this matter by incorporating maritime issues in his “Nine-Point Agenda for Change” (Nawacita) and proclaiming his vision for Indonesia to become the “Global Maritime Fulcrum” during the APEC Summit Forum held in Beijing, China in November last year.

The event was also attended by Deputy for the Education of National-Level Leaders Maj. Gen. M. Nasir Majid, Chief of Cooperation Bureau Brig. Gen. Ivan Ronald Pelealu, S.E., Acting Division Head of Protocol and Documentation Drs. Wahyu Djatmiko, M.Sc, and structural officials of Cooperation Bureau of Lemhannas RI.
