Lemhannas RI Disseminates Information on Disciplinary Sanctions for Civil Servants



“We still have some problems to resolve regarding disciplinary actions,” expressed Chief of General Affairs Bureau Police Brigadier General Drs. Budi Setiyadi, SH, M.Si. during a Training Event on Disciplinary Sanctions for Civil Servants held at Gadjah Mada Auditorium, Panca Gatra Building, 3rd Floor, Lemhannas RI on Tuesday (30/6).

The event moderated by the Head of Personnel Affairs Division of Lemhannas RI Colonel ADM Drs. Nana Sujana, M.Sc. was aimed at establishing the same perception of the disciplinary rules, particularly in Lemhannas RI.

Mid-level Lecturer of the State Civil Service Agency (BKN)'s Education and Training Center Harun Arsyad, who served as a resource person at the event, stated that the Government Regulation No. 30 of 1980 on the Disciplinary Actions for Civil Servants was no longer relevant as it had failed to create positive work ethics among civil servants. Hence, the Government Regulation No. 53 of 2010 on Civil Servant Disciplines is then put into effect.

In accordance with the Regulation No. 53 of 2010, any civil servants committing a disciplinary violation of civil servant regulations will be punished according to the severity of the offense. There are a few stages in the handling of such penalties, starting from alleged violation case, first summon, second summon, investigation, to enforcement of penalties. During these stages, the civil servants who commit the disciplinary offenses can submit an objection or appeal.

Following the presentation by Harun Arsyad, the event, which was attended by Echelon III and IV officials of Lemhannas RI, was ended with a discussion and question-and-answer session.



Lemhannas RI Refines and Analyzes Strategic Issues on National Resilience Measurement Laboratory (Labkurtannas)

“Based on the 2014 spatial analysis, we found that four provinces still needed special attention due to their less robust conditions,” said Budi Susilo Soepandji during a Roundtable Discussion on the National Resilience Measurement Laboratory (Labkurtannas) themed “Refining and Analyzing Strategic Issues Based on Spatial and Functional Relationship” at Kresna Room, Asta Gatra Building, 4th Floor, on Tuesday (30/6).

The event led by Lemhannas RI Governor Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. featured resource persons from the Central Statistics Agency (BPS), the State Intelligence Agency and the Ministry of Internal Affairs. In his remarks, the Governor stated that Indonesia’s development in recent years had seen a significant progress in human development, competitiveness quality and national resilience indexes. Nevertheless, some provinces still needed to be put on an alert list, especially in terms of ideological, social, cultural, and economic aspects.

The problems in economic and socio-cultural aspects in those provinces were acknowledged by BPS’ Deputy of Balance and Statistics Analysis Kecuk Suharyanto. According to him, the welfare issues in socio-cultural aspect, which were related to economic aspect, include poverty, economic inequality and access. “Looking ahead, these socio-cultural and ideological aspects must become our common concern in order to achieve enhanced national resilience,” said Kecuk.

Meanwhile, Officer-in-Charge for Director of the National Vigilance of the Directorate General of Politics and Public

Administration from the Ministry of Internal Affairs affirmed that the issues in ideological aspect were associated with Pancasila and national character. “Currently, there are some indications of weakening national characters as the instilling and implementation of the values of Pancasila and the 1945 Constitution, Unity in Diversity principle and the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia have not become the main foundation in the life of the nation and state,” he said.

The State Intelligence Agency, which was represented by Director of Sumatra and Kalimantan Regions Dr. Thony Saut Situmorang, elaborated on the strategic issues related to the spatial and functional relationships of the national security aspect. “The strategic issues of global security still focus on the potential threats of terrorism and radicalism, and the increasingly escalating sectarian issues. Conflicts do not involve states only but also non-state actors, and this is the thing that we have to look out for,” said Thony.

The event was also attended by Lemhannas RI Deputy Governor Vice Admiral Dr. Didit Herdiawan, M.P.A., M.B.A. and faculty members.

The integrated economic zones in the coastal areas would improve the development and prosperity of the local people in which home industry, farming, ecotourism, water tourism, forest industry, ports, and others are integrated in one single zone.

The other panelists at the event included Navy Deputy Chief of Staff Vice Admiral Widodo, S.E., M.Sc. and Analyst in National Resilience of Lemhannas RI Air Vice Marshal Bonar H. Hutagaol, M.M.

Acting Chairman of the Corruption Eradication Commission (KPK) Police Inspector General (Ret.) Drs. Taufiequirachman Ruki, SH said that corruption, which had pervaded all aspects of life in Indonesia since the beginning of independence era in 1945, could undermine Indonesia's national resilience.

The corruption eradication in Indonesia is still perceived as non-optimal due to overlapping regulations and corrupt mindset of the ministries and agencies' officials that need to be immediately changed. Political will alone is not enough for corruption eradication, commitment is also needed.

"Considering the importance of national resilience, this has become a pressing matter, which is the responsibility of each national component through their respective core businesses," said Taufiequirachman when serving as a resource person at the discussion panel in front of the 53rd PPRA participants in NKRI Room, Panca Gatra Building, 3rd Floor, Lemhannas RI on Friday (3/7).

In the event themed "Optimization of Corruption Eradication in Indonesia for National Resilience", Junior

Attorney General for Special Crimes Dr. Widyo Pramono S.H., M.M., M.Hum. put forth that the policies for the handling of the corruption cases throughout Indonesia could be carried out simultaneously and synergistically by engaging other law agencies. "It is our homework to work together in order to strengthen and build this nation," he said.

Meanwhile, Director of General Crimes at the Police Detective Corps Brig. Gen. Ahmad Wiyagus stated that there were five concepts applied universally in eradicating corruption, namely prevention, law enforcement, general technical or supporting assistance, asset recovery, and international cooperation. "In order to do well in what we are doing, we should have goals and targets to achieve," he asserted.

Following the presentations of the three resource persons, the event moderated by Lecturer of Law and Human Rights Police Inspector General Dr. H.M. Said Saile, M.Sc. was continued with a discussion and question-and-answer session.



Army Chief of Staff Calls Attention to Real Threats Faced by Indonesia

“**B**ased on the population principle theory, world conflict background and location shifting theories, the acceleration of the population rate, energy crisis and limited availability of food will shift the background and location of the world conflicts to the equator,” said Army Chief of Staff General Tri Gatot Nurmantyo when giving a briefing to the participants of the 53rd Regular Educational Course Program (PPRA LIII) and the 20th Short Educational Course Program (PPSA XX) in Gajah Mada Auditorium, Panca Gatra Building, 3rd Floor, Lemhannas RI on Monday (6/7).

In his presentation entitled “Being Alert in Facing the Real Threats to Indonesia”, Gatot Nurmantyo conveyed that in 2043 the number of world population would increase to 12.3 billion people, which was inversely correlated with the availability of food and water, thus driving the search for food and water energy sources toward the equator. Therefore, Indonesia should be aware of this scenario considering its location in the equatorial region.

Moreover, continued Billy Nurmantyo, proxy war would also pose a serious threat to Indonesia. “Proxy War is a war which is carried out through various aspects of the life of the nation and state,” he said.

In facing the proxy war, Indonesia needs to make the best use of its geographic capital by developing Indonesia into both an agricultural and maritime country, and reviving the spirit of mutual assistance that have proved to be an underlying factor for its power and triumph thus far.

"With a common understanding and perception, all work units of Lemhannas RI will be able to utilize its budgets based on the prevailing regulations in order to accelerate the achievement of its targets and goals," stated Chief of Planning and Financial Bureau of Lemhannas RI Air Commander Yoyok Yekti Setyono in his remarks.

Head of Regional Office of the Directorate General of Treasury from the Ministry of Finance Dra. Rina Robiati, who served as a resource person at the event, put forth that the budget problem was usually related to its utilization, as a result of institutional, structural issues as well as non-standard practices.

Rina continued that effective and efficient budget implementation strategies should have been prepared since the previous budget year, such as in the preparation of procurement tender for goods and services, in order to avoid low realization in the first quarter. Moreover, financial management officers should understand the principles of business trips based on PMK 113 / 2012 and the principles of input cost standards based on PMK 57/2015 so as to avoid any questions from the BPK.

Lemhannas RI Holds Roundtable Discussion on Narcotics and Drugs

Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. officially opened the Roundtable Discussion themed “Prevention of Drugs Abuse and Illegal Drugs Trafficking through Socio-Cultural Approach amidst National Drugs Emergency in Order to Save the Nation for National Resilience”. The event was held in Krishna Room, Asta Gatra Building, 4th Floor, Lemhannas RI on Tuesday (7/7).

The outcome of this roundtable discussion will then be submitted to the President Joko Widodo as a recommendation in informing policy-making process.

Director General of Social Rehabilitation from the Ministry of Social Affairs Samsudi, M.Si, who served as a speaker at this event, stated that in 2011, Indonesia had more than 5 million drug users, aged 10-59 years. This fact has put Indonesia in a state of emergency over drugs. Therefore, in accordance with the Law No. 35 of 2009 on Narcotics, it is stated in Article 54 that drug addicts and victims of drugs

abuse shall be required to go through medical and social rehabilitation.

In that regard, Rector of the Indonesian Islamic University (UII) in Yogyakarta Dr. Ir. Harsoyo, M.Sc. stated that there were several stages that had to be taken in order to overcome drugs problems: planning, implementation, and evaluation.

Deputy of Coordination of Cultural Affairs from the Coordinating Ministry for Human Development and Culture Dr. HaswanYunaz, M.M., M.Si. explained that drugs abuse was the use of drugs without any medical indications, or without any regular or periodic medical instructions or prescription for at least one month.

Meanwhile, Head of Defence Subdivision from the National Development Planning Board Ir. Gunarta, M.E. said that if there were no any prevention and control measures taken, the number of drug users by the end of 2019 was projected to reach 4.9 percent, or 7.4 million people.

Martowardojo said that Bank Indonesia had a sole goal of maintaining a stable value of Rupiah and establishing monetary policies, regulating and supervising macroprudential policies and ensuring a smooth payment system. He made the statement during a panel discussion with the participants of the 53rd PPRA of Lemhannas RI in NKRI Room, Panca Gatra Building, 3rd Floor, Lemhannas RI, on Wednesday (8/7).

In his presentation entitled "The Role of the Central Bank and its Relevance for Economic Growth Continuity," Agus Martowardojo said that in terms of monetary policies and macroeconomic management, it was important to maintain a balance between supply and demand in order to achieve a sustainable economic growth.

Furthermore, he stressed on the importance of maintaining a low and stable inflation rate in order to improve the certainty of business climate, maintaining people's purchasing power, as well as competitiveness for the sake of people's prosperity.

Regarding the problems of Indonesia's economy, there are still some obstacles to achieve high and sustainable economic growth due to structural economic issues, such as current account deficit, which put downward pressure on the Rupiah.

Therefore, Bank Indonesia has set some policy directions, such as by making a prudent and consistent monetary policy in order to manage inflation and reduce current account deficit.

Following the presentation by the resource person, the event was ended with a discussion and question-and-answer session with the participants of the 53rd PPRA of Lemhannas RI.

BKN disseminates Information on Functional Positions in Lemhannas RI

“According to the mandate of the Law No. 5 of 2014 on the State Civil Apparatus, there are three types of positions for state civil apparatus, namely High Leadership position, Administration position, and Functional position,” said Head of Personnel Affairs Division of Lemhannas RI Colonel ADM Drs. Nana Sujana, M.Si. during a dissemination event on the “Career Development of Professional Positions”. The event featured middle-level lecturer of the Development Center of State Civil Apparatus from the State Employee Affairs Agency (BKN) Drs. Suparjiyanta who delivered a presentation on the changes of state civil apparatus management in Syailendra Room , Asta Gatra Building, 3rd Floor on Thursday (8/7) .

As a consequence of the promulgation of the law, the nomenclature of civil servants will be changed into state civil apparatus with its new management system in accordance with Indonesian bureaucratic reform.” The system will shift toward specializations in accordance with the employees’ respective backgrounds,” said Nana Sujana.

The most notable changes in the current civil servant structure are the elimination of the echelon system and the introduction of functional positions, consisting of general functional position and specific functional positions. The general functional positions are for state civil apparatus of level 1 and 2. Meanwhile, the specific functional positions are determined by the competency of each personel, which is based on a fairer rank system.

Similarly, Suparjiyanta expressed, “The civil servants’ career development is directed toward creating more specific functional positions, of which the job promotion will be based on a credit system.

The event attended by entire civil servants of Lemhannas RI was ended with a question-and-answer session and discussion with official from the Personnel Division of Lemhannas RI.
