# Lemhannas RI Held Strengthening Program of National Values in Tarakan



**A**s an effort to maintain nationalism, values and national insight, Deputy of Strengthening of National Values of Lemhannas RI held strengthening program of national values in Tarakan, North Kalimantan. This program was officially opened by the Deputy of Strengthening of National Values Rear Admiral Dedy Yulianto on Wednesday (1/3), in Kayan Hall, Tarakan Plaza Hotel.

In Governor of Lemhannas RI's speech, which was read by Dedy Yulianto said that in the midst of globalization and democratization process currently being undertaken, Strengthening Understanding of National Values is an absolute necessity so this nation is not caught up in euphoria of democracy that moves away from Pancasila as national identity.

"It is very necessary to be understood by all participants related to important role given to build democratic, ethical and dignified civil society, nation and state. We do not want democracy process undermine the value of national identity characterized by a spirit of mutual cooperation," said Dedy.

North Kalimantan Governor Dr. H. Irianto Lambrie who had the opportunity to attend the program also expressed the need for nationalism values and concept, especially in North Kalimantan.

Irianto said, "With the plurality and diversity of race, culture, language, ethnicity, class and religion, on the one hand is a wealth that can be a positive force in this nation development.

But on the other hand, it contains potential conflict if it is not managed properly and lead to national disintegration."

Geographical location of North Kalimantan Province which is in the border area will mostly face some treats like crime, illegal fishing, illegal drugs, and robbery, and it becomes our responsibility in maintaining and managing national values. National values will be meaningless if we only discuss it without any implementation practice.

This program was followed by 100 participants, consisting of 34 people from the bureaucrats, 28 people from academics / teachers lecturers, 38 people from community leaders.

The program was carried out for 7 days with outbound and was using strengthening methods through lectures, discussion, participants coaching, teaching practice with the theme "Implementation of national values derived from the four national basic consensus in order to improve the quality of society, nation and state life".

Gen. (Ret) Agus Widjojo in his speech at the opening ceremony expected the PPRA LVI participants to be able to explore the intrinsic value of national idea that has been passed by the founding fathers to be implemented in the current national challenges.

During the study, besides the core material on national basic consensus, participants will receive operational doctrine material about archipelagic insight and national resilience. “The formulation of nationality inherited from the founding fathers is not about death, but it is oriented towards the future. Find the meaning of national values (in the formula), adjust to the current condition and current national challenges.” said Agus Widjojo.

Agus advised the participants to not only concerned with

participants to build networking, expand horizons and build cooperation.

“Social Dynamics of Culture as the National Resilience Challenge” was chosen as the theme for education program. This theme is related to the need to strengthen social and cultural aspects. According to the National Resilience Measurement Laboratory (Labkurtannas) in 2016, political aspect shows less tough conditions. This political aspect affected other aspects condition, potentially causing social friction and conflict of interest between groups. Understanding of national values in society also decreased. This condition affects the dynamics of social and cultural life of Indonesian society.

The opening ceremony of PPRA LVI was also attended by invited guests of friendly countries and some institutions leaders. Chief of General Staff Vice Admiral Dr. Didit Herdiawan, Deputy Chief of the Air Staff Air Marshal TNI Hadiyan Sumintaatmadja, Secretary General of the Indonesian Democratic Party of Struggle (PDIP) Hasto Kristiyanto, Head of Education and Training Department Commissioner General of Police Basyaruddin, and former Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Ermaya Suryadinata. ●

# Roundtable Discussion of Lemhannas RI Discuss Strengthening Understanding of Pancasila on Young Generation



Lemhannas RI held a Roundtable Discussion (RTD) with the theme “Strengthening Understanding of Pancasila on Young Generation to Achieve Mental Revolution in the framework of National Resilience” in Kresna room, Astagatra Building 4th Floor, Lemhannas RI on Monday (13/3).

In the RTD moderated by Major General (Ret) Dr. I Putu Sastra Wingarta, S.I.P., M.Sc., Governor of Lemhannas RI stated that the selected topic does not intend to judge the young generation but to tell the older generation of their role in providing a qualified understanding of Pancasila to young generation. In addition, Agus Widjojo also stated that young generation is the successor of this nation and should have a deep understanding of the Pancasila.

“The young generation should be taught to be able to absorb nationalism transformation process in accordance with the development of their spirit and idealism,” said Agus Widjojo.

RTD is then followed by presentation from Head of Pancasila Studies Center of Gadjah Mada University Heri Santoto, M. Hum. In his presentation Heru explained that currently, young generation is still entrust Pancasila education to teachers at school. In fact, other factors such as family and community leaders are also important in strengthen understanding of Pancasila in young generation.

Additionally, Heru also explained that the most effective way to provide understanding to the young generation is to choose the right method, to provide an understanding of Pancasila to the young generation will be more effective through book compared to television or social media.

On the other hand, Azyumardi Azra, CBE explained that the revitalization of harmony between religion and nationalism must be created. This is because the religion teaches about the spirit of nationalism. In Pancasila, Azyumardi continued, also illustrates that religion becomes a natural part of a nation. Therefore, harmonization between religion, nationality, and Pancasila must be revived

In addition, the role of Lemhannas RI to provide understanding of Pancasila to young generation through Strengthening Program of National Values should also be developed in order to create leader cadre with strong understanding of Pancasila. This discussion was followed by some perceptions from responders and floor as well as a question and answer session

## Lemhannas RI and KONI Hold Sports National Seminar

Indonesian National Sports Committee (KONI) in cooperation with Lemhannas RI held a National Seminar with a theme National Sports Development and entitled “Accelerating Development of Sport Performance to Increase Unity and National Integration in the framework of the National Resilience” at Dwi Warna Room, Pancagatra Building 1st Floor, Lemhannas RI on Wednesday (22/2).

In his keynote speech, Governor of Lemhannas RI Lt. Gen. (Ret) Agus Widjojo said that the national sports achievements are currently facing uneasy challenges like infrastructure problem, funding and coaching athletes. Therefore, Lemhannas RI will cooperate together with Ministry of Sports, KONI, KOI and related agencies to advance the achievement of national athletes which is also an important aspect of Indonesia’s national Resilience

“Achievement sports and national resilience are two variables that express empathic causality that the achievement of national sport can foster national pride which is one of aspects of national resilience development,” said Agus Widjojo.

The same statement also stated by Deputy III of Sports Civilizing Division of Ministry of Youth and Sports, Dr. Raden Isnanto, M.Pd., Raden Isnanto said that less qualified infrastructure available, Athlete funding and development affect national sports achievements.

Additionally, Raden Isnanto also stated that Ministry of Youth and Sports are trying to civilize sports to the public. Ministry of Youth and Sports also seek to build in 1000 fields in villages and add sports facilities in public spaces.

Major General (Ret) Toni Suratman, S.I.P as Chairman of KONI said that besides those factors mentioned above (infrastructure, athlete funding and coaching, inhibition of sports) is sport policy which is frequently change. Therefore, Toni Suratman hoped the situation can be better with the government’s role in realizing the national sports movement, improving sports facilities, improving athletes coaching to remote area and ensuring athlete funding.

To improve sports performance in Indonesia, Erick Tohir, M.B.A. argued that Indonesia should take advantage of Asian Games 2018 momentum as the host of the prestigious event. With good achievements in Asian Games, Indonesia is expected to show a better performance in the Olympics 2020.

On the other hand, Professor at the State University of Surabaya (UNESA) who is also The Rector of IKIP Mataram Prof. Drs. Toho Cholik Mutohir, M.A., Ph. D. declared that the most necessary to do to advance the achievement of national sport is to build synergies between relevant parties so sports achievement can increase and strengthen national resilience of Indonesia.

Besides sources person, the National Seminar moderated by Senior Journalist of Kompas Busiarto Shambazy was also attended by three responders namely Professor of UPI Bandung Prof. Danu Hoedaya and former National Athlete Dr. N. Nurosi Nurasjati, M.Pd. The National Seminar was followed by a discussion and question and answer session with the participants who came from various sports organizations in all regions in Indonesia as well as the reading of the results of National Seminar by Formulation Team. ●

# The United Kingdom DCDC Visits Lemhannas RI



**D**elegations of The United Kingdom Development, Concept and Doctrine Center (DCDC) led by Commodore Rhett Hatcher visited Lemhannas RI on Thursday (23/2). The visit was welcomed by Deputy of Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI, Dr. Ir. Djagal Wiseso Marseno, M. Agr. who was accompanied by the Director of International Studies Agus Budijarto, SH, M. Hum., and Col. Lek Rujito D. Asmoro, Gdipl In Ds., M.A., R.C.D.S. in Executive Guest Room, Astagatra Building 4th Floor, Lemhannas RI.

During the meeting, Hatcher said that the DCDC is a Think Tank organization which consists of three pillars, namely the future, concept and doctrine. The DCDC consists of Legal Team, Strategy Analysis Team, Research Team and has 65 staff which are under the Ministry of Defense and composed of military and civilian elements.

In addition, Hatcher continued, DCDC is also supported by academic elements such as Oxford University, Yale University and London University. Hatcher also revealed that DCDC also more focused on scanning development, conceptual way of

thinking and learning from previous experiences.

Hatcher also described the output that has been generated called “Global Strategic Trends” program which has been running on an ongoing basis and there are also some specific products produced regularly. One of the greatest output ever produced was “Global Strategic Trends out of 2045” which has been being produced since 2015 and will continue until 2045.

The Global Strategic Trends out of 2045 is produced every five years and adjusted to the current state of the British government to refresh and renew the national security strategy.

After a discussion on the role and functions of DCDC, Djagal Wiseso Marseno provided an explanation of duties and functions of Lemhannas RI through profile video playback and a brief description. The visit was followed by in-depth discussion of various studies that have been carried out by both institutions.

Also attended the discussion were four DCDC delegations and it was ended with grouped photo session. ●

Bagus Puruhito also explained that in democracy, strengthening understanding of national values is an absolute necessity so this nation does not get caught up in the democracy euphoria that moves away from Pancasila. Therefore, Bagus Puruhito hoped that strengthening program carried out for seven days could equip participants with material related to Four National Basic Consensus.

## Lemhannas RI Socialized the Substitutions of Civil Servant's Pension Fund from ASABRI to Taspen



**A**fter the morning assembly, Lemhannas RI in cooperation with PT TASPEN held a socialization to 220 Civil Servants (PNS) of Lemhannas RI in Gajah Mada Auditorium, Pancagatra Building 3rd Floor, Lemhannas RI on Monday (13/3). The socialization is organized in the framework of the pension funds transitional of 220 civil servants of Lemhannas RI from ASABRI to PT. TASPEN.

In this socialization, representative of PT. TASPEN Halomoan Lumban Tobing explained about PT. TASPEN. In his explanation, Halomoan provided a detailed explanation of the four program from PT. TASPEN for civil servants. Those programs were Retirement Savings, Pension Fund, Accident Insurance, and Life Insurance.

In addition, Halomoan also said that currently, PT. TASPEN already has 55 branches spread throughout Indonesia and has approximately 14,000 pension fund service points. The service point transactions are carried out in cooperation with banks and PT Pos Indonesia. Halomoan added that PT. TASPEN currently manages the pension funds of 4.3 million

active civil servants and 2.5 million retired civil servants.

PT TASPEN also constantly innovate with its services. One of the services that are currently able to facilitate the process of pension funds payment is automatic claims service where the recipient will receive a short message informing that pension funds have been sent automatically to the account of the beneficiary without the need to come to the taspen office.

In addition, PT Taspen also has 1 Hour Service Program, TASPEN Car Service and also TASPEN Mobile application that facilitates civil servants to check their pension fund through mobile phones.

In connection with the transfer of pension funds from ASABRI to Taspen for 220 civil servants of Lemhannas RI, Halomoan said that all administrative data have been resolved between the two institutions. "Those data of 220 civil servants are already transferred to PT. TASPEN," said Halomoan.

The socialization was continued with question and answer session and grouped photo session. ●



## Perista Lemhannas RI Socialize Indonesian Woven Fabric

**O**n Tuesday (7/3) Lemhannas RI Staff Wives Association (Perista) held routine meeting in Dwi Warna Room, Pancagatra Building 1st Floor, Lemhannas RI. In the meeting which is held every three months, Perista also gave brief socialization about Indonesian woven fabric.

Chairman of Perista Lemhannas RI, Ms. Nini Agus Widjojo, said that Indonesia is rich with nature, culture, customs, and tribes. One of those very beautiful diversity of Indonesia is woven fabric. In almost all parts of Indonesia, there are various kinds of woven fabrics. However, Nini Agus Widjojo continued, not all Indonesian people understand about woven fabric so that the introduction to the types of fabrics is needed.

In this socialization, woven fabric collectors Syamsidar Isa from the Association of Indonesian Woven Fabric explained that in almost every region in Indonesia has their own woven fabric. In addition, Indonesia is also the state that has the most weaving technique as it is influenced by the culture and traditions of local wisdom. Syamsidar Isa added that the motives of woven fabric in each region is also different depending on local customs.

The quality of the woven fabric itself, Syamsidar Isa continued, depends on the yarn and dyes used by weavers. Generally, dyes are derived from natural materials which are more durable and not easily faded. However, yarn staining techniques with natural dyes faces some obstacles, such as the length of staining time that hamper weavers productivity.

Besides the quality of the fabric, Syamsidar Isa also explained that to keep a woven fabric in a good condition is by rolling it. This is done so that the gold thread in woven fabrics is not broken.

After the brief explanation of Indonesian woven fabrics, the meeting was continued with a fashion show that showcased a collection of woven fabrics from various regions in Indonesia such as Sumatra, Kalimantan, Sulawesi, Kupang and Bali.

Also attended the meeting were Vice Chairman of Perista Meirina Bagus Puruhito, Perista Board, Alumni of Faculty of Psychology of University of Indonesia, Indonesia Personality Development Association, the Association of Indonesian Woven Fabric, as well as Lemhannas RI female staffs. ●
