The Strengthening Project of Lemhannas RI's Capacity Building was officially closed on October 31, 2012. The event closed by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. was also attended by the Ambassador of Spain to Indonesia H.E. Rafael Conde de Saro, Spain's Trade Attache Antonio Estevez, Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI, Secretary of the Governing Board, Principal Secretary and other officials of Lemhannas.

Lemhannas RI has implemented a cooperation with Spain's CIMSA IGEIA, SA which was started on March 1, 2011.

The cooperation has provided benefits in the aspects of office administration, as well as in the educational process for the national-level leadership cadres.

Other than infrastructure and applications, the cooperation with CIMSA IGEIA, SA also covers the aspects of training and socialization in one single package.

"The improved achievement of Lemhannas RI has strengthened Lemhannas RI's resolve to realize Indonesian President's hope for Lemhannas RI to become a world

class institution," said the governor of Lemhannas RI in his speech.

The Strengthening of Institutional Capacity Building is a significant step towards achieving the world-class institution status.

"The strengthening of institutional capacity building would require the application of information and communications technology in order to enhance efficiency and effectiveness.

It will also serve as a means to open ourselves up to the world through a solid and secure platform, allowing us to cooperate with stakeholders through data and knowledge sharing," he added.

Currently, the cooperation between Lemhannas RI and CIMSA has entered into a maintenance period, which will last for the next two years.

"It is not only important in strengthening the systems operation, but also in ensuring the transfer of technology, so that the system can continuously be maintained and operated," he said.

LEMHANNAS RI'S HEARING WITH COMMISSION I OF DPR RI

Tuesday (11/9), the National Resilience Institute (Lemhannas RI) and the National Resilience Council (Wantannas RI) conducted a hearing with the House of Representatives' Commission I in Nusantara II Building, Parliament Complex, Jakarta. The Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. who read his written explanation on the hearing was accompanied by the Deputy Governor, Principal Secretary and several structural officials.

The hearing discussed Lemhannas RI's programs for the fiscal year 2012.

"Based on the review of Lemhannas RI's provisional ceiling with the Ministry of Finance, it is revealed that there are some prioritized activities in the field of national resilience that have yet to be supported," said the Governor of Lemhannas RI starting his explanation.

"So, it is deemed necessary to amend the budget allocations, which include, first, the management support programs and the implementation of other technical duties, second, the improved oversight and accountability

of the state apparatus; third, the development program on national resilience," he continued.

Therefore, Lemhannas RI at the hearing again proposed the budgets for programs that have yet to be supported in the Ministry/Institution Work Plan and Budget (RKA-KL) for the fiscal year of 2013.

In addition, the governor also addressed the Commission I's call for the clarity of Lemhannas RI's land status that was discussed in the previous hearing. Lemhannas RI has endeavored to meet all legal requirements for the issuance of land certificates.

"In order to improve the facilities and infrastructure, budget support is needed, even though the required amount cannot be determined yet," he explained.

With the ongoing synergy underlying the hearing, the governor hoped that such a synergy like will always be maintained for the sake of the integrity of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia.

The Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji opened Lemhannas RI's workshop on Nuffic's Niche Project in Capacity Building in International Topics in Education and Studies at Lemhannas RI on 11 - 12 September 2012 in Sumba D room of Borobudur Hotel, Jakarta.

It was conveyed at the event that the intention of Lemhannas RI to become a World Class Institution had also to be supported through capacity building of its human resources.

Therefore, Lemhannas RI has received an offer from the NUFFIC for a cooperation program in the Netherlands Initiative for Capacity Development in Higher Education (NICHE).

The general objective of the program is to enhance the governance with the improved performance of Lemhannas RI in the field of education and studies.

While the specific objective is aimed at improving the management and capacity of Lemhannas RI in addressing the education and study issues, and the mainstreaming of

gender issues so as to make them relevant to the changes and in accordance with the needs of policy and decision makers.

"In order to bring Lemhannas RI to a world-class institution status, the first thing that we need to improve is the human resources," said Budi Susilo Soepandji.

Thus, he expected that the program will improve the capacity of the human resources of Lemhannas RI, especially the expert lecturers, expert analysts, expert professionals and management staff members of Lemhannas RI in terms of innovative aspects, especially in international issues, such as democracy, human rights, globalization, good governance, environment, climate change, science and information technology, international relations, food and energy security, gender mainstreaming, and etc.

They are expected to be able to respond to such changes and give inputs for policy and decision makers.



Roundtable Discussion on Understanding of Bhinneka Tunggal Ika Values

The Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. read his speech at the Closing of Roundtable Discussion on the “the Understanding of Sesanti Bhinneka Tunggal Ika or Unity in Diversity Values in Twelve Provinces” on 12 September 2012 on the 3rd Floor, West Wing of Astagatra Building of Lemhannas RI.

EXTERNAL DISCUSSION WITH HS DILLON

In a roundtable discussion of the Governing Board on Thursday (13/9) in Lemhannas RI, Jakarta, HS Dillon stated that we should reform governance, revitalize agriculture, improve the effectiveness of ongoing programs –structuring, monitoring and evaluation, and be willing to devote ourselves to enhance the dignity of the people.

Indonesia in a comprehensive and integrated manner by taking into account the actual conditions and dynamic development of national, regional and global environments.

The discussion was attended by the members of Governing Board, Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI, Principal Secretary, Deputies, Deputy Coordinators of the Expert Lecturers, Expert Analysts and Expert Professionals.

In his speech, the governor deemed the theme raised in the program, which is "National Values as Source of Values in Drafting Local Regulations" to be very important and relevant, taking into account some existing local regulations that require further revision and amendment in terms of the substance of the material.

Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. The visit was made in the context of Overseas Strategic Studies (SSLN) in McGuinness Institute, New Zealand, on Tuesday (4/09/2012).

The Participants of Lemhannas RI's 47th Regular Educational Course (PPRA XLVII) and the 18th Short Educational Course Program of the year 2012 conducted Overseas Strategic Studies (SSLN) in September 2012.

The PPRA 47 of Lemhannas RI started the overseas strategic studies from 2 to 7 September 2012 with four destination countries, namely New Zealand, Thailand, China, and the Phillipines.

While the PPSA 18 of Lemhannas RI started the overseas strategic studies from 17 to 21 September 2012 with three destination countries, namely India, Japan and Australia.

SSLN is one of the main activities in the educational course program of Lemhannas RI to provide the participants of PPSA 47 with an opportunity to learn about, and observe firsthand the strategy, pattern and system of national development of the destination countries being visited, which will later be used in comparison with national resilience in Indonesia.

Through the SSLN program, the participants will have the opportunity to learn, understand and analyze

as from Korea and Canada, it is difficult to keep younger people engaged in conversations about the future. Our experiences lead us to believe that young people feel there is no place for their voice to be heard. In order to address the problem, creative approaches are taken and the concept of “pay it forward” is introduced.

Through the “pay it forward” concept, the young people that have attended a workshop on the constitutional issues will pay it forward by sharing the new insights they gained to others and encouraging as many people as possible to be involved in the constitutional review process.

New Zealand is one of the few countries this century to invite citizens to review their nation’s constitution. The representatives of young people selected from throughout New Zealand, and from a wide range of backgrounds, will convene at Parliament to have their say on the future of New Zealand’s constitution in order to produce a draft constitution.

The McGuinness Institute, a non-partisan think tank based in Wellington, is known for its project Constitutional Review and Project 2058.

The next day, Wednesday (5/9), the PPRA 47 – led directly by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, visited the Wairakei Geothermal Research Center in Taupo to discuss, among others, the technology of exploration and utilization of geothermal energy as well as the possibility of further cooperation between the two countries in the particular field.

The visit was continued on the same day to the Wairakei Geothermal Power Plant based in Taupo in order to conduct a field inspection related to the utilization of geothermal energy for power generation.

On Thursday (6/9), supervised by the Principal Secretary of Lemhannas RI Drs. Chandra Manan Mangan, M.Sc., the delegation of PPRA 47 of Lemhannas RI made a visit to the Fonterra Co-operative Group Limited based in Auckland. At the Fonterra, the participants engaged enthusiastically in a discussion and question and answer session with the host regarding the history of Fonterra from a farmer-owned cooperative, which has now grown to become a successful global company.

Fonterra’s future plans after its investment decision worth NZ\$ 20 million for the development of plants in Indonesia as well as its initiative, as a large company, for the environmental protection were also discussed.

The border regions play an important role in the context of national development. Along with its development, they served as the front yard of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia, reflecting the identity and benchmark of the national development. Moreover, its highly strategic position has made the development of the border regions as the top priorities in the national development.

The border regions problems are crucial issues for Indonesia, especially considering its vast border regions from a territorial point of view of the unitary state of the Republic of Indonesia. One of the example is West Kalimantan which is a region directly bordered with neighboring country Malaysia, both on land and at sea.

The government policies in developing and empowering the communities in the border regions have become a very important issue. The border regions have always been regarded as

the back yard of the unitary state of the Republic of Indonesia. However, in order to improve the image of the state, border regions in the paradigm of national development should be made the national front yard reflecting the unitary state of the Republic of Indonesia.
