The Governor of Lemhannas RI Releases and Inaugurates Echelon Officials in Lemhannas RI

The Governor of Lemhannas RI, Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo, released 12 officials and inaugurated 22 officials at echelon I, II, III, and IV levels, on Tuesday (14/9). Besides congratulating, The Governor also hoped that the new officials could bring the spirit of better change for Lemhannas RI.

Pemuda Adat Papua pays courtesy call to Lemhannas RI

The Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI, Air Marshal Wieko Syofyan welcomed pemuda Adat Papua (the Papuan Indigenous Youth) for a courtesy call on Thursday (16/9). At the courtesy call, the Chairperson of Pemuda Adat Papua Jan Christian Arebo, S.H., M.H. was accompanied by Pemuda Adat Papua Advisor Daud Rumaropen, SP, Pemuda Adat Papua Deputy Chairman Muis Iba, Pemuda Adat Papua Head of Education and Human Resources Andris Wonatorey, and Head of BPSDM of Papua Province Aryoko A.F. Rumaropen, SP, M.eng.

The Chairperson of Pemuda Adat Papua suggested that Lemhannas RI provide national insight lecture for Papuan students who will study abroad. The lecture is needed so that the students will not be influenced by

ideas that are contrary to Pancasila. The situation abroad is a consideration that an early provision is needed.


Currently, students from Papua are spread across 17 countries from Europe, America, New Zealand, and several Asian countries with a total of 580 students. Head of BPSDM of Papua also stated that the BPSDM of Papua is responsible in preparing post-high school human resources who will undergo education in certain programs at domestic and foreign universities. Therefore, Head of BPSDM of Papua said that before the students leave to enrol their education, they should be equipped with national values so they can maintain their identity as Indonesians.

The Deputy Governor responded positively to this idea and said that cooperation could be pursued through

coordination with the Legal and Cooperation Bureau of Lemhannas RI. "Actually, with the pandemic situation, it opens up opportunities to be able to carry out Strengthening of National Values program through via online," He said.

The Deputy for Strengthening of National Values at Lemhannas RI, Rear Admiral Prasetya Nugraha, S.T., M.Sc. who was also attended the courtesy call said that prior to the Covid-19 pandemic, Lemhannas RI planned to hold a program to be carried out in Papua. However, with the Covid-19 pandemic, the plan had to be changed and implemented virtually. The Deputy also welcomes the plan to develop the Strengthening of National Values Program and hopes that current condition will continue to improve.

The First Olah Sismennas of PPSA 23

The 1st National Management System Simulation (Olah Sismennas) of PPSA 23 (Short Education Program Batch 23) of Lemhannas RI was officially opened, Tuesday (21/9). With the theme "Cross-Sectoral Coordination of Government Apparatus and Related Agencies in Continuing National Development Amid the Covid-19 Resolution," the activity was carried out virtually through video conference.

A total of 60 PPSA 23 participants carried out the scenario which was divided into 13 ministries and institutions. In detail, these institutions are Ministry of Health, Ministry of Villages PDTT, Ministry of Social Affairs, Ministry of Trade, Ministry of SOEs, Ministry of Law and Human Rights, Ministry of Transportation, Ministry of Tourism and Creative Economy, Ministry of Maritime Affairs and Fisheries, Ministry of Defense, Ministry of Home Affairs, and Police Headquarters.

In the Olah Sismennas scenario, various dynamics of national life

that are logically assumed will be described. The situation that arises is made in such a way that it creates similarities to the actual situation and dynamics. The various dynamics described, both external and internal, are considered to be able to influence national life, especially in terms of national development.

In his report, the Director of Education Operations of the Deputy Office of National Level Leaders Education, Air Commander Maman Suherman, M.A.P. convey some of the objectives of Olah Sismennas. First, to train participants in applying all the knowledge and fields of study gained during their education at Lemhannas RI. Second, train participants to make strategic policies and policy recommendations to accommodate stakeholders in solving national problems. Third, train participants in cross-sectoral coordination, both horizontally and vertically, through bureaucratic processes and mechanisms to make decisions. Fourth, train participants to make decisions in critical conditions and the limited

time and available infrastructure.

In more detail, Deputy for National Level Leaders Education of Lemhannas RI, Major General Sugeng Santoso, S.I.P., said that Olah Sismennas was a simulation exercise of cooperation, coordination, and synchronization between ministries and institutions to produce and operationalize a government policy. With the ultimate goal of national development being carried out in a synergistic, effective, and efficient manner which leads to increased benefits for the wider community.

The Olah Sismennas was originally one of the methods developed by the Lemhannas RI in learning specifically for the participants of the Regular Education Program and the Regional Leaders Strengthening Program. "This year is special because this year is the first time that the Short Education Program participants participate in carrying out Olah Sismennas," The Deputy for National-Level Leader Education said at the Opening Ceremony of the 1st PPSA 23 Olah Sismennas in 2021.

Governor of Lemhannas RI gives lecture to Participants of Training for Trainers Batch III

Lemhannas RI held a Training of Trainers of Strengthening of National Values Batch III in 2021. The Governor of Lemhannas RI, Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) The Governor had the opportunity to give lecture to the Training of Trainers participants who came from the various backgrounds such as teachers, lecturers, and training on Tuesday (21/9).

The Governor started his lecture by explaining that the Training of Trainers program is a development program for trainers who will later create new agents of change who carry the values of national insight. Due to the importance of their duties, the participants are expected to optimize the Training of Trainers program. "The participants of this program consist of lecturers, teachers, and trainers have different characteristics and cover several levels of education that require different approaches," The Governor said.

Moreover, The Governor explained that resilience is the ability of an entity to return to its original

form after its being stretched. The Governor also explained the concept of national resilience with Trigatra and Pancagatra approaches. Trigatra are relatively static approach which are gifts from God, covering geography, natural resources, and demography. Meanwhile, Pancagatra is a relatively dynamic approach that includes ideology, politics, economy, socio-culture, and defense and security.

The journey to national goals will face threats, disturbances, obstacles, and challenges and national resilience will only be achieved if the existing approaches

are in good condition. The Governor reminded that it is a common interest to provide an affirmative basis for strengthening Pancasila as the basis of the state in the context of strengthening national resilience.

On that occasion, The Governor also explained that the function of Lemhannas RI is to educate candidates for national -level leaders with national insight, four national basic consensus, and national values. In addition, Lemhannas RI is also a place to carry out strategic conceptual studies on national issues and also to internalize national values.

Parallel Session of Call for Paper of “Journal kajian” of Lemhannas RI

The Deputy Office for Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI again held a Parallel Session of Call for Paper on “Jurnal Kajian” of Lemhannas RI (research journal of Lemhannas RI) on Thursday (23/9). A total of 21 “Jurnal Kajian” with national resilience as its theme with writers from various universities and institutions were registered to participate in the parallel session.

The Director of Study Development Program of Lemhannas RI, Hentoro Cahyono, S.H., M.H. in his report said that all participants were divided into four virtual rooms, namely the socio-cultural room, the defense and security and geography room, the ideological and political room, as well as the economic and natural resources room. Each virtual room is managed by a moderator, operator, and attended by a tutor. It aims to give the opportunity for participants to get guidance and input on the journals that have been published.

The Deputy for Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Reni Mayerni, M.P. in her speech said that currently, the publication of Indonesian research results at the global level is considered very low, especially those indexed in reputable international indexes. One of the contributing factors is the undeveloped writing culture in society and the low willingness and ability to write research results and community service. It is not surprising then that the dissemination of research results and community service through international scientific periodicals is still low. “The development of culture and ability, especially motivation to write, becomes a challenge and a problem that must be overcome immediately,” She said.

The motivation to conduct research has not been balanced with the moral responsibility as a researcher to disseminate the results of his research which are very useful for the wider community both for practical purposes

and for theoretical development. In fact, by publishing research results in scientific journals, researchers will get a lot of input and at the same time, the opportunity to further develop their research in the future.

One of the efforts to increase the nation's competitiveness is through universities, including in this case Lemhannas RI, by increasing the quality and quantity of publications. “The role of Lemhannas RI and universities in the development of science and technology is not only the contribution of their graduates or quality alumni, but also from research results that are relevant to scientific development and development needs,” The Deputy said. Currently, Lemhannas RI has published printed journals that have been running until the 44th edition in December 2020 and online journals that are still in the pioneering stage towards accreditation.

The Signing of Memorandum of Understanding between Lemhannas RI and Japnas

For the first time, Lemhannas RI with the National Entrepreneurs Network (Japnas) signed a Memorandum of Understanding, Thursday (23/9). The scope of the Memorandum of Understanding includes improving the quality of Human Resources through education and training, exchanging experts and strengthening national values, exchanging information, as well as conducting studies and other fields according to the scope of collaboration.

General Chairperson of Japnas Bayu Priawan Djokosoetono said that the cooperation between Japnas and Lemhannas RI is a very important collaboration considering that Japnas is a small part of the contributors to Indonesia's economic growth. According to General Chairperson of Japnas, Japnas, which consists of businessmen spread throughout Indonesia, needs national values and insights that must be applied in the daily life of each member.

Japnas members in their respective capacities as entrepreneurs are small leaders in their industry, in their business, and in their companies. Therefore, the national values and insight becoming essential knowledge that must be understood by businessman to later be disseminated and implemented. "We all really need members of Japnas to become reliable entrepreneurs and also play an active role in maintaining the integrity of the Republic of Indonesia," He said.

The Governor of Lemhannas RI emphasized that the signing of the memorandum of understanding is a starting point. Therefore, it is expected that the signing of the memorandum of understanding will not only be ceremonial, but also need to be implemented in more concrete program consistently related to the fields within the scope of the collaboration.

"The synergy between these two institutions is expected to be one of our joint efforts in strengthening national insight as an absolute prerequisite in building quality Indonesian Human Resources, highly competitive, and having national character for the realization of strong national resilience," said The Governor. With the potential own by Lemhannas RI and Japnas, The Governor believes both institution can work together to produce more optimal results and targets.

The signing of the Memorandum of Understanding was also attended by the Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI, Deputy for National-Level Leader Education of Lemhannas RI, Deputy for Strategic Studies at Lemhannas RI, Deputy for Strengthening of National Values of Lemhannas RI, and Head of the Legal and Cooperation Bureau of Lemhannas RI, acting chairperson of Japnas, and vice general chairperson committee of Japnas.



The Governor of Lemhannas RI as Speaker at the National Webinar Untag Semarang

Mon, September 27th 2021

The Governor of Lemhannas RI, Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo, was present as a speaker at the National Webinar “Law Enforcement Toward a Humanist Justice – a Criminal Perspective”. Organized by the University of 17 August 1945 (Untag) Semarang, the webinar was held virtually on Monday (27/9).

On that occasion, The Governor discussed the topic “Restorative Justice in Law Enforcement toward a Humanist Justice”. Starting his presentation, The Governor stated that humanism is a movement to raise awareness of human values primarily emphasizing on humans as individual and personal beings.

Furthermore, The Governor said that restorative justice is a form of law enforcement toward a humanist

justice. The guideline for the application of restorative justice in the general judiciary is already available, namely the Decree of the Director General of the Supreme Court of the Republic of Indonesia Number 1691/DJU/SK/PS.00/12/2020 dated December 22, 2020 concerning the Enforcement of Guidelines for the Implementation of Restorative Justice.

Restorative justice is an alternative for resolving criminal cases that focuses on dialogue and mediation processes involving perpetrators, victims, families of perpetrators/victims, and other related parties to cooperatively create an agreement on a fair and balanced settlement of criminal cases for both victims and perpetrators, by prioritizing the restoration to its original state and restoring the pattern of good relations in society. The values of humanism in restorative justice are realized by

carrying out movements to support a generalist approach that allows all crime victims to access restorative justice procedures at all stages of the criminal proceedings.

The Governor closed his session by presenting a recommendation that the idea of the humanist aspect in a criminal perspective should not be reviewed with sectorial approach to deal with overcapacity correctional institutions, but viewed using a systemic approach. There are several things worth to consider, firstly the completion of good legal proceedings is emphasized more on the quality aspect rather than quantity target at the operational level, secondly searching for solutions to the deceleration in completing the proceedings, and thirdly emphasizing on preventing rather than handling cases in the context of law enforcement functions and public safety and order.





Orientation Course for PPSA 23 Participants' Wife/Husband Held Virtually

Orientation Course for PPSA 23 Participants' Wife/Husband of 2021 Lemhannas RI was officially opened, Monday (4/10). The event was held virtually for six days and was attended by 56 participants' wives and 1 participant's husband.

On that occasion, The Governor stated that there are at least three objectives for the orientation course for PPSA 23 Participants' Wife/Husband. First, to increase the insight, knowledge and horizons of the wife/husband's perspective in line with the development of insight, knowledge and horizons of the PPSA 23 participants after attending the education program at Lemhannas RI. Second, to strengthen the familial relationships between the wives/husbands of the participants including the organic personnel of Lemhannas RI. "Making acquaintance and getting to know each other based on a strong inner bond is expected to be a means for creating a conducive and communicative friendship climate in the future," He said. Third, to learn how to interact during this

pandemic that require adjustments to the new life order or new normal.

Furthermore, The Governor stated that the spirit of nationalism, a tolerant family environment, and togetherness with the foundation of Bhinneka Tunggal Ika can suffer from destruction due to the currents of globalization and the dynamics of the developing political situation. In dealing with this condition, the understanding of national outlook by prioritizing national unity and integrity based on democracy needs to be strengthened. "Through this orientation course, the significance of national morality and ethics should be understood and implemented in the mindset, attitudes, and actions in everyday life," He said.

The core of the orientation course for PPSA 23 Participants' Wife/Husband is to train the participants wife/husband to strengthen the roles in supporting and assisting wives/husbands, both in official relationships as well as in family and community life. As an effort to strengthen the role of

participants in the organization, family and community, The Governor expect that this event can be utilized well. "Be critical in absorbing knowledge, exchanging experiences with senior experts and lecturers as well as fellow orientation participants or with PPSA 23 Lemhannas RI's participants, because this is very important in order to meet and face the challenges of future assignments," He stated.

National Seminar PPSA 23

PPSA 23 participants of Lemhannas RI held a national seminar, Wednesday (6/10). The seminar was themed “Alternative Education System Roadmap in the Whirlpool of the Pandemic and Technological Developments to Welcome Golden Indonesia 2045”.

The Chairman of the National Seminar, Brigadier General Mohammad Fajar, M.P.I.C.T., in his report stated that prior to the seminar, PPSA 23 participants had conducted two FGDs. The two FGDs carried out was themed “Changes in the Education System in the Era of Digital Technology Development and Alternative Directions for Education System Policies in Generating Excellent Human Resources in the Golden Indonesia Period 2045. “This seminar is expected to provide us numerous input and solutions that will bridge

the gaps in the existing education system roadmap,” He said.

In his remarks, the Governor of Lemhannas RI, Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo stated that the national seminar was an indicator of the capability of PPSA 23 participants to absorb and understand various knowledge during their education at Lemhannas RI. Therefore, regarding alternative education systems, each household must be the core of all schools. “Let’s make each household the core of all schools, so that the goal of building character and civility to face an extremely volatile future can run well,” He said.

In the event attended by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo and several

representatives of Lemhannas RI officials, PPRA 62 Alumni, and PPSA 23 Participants onsite at the State Palace, PPRA 62 Alumni and PPSA 23 participants had the opportunity to present the results of the PPRA 62 seminar. PPRA 62 alumni was represented by Colonel Pnb Aldrin P. Mongan and PPSA 23 participants were represented by Prof. Dr. Agus Surono.

In his remarks, the President said that the wealth of natural resources is a gift, but if it is not managed properly it can pose as a disaster. Therefore, sustainability must be balanced among various interests. However, it is also necessary to increase the maximum added value for the national interest, for the interest of the country, for the benefit of the people. "That's why we take over the ownership of several foreign companies," He said.

On this occasion, the President reminded the importance of down streaming that we are no longer able to export commodities in the form of raw materials that have no added value. The President emphasized that the principles of a sustainable economy that must be adhered to are the green

economy and the blue economy. "We must encourage down streaming of all existing commodities, we must encourage industrialization," He said.

"The industrial revolution 4.0, the disruption of technology, and this pandemic accelerate the wave of change in the world. The world today is really changing very fast that creates high uncertainty," He said. Therefore, science and technology are urgently needed. Every aspect must be wiser in developing technology and acquiring new technology. Human Resources should be the focus of all levels.

In order to create quality Human Resources, higher education institution must facilitate students to develop their talents, not fence them off with shackling programs. Universities are expected not to let students simply carry on routine, monotonous activities, and do not dare to try new things. On the other hand, universities should encourage students to study anywhere and with anyone. "We ourselves, our children, and our students must be prepared to be strong, ready to learn, ready to face change," He said.

The Short Education Program Batch 23 (PPSA 23) was officially closed by the Governor of Lemhannas RI, Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo on Thursday (14/10) in the Dwiwarna Purwa Room, Lemhannas RI. The closing ceremony was held by implementing strict health protocols.
