The Implementation of the 2022 Jakarta Geopolitical Forum VI

emhannas RI held the 2022
Jakarta Geopolitical Forum (JGF)
VI with the theme "Geo Maritime:
Chasing the Future of Global
Stability" for two days on Wednesday and
Thursday (24-25/8/2022). This annual
event is held offline for invited guests
and broadcast online through Zoom and
Lemhannas RI Youtube channel.

"The theme we raised this year was geo-maritime. With the awareness that the geopolitical battle ahead will be getting closer to us, because it will take place in the East Asia region and will use maritime, sea and ocean as a means of fighting," the Governor of Lemhannas RI Andi Widjajanto said when opening the event.

Andi Widjajanto assesses that geopolitics has now entered the era of Geopolitics V, which prioritizes connectivity, connectivity between countries in the world, global infrastructure

development that combines countries and even continents, and the creation of a global supply chain. However, according to him, what is happening today is connectivity that has created global faults. The fault arose because of competition between major countries that declared technology and trade wars.

Highlighting this, through JGF VI, Lemhannas RI is trying to find a solution so that the faults do not get bigger and can be reconnected with each other. "So that the Geopolitics V era is again strengthened into one global connectivity, one global infrastructure, one global supply chain," Andi Widjajanto said. It must be realized that to become a maritime power, Indonesia needs long steps and strategic planning until at least 2070. Therefore, JGF VI discusses this comprehensively from all sides. "It is hoped that by holding

the Jakarta Geopolitical Forum today, the contribution of Lemhannas RI, (after) having dialogue with multi-sectors, can further strengthen our direction to obtain an ideal geopolitical capacity for Indonesia to project its regional strength in the future," Andi Widjajanto concluded.

at cavalry weapons headquarters,
Bandung, West Java.

Andi Widjajanto delivered a presentation entitled "War of the XXI Century and the Role of Cavalry Units". According to him, technological developments need to be considered whether there is a leap which is also known as the Revolution of Military Affairs (RMA), or not. If there is no technological leap or RMA then you can be more relaxed in planning for the future. However, if there is a significant technological leap, it is necessary to make adjustments immediately. Andi Widjajanto considered

that the motto of the Cavalry, namely Tri Daya Cakti, was still very relevant to current conditions. If you look at the evolution of cavalry technology, the leap in tank technology is also unlikely to occur at least until 2030. According to him, now is the best time for cavalry weapons headquarters to study cavalry trends going forward. "It doesn't make it irrelevant, but it makes it more relevant," he explained.

Referring to the prediction of war in the XXI century, Andi Widjajanto concluded that the Revolution of Military Affairs (RMA) did not occur. According to him, basically the way of fighting in the early 2000s until the Ukraine war was still similar to the way of fighting in World War II. The war that occurred shows that the military technology revolution is still not seen significantly. However,

O'Hanlon predicts in 2030 that the military technology revolution will be more mature for war in 2060. "We still have time ahead of how we study the technology, but what is clear is the three forces of the cavalry unit, namely destructive power, propulsion, and the shock is still valid," Andi Widjajanto concluded

On the other hand, Andi Widjajanto sees one thing that is become our weakness until today is the rarity of mapping orders of battle. Related to this, Lemhannas RI at the request of the Indonesian Ministry of Defense is currently conducting a review meeting on the defense industry. In addition, Lemhannas RI will develop a new way to calculate the need for defense equipment in TNI by not focusing on titles, but focusing on orders of battle.






said, was to get input from the Lemhannas RI regarding the curriculum and syllabus needed to instill a sense of love for the homeland.

What Lemhannas RI can do for Yayasan Perguruan Cikini is to provide training for trainers for Yayasan Perguruan Cikini teaching staff. "But actually we at Lemhannas RI are strengthening national values by looking for organizations and places where the strengtening of national values is problematic. Yayasan Perguruan Cikini is not on our radar (because it is not problematic)," he continued.

Andi Widjajanto views Yayasan Perguruan Cikini as a network of Lemhannas RI. Therefore, it is hoped that Yavasan Perguruan Cikini can cooperate with Lemhannas strengthening nationalism. If Yayasan Perguruan Cikini enters our network to strengthen nationalism, it is part of us to strengthen weak areas. We don't think it's Yayasan Perguruan Cikini that we have to strengthen, that's what we expect from the network going forward," he said.

Andi Widjajanto congratulated the alumni because they had successfully completed their education to continue serving in their respective institutions. emhannas RI held a Socialization on the Implementation of the Integrated Dynamic Archive Information System (SRIKANDI) Application, which was attended by a number of archivists and archive management officers within Lemhannas RI on Wednesday (7/9/2022) at Pancasila Room, Trigatra Building, Lemhannas RI.

Regulation of President of the Republic of Indonesia Number 95 of 2018 concerning Electronic-Based Government System (SPBE) and Regulation of the National Archive of the Republic of Indonesia Number 4 of 2021 concerning Guidelines for the Implementation of Integrated Dynamic Archive Information System (SRIKANDI) Application mandate ministries and government institutions to

implement SRIKANDI application in order to support the implementation of SPBE. Lemhannas RI as a Non-Ministerial Government Institution (LPNK) also supports this effort.

Associate Archivist of Lemhannas RI Basirin, S.E., M.A. emphasized that archivists and archive management officers who attended the socialization must transmit the material and knowledge obtained from the socialization to all personnel in their respective work units. "We ask for the help of archive management officers to implement the SRIKANDI application in order to realize the implementation of SPBE within Lemhannas RI and we hope that in the future, the Letter Management System at Lemhannas RI can be electronicbased," said Basirin when opening the socialization.

Lemhannas RI has compiled a Business Process Map of Lemhannas RI since 2021. The business process map of Lemhannas RI has been prepared so that the implementation of the tasks and functions of Lemhannas RI can run effectively and efficiently. The effort of preparing the business process map of Lemhannas RI is a form of realization of the President's mandate as stated in Presidential Regulation (Perpres) Number 98 of 2016 concerning Lemhannas RI. In Article 41 Chapter III of the Work Procedure of Presidential Regulation Number 98 of 2016, it is stated that in carrying out its duties, Lemhannas RI must prepare a business process map that describes an effective and efficient work procedures between work units within Lemhannas RI.

A number of personnel representing each work unit within Lemhannas RI attended the event. At the discussion, various issues were explained so that there was no overlap of the task division within Lemhannas RI.



Governor of Lemhannas RI: Addressing National Security Will Result in Strengthening the State

he Governor of Lemhannas RI Andi Widjajanto gave a lecture on "National Security Anatomy" to PPRA 64 Participants on Monday (12/9/22) at Bhinneka Tunggal Ika Classroom, 3rd Floor of Pancagatra Building, Lemhannas RI.

On that occasion, Andi Widjajanto said that the greater strengthening of the state wil certainly result in worries and concern that the state will become a repressive state. Therefore, he stated, democracy and human rights principles will emerge. These principles must be implemented to control the state so that the state will not become repressive. "We are now in the era of democracy, our efforts to address national security will definitely result in strengthening the state, resulting in an increasingly great role of the state," he said.

The principles of democracy and human rights consist of political authority, judicial authority, transparency, and accountability. Andi Widjajanto is of the opinion that whenever the state has to come up with a repressive state, it must prepare political communication so as to maintain the country's democracy and human rights.

In addition, Andi Widjajanto also highlighted the shift in the concept of security from a state-centric concept to a human-oriented (anthropocentric) concept. Human security that is cross-domain consisting of politics, environment, economy, food, health, individual, and community. According to Andi Widjajanto, these conditions have provided solutions that need to be systemic and cover all elements of human life.

Regarding human security, Andi Widjajanto views that the demographic bonus is one of the challenges that must be faced. The dominance of the productive age population becomes the capital to accelerate national development. However, the demographic bonus needs the development of human quality to be able to answer all existing national challenges and needs.

Therefore, Andi Widjajanto emphasized the importance of alleviating stunting. According to him, the vital key to alleviating stunting is held by Z Generation and Y Generation as well as women who are one of the upstream in the security spectrum.
