Attending Hearing Meeting, Lemhannas RI Discusses **Adjustments to Work Plan** and Budget for the 2024 **Fiscal Year**

JAKARTA - Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI. Rear Admiral Maman Firmansyah accompanied by a number of Lemhannas RI officials attended the Lemhannas RI Hearing Meeting (RDP) with Commission I of the House of Representatives (DPR RI) on Wednesday (13/9), at the DPR RI Complex.

In the RDP which discussed adjustments to Lemhannas RI's work plan and budget for the 2024 fiscal year, Maman Firmansyah conveyed several points, namely that Lemhannas RI had received a budget ceiling allocation for 2024 based on a joint circular from the Minister of Finance of the Republic of Indonesia and the Minister of National Development Planning/ The National Development Planning Agency of the Republic

of Indonesia. Lemhannas RI has also submitted a proposal for an additional budget (new initiative) and Lemhannas RI has adjusted the increase in personnel spending.

Commission I of the DPR RI has agreed on the budget allocation ceiling for the State Revenue and Expenditure Budget Draft (RAPBN) for the 2024 fiscal year for the management support program and development of national resilience.

Commission I of the DPR RI will also forward this matter to the DPR RI Budget Body so that it can be followed up in accordance with the mechanisms, procedures and provisions of laws and regulations.

JAKARTA - Governor of Lemhannas RI Andi Widjajanto attended the "Saran Kebangsaan" event organized by the Lemhannas Alumni Association (IKAL Lemhannas) on Sunday (17/9), at the residence of the General Chairman of the DPP IKAL-Lemhannas General (Ret.) Agum Gumelar, South Jakarta.

In the event, Andi Widjajanto said that Indonesia is currently entering a crucial point, because if Indonesia succeeds in running the 2024 elections democratically, then Indonesia will be one step towards a mature democratic state.

Furthermore, Andi Widjajanto said that the 2024 election would be a historical moment. First, the 2024 election will be held when Indonesia is in the upper middle class. Second, the 2024 election will be an election dominated by generations Y and Z. Then the third is that the 2024 election will be the first election with a predicted

51% of female voters. Fourth, the 2024 election will be an urban election, meaning that many voters live in cities.

In his speech, Maman Firmansyah said that the Indonesian government is committed to providing a National Social Security System (SJSN) for the entire community through law and social security administering bodies, namely BPJS Kesehatan and BPJS Ketenagakerjaan.

Employment social security aims to provide a sense of security, protection and encourage worker productivity and contribute to the economy and nation development. However, in realizing employment social security there are also challenges, especially for vulnerable workers who generally work in the informal sector with low incomes.

"Strengthening social security for informal workers is expected to improve welfare, reduce social vulnerability and be economically just, as well as provide valuable insight for policy makers, practitioners and the general public," Maman Firmansyah said.

Lemhannas RI Prepares Recommendations Regarding the Constitution in the State Administration of the Republic of Indonesia

JAKARTA - Lemhannas RI held a Focus Group Discussion (FGD) on "Constitution in the State Administration of the Republic of Indonesia" on Wednesday (20/9) in the Kresna Room, Astagatra Building, 4th Floor, Lemhannas RI. This FGD was carried out in order to prepare strategic and systematic policy recommendations to be submitted to the President of the Republic of Indonesia.

Since the reform period, the 1945
Constitution has undergone four
amendments. However, after more
than 20 years, the fourth amendment
is still the final amendment until
today and the idea of the fifth
amendment has not been realized.
The Fifth Amendment is often
suspected of merely serving political

purposes. In fact, amendments are felt to be necessary considering that the world's strategic and geopolitical environment has changed significantly compared to the beginning of the reform.

On several occasions, the People's Consultative Assembly (MPR RI) said that discussing the fifth amendment was an urgent matter. In fact, since the MPR RI for the 2014-2019 period, an Ad Hoc committee has been formed to discuss limited amendments to the constitution. "The committee proposes to formulate state policy and give the MPR RI the authority to reject the APBN Bill if it conflicts with state policy," Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Vice Admiral Maman Firmansyah.

In discussing the above matters, present as a speaker were the Deputy Chairman of the Indonesian Constitutional Court, Prof. Dr. Saldi Isra, S.H.; Special Staff for Political and Institutional Communications of the Minister of State Secretary of the Republic of Indonesia Nicolaus Teguh Budi Harjanto, S.I.P., M.A., Ph.D.; Constitutional Law Researcher and Founder of the Center for Law and Policy Studies, Bivitri Susanti, S.H., M.M. Apart from that, also present was Member of the KPK Supervisory Board/ Perpetrator of Amendments to the 1945 Constitution of the Republic of Indonesia, Dr. Harjono and special staff of the Chairman of the Indonesian Regional Representative Council, Dr. Ichsanuddin Noorsy, B.Sc., S.H., M.Sc. as responders.





Realizing National Renewable Energy, Lemhannas RI Holds **FGD Preparing NPP** Roadmap

JAKARTA - Lemhannas RI through the Directorate of Economic Studies and Natural Resources (SKA) held a Focus Group Discussion (FGD) with the title "Preparing a Nuclear Power Plant (PLTN) Roadmap in the Context of Realizing National Renewable Energy" on Monday

(25/9), in the Kresna Room, Astagatra Building, 4th Floor, Lemhannas RI.

In his speech, Deputy for Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Reni Mayerni, M.P. said that Indonesia is experiencing quite a

complicated problem recently such as worsening air quality which can be seen through the smog that covers the capital's skyscrapers every morning.

This pollution is caused by various factors, such as vehicle gas emissions and also industrial activities in Greater Jakarta, especially those that use coal in the manufacturing industry and electricity resources sectors. The existence of several operating steam power plants (PLTU) around Jakarta, coupled with increased vehicle gas emissions and industrial activities, has triggered a decrease in air quality.

This is a serious concern considering the impact of Steam Power Plant pollution on the environment and human health. "So strategic steps are needed to develop energy infrastructure where an energy transition is carried out from using coal plants to environmentally friendly plants," Reni Mayerni said.W

Lemhannas RI Discusses Urgency of Evaluation of TNI Law

JAKARTA - Lemhannas RI, through the Deputy Office for Strategic Studies, held a Focus Group Discussion (FGD) on "Evaluation of the TNI Law" on Monday (2/10), at Kresna Room, 4th Floor of Astagatra Building, Lemhannas RI.

The discussion comprehensively analyzed the relationship between Article 30 of the 1945 Constitution, Defense Law, TNI Law, Intelligence Law, Defense Industry Law, PSDN Law, and Omnibus Law on Job Creation that related to the defense industry. "We are trying to see what has changed significantly in the last 20 years and what will significantly jump in the next 20 years," Lemhannas RI Governor Andi Widjajanto explained.

This evaluation is considered necessary because when the

34/2004 Law concerning the TNI was formulated in 2004, Indonesia was still in its initial phase of the democratic process. The challenges faced by Indonesia 20 years ago were much different from the those of today. Bearing in mind that in 2004, the concepts of hybrid warfare, gray zone operations, A2/AD, strengthening of cyber security, strong indications of America and China conflict, and moving the state capital relocation were yet known.

"We have to evaluate these issues so that future changes in the dynamics of the strategic environment, threats, character of technology, and diverse conflicts can be well analyzed. Therefore, we can report the evaluation of the TNI Law carefully," Andi Widjajanto said. He also conveyed that there would be

further discussions and studies to review the follow-up to the evaluation results.
