Lemhannas RI Discusses Revision of **Presidential Regulation Number 98** of 2016



JAKARTA - Lemhannas RI held a Focus Group Discussion (FGD) to discuss the Revision of Presidential Regulation (Perpres) Number 98 of 2016 concerning Lemhannas RI on (22/11), at Nusantara 2 Room, First Floor of Trigatra Building, Lemhannas RI.

Professional Expert for Law and Human Rights of Lemhannas RI, Andrea Hynan Poeloengan, S.H., M.Hum., MTCP as the head of the Working Group stated that the discussion was a forum for exchanging ideas between stakeholders related to the condition of Lemhannas RI whose personnel come from various components.

Lemhannas RI consists of state civil apparatus (ASN), personnel of Indonesian National Armed Forces (TNI), personnel of Indonesian National Police (Polri), and professional experts consisting of retired military personnel, senior officers, professors, professionals, and former high-ranking state officials. In this regard, regulations related to the mentioned elements. such as the issuance of Law Number 20 of 2023 concerning ASN, will require adjustment in the Presidential Regulation Number 98 of 2016 so that it can accommodate the Lemhannas RI's legal umbrella.

"The revision of this Presidential Regulation concerning Lemhannas RI will have an impact on structural changes. Therefore, to avoid mistakes, we hope to receive inputs from the speakers," Andrea Hynan

Poeloengan said.

Meanwhile, in the health sector, maternal and child mortality rates in Papua are still high and community access to health services is still limited. Therefore, a thorough investigation is necessary to identify and analyze the source of the current problem, as well as the steps necessary to find an effective solution.

"The 2024 simultaneous elections are an important moment for Indonesian democracy because they are a means of electing leaders who will determine the direction of the nation's future," Panca Putra said. Apart from that, the general election will also determine the direction and policies of Indonesia's domestic politics for the next five years.

The 2024 political year is marked by dynamic domestic political conditions, including the electoral system, party coalitions, presidential and vice presidential candidates and various strategic issues and voter participation. These political dynamics will of course influence a number of other aspects, namely domestic security, the promotion of human rights, the Indonesian economy and the consolidation of democracy.

In line with this, it is important to understand and analyze the domestic political outlook in 2024 from various perspectives and points of view. "We hope that this discussion can become a forum for conducting studies and predictions on the influence of domestic political dynamics on these various aspects," Panca Putra said.

Apart from that, he hopes that this program will be an effort to maintain the integrity of the nation in the future.

Furthermore, Bambang Soesatyo defines advanced Indonesia from

various parameters and points of view. First, a minimum per capita income of 11,906 US Dollars which must be accompanied by a low poverty rate must exist in Indonesia.

Then the second is guaranteed security with a low crime rate and a high-tech state security defense system. Then the third is adequate health facilities and personnel, as well as a low death rate and high life expectancy.

At the end of his presentation, Bambang Soesatyo stated that to make Indonesia developed, economic growth must be driven by the business sector. To accelerate economic growth, national resilience must be supported by creating a safe and stable environment.

JAKARTA - Lemhannas RI, through the Cooperation and Legal Bureau, organized a socialization on Legal and Legislation Awareness Building with the theme of neutrality monitoring of state civil apparatus (ASN), Indonesian National Armed Forces (TNI), Indonesian National Police (Polri) in the 2024 simultaneous elections on Wednesday (6/12) at the Syailendra Room, 3rd Floor of Astagatra Building, Lemhannas RI.

"The neutrality of ASN, TNI and POLRI is the key to the success of election as an event for democratic celebration in Indonesia, especially facing the 2024 election," Prime Secretary of Lemhannas RI, Police Commissioner General Drs. R.Z. Panca Putra S., M.Si.

stated in his speech. The 2024 election will be different from previous elections because it consists of presidential election, legislative election, and regional heads election.

Panca Putra emphasized to all Lemhannas RI personnel to participate in making the 2024 election a success by maintaining their neutrality as a form of responsibility in upholding the reputation of the institution. Furthermore, Lemhannas RI keeps monitoring its personnel so that no one gets caught up in political currents.

The legal basis for ASN neutrality is the Law Number 20 of 2023 in article 2 (f), 9 paragraph 2, and 24 paragraph 1. Meanwhile the neutrality for the TNI and POLRI is regulated in Law Number 34 of 2004 article 39 and Law Number 28 of 2008 paragraphs 1 and 2 which state that practical politics is not permitted.

Panca Putra hoped that the socialization, which presented the Head of the Election Process Dispute Resolution Facilitation Bureau of Indonesian Election Supervisory Agency Election (Bawaslu) RI, Drs. Harimurti Wicaksono, M.Han. as a speaker, can enrich the understanding regarding the implementation of the 2024 election and can make Lemhannas RI's personnel stay neutral to maintain the reputation of Lemhannas RI.



The Academy of Military Sciences **Delegation of CPLA China Visits** Lemhannas RI



JAKARTA - Lemhannas RI received a visit from The Academy of Military Sciences Delegation of CPLA China at Nusantara 2 Room on Monday. 11 December 2023. The visit was led by the Head of Department Major General Qian Youwu who was accompanied by six other delegates along with the Deputy Defense Attaché of the Chinese Embassy in Indonesia in Jakarta.

During the visit, the delegation was received by Professional Expert for International Relations and Diplomacy of Lemhannas RI, Edy Prasetyono, S.Sos., MIS., Ph.D., who represented the leaders of Lemhannas RI. On that occasion. Edy Prasetyono delivered a presentation regarding the security situation in Southeast Asia and related issues.

He also conveyed the security situation within a state and security problems occurring on an extraregional scale. From an internal perspective, he explained separatism and internal conflicts such as those that occurred in the Philippines. Myanmar and Indonesia.

Furthermore, Edy Prasetyono explained the issues of democracy and human rights that still occur to the Rohingya tribe. Non-traditional security problems such as climate change, natural disasters, health problems, and energy problems cannot be neglected. Meanwhile, security issues on an extra-regional scale include the conflict between the United States and China, the territorial borders of the South China Sea, proxy wars, and the condition of ASEAN.

"We do not want ASEAN to become an instrument of proxy war from external powers. Therefore, ASEAN unity and centrality are the keys to regional stability and security," Edy Prasetyono added.

Also present on this occasion were the Head of the Foreign Cooperation Division of Cooperation and Legal Bureau Lemhannas RI, Colonel Mar.
