The Deputy Office of Strengthening of National Values of Lemhannas RI held an evaluation of the impact of the Training of Trainers (ToT) Alumni on Thursday (11/4) at Novotel Hotel Palembang, South Sumatra.

The Evaluation was opened by the Deputy for Strengthening of National Values Major General (Marines) Guntur Irianto Cipto Lelono, S.E. In his remarks, Guntur said that the Evaluation aimed to measure the effectiveness of the ToT program held by Lemhannas.

While the Head of South Sumatra National and Political Unity Office Fitriana, S.Sos, M.Sc who also attended this event said that the alumni need to maintain their neutrality during the election process considering their different educational and professional backgrounds. In addition, T.o.T alumni are required to further enhance their role and contribution more creatively in implementing the results of the ToT they had joined without having to depend on the central and regional governments.

Meanwhile, Ali Palita, the Chairperson of the alumni of South Sumatra T.o.T, Batch I, stated that many ToT alumni have carried out strengthening of national values program in their respective communities, such as schools and universities. Ali Palita said that the ToT Alumni felt very proud to be a part of Lemhannas RI and hoped

that the sense of togetherness among all Lemhannas trainings alumni in South Sumatra will continue to increase.

Luhut Binsar Pandjaitan gives General Lecture at Lemhannas RI

Coordinating Minister for Maritime Affairs General (Ret.) Luhut Binsar Pandjaitan gave a general lecture to PPRA 59 and PPSA 22 Participants, and all Lemhannas Officials on Thursday (11/4) at Gadjah Mada Auditorium, Pancagatra Building, 3rd Floor, Lemhannas RI.

Luhut at the beginning of his lecture said that currently, the rivalry between the United States and China is causing instability in economy sector at global level. Luhut said that based on IMF data, world economic growth will decline to 3.7 percent and it cannot be separated from the economic situation in Indonesia.

China experienced a very significant increase in the last 18 years in the economic sector. While Indonesia, Luhut explained, also experienced economic growth until it achieves one of the Top 15 rank according to the IMF. In the midst of this economic instability, Luhut revealed that the world still sees Indonesia as the leader country among other developing countries.

Luhut also explained that based on Standard Chartered data, Indonesia is predicted to become a rising star in 2030. "This is faster than we expected with a GDP of 10 trillion USD, with assumption 6 percent of our GDP," Luhut explained.

Regarding the Trade War between the United States and China, Luhut considers that so far, Trade War has been identical with the

existence of Trade Deficit which is explained as the state’s financial situation where the import growth rate is higher than the export growth rate.

On the other hand, Trade War is also related to competition in the field of technology, one of which is China’s plan to launch 6G network. “There are two things that make trade war important, Trade Deficit and technological competition,” Luhut explained.

Luhut stated that Indonesia’s position among the Trade War is neutral. “Indonesia is too big to side with one of the countries involved. We are an independent country so there will be no one who can dictate Indonesia,” Luhut concluded.

The Ambassador of The Russian Ambassador to Indonesia Lyudmila Vorobieva accompanied by Representative of the Defense Attaché of the Russian Federation Captain (N) S. Zhevnovatyy visited Lemhannas RI, Tuesday (16/4). The visit was welcomed by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo in the Executive Guest Room, Trigatra Building, 1st Floor, Lemhannas RI.

During the meeting, Vorobieva delivered a plan of cooperation that will be carried out between two institutions, Lemhannas RI the Military Academy of the General Staff of the Armed Forces of the Russian Federation. Vorobieva said that the military institution is a prestigious institution in Russia.

Some possible cooperation in the future, Vorobieva mentioned, are the exchange of lecturers and experts from the Russian Military Academy to Lemhannas RI to give general lectures on current issues to Lemhannas' education participants.

In addition to exchange lecturers and experts, Vorobieva also proposed the exchange of education participants from the Russian military academy to Lemhannas RI and vice versa. "It would be very interesting if the education participants in the Russian military

academy can visit Lemhannas and vice versa because our young generation is our future so I think it is good to build this cooperation," Vorobieva explained.

Vorobieva also suggested the possibility of establishing a working group to analyze international issues related to the two institutions. Furthermore, Vorobieva also invited Lemhannas staffs to Russia to attend international seminars and conferences.

"I think these things are some forms of future cooperation that can be carried out by both institutions. Such cooperation can promote bilateral cooperation between two institutions and also between Russia and Indonesia," Vorobieva said.

Agus Widjojo responded positively to the future cooperation mentioned. "Thank you for the offer and invitation given. Russia is a big country. It is very interesting for other countries to collaborate with Russia," Agus Widjojo said.

Labkurtannas discuss the validation of national resilience measurement



The National Resilience Measurement Laboratory (Labkurtannas) of Lemhannas RI held intellectual exercise to exchange ideas and experiences on the validation of national resilience index measurements, on Tuesday (16/4), in Kresna Room, 4th Floor, Astagatra Building, Lemhannas RI.

In his remarks before the discussion, the Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo conveyed that this discussion aimed to share experiences. "Finding out by sharing experiences among educational backgrounds, groups or institutions that have done similar efforts, how to measure phenomena based on real conditions," he said.

Prof. Dr. Dadan Umar Daihani, D.E.A., Professional Expert for Natural Resources and National Resilience of Lemhannas RI representing Labkurtannas, said that the measurement of the national resilience index is originated from the idea of measuring the condition of national resilience which refers to the definition of resiliency.

"Resilience is the ability of an organization to anticipate, prepare, respond, and adapt to gradual changes and disruptions that arise suddenly. We look for what makes us adaptable, responsive and to know the condition of national resilience, a diagnostic instrument is

needed, so that a system for measuring national resilience is created," he explained.

The national resilience measurement system with this diagnostic instrument model uses engineering and social approaches. "The measurement that we created actually reflect the definition of resilience. We make responsive, comprehensive, complete and easy-to-use measurement, but it can be easily developed as well. If there are changes in the future, the analysis can be deepened," Dadan continued.

Kemitraan, which was also invited as a discussion partner in this activity, through the Executive Director of Kemitraan, Monica Tanuhandaru, said that Kemitraan had carried out several measurements at national level including Indonesia governance index / IGI (governance index), police governance index (police governance index), and climate change governance assessment.

Responding to the process of measuring national resilience index, Monica assessed that Labkurtannas had done quite good job and it also has many indicators. "Labkurtannas measurement can be made to explain to people what can be improved in their institutions, procedures, regulations or work relations," she said.

Lemhannas RI holds E-Learning for PPSA 22 Participants

Governor of Lemhannas RI: Elections should not be marred by social conflicts



Responding to the current situation after the 2019 Election, the Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo held a press conference on Tuesday (23/4) in Syaleindra Room, Astagatra Building, 3rd Floor, to invite all components of the nation to respond to the situation wisely. Seeing the situation after the 2019 Election which still brings the sentiments of each party, Agus said that the most important thing now is to build a conducive situation throughout the country.

Accompanied by Professional Expert for Natural Resources and National Resilience Prof. Dr. Ir. Dadan Umar Daihani, DEA and Chief of Public Relations Bureau Brig. Gen. Sugeng Santoso, SIP, Governor of Lemhannas RI stated, "International recognition that praised the simultaneous elections on April 17, 2019, which went well and orderly, should not be marred with various forms of social conflicts (including those on social media) that have the potential to create social and national disintegration ". According to Agus Widjojo, the attitude of the elites of the two parties who contributed to the last general election was very important to build a conducive situation to reconcile the nation's unity.

Agus reminded, "Our nation and society are facing great challenges, and we believe that with our experiences and local wisdom, this nation is able to face this challenge and become a great nation with a higher level of civilization".

Meanwhile, at this press conference, Prof. Dadan Umar Daihini was also presented about the result of National Resilience Measurement Laboratory (Labkurtannas) of Lemhannas RI. Dadan as a Labkurtannas representative explained the condition of national resilience with political, economic, ideological and socio-cultural national indices. Labkurtannas' findings show that 2018 political status is quite strong, then for 2018 economic aspect is also quite strong even though there are some provinces that are still less resilient. Whereas for the ideology aspect in 2018 is less resilient. It means that social dynamics can destabilize national stability.

At the end of the press conference, Agus Widjojo said that Lemhannas does not have operational authority but as an educational and assessment institution, Lemhannas' views on post 2019 Election situation from the perspective of national resilience are expected to be a reference for policy makers. "Lemhannas is not a policy-making institution. Lemhannas focus more as a moral force," Agus Widjojo said. Agus also reminded the media to take a role in creating a conducive situation after the 2019 Election by giving enlightenment to the public what is right and what to do by the public.

National Defense University of Pakistan visits Lemhannas RI



The Pakistan National Defense University (NDU Pakistan) delegation visited Lemhannas RI on Wednesday (24/4), led by NDU Chief Instructor Major General Ayman Bilal Safdar, along with 20 NDU Pakistan students. Acting Deputy for Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI Inspector General of Police Drs. Basuki, M.M who represented the Governor of Lemhannas RI conducted a courtesy call with the group leader, accompanied by the Chief of Cooperation Bureau Commodore Budi Setiawan, S.T and the Chief of Public Relations Bureau Brigadier General Sugeng Santoso, S.I.P.

After the courtesy call, a discussion about the governance system in Indonesia and the regional strategic environment, in Airlangga Room, Lemhannas RI 3rd Floor Asta Gatra Building was held. Before discussing, Commodore Budi Setiawan, S.T. presented the Lemhannas profile to the NDU Pakistan delegation. Professional Expert for Natural Resources and National Resilience of Lemhannas RI gave an explanation of the geopolitical dynamics in the future and the geostrategy of the Indonesian government in dealing with these challenges.

Dadan revealed the world now depends on internet. "Internet is not supposed to be treated like an enemy. The increasingly developing information and technology allows communication to be carried out without physical limitations. This can be an advantage

if the information disseminated is true and in accordance with facts, but it can be a disadvantage if the information disseminated is false," Dadan said.

Other challenges faced by Indonesia is the diversity of 931 tribes and 731 regional languages owned by this country. "The differences exist is our wealth, not our weakness," Dadan said. This diversity will produce a beautiful harmony if it is well combined. The Indonesian people also have local cultural values that were instilled by their predecessors and are still maintained such as mutual cooperation.

The Participants of Regular Education Program Batch (PPRA) 59 of Lemhannas RI conducted overseas strategic studies (SSLN) in four countries, namely, South Korea, Japan, India, and Vietnam, from Monday (4/22) to Friday (26/4). This overseas strategic study is a part of educational activities in PPRA which aims to improve participants' understanding of the role of destination countries in a strategic or geopolitical environment, as well as a comparative studies to obtain data, information, and the current state of the destination country to be used to support the policy making process.

In contrast to the previous SSLN which directed participants to study comparatively and make the results of the study collectively, this year's SSLN directed the participants to create individual study results and observations by previously preparing proposals on the aspect and object that is going to be analyzed later in the destination country corresponds to the dynamic aspect of Pancagatra.

Several locations visited in each country include Indonesian Embassy as a place to discuss bilateral relations with the destination countries.

South Korea
