Lemhannas RI holds ceremony to commemorate its 55th Anniversary

The Governor of Lemhannas RI as the Speaker in Online Discussions related to National Resilience amid COVID-19 pandemic



The Governor of Lemhannas RI Lt. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo became the guest speaker in an Online Discussion held by the Central Board of the Indonesian National Student Movement (DPP GMNI), on Monday (27/4). The online discussion raised the topic "Learning from the World in Overcoming the COVID-19" with the theme "Can Indonesian National Resilience Overcome COVID-19?".

In the beginning of his material, Agus explained his understanding of defense, security and resilience. Generally, defense is where a situation of a state faces military threat from abroad. While security is all things related to the internal aspects of a state and is a juridical territory and internal threats come from within the state. The threat that comes from within the state is

essentially a violation of the law, then it can be overcome by applying law enforcement. Meanwhile, resilience is the endurance of a nation and is more precisely categorized within the scope and material of human security, such as individual threat. Non-physical threats, such as COVID-19, are included in the scope of resilience.

Agus believes that national resilience is needed to face threats, disturbances, obstacles, and challenges to achieve national goals. National resilience is manifested through two approaches namely the *Gatra* (aspects) Approach and the Geographical Spatial Approach. *Gatra's* approach consists of Ideology, Economy, Politic, Social and Culture, Defense and Security. The resilience of each *gatra* or aspect will affect national resilience. Meanwhile, the Geographical Spatial Approach is

influenced by the resilience of each province or region.

National resilience in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic can be felt in the form of policies issued by the government, such as electricity cost reduction policies, Large-Scale Social Restrictions (PSBB), homecoming tradition ban, credit relief, and health budget priorities. Agus does not deny that every policy cannot satisfy all parties, there must be those who agree and those who do not. Agus stressed that it is normal in a democracy. He said it will not be an issue if all the ideas and responses given were based on the basic consensus of the nation.

The success and effectiveness factor of a public policy, Agus continued, is an integrated national policy, covering the horizontal level, which means cross-sectoral and vertical levels, including the integration of central and regional government authority, also calculates the ability of the budget by determining sharp priorities and risk considerations. "Public policy making must be based on knowledge and competence and it must be integrated as well," Agus said.

On this occasion, Agus also expressed his condolences over the sacrifices of a number of medical personnel on duty. "The death of the medical personnel is a significant strategic loss for the nation, because to create an excellent medical personnel requires a lot of time," Agus said

Minister of Bureaucratic Reform: Whoever the Leader, Bureaucracy Must Be Professional

The Minister of Administrative and Bureaucratic Reform (Menpan RB) Tjahjo Kumolo gave a lecture entitled "Bureaucratic Reform Strategy to Create Clean and Good Governance" to the Participants of Regular Education Program Batch 60 (PPRA 60), on Tuesday (28/4).

According to Tjahjo, the current decision-making process is too long. At a glance, Indonesia looks like a regulatory state with so many existing rules, both regulations from the central and regional governments. Tjahjo said that the number of these regulations can more or less hamper the development process.

To deal with this, simplification of the bureaucracy is seen as an effort to accelerate decision-making process through disposition and more flexible communication. "Improving the quality of Human Resources (HR) is associated with simplifying the bureaucracy solely to build a fast decision-making process," Tjahjo said.

Simplifying the bureaucracy is also the government's response to the global challenges that are currently faced. Today, digital decision-making and transformation are increasingly required to have standards so that excellent human resources are needed. Then Tjahjo said that whoever is the leader and with any background, must create a professional bureaucracy. "Whoever becomes the leader, at any level, the bureaucracy itself must be professional and must serve the community," Tjahjo said.



The current bureaucratic reform road map has several goals and objectives namely the existence of measures of success, strategies, program activities, and bureaucratic reform management organizations that are at least prepared for the next five years or short term. "The surface of the bureaucratic reform already exist. It takes some times to get to its core," Tjahjo said.

It aims at creating priority scale for each agency, namely improving governance that must be in accordance with the characteristics, issues, challenges, and problems faced. Tjahjo also emphasized that the road map is not only a formality.

In addition to collaborating on bureaucratic reform, the Ministry of Administrative and Bureaucratic Reforms will also conduct annual evaluations for every ministry and

non-ministerial agency. The purpose of the evaluation is to map the stages of bureaucratic reform progress of each ministry or non-ministerial agency and to find out what needs to be improved. The evaluation will also be a measurement of the speed of the Bureaucracy Reform implementation in all ministries and non-ministerial agencies.

Lemhannas RI distributes 15,500 medical equipments for medical personnel in handling COVID-19



Lemhannas RI distributed a total of 15,500 medical equipments consisting of 500 Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), 10,000 Medical Gloves and 5,000 Masks to a number of parties in need. The medical equipments were handed over symbolically by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret) Agus Widjojo to several representatives of medical personnel to distribute directly to several Hospitals and public health centers on Wednesday (29/4), in Nusantara Room.

The symbolic handover of medical equipments was received by Dr. Damayanti Soetjipto Sp.THT-KL (K), Prof. dr. Ruswan Dahlan, Sp.An-KIC, Prof. dr. Ganesja Harimurti, Sp.JP (K),

dr. Yvonne Siboe, Sp.Ak., dr. Niesye, Dr. Dien Radjak, and Dr. Muhammad Rifki, Sp.OG. The symbolic handover was given directly by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo.

«I express my highest gratitude and appreciation to fellow medical personnel who have become the frontline to fight the COVID-19 and make extraordinary sacrifices in handling the Coronavirus Disease pandemic (COVID-19),” Agus opened his remarks.

On this occasion Agus also expressed his condolences over the death of a number of medical personnel while carrying out humanitarian

mission. “Their sacrifice is not in vain and we will always remember them,” Agus said. Then Agus also said that President Joko Widodo, in a limited meeting via teleconference, ordered the implementation of optimal protection for doctors, nurses, and other medical personnel in handling the COVID-19 pandemic.

Some of the medical equipments donated are entrusted by the Tanoto Foundation to Lemhannas RI. Therefore, their distribution is also a commitment and trust given to Lemhannas RI and one of Lemhannas RI's concrete steps in supporting COVID-19 countermeasures. Lemhannas RI believes that this pandemic is a humanitarian challenge that must be faced together.

Joko Widodo: 2021 is the year of recovery



The Governor and Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI attended National Development Planning Conference in order to arrange 2021 Government Work Plan (RKP) on Thursday (30/4) via video conference call.

On this occasion the Minister of national development Planning / Head of the National Development Planning Agency Dr. HC. Ir. H. Suharso Monoarfa in his report said that besides considering Work From Home (WFH) policies, the virtual conference is also one of the new ways of responding to responsive e-government policies that is adaptive to the developing strategic environment.

The conference is very important to be carried out in the context of preparing the 2021 Government Work Plan (RKP) which is closely related to the current challenges faced. "The scenario of the economic recovery agenda after the COVID-19 pandemic becomes an important part in the macro economic

framework of 2021 Government Work Plan," Suharso said.

The President of the Republic of Indonesia, Joko Widodo, on the occasion stated that the conference is an annual cycle to plan the next year development, in this case in 2021. "The 2021 development planning must be truly adaptive to the development of the situation we face today, what we are doing this year will result useful recommendations for the coming year," The President said.

The President further said that in 2020, the Government has made adjustments to development targets and re-allocated and re-focusing state spending on a large scale. The budget is prioritized on three sectors namely health, social safety for the poor, and economic stimulus so that businesses can survive and help to prevent employment termination. The President also invited all conference participants to move quickly for the sake of the safety of all the Indonesians although there is no certainty when this

pandemic will end.

"I am optimistic that 2021 is the year of recovery and the year of rebound," the President said. Then the President said that in addition to speed in overcoming COVID-19, the fast recovery after the pandemic ends is also important. According to the President, the country that will be the winner is not only the country that has succeeded quickly in overcoming COVID-19, but also the country which is fast in recovering.

The President stressed that strong synergy and cooperation that are closely intertwined between the central government and regional governments ranging from the central government to the provincial government, the district government of the city, to the village is needed. Each level of government must operate in one vision, one direction, and one solid policy. "I believe with synergy, the various impacts of this global pandemic can be overcome immediately," the President said.

Head of BNN: Establish Collaboration to break the narcotics distribution chain

The Head of the National Narcotics Agency (BNN) RI Heru Winarko gave a lecture entitled "Synergy in Saving Generations and Guarding the Country from the Threat of Drug Crimes" to The Participants of the Regular Education Program Batch 60 (PPRA 60), on Tuesday, (5/5).

At the beginning of his lecture, Heru said that Narcotics are not only heroin, ecstasy, and marijuana but also New Psychoactive Substances (NPS). Until today, there have been 950 types of NPS circulating in the world and 76 of them have been circulating in Indonesia. The type of NPS circulating in Indonesia is regulated in Minister of Health Regulation Number 20 of 2018. "Anyone who is proven to have misused the type of NPS, will receive punishment as in narcotics punishment," Heru said.

The geographical condition of Indonesia, which is two-thirds of the waters used as a favorite route by various syndicates in smuggling drugs from abroad. Therefore, the National Narcotics Agency is working with various parties to tighten supervision at the entrances to Indonesia as a way to reduce the circulation of drugs in Indonesia which will cut off drug supply routes.

Not only cooperating with law enforcement in the country, BNN also cooperates with foreign parties to jointly break the chain of drug smuggling. "In overcoming the pattern of international drug trafficking in Indonesia, BNN in this case has cooperated a lot with law enforcement agents in other countries," Heru said.

BNN is also aware of the threat of cybercrime in drug trafficking, the

development of information technology is also used by perpetrators to produce or distribute drugs more easily, cheaper, and undetectable. The first cybercrime is Surface Web Market, which is drug trafficking through social media and websites. Then the Deep Web Market which means distributing drugs through a hidden internet network that is very difficult to track. The third is, Crypto market which is a transaction using crypto-currency via internet. This method is not easy to trace and hide the user's identity.

In dealing with the threat of drug crime, BNN makes policies and strategies, one of which is the Prevention and Eradication of Drug Abuse and Circulation (P4GN) which consists of Prevention measures by building community capacity systems, Eradication, and Rehabilitation.

Perista Lemhannas RI distributes notebooks an effort to support national education


"This is certainly in line with one of the ideals of the nation which is to educate the nation's life based on independence, eternal peace and social justice," Agus said.

agreement to regulate everything in life. "If anyone thinks that there is no need for law, then what is the point of equality in seeing a problem if it is not based on law?" Agus said.

Furthermore, Agus stated that the effort to enforce terrorism was essentially a violation of criminal law that required a law enforcement response by law enforcement agents, which was carried out by the National Police and had been effectively dealt with. Whereas the Indonesian military was never designed to be a law enforcement agent and did not have the authority in this matter, but it can help. The Indonesian Military can be brought into the domestic security area on the basis of a Presidential Regulation which should be technically contained in an Indonesian Military Assistance Act to civil authorities in peacetime.

The Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo, became one of the Public Discussion speakers who raised the topic "The Polemic on Presidential Regulation Draft Related to the Regulation of Military Involvement in Eradicating Criminal Acts of Terrorism in the Perspective of Law, Democracy and Human Rights" on Wednesday (5/13) through video conference.

On the occasion, Agus said that the Presidential Regulation must certainly have a position in the hierarchy of the legal system, it must be a line of consistency. "Besides having to be on one line of consistency in terms of order procedures, the Presidential Regulation must also be one line of consistency in terms of content and substance," Agus explained.

Then Agus explained that basically the 1945 Constitution gave a mandate to the Indonesian Military as the main executor of the national defense function. Defense is basically defined as the ability to face military threats from abroad, maintain sovereignty, and territorial integrity.

According to Agus, every threat that comes from within the country is basically an act of violation of the law, so it must be dealt with law enforcement. On the other hand, the Indonesian Military was never designed to be a law enforcement agent.

Agus said all, including the role of the Indonesian Military in combating terrorism, must be placed on a clear basis and legal framework. Law is an
