BPK RI hands the Financial Audit Report Fiscal Year 2019 to Lemhannas RI

Senior Lecturers of Sespimti Polri visits Lemhannas RI



Thirteen Senior Lecturers of the High Staff and Command Schools of the Indonesian Police Education and Training Institute (Sespimti Lemdiklat Polri) led by Police Inspector General Drs. R. Z. Panca Putra, visited Lemhannas RI on Tuesday (14/7) at the Kresna Room, Astagatra Building, 4th Floor, Lemhannas RI.

The visit was received directly by the Governor of Lemhannas RI, Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo to

discuss the education model at Lemhannas RI. Agus explained that Lemhannas RI is an educational institution that aims to equalize the thinking paradigm of national strategic leaders.

According to Agus, in determining a policy, participants are prepared not to focus on their own power but they must consider the implications of the policy from all aspects including Indonesia's unity and integrity.

Agus emphasized that education aims to equip individual competency and capacity building. If a person's individual competence is getting better, the higher is his civilization.

Individual competence and capacity are also a concern in Lemhannas RI's education. "We hope everything given to the participants can be accommodated in their products, namely public policy," Agus said.

Lecture by the Head of BNN to PPRA Participants 61

The Head of the National Narcotics Agency of the Republic of Indonesia (BNN RI) Heru Winarko gave lecture on the topic “Synergize to Save Generations and to Protect the Country from the Drug Threat” to participants of the Regular Education Program Batch 61 (PPRA 61) on Wednesday (15/7) via online.

In the lecture, Heru explained the international patterns of drug trafficking are known as The Golden Triangle, The Golden Crescent, and The Golden Peacock. The Golden Triangle consists of Thailand, Myanmar and Laos. The Golden Crescent consist of Afghanistan, Pakistan and Iran. Meanwhile the Golden Peacock comes from Latin America.

“BNN is developing an active defense strategy,” Heru said. Active defense is carried out as an effort to prevent illicit trafficking, eradicate illicit trafficking, prevent drug abuse, eradicate drug abuse, and recovery and rehabilitation.

In realizing active defense, BNN cooperates with narcotics agencies of other countries, visits countries involved in the international pattern of drug trafficking, exchanges information, and seeks mitigation. “So, we carry out prevention and eradication from its base,” Heru said.

Heru also said that the development of information technology has also become one of the loopholes in drug distribution. Therefore, BNN conducts cyber operations to combat drug trafficking through cyberspace.



“Handling drugs must be holistic and comprehensive, it cannot be partial,” Heru said. This also encourages BNN to develop policies and strategies for the Prevention and Eradication of Drug Abuse and Illicit Drug Trafficking (P4GN) which consists of steps for Prevention, Eradication, and Rehabilitation.

Prevention is implemented by building a prevention system and building the capacity of the community to protect each individual from drug abuse and illicit drug trafficking. Then eradication, is done by strengthening cooperative relations both at the national and international levels to prevent the drug distribution from abroad. In the eradication step, prosecution is also carried out on the perpetrators and seizing the assets

of the perpetrators of drug trafficking crimes.

Lastly is Rehabilitation, which is building a comprehensive rehabilitation system for drug abusers and addicts and improving the accessibility and quality of rehabilitation services as an effort to recover drug abusers and addicts.

Inauguration of Southeast Sulawesi and Bali Provincial Commissariat Boards

"We must always care about our country," Agum said.

Another thing that must be remembered by IKAL members is understanding their role in the democratic process. Agum said that in carrying out their role in the democratic process as an organization, IKAL must be neutral. However, IKAL members as individuals still have democratic rights either to elect or be elected. In this case, IKAL gives freedom to each individual to make choices.

In line with what was conveyed by Agum, Governor of Lemhannas RI,

Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo also said that Lemhannas RI views IKAL as an important part of the of Lemhannas RI. Agus emphasized that IKAL and Lemhannas RI can be distinguished, but inseparable. "As in general, educational alma mater, the reputation and honor of educational institutions will be determined by its alumni performance," Agus said.

Agus conveyed that IKAL has a very important duty due to its warrior characteristic. Moreover, IKAL as a large organization brings the aspects contained in Lemhannas RI, namely the Four National Basic Consensus into a broad geographical scope. "IKAL as an extension of Lemhannas RI to the community will certainly bring the core of Lemhannas RI, the Four National Basic Consensus," Agus concluded.

IKAL Chairman gives lecture to PPRA 60 Alumni



Participants of Regular Education Program Batch 60 (PPRA 60) attended a brief lecture from IKAL (Lemhannas RI' Alumni Association) Chairman General (Ret.) Agus Gumelar accompanied by IKAL Deputy Chairman I Dr. Ir. Mustafa Abubakar, M.Si., and IKAL Secretary General Air Marshal (Ret.) Daryatmo, M.Si. on Monday (20/07) at Dwi Warna Purwa Room, pancagatra Building, Lemhannas RI.

On the occasion, Agus mentioned three main requirements to be able to carry out development in all sectors namely first, the spirit of nationalism and a sense of pride towards the nation and state, prioritizing the interests of the nation and the state above personal and group interests, and willing to sacrifice for the nation and state. "Without nationalism, a nation will not

become a nation," Agum said.

"The global era is increasingly making the world very competitive, competition is so fierce," said Agum explaining the second requirement, namely the competitiveness of the nation in the era of competition. So far, Indonesia still relies on comparative advantage, but it cannot be sustained. According to Agum, comparative advantage in this era must be transformed into a competitive advantage. "The key is Human Resources," Agum said.

The third requirement is be discipline in obeying all applicable laws and regulations. A development process will only be successful, when development is carried out in a disciplined society. "Nationalism, human resources, and discipline are the

requirements," Agum said.

Closing his lecture, Agum elaborated to all IKAL members that as an institution, IKAL must be neutral in facing various types of differences including differences in democracy process. However, as individual members of IKAL who have democratic rights, they are given the opportunity to use these rights and are free to vote.

BPK RI hands the **Financial Audit Report Fiscal Year 2019** to Lemhannas RI



The Supreme Audit Agency of the Republic of Indonesia (BPK RI) handed the Financial Audit (LHP) to the Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI, Air Marshal Wieko Syofyan who was accompanied by Inspector of Lemhannas RI, Police Brigadier General Drs. Agus Sukamso, M.Si. on Thursday (23/7), at the Auditorium Tower BPK, BPK RI Head Office.

According to the report, Lemhannas RI has kept its unqualified opinion (WTP) from the Supreme

Audit Agency (BPK) for five year in a row since 2015.

Member I of BPK RI Dr. Hendra Susanto M. Eng., M.H., CSFA, CFA accompanied by Lead Auditor Novy Gregory Antonius Pelenkahu and Expert Staff for BUMN, BUMD, and State / Regional Wealth officially presented the results of the audit to Lemhannas RI.

Hendra expressed his appreciation to all Ministers and Heads of Institutions or those representing for their tangible manifestation and

commitment to carry out transparent and accountable management of state finances.

According to Hendra, the opinion achieved is the result of the hard work of Ministries and Institutions attended today in order to manage and be accountable for state finances.

Among 13 Ministries / Institutions BPK gave 10 Unqualified Opinions (WTP), 2 Qualified Opinions (WDP) and 1 Does Not Give Opinions (TMP).

Governor of Lemhannas RI gives lecture to PPRA 60 Participants

The aim of education is to strengthen national-level leader cadres with statesman character," Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo while giving lecture to participants of the Regular Education Program Batch 60 (PPRA 60) on Thursday (23/7). Agus emphasized that Lemhannas RI aims to strengthen leader cadres, not to form leader cadres, due to the limited time of the education program which only lasts for seven months.

Agus said that the core of the materials taught at Lemhannas is nationalism, so that the participants are expected to be able to think strategically in solving problems at the national, regional and global levels. "The participants are expected to be able to provide inputs to the government on policies at a strategic level based on national values," Agus said.

Furthermore, Agus also said that after attending education, participants can improve the ability to communicate their ideas effectively, analyze systematically, organize and use the network to complete their tasks.

Furthermore, Agus explained the operational forms of education at Lemhannas RI. Agus said that currently, Lemhannas RI is trying to create an educational method that involves active participation of the participants and emphasizes their ways of thinking that can later be applied in various aspects. "Participants are encouraged to think critically, strategically, comprehensively, integrally and holistically, and we



will focus on active participants and give them actual case studies. we are currently in the process of making it happen," Agus said.

Agus further said that the next form of education focuses on developing individual capacities and competencies which can be interpreted by assessments based on individual products without group assessment, ranking system, assessment materials that are grouped into product academic values, non-products academic values, and non-academic values for identifying leadership characteristics, and organizing in a special form such as seminars.

On this occasion, Agus also said that the Covid-19 Pandemic also had an impact on education such as the inability to carry out face-to-face teaching methods, inability to carry out face-to-face activities such as national Management System (Sismenas), Domestic Strategic Studies (SSDN), Foreign Strategic Studies (SSLN),

and cultural introduction for foreign participants, and the inability to carry out social activities. Lemhannas RI, Agus explained, has made adjustments in the curriculum, such as adjusting the assessment material by eliminating face-to-face activity material from the graduation requirements.

Governor of Lemhannas RI as Keynote Speaker at Seminar and Book Review

Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo became the keynote speaker at the Seminar and Book Review "Corruptors Go To Hell !! Octopus Corruption in Indonesia", on Wednesday (29/7) via online from his office.

On the occasion, Agus considered the book amusing because it was written by millennial generation. "It becomes amusing because it shows the point of view of corruption from millennial so that we get a picture of how the millennial views corruption and in which direction this generation has ideas in response to corruption as a phenomenon that mostly influence the progress of a nation in a democratic system," Agus said.

In the book, 5 potential causes of corruption are mentioned, namely system, integrity, income / remuneration, control / supervision, and culture. Meanwhile, the Corruption Eradication Commission (KPK) will take role as a pioneer in building a national integrity system and developing fraud control with the assumption that the national integrity system has been successfully implemented by creating a culture of integrity.

"A culture of integrity will reduce corruption," Agus said. In the context of national insight, a culture of integrity has a close relationship with the implementation of national values that have been contained in the Four Basic National Consensus. Therefore, to have a strong culture of integrity, a person must have a strong insight and national character. In order to instill national



insight and shape national character, a person must develop and implement national values continuously.

According to Agus, the culture of integrity in millennial is important considering the demographic bonus is dominated by the millennial generation. In the future, the millennial generation will take control of development which are expected to be able to lead Indonesia towards a more advanced and dynamic development. The millennial generation is a great asset to create national independence in all aspects of this nation's life. "As a big asset for the development of a nation, the millennial generation is expected to have the potential compare to previous generations," Agus continued.

Furthermore, Agus emphasized that the millennial generation will determine the existence of this nation in realizing national ideals without
