Lemhannas RI received twenty two books of each title. Twenty books will be stored in the library of Lemhannas RI, and the other

two books will be in the possession of the Governor.

The book entitled *Against All Odds, Prajurit Marinir yang Menjadi Panglima Nelayan* is the autobiography of Major General (Ret.) Dr. H. Yussuf Solichien M, M.B.A., Ph.D., illustrating his experiences during his career in the Army until he received the rank of Major General and became the General Chief of *Himpunan Nelayan Seluruh Indonesia* (HNSI) or The Indonesian Fishermen Association. Yussuf hopes that his autobiography can motivate the readers, especially the young generation of TNI, POLRI, and ASN that everything is within our reach if we have a will. "As long as we have a strong will, keep asking to the

God, we will do it," Yussuf said.

The second book entitled *Peran Negara dalam Memberantas Illegal Fishing* is the conversion of Yussuf's dissertation of his doctorate study at Political Doctoral Study Program, Universitas Indonesia. The book discusses the causes of illegal fishing, the nation's policy in handling illegal fishing, the roles of the government and law enforcers, especially the Army, in dealing with illegal fishing in Natuna.



# Entry Meeting of audit report on Ministries and Non-Ministerial government institutions' 2020 financial reports



**G**overnor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo attended the Entry Meeting of audit report on Ministries and Non-Ministerial government institutions' financial reports (LKKL) under the State Finance Auditor I (AKN I) of Supreme Audit Agency of the Republic of Indonesia (BPK RI) on Thursday at the BPK RI Auditorium.

The Coordinating Minister for Political, Legal, and Security Affairs (Menkopolhukam) Prof. Dr. Mohammad Mahfud MD, S.H., S.U., M.I.P. who attended the meeting, gave his remark. According to Mahfud, this Entry Meeting is a real commitment of Ministries / Non-Ministerial Government Institutions' Leaders, all officials and invited participants of the meeting to conduct transparent and accountable state finance management administration.

On the occasion, Mahfud MD also conveyed that currently, the government concentrate on three focuses. First, the government focus on handling a global pandemic, Covid-19. second, the

government focus on national economic recovery particularly by empowering small-scale economies in public. Third, the government focus on maintaining public social stability entirely.

Meanwhile, the Head of State Finances Audit I of BPK RI Dr. Hendra Susanto, S.T., M. Eng., M.H., CFRA., CSFA., explained that BPK RI as one of state agency that established and regulated in the 1945 Constitution together with other institutions have duties to encourage the achievement of state objectives. BPK RI is instructed to audit state finance management and responsibility which include all state finances elements including separated state assets.

The audit report on LKKL in 2020 basically aimed to give opinion on each ministries and Non-Ministerial Government Institutions' financial report

by paying attention to four criteria namely the suitability of the presentation of numbers in the financial statements

with government accounting standards, the adequacy of information disclosure in the notes to financial report according to government accounting standards, the compliance towards laws and regulations, the effectiveness of internal control system both in its planning and its implementation. In line with it, financial report scopes are five components of LKKL in 2020 which consisted of budget realization report, operational report, balance sheet, statement of changes in equity, and notes to financial statements.

Apart from Menkopolhukam and Governor of Lemhannas RI, also attended the Entry Meeting were Head of the National Counterterrorism Agency (BNPT), Secretary General of the National Resilience Council (Wantannas), Head of the National Cyber and Encryption Agency (BSSN), Head of the Corruption Eradication Commission (KPK), Head of the Meteorology, Climatology and Geophysics Agency (BMKG), and several auditor I of BPK RI.

# Disseminate Pancasila : Its Challenge, Obstacle, and Solution



**P**rofessional Expert of Ideology and Strategy of Lemhannas RI Brigadier General (Ret.) A. R. Wetik, S.IP,M.Sc represented Governor of Lemhannas RO to deliver material on Pancasila and Strengthening National Values conducted by Akademi Ilmu Pancasila on Wednesday (10/2) in Merlynn Park, Jakarta.

In his presentation, Wetik conveyed that Pancasila is not only an ideology for Indonesia but also culture, philosophy of life, and also as a legal ideas or the foundation of the nation embedded in Indonesian people and cannot be separated in nation's life.

"Pancasila which was a part of hegemony of New Order can survive even though government regimes keep changing. It is different compare to communist ideology which is

disappeared along with the collapse of Uni Soviet because it is not Indonesia's genuine ideology," Wetik explained.

Even so, Pancasila still needs to be disseminated to the next generation. Carrying out various forms of socializations such as being taught, being imitated, being regulated, and being watched. "Pancasila originated from our land, we have to disseminate it to Archipelago," Wetik said.

On the next process, Wetik said, Pancasila must be applicative in daily life. By embedding Pancasila values in daily activities, it will undoubtedly become a habit which then becomes a culture containing Pancasila values. After it becomes a culture, over time, Pancasila values must carry out continuous actualizations and adjustment based on the changing time.

Wetik also conveyed that heterogeneous conditions of Indonesian people must have the same vision as a nations namely independent, united, sovereign, fair, and prosperous As stated in the preamble of the 1945 Constitution. This vision can be achieved if the state carry out its functions by sticking to mutually agreed values such as Pancasila with its various instruments. Wetik hopes that every socialization, Pancasila must be taught properly to public particularly young generations so it will be a habit.

Also attended the Lecture on Pancasila and Strengthening National Values were the Head of the Agency for Pancasila Ideology Education (BPIP) Prof. Dr. Hariyono, M.Pd., and a lecture of Akademi Ilmu Pancasila Brigadier General (Ret.) Harsanto Adi.

# National Webinar on **Strengthening Strategy of Palm Oil Processing Policy**



**D**eputy for Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Reni Mayerni, M.P., representing the Governor of Lemhannas RI, attended the National Webinar on Strengthening Strategy of Sustainable Palm Oil Processing Policy to Improve Public Welfare in the context of National Resilience on Wednesday (10/2).

In her presentation, Reni talked about "Safeguarding State Sovereignty through Optimizing the Use of Palm Oil as a Renewable Energy Source". Talked about national resilience which comes from "astagatra" (eight aspects of life) resilience one of which is a natural resources such as palm oil plantations.

Further, Reni conveyed that national resilience related to nation's dynamic condition to overcome threats, disturbances, obstacles, and challenges so the approach chosen will be economic aspect. Along with the aspect chosen, there are geographic spatial approach, namely the provincial approach, especially oil palm in several provinces in Indonesia.

"The only thing that can be a pioneer in national agribusiness is palm oil plants," Reni said. According to Reni, the palm oil industry development sector is very strategic for plantation development in Indonesia because it can be a pioneer national agribusiness development. Moreover, there are two potential energies can be resulted from palm oil such as biodiesel and biopower. "This is, of course, will contribute to regional resilience where the spatial regional resilience will be national resilience, Reni stated.

During the national webinar, Reni also talked about the essential thing to optimize palm oil utilization. Reni saw it necessary to establish Palm oil authority body to solve overlap regulations problems among ministries or between central and regional government to develop palm oil industry in the future.

Reni also hopes that there will be more policies that encourage the development of palm oil processing industry in a small or medium scale.

"Encouraging small-scale processing industry to form clusters of palm oil derivatives which we call media factory sharing," Reni said. It can be conducted by development patterns, training, facilities (production houses and machines), and product marketing to oil palm smallholders can be supported by the ministry's and institutional programs.

# Seminar on “The Power of Political Parties and Political colors in simultaneous Election on December 9, 2020”



**G**overnor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo attended Seminar on “The Power of Political Parties and Political colors in simultaneous Election on December 9, 2020” on Thursday (11/2) in Gajah Mada Auditorium.

On the occasion, Agus said that Indonesia is a democratic state where its citizens have the opportunity to participate directly in the election to choose the leaders both in executive and legislative in national and regional levels.

Even though it was conducted during COVID-19 pandemic, the implementation of regional leader election on December 9, 2020 was carried out safely, peacefully, and smoothly. There are 270 regions that conduct regional leader elections, covering 9 provinces, 224 regencies and 37 cities.

By looking at the result, there are several interesting phenomena such as the strengthening of political dynasties, money politics, and indications of 21 cases of violations of ASN (State Civil Apparatus) neutrality. Regarding the condition of democracy with the

existence of the Regional Election phenomenon that may continue to repeat, it is necessary to conduct further studies on the role of political forces in the regional election to be able achieve a successful democracy in Indonesia.


Agus emphasized the importance of continuing to believe in the democratic process. “It does need improvement, but

The seminar, moderated by the former managing editor of Tempo Magazine, Nugroho Dewanto, aims to analyze the political colors and strength of political parties at the provincial, district and city levels through a survey conducted by the Kompas Research and Development Center.

The main speakers in the limited discussion were Ignatius Kristanto and Bambang Setiawan from Kompas Research and Development, and Arya Fernandes M.Si, Researcher at the Department of Politics and Social Change at the Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS) as a comparison. The discussants presented Deputy Chief Editor of Kompas Tri Agung Kristanto, Wawan Ichwannuddin M.Si. from the Center for Political Research (P2P) of Indonesian Institute of Sciences (LIPI), Dr. Sri Budi Eko Wardani, S.IP, M.Si from the Center for Political Studies, Universitas Indonesia (UI), and Cecilia Sumarlin.

# Agus Widjojo addresses online Webinar to commemorate 76<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of PETA Awakening



**G**overnor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo attended the webinar conducted by Yayasan Pembela Tanah Air Pusat (Central Homeland Defenders Foundation or PETA) via online on Monday (14/2). According to Agus, the webinar is relevant to remind us and reflects the patriotic values contained in history of Indonesia in facing current nation's challenges.

Agus described history as roots of a tree which grows into a strong big tree. In line with this, the growth and life journey of a nation cannot be separated from the history of its formation. "Therefore, understand and preserving history in the collective memory of the Indonesian people is an important drive for safeguarding and taking care the life of the nation so that it continues to grow, develop and become stronger," Agus said.

The presence of PETA cannot be removed from the historical record of the journey of the Indonesia's struggle, especially in the struggle to escape

from the shackles of colonialism. Agus also said that as an organization, PETA was a resistance community formed by the Japanese (colonial) government as an armed resistance guard to assist the Japanese army in defending the Indonesia's islands, which at that time was still a Japanese colony from the re-invasion of Allied forces. At that time, PETA had the patriotic spirit to defend Indonesia from being re-colonized by Europeans.

After the proclamation of Indonesia's independence, on August 19, 1945, the Japanese government dissolved the PETA organization. It was due to the defeat of Japanese troops from the Allied forces which also marked the end of colonization throughout Indonesia.

Since that day, PETA was no longer exist as a resistance organization againsts the colonialism. "However, young people who at that time were members of the PETA still have a patriotic spirit, love Indonesia as a nation and state," Agus said.

The historical record of the struggle of the Indonesian people against and expelling colonialists for more than three and a half centuries had shown patriotic values that should receive high respect. Agus said that the historical values of the struggle are essentially the roots for the growth, and the development of strong Indonesia's national "tree". Meanwhile, patriotic values extracted from the historical process of the struggle for the independence of Indonesia as nation and state, can be used as lessons for all generations of this nation.

On this occasion, Agus hopes that the commemoration of PETA's Awakening will not only be filled with protocol events, but also conducted in a long-distance meeting discourse activities. According to Agus, a wide variety of approaches and perspectives on the history of PETA is important. "We have to be loyal to listen to these different perspectives to take lessons and not just to be commemorated in protocol events," Agus said.

# Online Strengthening National Values Program for Ikatan Alumni ITB Batch I of 2021



**G**overnor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo attended the Opening Ceremony on Online Strengthening National Values Program for Ikatan Alumni Institut Teknologi Bandung (Alumni Association of Bandung Institute of Technology of ITB) Batch I of 2021 of Lemhannas RI on Monday (15/2). The strengthening program which was held for a week was followed by 97 ITB Alumni.

Agus said in his remark that currently, the decrease in understanding Pancasila values as a guidance on social, nation, and state life has made public easily provoked and divided by irresponsible parties.

Therefore, according to Agus, understanding on national values is seen very important to be implemented, internalized, and disseminated to the public so national service spirit can increasingly be intensified while at the same time strengthening the unity and maintaining the integrity of the nation.

According to Agus, ITB Alumni who has spread in various regions in

Indonesia, has held strategic position in government structure, State-Owned Enterprises (BUMN), and private sector. Although they have joined the ITB Alumni Association, there are still differences among its alumni such as differences in academic disciplines, differences in social life, differences in individual experiences, and differences in quality on national values. "ITB Alumni Association is a forum to unite intellectuals graduated from Institute Technology Bandung," Agus said.

Agus stated that it is very appropriate for the ITB Alumni Association to attend this online strengthening national values program to create equal point of views and strengthen understanding related to national values originated from four basic consensus of the nation namely Pancasila, The 1945 Constitution, Bhinneka Tunggal Ika (Unity in Diversity), and NKRI (the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia).
