General Secretary of Wantannas visits Lemhannas RI

General Secretary of Wantannas visits Lemhannas RI



The Secretary General of the National Resilience Council (Wantannas), Vice Admiral Dr. Ir. Harjo Susmoro, S.Sos., S.H., M.H., accompanied by several high officials from Wantannas paid a Courtesy Call to the Governor of Lemhannas RI, Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo on Monday (15/2), at the Governor's Executive Guest Room Lemhannas RI, by implementing health protocols.

The Courtesy Call discussed the change in the nomenclature of Wantannas. Regarding the topic, Harjo stated that security issue is a part of national interest. Harjo said national interests are welfare and safety. Harjo stated his opinion, saying that the welfare is related more to politics because it depends on how the government ensures the people's welfare. Regarding security, it is in the scope of the state because it is related to how to keep the state free. The point is social justice for all the people of Indonesia. Security has a particularly important role in this matter. However, the security has been inadvertently degrading. Therefore, it is considered necessary for Wantannas to be

reformed as National Security Council (Wankamnas).

Harjo stated that regarding the nomenclature, currently it is in the stage of drafting the more complete and comprehensive Presidential Decree (Keppres). Other than the Presidential Decree, at present, the national security strategic plan is drafted, that is necessary to achieve national ideals and goals. "The national security strategic plan is how to maintain Indonesia to stay free, sovereign, just, and prosperous," Harjo stated.

On this occasion, Harjo also stated that Wantannas plans to make use of national resilience measurement data from the Measurement Laboratory of the National Resilience (Labkurtannas) Lemhannas RI to provide opinions for the President as the chairman of the Council. "We are informed that there is the national resilience measuring tool here called Labkurtannas and the measurement is one of the main tasks of Wantannas, including monitoring, identifying, assessing, evaluating the national security and national resilience development," Harjo explained.

Responding to this, Agus said

that changing nomenclature is not a simple issue because the term National Resilience Council has been recorded in the law. However, this does not mean that it is impossible. In addition, Agus also shared the history of the change in the name of the Indonesian National Resilience Institute, which had also changed from the National Defence Institute to the National Resilience Institute. "From Defence to Resilience. However, even though the name has changed, the function is unchanged and is still in charge of educating practitioners of resilience," Agus said.

Also present accompanying the Governor of Lemhannas RI at the Courtesy Call were the Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Air Marshal Wieko Syofyan, the Deputy of Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Reni Mayerni, M.P, Senior Lecture in Defence and Security of Lemhannas RI Rear Admiral Budi Setiawan, S.T, Senior Analyst in Defence and Security of Lemhannas RI Brigadier General Supriyatna, S.I.P., M.M., and the Director of Defence, Security, and Geography of the Deputy Office of Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI, First Marshal Heddezul, S.Sos.

The Visit of the Governor of Lemhannas RI to Seskoad and Sesko TNI

The Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo accompanied by several officials of Lemhannas RI went to Bandung, West Java for a visit to the Army Staff and Command School (Seskoad) and the Armed Forces Staff and Command School (Sesko TNI), on Thursday (18/2) in Bandung.

Upon arrival at Seskoad, the visit was received by the Commander of Seskoad (Danseskoad) Maj. Gen. Dr. Anton Nugroho, MMDS., M.A., accompanied by the Deputy Commander of Seskoad Brig. Jend. Fulad, S.Sos., M.Si., and several of his Staff. The purpose of this visit was to conduct a comparative study regarding the implementation and mechanism of education carried out by Seskoad.

During the visit, staff of Lemhannas RI and Seskoad entered A. Yani Seskoad building and presented opinion from each part. Afterwards, discussions and question and answer session were held in order to enrich each part's insights. Finishing the visit, Lemhannas RI and Seskoad exchanged souvenirs and followed by lunch and hospitality. The visit is expected to be a means of exchanging ideas and discussions between Lemhannas RI and Seskoad aiming to provides opinions and suggestions for the implementation of education at Lemhannas RI.

After the visit from Seskoad, the Governor of Lemhannas RI and staff visited the Armed Forces Staff and Command School (Sesko TNI). The Deputy Commander of Sesko TNI (Wadan Sesko TNI) Maj. Gen. Tri Martono, S.I.P., M.I.P., accompanied by several Sesko TNI key officials received the Governor of Lemhannas RI and staff in the VIP Room Sudirman Building of Sesko TNI.

Similar to that to Seskoad, the purpose of the visit to Sesko TNI was to conduct a comparative study regarding



the implementation and mechanism of education carried out by Sesko TNI so far. This visit is expected to be a means of exchanging ideas and discussions between Lemhannas RI and Sesko TNI, aiming to provides opinions and suggestions for the implementation of education at Lemhannas RI. "Hopefully, this meeting, apart from conducting a comparative study to figure out diverse points that are applied regarding the operational education at the Sesko TNI, can also be a means to strengthen the friendship among us all," Martono said.

Based on the results of the Evaluation of Dikreg-47 Year 2020 and by considering the Covid-19 pandemic, it was decided to conduct the teaching and learning process by implementing the Three Basic Education Pattern orienting the process towards three aspects, including knowledge, personality, and physical. In order to ensure the development of the student officers and obtain an impartial evaluation of learning outcomes, especially in the personality and

physical aspects, it is necessary to directly observe the student officers while applying strict health protocols in every activity. On this occasion, the Lemhannas RI officials also received an explanation of the Sesko TNI's E-Learning learning system.

Strengthening Knowledge and Sharpening Competence, Lemhannas RI holds Intellectual Exercise



Lemhannas RI held an Intellectual Exercise, on Monday (22/2) in Kresna Room, Astagatra Building, 4th Floor, Lemhannas RI. The Intellectual Exercise is a series of activities held regularly by the Deputy for Strategic Studies in order to strengthen knowledge and sharpening competencies by deepening and exploring a more comprehensive understanding of the conception of national resilience in the context of dynamics of the strategic environment and enriching knowledge about national resilience as a multidisciplinary science. The Intellectual Exercise activity was attended by structural officials of the National Defence Institute RI, senior lecturers, senior analysts, and professional experts of Lemhannas RI.

The fundamental reason of the theme of the Intellectual Exercise focusing on national resilience is because the relevance of national resilience in today's life which is faced by diverse changes that are occurring exceptionally fast, even faster than

expected and is unpredictable with a variety of challenges. Thus, it is necessary to rethink and understand the meaning and value of national resilience, both conceptually and contextually accommodating the present and future life.

"National resilience is not a single discipline," Agus said. Agus emphasized that national resilience is a condition of totality, accumulation, or aggregate to achieve national goals which in its journey will always face threats, disturbances, obstacles, and challenges. National resilience is achieved through the *Pancagatra* Resilience approach, including the ideological, economic, political, socio-cultural, defence and security aspects. Therefore, the national resilience can be said good if the resilience of each aspect is also good. To build a good condition for the resilience of each aspect, it must be sourced from the disciplines of each aspect.

Agus further said that currently,

the challenge is transforming the resilience of the approaches originating from the disciplines of each element to be processed by making them concrete, which can be useful for the people. "The challenge is transforming the theory of disciplines into policy," Agus said. Everything cannot stop with knowledge alone, but the knowledge must be transformed into policy. This is necessary in order to answer actual problems.

To build national resilience, Agus stated that policy makers must refer to the basic cross-disciplinary knowledge and must possess the competence to build policies. In line with this, Agus explained that Indonesia as a democratic country does respect differences, but these differences must be based on the basic consensus of the nation. Therefore, differences that come from outside the basic consensus of the nation and aim to get out of the basic consensus of the nation can be suspected of being an abuse of freedom of thought.

The Minister of Trade gives lecture to the Participants of Strengthening National Values for ITB Alumni Association



The Minister of Trade of the Republic of Indonesia, Muhammad Lutfi, delivered a lecture to the participants of the Strengthening National Values Program (Taplai) Batch I for Bandung Institute of Technology (ITB) Alumni Association with the topic "Indonesia Economic Outlook 2021" via online, on Monday (22/2).

Lutfi started his lecture by saying that the world is currently experiencing the second phase of the evolution of international trade. The first phase began when Ferdinand Magellan from Portugal began exploring and looking for goods that could be traded, then followed by Spain, England, and the Netherlands. This phase, which lasted until the 19th century, showed that the exploratory countries finally have a high level of prosperity and became the leaders of the colonial era. After entering the modern era, especially after the World War II, there was decolonialization and the international trade turned into competition.

Entering the 60's, international trade began to have regulation so that taxes were reduced and trade gave

prosperity to the world's population. The policies made have enabled many countries to fight the poverty and to increase welfare through collaboration. Collaboration is key in dealing with the international trade climate in this second evolutionary period. "If we can't contribute to a collaboration then we will become parasites," Lutfi said.

Lutfi further said that even though hit by a pandemic, in 2020 Indonesia obtained a trade balance surplus of 21.74 billion US dollars, the highest since 2012. He explained that Indonesia has a great opportunity in oil and gas exports. He showed that the export value of iron and steel in 2020 was 10.85 billion US dollars, increasing by 46.84% compared to the previous year.

Lutfi emphasized the export value of automotive and spare part products, which are still ranked in the top ten of non-oil and gas export commodities, even though it decreased by -19.36% compared to the previous year. According to Lutfi, the high export value of the two commodities shows a good opportunity for Indonesia to collaborate in international trade because the two commodities have the potential to

attract large investments which in the future can become pillars of Indonesia's exports.

Closing his lecture, Lutfi stated the need for the right strategy to collaborate in international trade so that Indonesia could later become the centre of world production. "In this era of collaboration, we must be able to play a defined strategy, including opening the market skilfully and attracting investment. Once the investment comes, we become a center of production," he said.

FGD on Optimization of the Role of Social Media to Develop National Insights



Lemhannas RI held a Focus Group Discussion (FGD) of Long-term Study on "Optimization of the Role of Social Media to Develop National Insights", on Tuesday (23/2) in Gatot Kaca Room, Astagatra Building, 3rd Floor, Lemhannas RI.

In his remarks, Deputy for Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Reni Mayerni, M.P. said that based on the research results, every day people spends about 135 minutes surfing on various social media such as Facebook, Youtube, Twitter, Instagram, Whatsapp, and so on.

Reni's view on social media is that it is now addictive for the community. Almost every urban resident access social media. The characteristics of social media that are interactive, attractive, fast, and easy to access make social media possess a great power in shaping people's lives. Social media is also considered capable of spreading messages in a revolutionary manner. The effects of these messages can be so broad that they affect the collective attitudes and behaviour of the community.

Regarding this point, the development of national insight is expected to be more rapid by taking advantage of all available facilities and resources, including social media. The values of national insights can be widely communicated to the public by using social media, so that it can encourage people to anticipate values that are detrimental to the nation and to adopt a mental attitude that supports the realization of national unity.

Reni further said that currently, social media has yet been widely used to publicise national insight materials. The proportion of content containing the theme of national insight is still much smaller than other entertainment content, many of which are less useful and can even have a negative impact. "Social media possess a strategic role to convey information on various issues. Therefore, the use of social media to publicise knowledge about national insight needs to be made more optimal," said Reni.

This FGD was attended by several speakers and discussants in order to obtain suitable opinions, concepts,

and thoughts. Therefore, this FGD is expected to gather smart ideas and strategic thoughts from the speakers, discussants, and all discussion participants to enrich the substance

of the study being prepared by the Lemhannas Review Team.

The FGD held were the initial stage of the study drafting process, to explore information and data that were directly related to the substance of the study, namely the root causes and demands of the Papuan people, global factors that influence conduciveness in Papua, strategies and optimal solutions in developing Papua while still prioritizing the rights of the Papuan people as the part of Indonesia, as well as suggestions and recommendations for the Papua problems to maintain Papua as a part of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia.



Parallel Discussions of Lemhannas RI's Scientific Journals



By publishing research results in scientific journals, researchers will get a lot of input and at the same time they will have the opportunity to develop research in the future.

Publication of Indonesia's research in global level is still very low, especially in media indexed in reputable international indexes. One of the contributing factors is the undeveloped people's writing culture," Deputy for Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI said Prof. Dr. Ir. Reni Mayerni, M.P. when opening the Parallel Discussions of Lemhannas RI's *Jurnal Kajian* (research journal). This is also the main inspiration for Lemhannas RI to conduct this parallel discussions.

The parallel discussions which took place on Thursday (25/2) was attended by participants from various universities, such as Universitas Gadjah Mada (Gadjah Mada University or UGM), Universitas Indonesia (University of Indonesia or UI), Universitas Pelita Harapan (Pelita Harapan University or UPH), and Universitas Cendrawasih (Cenderawasih University).

On this occasion, Reni encouraged the participants to conduct research and publish the results. "By publishing

research results in scientific journals, researchers will get a lot of input and at the same time they will have the opportunity to develop research in the future," Prof. Dr. Ir. Reni Mayerni, M.P. said.

According to Reni, the results of the research will be of great benefit to the public, both for practical purposes and for theoretical development. The low level of publication of scientific journals in Indonesia is indeed quite a concern. According to the SCImago Lab scientific publication ranking processed website (www.scimagojr.com), currently Indonesia is ranked 47th with a total of 158,733 documents / journals uploaded. Indonesia's position is still lagging behind other ASEAN countries such as Thailand, Malaysia and Singapore, which rank 44.34 and 33.

In this parallel discussions, the participants had the opportunity to provide guidance or changes regarding scientific journals that will be or are being written. The reviewers who participated were the Head of the Center

for Pancasila Studies of Universitas Gadjah Mada Drs. Agus Wahyudi, M.Si., MA, Ph.D., researcher at the School of Strategic and Global of Universitas Indonesia, Dr. Margaretha Hanita, SH, M.Sc., then a lecturer at the Faculty of Economics and Business of Universitas Indonesia, Dr. Telisa Aulia Falianty, SE, ME., And finally, Head of National Leadership Study sub-directorate of Deputy Office of Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI, Colonel (KH) Dr. Dwi Hartono, S.Pd, M.AP.

The number of papers or scientific journal manuscripts collected at this parallel discussions were 24 manuscripts. It is expected that the research conducted by these authors can be seen as an effort by those universities and also Lemhannas RI to increase competitiveness in international forums. Furthermore, Lemhannas RI's *Jurnal Kajian* is expected to be an important component in national resilience pillars in terms of economic, political and socio-cultural development.

FGD on Mineral Downstream and Rare Earth Elements to Support National Economic Growth



Lemhannas RI conducted a Focus Group Discussion (FGD) as the beginning of a Long-Term Study of Minerals Downstream and Rare Earth Elements (REE) to Support National Economic Growth on Thursday (25/2) in Gatot Kaca Room, Astagatra Building, 3rd Floor, Lemhannas RI.

Deputy for Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Reni Mayerni, M.P. who opened the FGD said that strategic mineral wealth, associated minerals, and Rare Earth Elements (REE) in Indonesia are strategic minerals that have economic potential to support national economic growth. This strategic mineral is a reserve resource that is quite significant compared to the total reserve resource in the world, which is also considered strategic in the application of renewable energy.

Reni sees that the additional value will increase if the production of mineral mining and Rare Earth Elements or what is commonly called Rare Earth Metal can be further processed and refined domestically. Therefore, strengthening the downstream industry based on strategic minerals, associated minerals and REEs is needed to increase national economic growth and national industry resilience. However, the utilization of products from the processing and refining of strategic minerals and associated minerals is unfortunately cannot be fulfilled in Indonesia.

Most of these products, Reni continued, have been exported abroad in the form of intermediate products. This is due to Indonesia's dependence on technological reliability in other countries and lack of reliable human resources, resulting in missed

opportunities to increase yields with high added value. In addition, regulations, fiscal and non-fiscal policies that have not fully supported the identification of downstream technologies have further weakened the mineral and REE industries in Indonesia.

Through the FGD, it is expected that the speakers and discussants, as well as participants attended the FGD, can sharpen the identification and inventory of what problems are faced in optimizing mineral downstream and REE and how to realize mineral downstream and REE management, in order to fulfill needs-based exploration and development activities based on domestic and foreign markets demands in supporting national economic growth.

Former Air Force Chief of Staff donates a number of books to Lemhannas RI

"We are following the pace of development of the strategic environment," Agus said. Then Agus said that currently, Lemhannas RI is in the process of trying to shift the methodology, such as transforming from a conventional "top down" to involving more participants with critical thinking. So, it is hoped that the participants

will have more knowledge and have a comparison, not only from the lecturers but from fellow participants.

On this occasion, Chappy also asked about the progress of the study at Lemhannas RI. Agus said that the studies at Lemhannas RI have recently been sharpened in terms of quality and in terms of quantity of pages. In the study preparation process, Lemhannas RI also always involves practitioners of all stakeholders, both practitioners, academics, and bureaucracy. It aims to increase input for Lemhannas RI.

In the end of the meeting, Agus said his gratitude for Chappy for the donation of books and he also gave *Kiprah Lemhannas RI* book for Chappy in return.

Covid-19 vaccination at Lemhannas RI



Lemhannas RI held a Covid-19 vaccination on Wednesday (18/3) in Dwi Warna Purwa Room, Lemhannas RI. The Covid-19 vaccination is carried out in collaboration with the Indonesian Ministry of Health, DKI Jakarta Provincial Government Health Service, and a number of vaccinators from Gambir Health Center, State Intelligence Agency Polyclinic, Sawah Besar Health Center, and Medistra Hospital.

"The implementation of the Covid-19 vaccination is one of the government's efforts to prevent and control the spread of Covid-19," Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Air Marshal Wieko Syofyan said. The first phase of the vaccination period starts from January to April 2021 which prioritizes 1.3 million health workers and 17.4 million public service workers.

In line with this, the implementation of Covid-19 vaccination at Lemhannas RI was given to 713 personnel out of a total of 774 registered personnel. Participants registered in the Covid-19 vaccination at Lemhannas RI are all personnel, including Senior Lecturers, Senior Analysts, Professional Experts who are already in clinically vulnerable groups. The implementation of Covid-19 vaccination is expected to support the implementation of the duties and functions of Lemhannas RI.

"This vaccination does not mean to make someone immune and free from Covid-19 and replace the implementation of health protocols," Wieko said. Furthermore, Wieko emphasized that vaccination is expected to reduce transmission of Covid-19, reduce morbidity and mortality due to Covid-19, achieve group

immunity or herd immunity and protect people from Covid-19 in order to remain productive socially and economically. "I urge all of you to continue applying health protocols through the 5M movement during the implementation of vaccination," Wieko said.

At the end of his remarks, Wieko appreciated all those who have worked in the stages of Covid-19 vaccination, starting from preparation, distribution to Covid-19 vaccination services. Wieko hopes that the Covid-19 vaccination that has been pursued with support, commitment and cooperation will be able to control the spread of the Covid-19. "Let's carry out the implementation of Covid-19 vaccination at Lemhannas RI together to protect ourselves and heal our country," Wieko said.
