# Agus Widjojo: Making Changes Is Indeed Challenging

Mon, May 24<sup>th</sup> 2021

The Governor of Lemhannas RI, Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo was present as a speaker at the Accelerated Leadership Program for IPC PT. Pelabuhan Indonesia II (ALPI), on Monday (24/5) at the Maritim Museum, Jakarta.

In the event that implemented strict health protocols, Agus stated that within a change, every party will be related to the change. However, an aspect that is necessary to be put into consideration is culture from which people are accustomed to seek certainty, while change is perceived otherwise. "This aspect needs to be considered and identified in a change and I believe this has been understood by the leaders who indicate the change," Agus added.

According to Agus, change will occur more quickly and smoothly if it arises from the awareness of members within the organization. Therefore, it can be stated that the true challenge is change in management.

Agus added that change is also influenced by external aspects of the future that are different from the past. This will complement a variable to the made changes. "Making changes is indeed challenging," Agus said.

To overcome this, Agus realized that viewed from the internal institution, cohesiveness in terms of trust between officials and leaders within the institution is necessary. "Have faith that when leaders make changes, there are always positive and good arguments put into consideration. I do not believe that there are leaders who plan to make changes for the worse," Agus said.

"Therefore, the uniformity and consistent understanding regarding the change and the need for change



is realized. For the change to be able to be disseminated, shared, in a sense of ownership, everyone must have the feeling of possessing the change," Agus continued.

On this occasion, Agus appealed that in implementing changes, there must be solidity and trust built. There should be no sectoral pride and all sections must give priority to the general interest of the organization. Do not get caught up in steps that only prioritize personal or group interests interfering the performance achievement of the organization. "As long as all parties carry out their duties, demands, roles, and authorities in accordance with the existing provisions, the organization will run more effectively," Agus said.

# Signing of Memorandum of Understanding between Lemhannas RI and Untag Semarang

**B**y implementing strict health protocols, Lemhannas RI and University 17 August 1945 (Untag) Semarang for the first time signed a Memorandum of Understanding, on Monday (31/5) in Nusantara Room, first floor of Trigatra Building, Lemhannas RI.

The scope of the Memorandum of Understanding covers several points, including improving the quality of human resources through education and training, community service, exchanging experts, strengthening national values, exchanging information in the context of measuring national resilience, conducting studies and other fields according to the needs agreed by the parties involved. The memorandum of understanding is valid for five years starting from the signing of the memorandum of understanding.

The Rector of the University of 17 August 1945 (Untag) Semarang, Prof. Dr. Drs. Suparno, M.Si, in his speech expressed his gratitude and highest appreciation for the cooperation between Lemhannas RI and Untag Semarang. Suparno hopes that both parties will proceed with the follow-up of the content of the agreement earnestly.

The Governor of Lemhannas RI, Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo, stated that this newly established cooperation is an honor and trust that must be implemented through program activities that can support the nation's development in the future.

Therefore, Agus emphasized that the signing of the memorandum of understanding is not only a

ceremonial event, but also is expected to be implemented in more concrete activities consistently regarding the fields that are included in the scope of the collaboration.

# Commemorating Pancasila Day, President Calls for Making Pancasila the Foundation in Science and Technology Development

President Joko Widodo stated that the development of science and technology also affects the landscape of ideology contestation. The industrial revolution 4.0 has provided various conveniences in dialogue, interaction, and organization on a large scale across countries.

“The speed of expansion of radical transnational ideologies can exceed normal standards if taking advantage of this technological disruption,” the President conveyed. Therefore, President Joko Widodo reminded that in facing the existing challenges, the expansion and deepening of the values of Pancasila cannot be carried out in the usual way. Extraordinary and innovative ways are necessary, including utilizing the development of science and

technology, especially the Industrial Revolution 4.0.

“Pancasila must be used as the foundation in developing Indonesian science and technology,” the President stated. Closing his mandate, the President invited all government officials, religious leaders, community leaders, educators, professionals, Indonesian youth, and all Indonesian people to unite and to actively make a move to strengthen the values of Pancasila to realize Indonesia Onward as aspired.

# South Sulawesi as Locus of Study on the Influence of Identity Politics

**A**fter departing for the North Sumatra Locus last March, Lemhannas RI Study Team left for the Makassar Locus, South Sulawesi to strengthen the formulation of the influence of identity politics on democracy in Indonesia, on Thursday (3/6) and Friday (4/6). This event is an advanced stage of the Indonesian National Resilience Institute RI in formulating the Long-Term Strategic Study of the Indonesian National Resilience Institute of 2021 with the title “The Influence of Identity Politics on Democracy in Indonesia”.

The Lemhannas RI delegation was led directly by the Governor of Lemhannas RI, Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo, accompanied by the Deputy for Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Reni Mayerni, M.P, professional expert on Geopolitics and Archipelago Insights of Lemhannas RI, Major General (Ret.) E. Imam Maksudi, and professional expert on National Vigilance and Ideology of Lemhannas RI, Major General (Ret.)

During the two-day visit in Makassar, the Lemhannas RI delegation held four Focus Group Discussions (FGD) with the South Sulawesi Provincial Government, South Sulawesi Regional Police, Military Area Command (Kodam) XIV/Hasanuddin, and University of Hasanuddin (Unhas). FGD is one of the efforts to obtain input from experts, bureaucracy, academics, law enforcement, and practitioners of the Locus of South Sulawesi Province.

According to Agus, democracy in Indonesia is currently experiencing a paradox. Freedom of expression is currently meeting a challenge in the form of the spread of identity politics. Agus stated that identity politics can be threatening for democracy because it is related to primordial sentiments mobilized by a handful of actors for political interests. This is considered effective in gaining electability, especially the adopted identity is religion.

In addition, Agus viewed that if political institutionalization run well, people will automatically believe and make choices rationally, uninfluenced by identity politics which is more emotional in nature. Sharp polarization can also be minimized because people’s political aspirations should have been accommodated by political parties and elections, so that physical and psychological conflicts can be avoided, shifting to institutionalized conflicts in parliament and electoral.

Lemhannas RI considers that the phenomenon of identity politics is a challenge to be faced and a solution is necessary so that the existing democratic system can be appropriately used in accordance with the law corridors in Indonesia. Therefore, Lemhannas RI formulates the Long-Term Strategic Study on the Influence of Identity Politics on Democracy in Indonesia.

## Locus Visit to Southeast Sulawesi in Search of Information and Recommendation

**A**fter visiting West Kalimantan Locus in March and Bangka Belitung Locus in April, Lemhannas RI Study Team went to Southeast Sulawesi Locus from Monday (7/6) to Wednesday (9/7) in order to collect data and facts for formulating a Long-Term Study concerning "Mineral Downstream and Rare Earth Metal to Support National Economic Growth".

The Lemhannas RI Study Team was led by the Deputy for Strategic Studies Lemhannas RI, Prof. Dr. Ir. Reni Mayerni, M.P, accompanied by the Director of Economic and Natural Wealth Studies Brigadier General Ramses L. Tobing, Professional Expert of Natural Wealth Lemhannas RI Ir. Edi Permadi, Professional of Natural Wealth Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Jana Tjahjana Anggadiredja, and Deputy Head of the Indonesian Geologists Association (IAGI) Yoseph Swamidharma, M.Sc.

During the three-day visit to Southeast Sulawesi Locus, the Lemhannas RI Study Team conducted four Focus Group Discussions (FGD) with PT. Aneka Tambang Tbk (ANTAM) Pomalaa, University of Haluoleo (Unhalu), PT. Virtue Dragon Nickel Industry (VDNI), and the Regional Government of Southeast Sulawesi Province.

On this occasion, Reni stated that one of the primary tasks of Lemhannas RI is to conduct conceptual and strategic studies on wide range of national, regional and international issues required by the president. Therefore, according to Reni, in 2021, Lemhannas RI will carry out a long-term study entitled "Mineral Downstream and Rare Earth Metal to Support National Economic Growth".

"This FGD at Southeast Sulawesi Provincial Locus is a series of activities to deepen the long-term study material of the Directorate of Economy and Natural Wealth Debidjianstrat, as an effort to obtain real data and facts according to conditions in the field regarding mineral downstream and rare earth metal," Reni stated.

It is expected that the visit of the Lemhannas RI Study Team to Southeast Sulawesi Locus will further complement the information and recommendation on mineral downstream and rare earth metal. Therefore, the major questions regarding the problems and obstacles faced by the central government, regional government, and the private sector in optimizing the mineral downstream and rare earth metal, and how to realize the mineral downstream and rare earth metal can obtain in-depth answers.

# Opening of Virtual National Taplai Binlak Activities and Training for Trainers

The Governor of Lemhannas RI, Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo, officially opened the coaching and implementation (Binlak) of Strengthening National Values (Taplai) and Training for Trainers on Tuesday (8/7) online. Each activity lasts for 7 days for each batch, starting from June 8, 2021 to November 24, 2021.

Agus, on this occasion, stated that as citizens of a nation united on account of differences and pluralism, national values and insights are absolute prerequisites that must be maintained in order to maintain the integrity of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia. “The current condition of human resources is in large quantity but poor quality, so there is still a lot to improve,” Agus said. Furthermore, Agus conveyed that there are still countless weaknesses in mentality and morality that require careful attention. The problem that is considered complex is the decline in mentality regarding discipline, culture, work ethic, morals, ethics, and the spirit of nationalism and patriotism.

In addition, Agus explained that the perception of the decline is not a linear



phenomenon because each generation will stay in their own environment and era. “Therefore, it is significant to continuously instill and develop national insight and character,” Agus stated.

Agus also expressed his gratitude to the committee and involved parties who support the event. Agus also reminded the participants and the committee, that during these activities to constantly apply health protocols seriously as an effort to break the chain of the spread of Covid-19.

This event provides participants with materials related to the Four Basic Consensus of the Nation, including Pancasila, the 1945 Constitution of the Republic of Indonesia, Sesanti Bhinneka Tunggal Ika and the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia, as well as the National Paradigm, including Archipelago Insights, National Resilience, National Vigilance, and National Leadership.

It is hoped that after the event ends, the participants will be able to understand the national values



originating from the Four Basic Consensus of the Nation, understand the implementation of the National Paradigm, be able to apply national values according to their respective roles in the life of society, nation and state, and be able to disseminate national values according to their respective roles in the life of society, nation and state.

## Lemhannas RI Participates in Hearing Meeting with Commission I DPR RI

Agus stated that Lemhannas RI has contributed to the quality of Indonesian people improvement and cultural advancement reflecting the nation's character for the development of human resources through mental revolution

and cultural development programs. The contribution of Lemhannas RI on the RKP for fiscal year 2022 is categorized in three points, including Strengthening National Values, Training for Trainers, and Socialization/Dialogue of National Insights. "The work plan of Lemhannas RI for fiscal year 2022 is summarized in two programs, including the National Resilience Development Program and the Management Support Program," Agus stated.

Agus further explained that the National Resilience Development Program is described in the activities of three deputies and one laboratory center, including the Regular Education Program (PPRA) Batch 63 and 64, the Strengthening Regional Leaders Program (P3DA) Batch 12, Strengthening National Values, Training for Trainers, Dialogue of National Insights, four Long-Term Studies, four Urgent and Rapid Studies, the Jakarta Geopolitical Forum Seminar, Preparation of the National Resilience Institute of RI Book, and Dissemination

of National Resilience Measurements in four provinces and 42 regencies/cities. Regarding the Management Support Program, Lemhannas RI will implement five service activities and one supervisory activity.

On this occasion, Agus said that Lemhannas RI also proposed the National-Level Leaders Education Program as a national priority to support the government's agenda aiming to increase quality and competitive human resources. In preparing the work plan and budgets, Lemhannas RI has adjusted to government policies and financial management regulations effectively and efficiently and created innovative and beneficial programs, activities, and projects for the community in order to increase national insight. "The National Resilience Institute will continually support government policies in accelerating the implementation of the national priority of RKP 2022, implemented with health protocols," Agus stated.
