The importance of national values for Association of Land Deed Officials



One hundred and sixteen members of Association of Land Deed Official (IPPAT) joined Strengthening Program of National Values for seven days from October 2 – 8, 2017.

Land Deed Official (PPAT) is responsible in making deed as evidence of certain legal acts related to Strata Title, which shall be the basis for registration of changes in land registration data resulted from the legal act.

PPAT is an integral part and directly connect to society especially related to its role in achieving national goals for society prosperity. In the society, PPAT must be able to be agent of change in implementing national values in creating security and peace in society and also urge society to put forward this nation's goals. Furthermore, national values will be relevant to be implemented in nation and state life.

In the opening ceremony on Monday (2/10) in Trigatra Building, Lemhannas RI, Governor of Lemhannas RI Lt. Gen. (ret) Agus Widjojo stated in his remark that this program is a strategic place to implement national values in creating peaceful and prosper society.

"The unity of land deed officials in Indonesia shows that national values has been a major influence for the growth of national consciousness. Land deed officials has important role in national development through banking system, financing institution, making deed of sale and mortgage deed. On the other hand, land deed officials also face several legal issues because land deed officials does not only directly connect to BPR but also connect Director General of Taxation, Local Government, Police, Prosecutors, Corruption Eradication Commission (KPK), Financial Transaction Report and Analysis Center (PPATK), Judges and other agencies," Agus Widjojo said.

Agus Widjojo said that it is a strategic program to implement national values in creating prosper society. As a nation with its unity in diversity, national values is an absolute prerequisite that must be maintained in order to strengthen the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia (NKRI).

According to Agus Widjojo, pluralism and diversity can be a positive force for this nation. On the other hand, it also contains conflict potentials which will potentially divide national unity. ●

Closing ceremony of PPRA LVI of Lemhannas RI

At the occasion, Acting Deputy of National-Level Leader Education Maj. Gen. Karsiyanto said that all 114 PPRA LVI passed from Lemhannas RI.

“You will be national leader candidates, you have to understand geopolitics and geostrategy in your own country.

Current phenomenon that should be taken seriously is society condition where intolerance increases, misuse of social media by spreading hoax, radicalism, terrorism, and intolerance. This condition can weaken national resilience,” Agus Widjojo said.

At the occasion, Agus Widjojo also gave several appreciations to the participants. The best academic predicate was given to Ruslaini, S.E., M.M., The best individual paper was given to Grand Commissioner of Police Drs. Surveillance Audit Meeting in Lemhannas RI started on Monday (2/10) was officially closed by Professional Expert for Domestic Politic Drs. Sukendra Martha, M.Sc, M.App.Sc. as a management representative in Nusantara II Room, Trigatra Building, 1st Floor, Lemhannas RI on Tuesday (3/10).

At the occasion, Sukendra said that this audit aimed to find if Lemhannas RI successful in maintaining ISO 9000 : 2015.

Satrio Budiawan as one of external auditors from British Standards institution said that this two-day audit did not show any non-conformity finding which makes Lemhannas RI deserve to maintain ISO 9000 : 2015 certificate.

On the other hand, three improvement opportunities in Lemhannas RI. The first improvement opportunity is the Quality Goal on the Deputy

Office of Strategic Studies.

The second improvement opportunity is an issue related to budget efficiency which affect the number of strategic studies themes planned.

The third improvement opportunity, Satrio continued, is the organizational quality goals which is not one of routine programs but a process unrelated to service such as to be a World Class Institution.

The closing of audit meeting was continued with further discussion and closed with luncheon. Deputy (policy) Singapore Ministry of Defence gives general lecture in Lemhannas RI

Agus Widjojo in his opening remarks said that Mr. Keith visits show a good relationship between Indonesia and Singapore in both education and bilateral.

Singapore, according to Agus Widjojo, is a good neighbor of Indonesia who has aspects of similarities in society, social and culture, and some issues related to security threats faced today. Deputy (policy) Singapore Ministry of Defence's visit is expected to provide insight into Indonesia-Singapore bilateral relations on defense aspect.

At the occasion, Mr. Keith said that Singapore MINDEF and Armed Forces (SAF) has a very important relations with Lemhannas RI. Since 2009, SAF started to send its High-Ranked Officers to Lemhannas RI to join Regular Education Program (PPRA) every year. The PPRA alumni from SAF reported that the materials delivered were really complete and beneficial for them.

Mr. Keith said his gratitude for the opportunity given to the education program participants from Singapore so they can learn about local, regional, and global development. Indonesia-Singapore

defence bilateral relations was strongly established which can be seen from flypast event on last September as a commemoration of 50th years diplomatic relations between both countries.

Mr. Keith also stated that based on the cooperation established between both countries in keeping regional's peace and security from threats, Singapore and Indonesia have to improve their cooperation effectiveness to face those new and non-conventional threats like terrorism.

It is expected that Indonesia and Singapore can work together to find an ASEAN-centric solution that will help ASEAN achieve its vision to become a dynamic and open region, "Mr. Keith said.

Personally, Mr. Keith feels very optimistic about Indonesia's future. Indonesia is rich with its natural resources, a strong economy, well-educated workers, and a well-developed democratic system. Over the past 20 years, Indonesia has been regarded as one of the best developed countries in Asia, and also known as "Asian miracle". Mr. Keith also hopes to deepen the special partnership between the two countries for the sake of future generations. ●

Commission I of House of Representatives approves Lemhannas RI's Annual Budget for 2018



Following up on the Hearing Meeting (RDP) result of Ministries and Institutions Work Plan and Budget (RKA-K/L) with Commission I of the House of Representatives (DPR RI) on Monday (4/9), further RKA-K/L RDP was held and attended by National Resilience Institute (Lemhannas), National Security Council (Wantannas) and the Indonesian Maritime Security Agency (Bakamla) on Monday (16/10) morning at Nusantara II Building, DPR RI complex. RDP led by Vice Chairman of Commission I of DPR RI Tubagus Hasanuddin, S.E., M.M. discussed the conclusion of Budget Ceiling results from the three institutions, which had previously been discussed with the DPR RI Budget Board.

Governor of Lemhannas RI Lt. Gen. (ret) Agus Widjojo presented the work plan of Lemhannas RI in the upcoming 2018, accompanied by Deputy Governor Air Marshal Bagus Puruhito, S.E., M.M. and Principal Secretary Commissioner General of Police Drs. Arif Wachyunadi. Based on the letter of the Minister of Finance Number: S-162 / MK.2 / 2017 dated October 10, 2017, the budget allocation for Lemhannas RI is set at Rp 277.7 Billion.

The budget will be allocated to Lemhannas RI's work program consisting of the National Resilience Development Program, Management Support Program and the Implementation of Other Technical Tasks Program, as well as the Program for Apparatus Supervision and Accountability.

Based on budget draft proposed by the Governor of Lemhannas RI, from the total budget allocation of Rp277.7 Billion, Rp99.7 Billion will be used for the National Resilience Development Program, divided into three deputy offices namely Deputy Office for National-Level Leader Education, Deputy Office for Strengthening of National Values, and Deputy Office for Strategic Studies includes the budget to support the National Resilience Measurement Laboratory (Labkurtannas).

At the end of the meeting, Hasanuddin said that the three institutions attended the meeting are able to put forward the principles of efficiency in using state budget, "Commission I of Parliament urged Lemhannas, Wantannas, and Bakamla to use their budget in 2018 based on the principles of efficiency, effectiveness, transparency, and accountability in managing state budget," Hasanuddin said. ●

PPSA XXI participants present SSDN reports in three provinces



After completing the Domestic Strategy Study (SSDN) from 9 to 12 October 2017, participants of PPSA (Short Education Program Batch XXI) on Tuesday (17/10) reported the results to Governor of Lemhannas RI in Pancasila Room, Trigatra Building, 3rd Floor Lemhannas RI. The SSDN is divided into three groups to visit three different provinces; Central Kalimantan Province, Central Java Province, and Maluku Province.

PPSA XXI receive a general lecture on state budget management from Head of BPK RI

The Supreme Audit Agency (BPK) Head Dr. Moermahadi Soerja Djanegara, M.Si. was giving a lecture to Short Educational Program Batch XXI (PPSA XXI) participants and Lemhannas RI personnel at Gadjah Mada Auditorium 3rd floor Pancagatra Building, Thursday (19/10). Moderated by Lemhannas RI Inspector Brig. Gen. Pol Immanuel Larosa, the lecture was expected to provide the participants an understanding on the state finances management and the role of BPK as said by Lemhannas RI Governor Lt. Gen. TNI (Ret) Agus Widjojo.

"The purpose of this event was, for us, to get enlightenment on how we manage the state financial well and accountable according to the prevailing regulation, and also to get more understanding of BPK mandates, tasks, and functions", Agus said.

"In accordance with the Law No.13/2003 on the State Finance and Law No.1/2004 on the State Treasury, state finances management must follow the terms (law) and produce effective output and outcome based on the goals that have been set. Therefore, the state finances management must be done orderly and accountably," Agus explained.

BPK's audit, Agus added, have an important role in achieving a clean and good governance. Lemhannas as non-ministerial government agency, every year receives state budget (APBN) to

conduct its mandate, task, and functions. Lemhannas RI bears responsibility to manage the budget accountably, thus the lecture from BPK head is very important and necessary.

In his lecture, Moermahadi Soerja introduced the organizational structure, task, and function of BPK. He said that BPK RI is a free and independent state agency with its authority to audit the state finances management of state agencies such as central government, regional government, ministerial, non-ministerial agency, Bank of Indonesia, state owned enterprises, region-owned enterprises, public service body, and other agencies who receive state budget. BPK have numerous internal auditors and also expert or external auditor who works under BPK's name to conduct those tasks.

Law No.15/2006 on the Supreme Audit Agency (BPK) article 11 stated that BPK can provides suggestions to the House of Representative (DPR), the Regional Representatives Council (DPD), the central government/regional government, ministerial, non-ministerial agency, Bank of Indonesia, state owned enterprises, region-owned enterprises, public service body, and other agencies who receive state budget if needed because of its work characteristic. BPK RI also has a role in the international level by auditing international agency such as International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA). ●

Participants of PPSA XXI held a seminar entitled “Implementation of Pancasila in Education System to Strengthen National Unity in Order to Increase National Resilience”, on Monday (24/10) at Gadjah Mada Auditorium, Pancagatra Building. 3rd Floor, Lemhannas RI. Aviani Malik as the moderator of seminar presenting Chairman of UKP-PIP Yudi Latif, M.A, Ph.D as keynote speaker, Dr. (HC) Ir. H. Salahudin Wahid, Prof. Dr. Azyumardi Azra, Commissioner General of Police (ret) Drs. Ito Sumardi Djunisanyoto, and Dr. J. Kristiadi as speakers in the panel discussion.

The Chairman of Seminar Prof. Dr. Ir. In his statement on the phenomena related to replacing Pancasila with other ideologies, Azyumardi Azra said that Pancasila is neutral. Because of its impartiality, Pancasila can accommodate religious diversity, so Pancasila rejuvenation is required. The seminar was then continued with an in-depth discussion on the implementation of Pancasila values in the education system. ●



Susi Pudjiastuti briefs her achievement in three years as Maritime Affairs and Fisheries Minister

The presence of Maritime Affairs and Fisheries Minister Susi Pudjiastuti in the PPSA XXI class at the Bhinneka Tunggal Ika Pancagatra Lemhannas RI, Wednesday (25/10), gave a different vibe. She briefed the PPSA XXI participants about the current development of maritime and fisheries in Indonesia, especially in the three years of her tenure as minister.

She claimed the changes occurred in the maritime and fisheries sector in Indonesia was very significant as on the fishing by foreign vessels. “These changes were almost like a revolution if we see it from the fishing condition in Indonesia. There were more than ten thousand foreign vessels, including that has been turned into Indonesian-flag vessel or still with their own flag, or vessel without flag from other states; they operated in the Indonesian territorial sea,” explained by Susi, who owns Susi Airlines.

As said by Susi, based on the National Committee of Fisheries Studies reports, the fish stock in Indonesia territory rise up from 6,5 million tons to 12,54 million tons. “If we calculate this incredible rising; 6 million tons times US\$1 dollar, we have US\$ 6 million. It means around Rp10.000 trillion,” she concluded.

The other good news is the fishermen’s purchasing power and the fisheries industry rate are also raising significantly. “We manage to raise the fishermen’s purchasing power from 104 to 110. The fisheries industry rate also rises from 103 to 120,” Susi said based on the data from the Central Statistics Agency (BPS) and Bank of

Indonesia (BI).

The other policy breakthrough that had caused controversy and rejection of fishermen community is Maritime Affairs and Fisheries Ministerial Regulation No. 56/2014 about the Moratorium of Fishing Licenses in the Indonesia Fishing Territorial Management which bans foreign fishing vessels and ex-foreign fishing vessels to operate and explore Indonesian sea.

Besides, Susi also imposed transshipment ban since 2014 by issuing Maritime Affairs and Fisheries Ministerial Regulation No. 57/2014 about transshipment. “The reason behind the ban because Indonesia is as a sovereign state and having ports, navy, marine police; transshipment in the middle of the ocean is not permitted. Meanwhile, transporting the fish catch is not part of the transshipment,” Susi explained. The purpose of this regulation is to control and to prevent the illegal fishing practices which is estimated to cost up to Rp30 trillion per year.

Susi Pudjiastuti did not deny that it is true there are many foreign vessels that catching fish illegally in Indonesian water (illegal fishing). She hopes that those vessels won’t come back to Indonesia. “It is true, there are huge numbers of giant vessels sails in our territory, and I don’t want them to come back again later because it makes our natural resources unrenewable,” Susi said. In this occasion, Susi who born in Pangandaran, expressed her wish to the PPSA XXI participant as the future national leaders to support her deeds in returning Indonesia to be a maritime axis of the world. ●
