



SCIENTIFIC ORATION OF GOVERNOR OF LEMHANNAS RI: YOUNG INTELLECTUALS AND THEIR ROLES IN THE PERSPECTIVE OF NATIONAL RESILIENCE

Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. The governor also said that, amid today’s global competition, qualified human resources is an absolute necessity that can not be ignored and must be realized by the nation’s components, especially by the educators who are committed to the advancement of the nation and state. This is due to the fact that the competitiveness of the Indonesian human resources is still at a lower level compared to other nations.

The Governor expected the followings from the graduates of the University of Azzahra: **First**, the quality of Azzahra University graduates, both for the graduate and postgraduate programs, to improve so that the graduates will be more recognized and used widely by the people in the development of the nation and state; **Second**, the graduates of the University of Azzahra, either for those who have or have not been employed, should be able to produce real work and give a positive contribution to the improved competitiveness of Indonesian human resources, so that the Indonesian people are able to demonstrate their existence in the era of global competition; **Third**, the graduates of the University Azzahra should be able to develop the mindset, attitude and behavior patterns that are consistent with the nation’s moral values in order to solve the nation’s problems and promote a sense of unity and national interests; **Fourth**, in the midst of the complexity of the nation’s problems, the graduates of the University of Azzahra can be absorbed and become pioneers in creating jobs which in turn will strengthen the national resilience of the nation.

COFFEE MORNING WITH GOVERNOR AND OFFICIALS OF ECHELON I, II, AND III OF LEMHANNAS RI

Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. attended a Coffee Morning event on April 21, 2011 at the Nusantara room of Lemhannas RI. It is a monthly routine activity. The event was attended by the Secretary of the Governing Board, First Secretary, Deputies, Heads of Bureaus, Expert Lecturers, Expert Analysts, and Expert Professionals as well as other structural officials. The coffee morning event was also attended by the Deputy for the Coding Analysis of the State Coding Institute Brigadier General Ruly Nursanto who gave a presentation on the “the Safeguarding of Information and Communication”. It was later continued by the Inspector of Lemhannas RI Brigadier General of Police Johnny Samosir who gave a presentation on “the State Official Wealth Report Form (LHKPN)”

In his presentation, the Deputy for the Coding Analysis of the State Coding Institute conveyed that Indonesia is now entering an era of information transparency. Legally, the public has a right to information transparency as contained in the Transparency of Public Information Law No. 14 of 2008. It was also conveyed that currently the war has shifted from conventional warfare to information warfare. The latter does not cause casualties but it can affect the military, political, social, cultural, and economic structure. Some of the threats to information can also threaten state security, such as logical, physical and administrative threats which can

also threaten confidential information related to the interests of the state. Therefore, a coding is needed for the information deemed confidential for the state, because all information technology can be intercepted and the coding is not intended to secure the interception, but to secure its contents.

The next presentation was delivered by the Inspector of Lemhannas RI Brigadier General of Police Johnny Samosir who explained about the LHKPN. In his presentation he explained about the obligation of every state official to report his/her wealth. In addition to that, he also conveyed some steps that have been made by the Inspectorate, including the follow-up to the letter from the vice chairman of the Corruption Eradication Commission

(KPK) No. B/3038/01-30/II/2010 dated 9 November 2010 concerning the National Conference on Combating Corruption in 2010. The Inspectorate has carried out a follow-up on the letter by making and circulating an inter-office memo regarding the LHKPN to officials of echelon I and II in Lemhannas RI. Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. welcomed the socialization conducted by the State Coding Institute regarding “the Safeguarding of Information and Communication” and supported the activities carried out by the Inspectorate in socializing the LHKPN to officials of echelon I and II in Lemhannas RI.

LEMHANNAS RI PRIMARY COOPERATIVE'S ANNUAL MEMBERS MEETING

The first Secretary of Lemhannas RI Drs. Chandra Manan Mangan, M.Sc. gave an opening remark in the 20th Annual Members Meeting of the Lemhannas RI's Primary Cooperative in the financial year of 2010 on April 26, 2011 in Dwi Warna Purwa Building of Lemhannas RI. The event was attended by structural officials and members of the primary cooperative of Lemhannas RI. It was also attended also by the Division Head of Cooperative SME of Central Jakarta Drs. Anton Lumbangaol.

The primary cooperative of Lemhannas RI is a jointly-owned business organization which plays a role in improving the welfare of its members. It has progressed significantly every year and has contributed positively to its members.

In his opening speech, the First Secretary conveyed that the primary cooperative of Lemhannas RI has so far established partnerships with other parties in order to seek mutually beneficial business relationship between Lemhannas RI and the partners. develop to become a strong medium business, and therefore increase the capital for the development of the cooperative. This will eventually lead to the improved welfare of its members. In order to have a strong cooperative in accordance with the cooperative identity, the participation of its members is required so that it can meet their growing needs. This will also affect the development of cooperative in increasing net income which is needed for the welfare of all members.

At the end of his speech, the First Secretary hoped that cooperative management can work better, accurately and in accordance with applicable regulations, and avoid mistakes in tax payments. As for the spending of the cooperative store, it is expected that the appropriate tax invoice form be used in accordance with taxation rules. It is also expected that the cooperative is developed seriously so that it can increase its productivity, competitiveness and independence, as well as to contribute in improving the welfare of all members.

GOVERNOR'S LECTURE IN SESKO TNI: "STRATEGIC LEADERSHIP"

Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji gave a lecture to the students of the regular course of TNI Staff and Command School (*Sesko TNI*) on May 3, 2011 at Sesko TNI in Bandung. The lecture delivered was themed "**Strategic Leadership**".

At the beginning of his lecture, Governor of Lemhannas RI delivered on the development of leadership paradigm. Leadership is a process of influence in order to determine the goals of the organization, motivate the behavior of the followers to achieve goals, improve the group and its culture. Leadership has a close connection with

motivation. It was also said that the success of a leader in moving the others to achieve determined goals relies heavily on his/her intelligence and charisma and how the leader create self-motivation in his/her subordinates, colleagues, or superiors.

Governor of Lemhannas RI also mentioned that the military leadership model can be classified into two types, namely senior-level leadership and junior-level leadership. Military leadership is essentially an elaboration and a simplification of the 11 Principles of TNI Leadership (*taqwa, ing ngarso sung tulada, ing madya mangun karsa, tut wuri handayani, waspada*

purba wisesa, ambeg parama arta, prasaja, satya, gemi nestiti, belaka, and legawa). The 11 principles of TNI leadership can be implemented in terms of the consolidation over the regeneration of TNI leaders, the total integration of the TNI and the people, TNI maturation, social communication, development of total defence system, and manifestation of soldiers professionalism. As for the process of regeneration in the military leadership, it is hoped that the future military leadership will have good characters, such as honest and brave (physically and morally), knowledgeable, assertive and thoughtful, loyal and trustworthy, fair and wise. They should also be a role model who is loyal, able to make decisions, and so forth.

Governor of Lemhannas RI also spoke about Indonesia's National Leadership Index (IKNI) which is a description of social trust benchmark regarding the capability and acceptability of a leader. The IKNI itself has 4 (four) categories: **first**, the index of morality and individual accountability; **second**, the index of morality and social accountability; **third**, the index of institutional morality and accountability; **fourth**, a global index of morality and accountability.

ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION: STRATEGIES TO DEVELOP RENEWABLE ENERGY IN THE FRAMEWORK OF ENERGY SECURITY IN ORDER TO SUPPORT NATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

S On Tuesday, May 3, 2011 on the 3rd Floor, West Wing of Astagatra Building, the Deputy for Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI organized a roundtable discussion on the “Strategy to Develop Renewable Energy in the Framework of Energy Security in Order to Support National Development”. The roundtable discussion was led by Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. and was attended by the Secretary of the Governing Board, the First Secretary, Expert Lecturers, Expert Analysts, Expert Professionals, speakers and panelists as well as Lemhannas officials and other invitees.

In the keynote speech of Governor of Lemhannas RI which was read by the First Secretary, it was conveyed that the geographical condition of Indonesia, with its spread-out energy resources, requires a strategic and sustainable planning and management. Therefore, the regional governments need to be involved so that they take responsibility for the availability of energy in their regions. Indonesia’s energy needs continue to increase significantly from year to year, while the current energy needs are mostly (95.21%) still dependent on fossil-based fuels (oil, natural gas and coal) and it is

predicted that they will be exhausted in about 11 years, assuming there will be no exploitation of new fields.

The current problems in the energy sector that need serious attention, among others, include the followings: **first**, more of Indonesia’s energy is exported than meets domestic demand; **second**, the low allocation of investment funds to increase energy reserves; **third**, suboptimal achievement of the target for energy mix program; fourth, high use of energy for consumptive activities instead of productive activities; **fifth**, energy prices have not been based on the fair economic value and it makes energy subsidies are not well targeted;

sixth, declining oil production levels; and seventh, protection/preservation of the environment has not been a priority.

At the end of his keynote speech, Governor of Lemhannas RI expected us all to be able to change the paradigm of energy resources as a capital for the development, increase proven reserves of fossil energy and reduce their share in national energy mix, increase the share of new renewable energy resources, improve program efficiency, conservation and diversification as well as the success in environmental conservation and other strategic steps in developing renewable energy.

and the Government of the Kingdom of the Netherlands by Head of Political Affairs of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Kingdom of the Netherlands Mr. Martin Boef in Nusantara Room I, Trigatra Building in Lemhannas RI.

This signing is a form of cooperation between Lemhannas RI and Government of the Kingdom of the Netherlands through its Foreign Ministry to strengthen the friendship and mutual understanding as well as closer cooperation and development,

and to recognize the importance of the principles of equality and mutual benefit between both parties. NICHE in Indonesia aims at strengthening the institutional capacity for higher education and training, while at the same time supporting the work programs for the ongoing bilateral cooperation between Indonesia and the Netherlands.

The Memorandum of Understanding is a follow-up and improvement of cooperation in the field of capacity development, including in curriculum development in international topics, and research development. It is expected that this cooperation will become one of the efforts to make Lemhannas RI a world-class institute.

ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION:

IMPLEMENTATION OF NATIONAL MANAGEMENT SYSTEM IN THE ERA OF REGIONAL AUTONOMY

The Deputy for Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI held a roundtable discussion in the field of politics on May 5, 2011 on the 3rd floor, West Wing of Astagatra Building of Lemhannas RI with the theme “Implementation of the National Management System in the Era of Regional Autonomy for Strengthening National and Local Relations in the Framework of National Development Acceleration”. The event was attended by the Secretary of Governing Board, the First Secretary, the Deputies, Expert Lecturers, Expert Analysts and Expert Professionals of Lemhannas RI. The Director General of Informatics Applications of the Ministry of Communications and Information Ashwin Sasongko and Director General of Regional Development of the Ministry of Home Affairs Dr. Drs. H. Syamsul Arief Rivai, M.S. were also present on the occasion.

In his keynote speech, Governor of Lemhannas RI conveyed that the national management system is the reference or guidelines for the state governance and national development management. This management system has yet to be supported by the national information system for the improvement in efficiency and effectiveness of public servants. Regional governments are parts of the national governing system within the framework of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia. Therefore, this system should be

implemented nationally within the framework of the strengthening of the relationship between central and regional governments, especially in the acceleration of national development. The purpose for the implementation of the national management system and national information system is to achieve harmony, balance and sustainability so that an integrated policy can be built using a participatory approach among the actors. This process depends on the capacity of leadership as a visionary statesman who demonstrates the ability to mobilize institutional capital through the development of creativity and innovation and improvement in productivity.

The regional autonomy and decentralization aim at sharing the

roles as well as responsibilities between the central and regional government institutions in developing regional potentials. Therefore, the vision and mission of government institutions must be in harmony despite of differences in the strategies and priorities in order to suit their respective regional potentials. There are various problems in the regional autonomy which are caused by, such as, weak national information system as the basis for the application of the national management system. Therefore, public competencies are required through formal education, enlightenment through mass media, and social contacts. Besides, an attention needs to be given to cost and risk aspects, such as data security, including the response from the people.

COFFEE MORNING: GOVERNOR OF LEMHANNAS RI MEETS THE PRESS

“Lemhannas RI is a non-ministerial government institution that has a fundamental duty to prepare cadres for national-level leadership, to carry out a strategic study on the nation’s problems and to preserve the national insight values in order to maintain national unity”. Such an emphasis started the press conference of Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. in front of some representatives of chief editors and a number of reporters who attended the coffee morning which was held so that the Governor of Lemhannas RI could meet people from print and electronic media recently.

The event, which was held on May 6, 2011 is one of the programs of the Public Relations Bureau of the Main Secretariat of Lemhannas RI. It was initiated in order to welcome the 46th anniversary of Lemhannas RI, as well as to socialize Lemhannas RI’s roles in response to controversial issues that arose in the society. The event was attended, among others, by the First Secretary, the Secretary of Governing Board, the Deputies, Expert Lecturers, Expert Analysts, Expert Professionals, Heads of Bureaus. Meanwhile, the mass media was represented by chief editors and reporters of print and electronic media in Jakarta. The coffee morning activity was started with a welcome address and an introduction to Lemhannas RI through a playback of a video profile of Lemhannas RI.

The coffee morning activity was closed with the delivery of a press release by Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. which contained the followings: **First**, Lemhannas RI is a non-ministerial government institution which has basic duties to prepare cadres for national leadership, to conduct a strategic study on the nation’s problems, to preserve the values of national insight in order to maintain national unity. **Second**, to celebrate the coming 46th anniversary on May 20, 2011 which coincides with the National Awakening Day, Lemhannas RI will hold a seminar themed “Optimizing the Management of National Economic Resources in Order to Improve the Self-Reliance and Competitiveness in the Framework of National Resilience” on May 11, 2011 “. **Third**, related to the current issues, such as: corruption, terrorism, horizontal conflicts, Ahmaddiyah, and the Indonesian Islamic State Movement (NII), Lemhannas RI, in line with the duties, functions, capacities and capabilities, will continue to carry out in-depth and comprehensive study in accordance with the four national consensus. **Fourth**, Lemhannas RI has made, and will continue to make tangible efforts by, for example, reviving its networks, such as through IKAL, higher education institutions, mass organizations, political organizations, and etc. **Fifth**, in order to support the process of deradicalization, Lemhannas RI is preparing short, medium and long-term studies in order to revitalize the values of national insight.

After the press conference, Governor of Lemhannas RI gave the reporters an opportunity for dialogue about the stance taken by Lemhannas RI related to controversial issues the nation was recently facing.

DISCUSSION: PRESERVING THE NATION'S CULTURAL VALUES OF THE COMMUNITIES IN THE BORDER AREAS



Governor of Lemhannas RI and Research Team from Lemhannas RI have a discussion with the elements of the Regional Executive Conference (MUSPIDA), Regional Work Units (SKPD), religious leaders, community leaders, indigenous community leaders of the West Kalimantan province.

In order to carry out the work program of the Deputy for Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI in 2011, a continuous strategic analysis program has been prepared with the topic “Preserving the Nation’s Cultural Values of the Communities in Border Areas to Enhance National Resilience in the Framework of the Integrity of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia.”

This year’s continuous strategic analysis activity was conducted in West Kalimantan with a series of comprehensive surveys, and was continued with a discussion on May 10, 2011 with Governor of Lemhannas RI. The event was expected to complete the results of the survey activity.

Present at the discussion were Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A., Acting Deputy for Strategic Studies Inspector General of Police Drs. Moch. Rashid Ridho, S.H., M.H. and the staff members from Lemhannas RI and the Governor of West Kalimantan, the Speaker of West Kalimantan Province’s Legislative Council, the elements of the Regional Executive Conference (MUSPIDA),

academicians and community leaders.

In his keynote speech, Governor of Lemhannas RI conveyed that the presence of the analyst team from Lemhannas RI in West Kalimantan Province is aimed at making a strategic analysis of the preservation of the nation’s cultural values of the communities in border areas in order to enhance the national resilience. It is done in the context of the integrity of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia. The analysis will be made by conducting research directly in the border areas so as to identify more deeply about how tough the conditions of socio-culture resilience, cultivation of integrative values and quality of regional government services to the communities in border areas that affect the national resilience and the integrity of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia.

Governor of Lemhannas RI also conveyed that to obtain a comprehensive result, the Research Team of Lemhannas RI will make a visit to several government agencies, academic institutions and various elements of society. The results of this study will later be reported to the President of the Republic of Indonesia as a recommendation to government policy-making in the efforts to preserve the nation’s cultural values, especially in the border areas.

The theme of the seminar was very relevant to the principle of economic self-reliance which is in line with the vision of Indonesia 2025, namely "the Self-Reliant, Advanced, Just and Prosperous Indonesia". The self-reliance is a means to reduce dependence on foreign countries, either in terms of product, production or financial factors, by better utilizing local potentials. Self-reliance is also closely associated with competitiveness. There are three indicators of competitiveness in the world that need to be taken into account, namely: human resource excellence and innovation, quality of infrastructure and facilities, and institutions that are responsive to the market mechanism.

At the end of his keynote speech, Governor of Lemhannas RI conveyed that in the era of regional autonomy there is an opportunity for the regions to manage national economic resources in an integrated way for the regional and national interests. Therefore, a harmony between vision and program of the development of all regional governments that is guided by achievement indicators are needed for the improvement of national competitiveness. The regional policies and strategies should be within the policy corridors, such as national development, which will largely be determined by the capacity and quality of apparatus, technology support and participation of stakeholders.
