Earlier at the event, the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. conveyed in his speech that Indonesian women will play a huge role in achieving national goals.

Minister of Women Empowerment and Child Protection explained in her presentation that the government has paid attention to gender mainstreaming issues by issuing several strategic policies, such as by requiring political parties to reach a 30% quota for women.

As quoted from Dr. Cipto Mangunkusumo in *Kartini, De Expres - 1912* that "Each page of Kartini's letters expressed her desire to see her people wake up! Rise! Wake and rise from the state of deep sleep that they have been in for hundreds of years", conveyed the Minister of Women Empowerment and Child Protection, explaining how Kartini did not only fight for the rights of women to equality, but also for the rights and dignity of Indonesian people who had endured colonization for hundreds of years.

While the Talkshow "Women and Leadership" discussing the Strategic Role of Women in Advancing Indonesia featured several speakers, namely the General Chairman of IWAPI Ir. Nita Yudi, Staff Expert to the Minister of Coordinating Minister for Political, Judicial and Security Affairs for Constitutional and Ideological Affairs and Honorary Chairman of the Board of Indonesian Journalists Association Tarman Azzam. A bazaar was also held during the event to showcase superior products made by Indonesian women.

Governing Board's Intellectual Exercise

One expert lecturer and two expert professionals of Lemhannas RI delivered presentations in an Intellectual Exercise organized by the Governing Board of Lemhannas RI on Tuesday, (23/4), on the 4th Floor of Asta Gatra Building of Lemhannas RI.

The Intellectual Exercise opened by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. aims at honing the knowledge and skills of the expert lecturers, expert analysts and expert professionals of Lemhannas RI by developing academic life and fine-tuning their capabilities. The Intellectual Exercise serves as some sort of monitoring and evaluation of the implementation of the general policy of the Lemhannas RI's Governing Board.

Expert Analyst in the Field of National Vigilance of Lemhannas RI Maj. Gen. Djumadi, who served as one of the speakers at the event, raised the topic "Optimization of the Horizontal Conflict Handling in Provinces in Order to Improve Security Stability in Strengthening National Resilience". He said that although the pluralism of the Indonesian society brings a positive influence, it can also pose a threat to the integrity of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia. The accumulated conflicts in the provinces will affect the stability of national resilience. Therefore, crisis centers need to be established from central level down to provincial level.

Two other speakers were Professional Expert in Domestic Government/National Management System of Lemhannas RI Dr. Kausar AS, M.Si. and Expert Professional in the Field of Defence of Lemhannas RI

Maj. Gen. (Ret.) I Gusti Putu S.AP Buana, M.Sc.

Dr. Kausar AS, M.Si., who raised the topic "Strengthening of the System and Management of the Implementation of the Roles, Functions and the Hierarchy in the Running of Provincial Government, described the seven basic elements of the local government, namely, government affairs, institutional affairs, personnel/staffing, provincial finance, representatives, public services and supervision. He said that the seven elements must be organized in order create a strong foundation for each province in the effort to implement regional autonomy in an efficient, effective, economical and accountable manner.

Improving the Guarding of the Outlying Islands in Order to Uphold National Sovereignty was the topic raised by Maj. Gen. (Ret.) I Gusti Putu Buana S.AP, M.Sc. He explained some efforts made by Indonesia in order to secure the outlying islands and make sure that they are not taken over by foreign countries, hence maintaining the Indonesia's integrity. He said that the central government, in synergy with local governments and the entire people, must take the necessary measures to strengthen effective occupation and exercise of sovereignty over the whole territory of the Republic of Indonesia, especially its outlying islands.

In addition to Expert Lecturers, Expert Analysts and Expert Professionals of Lemhannas RI, the event was also attended by the Vice Governor, Secretary of the Governing Board, Principal Secretary, as well as other invitees.

Women Have Equal Access and Opportunities to be Leaders

On Thursday (25/4), the governor of Lemhannas RI hosted a coffee morning event with the editors-in-chief and journalists from print and electronic media with the theme “the Participation of Women in National Leadership” at the Nusantara Room in Trigatra Building. The event featured the State Minister for Women Empowerment and Child Protection Linda Amalia Sari, S.I.P.

In her presentation, the minister explained that Indonesia, actually, has long become a pioneer of women’s leadership since the period of pre-colonial kingdoms. She said there were many exemplary women leaders at that time who were highly respected by their people, such as Queen Sinuhun in Palembang, Queen Dayang Lela in West Kalimantan, Queen Daeng Pasuli in South Sulawesi, Queen We Tanri Ole in Ternate, Sultanah Tajuk Alam Safiatuddin Syah in Aceh, Queen Tribuwana Tungga Dewi (Majapahit) and Admiral Keumalahayati (Aceh).

Based on the Constitution of the Republic of Indonesia, it is clear that every citizen is equal before the law and government, and must uphold the rule of law and support government in national development without exception. “Women actually have the same access and opportunities to become leaders in various fields of development”, she said.

However, she said there is still “glass ceiling” of

patrilineal culture that prevents women from organizing and expressing themselves as characterized by gender relations in the family, hence inhibiting women in their career in public office.

“The patriarchal mindset is not only happening in informal relationship but also in formal domain of power”, she said, adding that the mindset is reflected in the still gender-biased policies.

The government, through the ministry that she leads, has taken some affirmative actions, such as by making a joint agreement with other ministries/institutions and local governments relating to the development of women’s empowerment and child protection through gender mainstreaming strategy. Besides, a circular letter of four ministers (minister of finance, minister of home affairs, Minister for Development Planning (PPN) / National Development Planning Board (Bappenas) and the Minister of Women Empowerment and Child Protection on the National Strategy for the Acceleration of Gender Mainstreaming through Gender-Responsive Planning and Budgeting (PPRG) in various fields of development.

The coffee morning, which is regularly held once every two months, was attended by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A., and Lemhannas RI staff members, as well as the State Minister of Women’s Empowerment and Child Protection.

Population Development in the Perspective of National Resilience

Demography, or human population, is one of the three natural aspects which is seen as blessing and main modality of the national building that must be managed and utilized intelligently in order to improve the nation's competitiveness. The comparative advantages must be balanced with the competitive advantages that derive from quality human resources or population.

With that regard, a National Seminar and National Working Meeting of the Coalition for Population was held on Saturday, (27/4) at the Grand Clarion Hotel in Makassar, South Sulawesi. The event was opened by the Coordinating Minister for People's Welfare HR. Agung Laksono.

The Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A., who acted as a speaker at the event, conveyed that in the perspective of national resilience, demography is one of natural aspects which has contributed to, and played an important role, in the process of national development. According to him, the large number of population is the force that keeps the wheels of national development rolling.

With that perspective, the national development can be interpreted as a comprehensive human development of Indonesia, and the development of the entire

society. Therefore, as both subject and object of the development, human resources have a significant role and contribution in the establishment of a strong national resilience.

"Human resources are a central point of population; therefore, the development of population, whether directly or indirectly, plays a vital role in terms of the five dynamic aspects of social life", said the governor.

Further elaborating on the development of Indonesian population, he said that the aspect, whether as individuals, family members, community members or citizens, is closely related to the resilience of ideology/politics, economy, socio-culture, security and defence. In other words, the development of Indonesian population cannot be separated from national resilience, whether as a

concept or condition.

The population issue has long become an important issue in Indonesia following the increasing dynamic and complex population problem itself, such as rapid population growth, high rates of infant or maternal mortality, changes in age structure, population mobilization, and so on. The government and stakeholders need to give serious attention to the issue.

According to the governor of Lemhannas RI, given all the population issues as well as the demographic bonus that serve as a window of opportunity, the success of population development in the perspective of national resilience will involve a synergy between leadership and population that is based on moral strength, competency, behavior and national vision.

Roundtable Discussion: the Role of Indonesia in the ASEAN Community

On Tuesday (30/4), a roundtable discussion on the Improvement of Indonesian Role in ASEAN Framework of the Equitable Economic Development (EED) for National Resilience was held at the Nusantara I meeting room in Tri Gatra Building of Lemhannas RI.

The event opened by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. was attended by the Secretary of the Governing Board, Principal Secretary of Lemhannas RI, Expert Lecturers, Expert Analysts, and Expert Professionals of Lemhannas RI.

The speakers at the event were Special Presidential Staff for Economic Affairs Dr. Rizal E. Halim, Executive Director of ASEAN Foundation that is represented by Ambassador Eddi Haryadhi and Lecturer of the Faculty of Economics from the University of

Indonesia Dr. Telisa Felianty. While the panelists at the event were Deputy IV for International Economic Cooperation and Financing from the Coordinating Ministry of the Economic Affairs Rizal Affandi Lukman, Director General for ASEAN Cooperation from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs Iwan Suyudhi Amri, Professional Expert in the Field of International Strategy and Relations of Lemhannas RI Rear Admiral (Ret.) Robert Mangindaan and Director for International Affairs of Bank Indonesia Aida Budiman.

ASEAN Community itself was established with the purpose of further strengthening ASEAN integration in the face of international developments in the field of ideology, politics, economy, socio-culture, defense and security. When Indonesia chaired the ASEAN Summit in Bali in 2003, it sponsored

a balanced cooperation in ASEAN through the ASEAN Charter. The ASEAN Community with the motto of one vision, one identity and one community is intended to ensure the implementation of the pillars of political-security community, economic community, and socio-cultural community.

Indonesia, as an ASEAN member country which sponsored the ASEAN Charter, should be able to take advantage and become a player when the ASEAN community is implemented in 2015. To that end, the spirit of nationalism and patriotism of the community and the elites needs to be constantly consolidated in the face of the realization of the ASEAN Community, particularly the ASEAN economic community in 2015, in order to strengthen national resilience.

The governor hoped that the activity will generate thoughts and inputs for Lemhannas RI in formulating policy recommendation for president that will be used for policy making related to ASEAN equitable economic development. Such policies are expected to reduce the development gap and expedite the process of ASEAN integration in the future, hence strengthening the ASEAN equality.

The roundtable discussion was attended by Expert Lecturers, Expert Analysts and Expert Professionals of Lemhannas RI as well as other invitees.

Indonesia's National Airspace Traffic Needs to be Regulated

Indonesia, as one of the biggest archipelagic countries by area, has a vast airspace which can be used for civil and aviation and military interests. Therefore, Indonesia must have the capabilities to regulate its national airspace, which is not only for the sake of aviation safety and for upholding the national sovereignty, but also for ensuring its economic interest.

Based on that consideration, Lemhannas RI, on Wednesday (1/5), held a Roundtable Discussion on the Urgency to Regulate Indonesian Airspace Traffic in Order to Strengthen the Stability and Security of the National Airspace and Uphold the Sovereignty of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia at the Nusantara I Meeting Room, Trigatra Building, Lemhannas RI.

The Roundtable Discussion featured several speakers, namely Aviation Observer Chief Air Marshal (Ret.) Chappy Hakim, Airspace Law Experts Prof. Priyatna Abdurrasyid, S.H., M.H., and a representative of the Director of Air Navigation from the Directorate General of Air Transportation of the Ministry of Transportation Elvi Amir. Meanwhile, the panelists at the event were Chief of Staff Division of Military Area

Command Air Commander Bonar Hutagaol, Airspace Law Expert Prof. Dr. HK. Martono, S.H., LL.M and Expert Analyst in the Field of National Resilience of Lemhannas RI Maj. Gen. M. Nasir Majid and Director of Air Fast Indonesia Erlangga Suryadarma.

The event was also attended by the Deputy Governor, Secretary of the Governing Board, Principal Secretary, Deputies, Expert Lecturers, Expert Analysts and Expert Professionals as well as other invitees.

In his speech, the governor of Lemhannas RI said that, due to one thing and another, some of the Flight Information Region (FIR), up until now, are still governed by the laws of the neighboring countries. From

the economic aspect, such a situation is not profitable for Indonesia as the country will not get the "fee" charged for the Route Air Service. Besides, in terms of the aspect of state defense, the condition puts some limitations on the Indonesian military aviation, including the possible foreign airspace penetration.

The governor has high hopes that the roundtable discussion will generate strategic insights into the urgency of regulating Indonesian airspace traffic in order to strengthen national airspace stability and security in order to strengthen the sovereignty of the unitary state of the Republic of Indonesia.

Socialization of Civil Servants' Job Performance Assessment

An event to socialize the Government Regulation No. 46 of 2011 on the Policies of Civil Servants' Job Performance Assessment and the Regulation of the Head of National Personnel Board (BKN) Number 1 of 2013 on the Guidelines for the Implementation of Job Performance Assessment was held on Wednesday (1/5) at the Auditorium of Lemhannas RI.

The activities opened by the Principal Secretary of Lemhannas RI Drs. Chandra Manan Mangan, M.Sc. featured Assistant Deputy for the Development of Apparatus from the Ministry of the Empowerment of Human Resources and Bureaucratic Reform Dra. Nadimah, MBA. and Director for Employee Performance from BKN Drs. Purwanto, M.M as resource persons. The socialization event moderated by Air Vice Marshal Beng Tardjani was attended by echelon I, II, III and IV officials as well as the staff members of Lemhannas RI.

In her explanation, Dra. Nadimah, MBA explained that the performance assessment of the civil servants aims at ensuring the objectivity of civil servants' development that is carried out based on the job achievements and career system, with the emphasis being placed on the job achievement

system. According to her, based on the Government Regulation No. 46/2011, the assessment is based on objective, measurable, accountable, participatory and transparent principles. The assessment of the job performance includes the elements of employees' target works (SKP) and work behavior.

On the occasion, Drs. Purwanto, M.M. said that the Regulation of the Head of BKN No. 1 of 2013 is a follow-up on the implementation of the Government Regulation No. 46/2011, Articles 11, 14, and 18. The regulation of the Head of BKN will be effective from the date of its promulgation on January 1, 2014. The assessment of the civil servants' job performance aims at ensuring the objectivity of the civil servant development that is based on job performance and career system, with the emphasis being placed on job performance system.

The assessment of the civil servants' job performance is strategically directed as a control of the work productivity as required in order to achieve the work target, so that it will not be based on personal consideration. The evaluation must also be relevant to employees' own job duties and structural hierarchy.

Vice President: Quality Institutions Contribute to the Success of a Nation

In celebrating the 48th anniversary of Lemhannas RI and the 35th anniversary of IKAL, Lemhannas RI, together with IKAL, held a national seminar on the “New Paradigm of National Development: Building Indonesia’s Future Based on Science and Technology” on Wednesday (8/5) at the Auditorium of Lemhannas RI in Jakarta.

The seminar was opened by the Indonesian Vice President Prof. Dr. Boediono and was attended by the Minister of Research and Technology Gusti Muhammad Hatta, Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A., General Chairman of IKAL Agum Gumelar, Structural Officials of Lemhannas RI, Expert Lecturers, Expert Analysts, Expert Professionals of Lemhannas RI and participants from the PPRA 49 and PPRA 50 of Lemhannas RI as well as other invitees.

The seminar, which was also attended by experts in the field of politics, economy, socio-culture, security and defense, aimed to generate smart concepts and ideas to build a better, more prosperous, dignified and equitable Indonesia in the future.

In his speech, the governor of Lemhannas RI conveyed that in the recent years Indonesia has experienced a demographic bonus that will reach its peak in the 2020 – 2030 period. “This condition should, of course, be prepared and utilized as early as possible so that it will benefit the

economic development and improve the welfare of the community in the future”, he said.

He said that proper, consistent and sustainable education on science and technology is a strategic step that is needed by Indonesia. It should be the first choice in improving the competitiveness of Indonesian human resources.

Later at the event, the vice president stated that Indonesia needs to seek ideal and appropriate economic system taking into account all the typical characteristics of Indonesia. “The techno-economic system must be integrated with the social and political aspects of the country”, he said.

According to him, the role of quality institutions is very critical in the success of a nation through the building, managing and improving of political, economic and socio-cultural institutions. He also asserted that the most fundamental thing lies in the political institution, because rules are derived therefrom, and will spread to other fundamental areas, either economy, or socio-culture.

In closing his speech, the vice president has called attention to the Indonesian independence struggle, which was a political struggle by the nation’s best men and women. Based on that consideration, we must not let our nation’s best people to slip away from politics.
