Lemhannas RI again organized the Strengthening of Nationalistic Program for Youth on Monday (24/11) at the Auditorium of Gajah Mada, Panca Gatra Building of Lemhannas RI. The program, which was opened by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, DEA, lasted for seven days at Lemhannas RI and was closed in Sukabumi.

On the opportunity, Budi Susilo Soepandji conveyed that the nationalistic values had to be continuously maintained for the integrity of the Republic of Indonesia. The Indonesian diversity in ethnicity, language, and culture can be a positive potential, but at the same time it also had a potential conflict if not managed properly. "The youth play an active role as an agent of change in creating a just and prosperous society," he explained.

The important role played by the youth, through the Youth Pledge event on October 28, had been recorded in the long history of the nation's struggle for independence. It was an important momentum seized by the youth in order to maintain the unitary state of Indonesia.

Since the youth is the vanguard of national goals, their existence becomes deciding factors in the modern era of Indonesia. They are expected to be a facilitator to instill nationalistic values in the society so that an independent, united, and sovereign nation of Indonesia can be realized.

The coaching, which employed lectures, question and answer sessions, discussion about character development, was followed by 100 participants, consisting of 73 men and 27 women from various youth organizations and universities, such as the Aceh Youth Student Committee, Malaysia-branch National Committee of Indonesian Youth (KNPI), Maluku-branch KNPI, Southeast Sulawesi-branch KNPI, North Kalimantan-Branch KNPI and Student Executive Boards from the 17 August University.

Anti-Corruption Lecture for Provincial Parliaments' Members

On Friday (21/11), members of the Provincial Parliaments received a lecture from two state institutions officials, which were from the Corruption Eradication Commission (KPK) and the Supreme Audit Agency (BPK) at Bhinneka Tunggal Ika room, Panca Gatra Building, Lemhannas RI. After delivering their presentations, the resource persons were engaged in a discussion and question and answer session with the audience.

At the event, the Chairman of BPK RI Dr. H. Harry Azhar Aziz M.A. conveyed that BPK had carried out its duties in conducting audits throughout Indonesia. He also revealed the complaints that he received from some institutions because of the differences between the outcome of the audit carried out by BPK and that carried out by concerned institutions.

It is also said that the legal system and legislation still need to be developed in order to avoid any problems or disputes among agencies, for example, the issue of state-owned enterprises or region-owned enterprises' accounts receivable still using the law on limited liability companies. Therefore, Harry put forth the need for a more holistic auditing in the future. He then promised to improve the internal system of the BPK so that the institution could play its role more optimally when dealing with external parties.

Meanwhile, the Director of Gratification from KPK Giri Suprapdiono elaborated on one reality in Indonesia where, unknowingly, Indonesia had been 'invaded' by foreign nations through

modern imperialism, colonialism, and globalization. This can be seen in the strong preference of the Indonesian people for foreign products over locally-manufactured products.

Giri was concerned to see that the advantages that should have been gained by Indonesia ended up going to neighboring countries. Moreover, he also reminded the parliament members that they, as government officials, had to avoid any forms of corruption such as bribery, gratifications as well as conflicts of interest. All those things would not just harm the state, but also themselves.

At the end of the question and answer session, Giri invited all the participants in the room to stand up and sing a patriotic song Indonesia Pusaka (Indonesia, the Heritage) in order to foster the spirit of nationalism.



Commitment of Provincial Parliament Members Batch I

Coaching and Strengthening Program of Nationalistic Insight for Provincial Parliament Members was officially closed by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, DEA at the Dwi Warna Lemhannas RI on Monday (24/11). The closing ceremony was attended by Deputy Governor, Deputy for Education of National-level Leaders, and faculty members of RI.

Given the increasingly complex tasks and responsibilities as legislators in the era of democracy, the governor of Lemhannas RI warned them of the possibility of conflicts of interest. "Such possibilities should be addressed wisely so as not to cause any negative impacts on national unity", he said.

After the program was completed, the participants were expected to spread the knowledge that they had gained and resumed their duties by fostering unity and synergy among fellow parliament members and other stakeholders.

During the closing ceremony, some representatives of the participants gave their testimony of the program. According to them,

the activity was very useful to strengthen and maintain the ties that had been established as well as to build a synergy among them in carrying out their duties. On the occasion, the participants also read their commitment aloud asserting that they would apply the knowledge and insight that they had gained in the community.



The Importance of Political Party Education in Lemhannas RI

On Monday (24/11), Lemhannas RI, in cooperation with Radio Republik Indonesia (RRI) held a dialogue on nationalistic insight themed "The Importance of Political Party Education in Lemhannas RI" in "Indonesia Pagi" program which was broadcast live by RRI.

The dialogue involving participants of the coaching and strengthening program of nationalistic values from the provinces of DKI Jakarta, Lampung and East Java took place at the Syailendra room, Mini Auditorium, 3rd Floor, West Wing of Astagatra Building, Lemhannas RI. It was moderated by Maulana Isnarto.

Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, DEA said that the members of the provincial parliaments actually already had a nationalistic insight, however further improvement was needed so that they could have a more comprehensive understanding of the concept. He also added that Lemhannas RI might organize educational course programs beyond the concept of nationalistic insight, such as education about political parties.

According to Murdadi from Lampung Parliament, Lemhannas RI, as one of the most trusted training institutions for political parties, was also expected to organize a Training of Trainers (ToT) for political parties, community leaders, students, and wider community.

Sharing Murdadi's views, Syarifudin from DKI Jakarta parliament also expressed that the strengthening program ought to start from cadres, as future leaders would emerge from cadre structures. The participants hoped that Lemhannas RI would be able to work together with political parties as well as ministries in order to provide trainings for wider segments of society.

Meanwhile, Murdadi from Lampung Parliament put forth the issues of conflict of interests between political parties and the public and how this kind of problem could be solved if we realized the functions of the parliament in terms of legislation, interpellation and budgeting. Furthermore, in order to do that, Yuzrizal from Lampung

Parliament said that an active role of the people was quite needed in order to observe and supervise the members of the political parties.

Mirzali from Lampung Parliament highlighted that over time there was a shift in nationalistic values among the political parties. He also added that the internal system of the political parties needed to be improved, such as the recruitment process, cadre regeneration and so on. Such improvement needed to be made urgently given the fact that one of the regional parliament's duties was to prepare regional regulations. Hence, there was a need for personnel with specific competencies. It was agreed by Eva Dwiana of Lampung Parliament that ethics education was needed by members of political parties so that they could develop pro-people policies and regulations.

On the occasion, Deputy for the Strengthening of Nationalistic Values Maj. Gen. Nasir Majid conveyed that there had been growing awareness of the importance of the strengthening of nationalistic insight which had been a moral responsibility of Lemhannas RI. Therefore, since 2013, Lemhannas RI has carried out strengthening programs of nationalistic insight for 14 provinces in Indonesia in cooperation with National Unity, Politics, and Public Protection Agency and ToT for bureaucrats, academics, youth, and religious leaders.

In response to the requests from the people's representatives for more extensive coaching and strengthening program in the regions, Deputy for Education of National-level Leaders Rear Admiral Leonardi highlighted some constraints being faced by Lemhannas RI, such as limited human resources, budget constraints and so on. However, he added that Lemhannas RI had already made a plan to extend the outreach of the program down to regency level.

The dialogue also involved people's participation through telephone, with audience calling from Solo, Yogyakarta, West Sumatra and Gorontalo. Other than expressing their opinions on the parliament's performance, they also stressed the importance of the role played by Lemhannas RI in enhancing one's nationalism.

On Tuesday (25/11), Lemhannas RI held an opening ceremony for the Strengthening Program of the Nationalistic Insight for Provincial Parliament Members in Dwi Warna Building, Lemhannas RI.

The opening ceremony led by the Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Air Marshal Dede Rusamsi, SE, MM. was also attended by Prime Secretary, Deputy for Education of National-level Leaders, and faculty members of Lemhannas RI.

In his speech, Dede Rusamsi, SE, MM, conveyed that Indonesia was a country created out of common consensus from the people with various ethnic, religious, racial, and cultural backgrounds. "Diversity must be managed by national leaders as a potential in an effort to maintain the unity of the nation. This attitude must also be possessed by leaders who represent the people in their respective regions," he explained.

Four basic national consensuses, namely Pancasila, the 1945 Constitution, the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia, and the Unity in Diversity principle, are Indonesian people's common agreement in managing the country's diversity while upholding the values of unity and integrity.

Such values, which were also ingrained in nationalistic insight, must also be safeguarded and maintained by leaders at any levels. Being provincial parliaments' members who assume the mandate

of the people, the participants need to strengthen their nationalistic insight so that they will not get caught up in political interests of certain groups.

The importance of nationalistic insight was also addressed in the official state speech of President Joko Widodo, stating that Indonesia should thrive in maritime sector. This is based on the understanding of the Indonesian geography as the largest archipelagic country in the world. Such geographical conditions gave birth to the conception that the sea does not separate but connect islands.

Only with strengthened nationalistic insight among our national leaders and their willingness to align themselves with the national vision, which is to establish a maritime state of Indonesia, will our country be able to thrive in the maritime sector.

In order to realize such a vision, all the national components, especially executive, legislative, and judicial branches, need to work together in a synergy. In addition to maritime sector, agriculture and aerospace sector also need to be developed.

The opening ceremony was attended by 76 participants from three provincial parliaments in Indonesia, namely Jakarta, West Java and East Kalimantan parliaments. All the participants were expected to fully understand and implement the nationalistic insight in all aspects of national life when carrying out their duties in provincial legislative councils.

Lemhannas RI's Coffee Morning with Journalists

On Friday (28/11), Lemhannas RI held a Coffee Morning with journalists at Gatot Kaca Room, Astagatra Building, Lemhannas RI. The event was opened by Head of Public Relations Division Ir. Yusita Pusparini, M.Sc. who represented the Chief of Public Relations Bureau of Lemhannas RI.

A total of 34 journalists from print media, online media, radio, and television attended the event which featured RRI broadcaster Maulana Isnarto as a resource person.

Yusita Pusparini, in her speech, said that the event was aimed to obtain inputs from media people about the plan to establish a media community (journalists' forum) in Lemhannas RI.

Furthermore, she also expressed her hope for active participation from the participants, in terms of idea contribution, regarding the ways to improve the effectiveness of the role of the media community in disseminating information on important activities of Lemhannas RI.

During the discussion, Irfan from hariannasional.com requested that the media be given the freedom to publish news about Lemhannas RI. Meanwhile, Yudi from Jurnal Jakarta said that the forum should have a clear organizational structure with a certain authority.

In addition to the organizational structure, Arini from beritabuana.com also suggested that a mailing list be created in order to allow easier delivery of information regarding Lemhannas RI's activities. While Merry from silangmonas.com also expressed the need for Lemhannas RI to provide a room specially designated for the press that was equipped with journalistic facilities and infrastructure.

In response to all of the inputs, Maulana conveyed that the significant issue being faced by all ministries and agencies was the constrained budget to facilitate such media community. However, Yusita did not dismiss the possibility to build a press room for Lemhannas RI.

Indonesia's Scenario toward 2045



On Thursday (4/12), the Deputy for Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI held a roundtable discussion themed "Indonesia's Scenario toward 2045" in Krishna Room, Trigatra Building of Lemhannas RI. The event was led by Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, DEA.

The discussion moderated by the 52nd PPRA alumnus of Lemhannas RI Dr. Yosefina Rasyanti Munthe, MA. Psi, featured keynote speakers Prof. Azyumardi Azra, Prof. Dr. Paulus Wirutomo, M.Sc., Dr. J. Kristiadi, Daud Dharsana, La Ode Ida, Prof. Dr. La Ode Masihu Kamaluddin, Prof. Mubariq Ahmad, Prof. Dr. Ir. Dwi Andreas Santosa, M.S., Prof. Dr. Rizaldi Boer, Prof. Darmin Nasution, S.E., Ph.D., Chief Air Marshal (Ret) Chappy Hakim, Dr. Arif Budimanta and Dr. Makarim Wibisono.

In his speech, the Governor of Lemhannas RI said that the scenario would help the institution to identify various events that might occur in the future while producing relevant policies and strategies.

In relation to Indonesia's scenario toward 2045, Lemhannas RI has an interest and moral responsibility with respect to Indonesia's condition in the year 2045 since the existence and integrity of the country are its main focus of concern.

Indonesia's Scenario toward 2045 is a forecast of the country's state in 2045. The aspects being studied included economic, social, political, and cultural aspects. In their presentation, the scenario drafting team conveyed their tentative conclusions stating that,

among others, the new Indonesian generation in the year 2045 would have a different perspective from the previous generation and that they would occupy political and business circles. Furthermore, it was stated that the world's economic center of gravity would shift from Europe to Asia-Pacific region, and there would be deteriorated sociological and cultural condition and diminished nationalism that lead to national disintegration.

One of the speakers who gave their input to improve the scenario included was an academic from the University of Indonesia Prof. Mubariq Ahmad. He elaborated on the methodology used in determining the focal concern and the focus of scenarios.

In addition, the Director of Post-Graduate Study Program of UIN Syarif Hidayatullah Jakarta Prof. Azyumardi Azra argued that the scenario was not a story, but rather possible future occurrence. Therefore, the research team had to determine the vocal concern by elaborating on the things that needed to be anticipated so that the research could be more focused.

Sharing the views of Dr. Mubariq Ahmad and Prof. Azyumardi Azra, a political observer from CSIS J. Kristiadi also deemed it important to determine the vocal concern of the scenario and that the scenarios should be guided by the nation's ideals. Meanwhile, Dr. Makarim Wibisono from the Indonesian Council of World Affairs (ICWA) revealed that the scenario ought to be made based on the dreams of the nation's founders and it had to be sustainable from one generation to the next in order to realize the same ideals.

On Monday (1/12), Lemhannas RI held a thanksgiving event to commemorate the anniversary of the Indonesian Civil Servants Corps (Korpri) at the Gajah Mada auditorium of Lemhannas RI. The event was attended by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, DEA, Secretary of the Governing Board, Principal Secretary, Deputies, Faculty Members, Structural Officials, and all members of Lemhannas RI.

The thanksgiving event was held immediately after the Governor of Lemhannas RI and several structural and functional officials of Lemhannas RI attended the 43rd Korpri anniversary ceremony held at Monas. The theme of this year's commemoration was "Through the Commemoration of the 43rd Anniversary of Korpri 2014, Let's Make Mental Revolution Movement of State Apparatus a Success". President Joko Widodo who acted as the inspector of the ceremony called on the Korpri members to continue to consolidate and work together in synergy and put aside their sectoral egos; and jointly continuing the national development by providing their better services.

Meanwhile, the thanksgiving event at Lemhannas RI raised the theme "Strengthening Esprit de Corps of the State Apparatus in Order to Support National Leadership for an Advanced, Prosperous, and Dignified Nation". At the thanksgiving event, Chairman of the

Management Board of Korpri drg. Sri Wahyuni Pujiastuti, M.M. reported the performance of the Korpri Management Board for the 2012-2014 period.

According to Sri Wahyuni, during her 3-year period of leadership, the Korpri management board had carried out various activities, such as Korpri consultation meetings, installing of Korpri management board members, provision of scholarships, motivational activities, national seminars, joy sailing of KRI 592 Banjarmasin, blood donations, visits to Tangerang women's penitentiary, and a pilgrimage to Kalibata Heroes Cemetery.

Budi Susilo Soepandji, in his speech, hoped that, Korpri, as civil servants' umbrella organization, should further improve its performance and efforts in bureaucratic restructuring, either in the aspects of institution, personnel, and budget by adhering to the law on state civil apparatus (ASN).

In the near future, Korpri will be transformed into ASN Corps, which could be seen as both opportunities and challenges for individual apparatus to compete according to their competence by taking into account the five important things: (1) enhancing insight through the utilization of libraries and Internet (2) implementing planned programs (3) synchronizing and coordinating, (4) creating a conducive working environment, and (5) providing the best possible service.

Workshop on the Quality Improvement of Educational Course Program

On Tuesday (9/12), Lemhannas RI held a Workshop on the Quality Improvement of Educational Course Program in Syailendra Room, Astagatra Building, Lemhannas RI. The event was opened by Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, DEA, and was attended by the Deputy Governor, Deputies, Faculty Members and structural officials of Lemhannas RI.

The workshop attended by the faculty members and structural officials of Lemhannas RI was basically a year-end routine evaluation activity. It was one of Lemhannas RI's important activities in an effort to improve the quality of its institutional performance through educational course programs, strategic studies and strengthening program of nationalistic values.

There are three main targets to be achieved through the convening of this workshop, namely: to improve the quality of educational courses, especially the learning process; to

produce the best learning method based on participants' needs and to improve the quality of faculty members and tutors of Lemhannas RI.

In his speech, Budi Susilo Soepandji said that the workshop was aimed at minimizing the problems in running the educational courses for national-level leaders. Meanwhile, Deputy for the Education of National-level Leader Rear Admiral Ir. Leonardi, M.Sc. explained that the workshop, which was held for 3 consecutive days from 9 to 11 December 2014, was expected to serve as a forum to exchange views and to review educational course materials in order to generate a better education quality.

He also hoped that the final outcome formulated in the workshop could be earnestly implemented so that any problems that might arise in the organizing of the courses could be prevented.

Discussion between Lemhannas RI – Malaysia's National Civics Bureau

On Monday (8/12), Governor of Lemhannas RI, who was accompanied by four structural officials of Lemhannas RI, received a courtesy call of six officials of Malaysia's National Civics Bureau or Biro Tata Negara (BTN). After the courtesy call, the event was continued with a discussion that took place in Nusantara II room, Trigatra Building, Lemhannas RI.

The discussion led by Deputy for the Education of National-level Leaders Rear Admiral Ir. Leonardi, M.Sc. was attended, among others, by Professional Expert in Geostrategy and Geopolitics Maj. Gen. (Ret) Endang Haerudin, S.T.,M.M.; Chief of Public Relations Bureau Commodore E. Estu Prabowo, M.Sc.; Chief of Cooperation Bureau Brigadier General Sudibyso, S.E.; and Head of International Study Subdirector Colonel Sus Dr. Ir. Rudy Gultom, M.Sc. Meanwhile, the BTN delegation consisted of H. Zainal Abidin bin Abu Hasan, Mohd Noor Rashid, Mohd Khailani bin Ismail, Hamizi Yakub, Muhammad Syafarin bin Shaari, and Ahmad Nabi.

Malaysia's BTN is an agency of the Malaysian government in the Prime Minister's Department which was established in 1974, focusing on national development to foster the values of nationalism. The BTN visit was expected to strengthen the cooperation between the two parties.

During the discussion themed "Increasing Knowledge and

Understanding of Patriotism", Professional Expert in Geostrategy and Geopolitics of Lemhannas RI Maj. Gen. (Ret) Endang Haerudin, S.T.,M.M. asked a few questions regarding the types of materials provided by BTN for training participants and the link between the materials provided by BTN and school/university curriculum.

In response to the questions, Director of Constitutional Affairs of Pahang State Hamizi Yakub explained that the materials to be given actually depends on the participants themselves, so they might be related to pure moral values of the nation, the Five Pillars of Malaysia, politics, and economy. However, unlike Indonesia, the training materials from BTN and the values of the Five Pillars of Malaysia had not been integrated yet into school curriculum. Therefore, BTN sought to learn more about the instilling of nationalistic values in Lemhannas RI.

On the occasion, the Chief of Public Relations Bureau of Lemhannas RI Commodore E. Estu Prabowo, M.Sc. conveyed the planned visit of the Lemhannas RI's roadshow team to Malaysia on 18 to 20 December 2014, which was intended to explore cooperation in the field of education and strategic studies. H. Zainal Abidin bin Abu Hasan welcomed the plan and hoped that the cooperation between the two institutions could be further strengthened through the reciprocal visit.

IKAL-BKKN National Seminar



Alumni Association of Lemhannas RI (IKAL), in cooperation with the National Population and Family Planning Agency (BKKBN) held a national seminar with the theme “Momentum of Demographic Bonus to Prepare Indonesia toward World’s Maritime Axis” on Thursday (11/12), at Dwiwarna Building of Lemhannas RI.

The seminar moderated by Dr. Rosita S. Noer, M.A., featured several resource persons, namely the Head of BKKBN Prof. dr. Fasli Jalal, Ph.D., Sp.GK, Head of the Institute of Demography from the University of Indonesia Dr. Sonny Harry Budiutomo Harmadi, Head of Criminal Investigation Agency of the Police Headquarters Commissioner General of Police Drs. Suhardi Alius, M.H., Acting Deputy for Coordination of Human Resources from the Coordinating Ministry for Maritime Affairs Dr. Safri Burhanuddin, Assistant of Chief of the Indonesian Navy for Planning and Budgeting Rear Admiral Agung Pramono, S.H., M. Hum.

Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, DEA, who served as a keynote speaker, said that in order to turn Indonesia into a global maritime axis, there were three aspects that need to be paid attention to, namely, demography, economy, and socio-culture. The three aspects were closely linked to education, welfare, and infrastructure.

In this seminar, the resource persons expressed their views on the relationship between demographic bonus and global maritime axis. For example, Fasli Jalal who conveyed that the demographic bonus could be realized with the support of education sector, skills,

work ethic and entrepreneurial spirit, which in turn will help make Indonesia the world’s maritime axis.

Meanwhile Suhardi Alius put forth that the demographic dividends could bring both benefits and challenges, depending on how they were managed. This statement was further reinforced by Sonny Harry Budiutomo who expressed that the demographic bonus had to be managed properly so that it could support the maritime sector.

Moreover, Agung Pramono asserted that the elements of maritime power associated with the demography, which were the number of population and national characters, had to be constantly monitored. However, he reminded that in order to turn Indonesia into a global maritime axis, it was imperative for Indonesia to develop its human resources which were currently dominated by primary school graduates.

Developing Indonesian people with a nationalistic insight is not just the duty and responsibility of the central government, but also the regional governments as set forth in Article 25 of Law No. 23 of 2014 on Regional Government.

Therefore, a synergy between central and local governments is needed in order to organize educational courses that are based on nationalistic insight, spirit of togetherness and mutual cooperation. If this can be done simultaneously and consistently, the demographic bonus can open a window of opportunity that helps to make Indonesia the world’s maritime axis.

Lemhannas Paves the Way for the Establishment of Leadership Laboratory
