The PPRA 59 participants conduct SSDN to four provinces

The Participants of Regular Education Program Batch (PPRA) 59 conducted Domestic Strategic Studies (SSDN) simultaneously, since Monday (1/7) to Friday (5/7). During the SSDN, the PPRA 59 Participants were divided into four groups which visited four different provinces namely Central Java, Special region of Yogyakarta, East Java, and West Java.

In their visit to Central Java, the Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Air Marshal Wiekto Syofyan accompanied the PPRA 59 Participants visited the Central Java Governor's Office to receive a brief lecture regarding the Mid-Term Regional Development Plan (RPJMD), Lawang Sewu, Sam Poo Kong Temple, Central Java Regional Police Headquarter (Mapolda), Military District Commands (Makodam) IV/ Diponegoro, CV Laksana, Old City, and Blenduk Church.

Lemhannas RI holds a Dialogue on National Insight

Lemhannas RI held a Dialogue on National Insight with youth leaders, community leaders, and social organizations of DKI Jakarta Province, on Tuesday (9/7) to Thursday (11/7) in the Constitution Room, Trigatra Building, 3rd Floor, Lemhannas RI.

“This dialogue aims to strengthen nationalism and enlighten national values which are sourced from the Four National Basic Consensus, namely Pancasila, the 1945 Constitution of the Republic of Indonesia, Unity in Diversity and The Unitary State of The Republic of Indonesia (NKRI),” the Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo said in his speech.

The participants attended the dialogue are expected to strengthen their sense of nationalism and their spirit of nationalism in facing various challenges and threats of the globalization era that are contrary to national values and encourage the spirit to uphold the dignity of the nation, defend national interests above personal and group interests, are willing to sacrifice for the sake of nation and state



and have an awareness of all the rules in national and state life.

Agus then explained that Lemhannas RI is an educational institution that has the authority to disseminate values. It is hoped that the material discussed during the dialogue can be implemented by the participants in daily life. “We cannot just be echoing the ideology of Pancasila. How about the implementation? The real challenge is how to implement Pancasila values in our life,” Agus concluded.

Lemhannas RI FGD: Strengthening Regional Autonomy to Support National Defense

The Directorate of Defense, Security and Geography Assessment of the Deputy Office of Strategic Studies of Lemhannas RI held a Short-Term Focus Group Discussion (FGD) on the topic “Strengthening Regional Autonomy in Supporting National Defense to Maintain the Integrity of the Republic of Indonesia” on Monday (15/7), in the Gatot Kaca Room, Astagatra Building, Lemhannas RI.

The speakers who attended the discussion were the Director General of Defense Potential of the Ministry of Defense Prof. Dr. Ir. Bondan Tiara Sofyan, M.Sc., Director of the Regional Legal Products of Directorate General of Regional Autonomy of the Ministry of Home Affairs Sukoyo, SH, M.Sc., and Professor of the Department of Administrative Science and Researcher of the Center for Regional and City Administrative Development Studies (PKPADK) of Indonesia University Prof. Dr. Irfan Ridwan Maksum, M.Sc.

Prof. Dr. Ir. Bondan Tiara Sofyan, M.Sc. from the Ministry of Defense explained that regional autonomy refers to give more proportional authority to regional governments, meanwhile the meaning of the concept of defense itself is cross-regional space which cannot be divided based on regional administrative regions. In the context of the defense territory, such as maintaining the sovereignty of the country and the integrity of the Unitary Republic of Indonesia,

each region must be willing to be integrated in Indonesia’s defense territory.

Meanwhile, a guest speaker from the Ministry of Home Affairs Sukoyo, S.H., M.Sc. linked regional autonomy with the dynamics of the strategic environment. “Regional autonomy cannot be separated from the dynamics of the strategic environment,” Sukoyo said. According to him, the dynamics of the strategic environment are related to five developing issues such as proxy war by using third parties, communal conflict signed by the values and norms shifting that generate disharmony, foreign infiltration shown by the arrival of illegal immigrants and foreign workers, the potential for natural disasters, and cyber war.

The last speaker Prof. Dr. Irfan Ridwan Maksum, M.Sc. recommended a number of things to make regional autonomy run effectively. First is to consider past experience with clear indicators of change, then compare our positions with various countries that are relevant to our experience as a state, make changes in accordance with the ideals of Indonesia’s vision of regional autonomy and the last is to maintain consistency in the application of the governance principles that has been established.





The Participants of Diklat PIM of Ministry of Religious Affair visit Lemhannas RI

Thirty Echelon III Officials of Ministry of Religious Affairs paid a visit to Lemhannas RI during Level III Leadership Training Batch LIX, on Wednesday (10/7) in Syailendra room, Astagatra Building, Lemhannas RI.

The Head of Education and Training Organizers, Drs. H. Aden Dainuri, M.Ed. as the head of the group conveyed that the main purpose of the visit to Lemhannas RI is due to the national insight material given during the training. "We would like to ask the willingness of Lemhannas RI to provide some material regarding strengthening of national values to sharpen the training participants' knowledge regarding the national insight," Aden added. Aden also hoped that the material given by Lemhannas RI to help the participants in creating their change projects.

Meanwhile, Professional Expert of Lemhannas RI, Drs. H. Edijian Tandjung, M.Sc. as the speaker delivered a presentation on "The Implementation of National Values in Community, National and State Life". In his presentation, Edijian explained that there were five implementations of national resilience in social life. First, improve understanding and implement the values of the four national basic

consensus in social life, such as mutual cooperation, tolerance, mutual assistance, and respect. Second, eliminate vulnerability that contains SARA (ethnicity, religion and race). Third, increase role models in society. Fourth, revive local wisdom and filtrate foreign culture. Fifth, fostering family and environment well.

Edijian also explained several things regarding the NKRI. First, there is the value of territorial unity, which is a consequence of the archipelagic state, the sea, and the waters unite the islands. Second, the unifying value of a nation, which is a consequence of a pluralistic nation with many tribes, religions, cultures, etc. Third, the independence value which means building a nation our own strength and external assistance is only used to overcome national deficiencies.

"I invite the participants of the Diklat PIM III of Religious Affairs to explore nationalism issues, not only using knowledge, reason and logic, but also our heart," Edijian said. Edijian also said that the strategic role of every employee of the Ministry of Religious Affairs should be able to be an agent of social change in the implementation of national values which originated from the four national basic consensus in the social, nation and state life.

Perista Routine Meeting discusses facial skin health

The Association of Wives and Female employees of Lemhannas RI held a regular meeting on Wednesday (11/7), in Dwi Warna Purwa, Pancagatra Building, 1st Floor, Lemhannas RI, discussing to discuss the health of facial skin with a dermatologist, dr. Aditya Zulkarnain as a guest speaker.

The meeting also held as an event to introduce the new Perista Deputy Chairperson, Lisa Wieko Syofyan and Perista new member, Christina Julexi Tambayong, wife of the Chief of Finance Planning Bureau Julexi Tambayong. "Hopefully the relationship and togetherness exist among Perista members can be develop not only during our meeting but also in our life," Lisa said in her opening speech.

Meanwhile, dr. Aditya in his explanation stated that in general, skintype is divided into two. "Actually, there are two skin types, normal and sensitive, and sensitive skin types consist of oily and dry skin," he said. Skin problems faced by each person are certainly different and depend on age. "Usually the problems faced by older women are

dry skin, black spots, wrinkles and reduced skin elasticity due to the decreased collagen production," dr. Aditya explained.

Then Aditya explained the mandatory and forbidden things in treating facial skin. The thing to do is clean your face thoroughly, then use a facial moisturizer and wear sunscreen before going outdoors. While the harmful thing to do to maintain healthy facial skin is consuming foods that contain fat and coconut milk, getting exposed to direct sunlight for a long period of time and applying cream that contains dangerous ingredients. According to him, vitamin C is a vitamin that is quite important for skin health. Every day, a person needs at least 250mg of vitamin C which is equivalent to two oranges.

"Taking care of our facial skin not need to be expensive and complicated, the point is to maintain food we consumed, do exercise, avoid stress and use the right products, such as clean your face after wearing make up and apply sunscreen before going outdoors," dr. Aditya said in the end of his explanation.





Jusuf Kalla gives Public Lecture to PPRA 59 and PPSA 22 Participants

The Vice President of the Republic of Indonesia Jusuf Kalla gave a public lecture in front of the participants of the Regular Education Program Batch 59 (PPRA 59) and the Short Education Program Batch 22 (PPSA 22) on Thursday (11/7) at the Vice Presidential Palace.

The Vice President, often known as JK, expressed his hope to the participants as potential leaders of this nation. "I hoped that you will become leaders of the nation both now and in the future," JK said.

JK explained that to be a good nation leader, experience as the best teacher is needed. Therefore, the education system applied should not only about science but also teach how to gain right experience in the system and bureaucracy.

In this public lecture, JK also explained about the current national and global economic conditions. According to him, in the current state of the open economy, anyone can compete and the most efficient one will be the winner.

At the world economy level, there is an different economic dynamic from the past called as a socialist country like China that used to tend to have closed economy is now joining the competition. In the opposite, capitalist countries like America now tend to be closed and protective. These policies also affect the economic condition of

Indonesia, with the expensive policy of Chinese goods entering the United States will result in a decline in Chinese exports and it will also have an impact on the economic downturn of other countries such as Indonesia.

JK also explained about the challenges in technology. Jusuf Kalla explained that the challenges in technology were influenced by human resources based on education. Therefore, education must create people who can compete both at national and international level. To be able to compete, Indonesia also made agreements such as free duty agreements. The agreement makes the price of Indonesian goods sent to friendly countries not taxed so that the prices can compete with other countries such as Vietnam and Thailand that have the same agreement.

General Lecture on National Insights for Participants of Sespimti Polri

The Governor of Lemhannas RI, Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo gave a lecture on national insights to sixty-two students of the Regular Education 28 of National Police Command and Staff Academy(SespimtiPolri), on Thursday (18/7) at the Police Science and Technology College (STIK), Jakarta.

Agus explained, the meaning of national insight is basically mandating all citizens to place unity as well as the interests of the nation above their own or certain groups' interests. In addition, it also concern to the development of the unity of Indonesia so that it can maintain the integrity of the Unitary Republic of Indonesia based on Unity in Diversity. Nationalism must also always be based on Pancasila as the ideology of the nation and succeed in carrying out the mission in the midst of the world state administration.

The national insight itself consists of several elements. The first element is Archipelago Insight. "Practically, archipelago insight is the perspective and attitude of Indonesia in its environment and also consider the implications for the unity and integrity of the whole nation," Agus said.

The next element is the resilience of the Pancasila ideology which means the ability of the Pancasila ideology to return to its form when it is able to respond to threats or obstacles and challenges. The function

of national resilience itself is to overcome threats, disturbances, obstacles and challenges in the context of achieving national goals. National resilience is also a totality of aggregate accumulation of two approaches such as Aspects approach, if ideological resilience, political resilience, economic resilience, socio-cultural resilience, and security and defense are in a good condition then national resilience is achieved.

Agus also stated that the most important thing was that everything must be based on basic consensus which are Pancasila, the 1945 Constitution, the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia, and Unity in Diversity. "This (basic consensus) is the screw, if the screw is removed, there will be chaos and threats to the loss of the Pancasila state," Agus said. Agus added that it also applies in democracy, different opinions or choices are accepted, but all must be within the basic consensus.

Agus then explained, the challenge in national insight is how to interpret the intrinsic value of the values we inherited from the past to be transformed into operational instrumental values in Indonesia and the changing strategic environment. There are also external challenges from globalization, the character of the nation, and the Industrial revolution 4.0.



The Governor of Lemhannas RI as speaker at KEIN FGD

The Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo was one of the speakers in a focus group discussion (FGD) in the field of strategic industries organized by the National Economic and Industrial Committee (KEIN), on Thursday (18/7), at the Le Meridien Hotel in Jakarta.

According to the Chairman of KEIN, Soetrisno Bachir, this discussion was carried out as a preparation to support the work of the next government, especially in the field of strategic industries. In addition to the Governor of Lemhannas RI, a number of speakers who were present included Minister for Foreign Affairs Retno Marsudi and Chairwoman of the Presidential Advisory Council Prof. Dr. Sri Adiningsih.

In his discussion, Agus Widjojo emphasized that this discussion was related to providing inputs to the President, so that concrete recommendations that is able to be implemented is needed, recommendations are not policies that was optional and it also have a background of demands that could not be avoided. Agus focused on recommendations related to ideology, defense and security.

In accordance with the main tasks and functions of Lemhannas

RI, one of which is conducting education to prepare national-level leaders, because it is necessary to foster and control prospective national leaders. "It is necessary to build a guiding system and fostering the potential and talents of national leaders cadres from the best graduates of secondary education, higher education, and officials school. It is related to the next recommendation, namely the need for affirmative policies in accelerating the maturation of cadres of national leaders by providing scholarships and accelerating promotions," Agus explained.

Meanwhile, in the defense and security sector, Agus Widjojo revealed the need for joint operational command and filling the void in the national security policy due to the uncertain National Security Bill. "The three-dimensional joint command, which had been stopped in 1982, needs to be re-established and the combined command of the existing defense area can be used as an operational joint command," Agus said. Furthermore, related to the uncertainty of the National Security Bill, Agus stated the need to establish a National Security Command and Control Center.





General Lecture on Bilateral Relations between Indonesia and Singapore

Lemhannas RI received a visit from the Deputy Secretary of the Minister for Policy of the Ministry of Defense of Singapore Teo Eng Dih, on Tuesday (23/7). In his visit to Lemhannas RI, Teo Eng Dih delivered a public lecture on diplomatic relations between Indonesia and Singapore which has been established for 52 years with the title “Ties that Bind - Bilateral Relations Between Indonesia and Singapore”, at Gadjah Mada Auditorium, Lemhannas RI.

Diplomatic relations between Indonesia and Singapore had begun since the reign of Prime Minister Lee Kuan Yew and President Suharto. Various fields of cooperation have been carried out in order to strengthen relations between the two countries, one of which is in the field of defense by exchanging military personnel and holding regular exercises between the Singapore Armed Forces (SAF) and the Indonesian Armed Forces (TNI). “The deep relationship and cooperation between our two defense apparatuses is a strong foundation for cooperation in other fields and has been beneficial for both parties,” Teo said.

This cooperation is also increasingly developed with the exchange of information in maritime security and counter terrorism. Responding the dynamics of the regional security environment that continues to

change and the emergence of new threats, this defense cooperation must be strengthened. “Cooperation between the TNI and SAF is very important for increasing regional security and overcoming terrorist threats,” Teo said.

At the regional level, Teo believes Indonesia has an important role in ASEAN. Singapore supports the ideas that Indonesia coined in ASEAN such as creating the 2003 ASEAN Security Community which became the foundation for the holding of the ASEAN Defense Ministers Meeting (ADMM).

Singapore also expressed its support for Indonesia for being selected as a Non-Permanent Member of the UN Security Council from 2019 to 2020. Teo stated that Singapore strongly supports Indonesia’s membership in the UNSC and will certainly learn from Indonesia. “I believe the relationship between Indonesia and Singapore will become even stronger,” Teo said.

After the public lecture from Teo Eng Dih, the public lecture was ended with question and answer session. The public lecture was also attended by PPRA 59 and PPSA 22 Participants, invited guest from Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ministry of Defense, Indonesian Army, Indonesian Air Force, Indonesian Police and University Students.



Royal Thai Navy visits Lemhannas RI

Director of the Center for Strategic Studies of the Royal Thai Navy, RADM Thamrong Tiammek along with several Royal Thai Navy delegations visited Lemhannas RI on Thursday (25/7). The visit welcomed directly by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Lieut. Gen. (Ret.) Agus Widjojo was followed by a courtesy call in the Executive Guest Room, Trigatra Building, Lemhannas RI.

After conducting a discussion, the delegation from Royal Thai Navy visited the National Resilience Measurement Laboratory (Labkurtannas). In Labkurtannas, the delegation was welcomed by the Professional Staff for Natural Resources and National Resilience of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Dadan Umar Daihani, DEA who explained the ins and outs of national resilience and its measurement.

"Now Indonesia is entering a very dynamic and complicated situation," Dadan said, opening his explanation on National Resilience Measurement System (Siskurtannas). Dadan further explained that there are many factors that influence the current situation such as intolerance, poverty and economic crisis, and differences. Therefore, to determine the level of national resilience, Lemhannas RI created a national resilience index measurement system.

This system consists of 2506 parameters, 821 indicators, 108 variables and 8 aspects," Dadan said. Furthermore, Dadan explained that static determinants provide a description of national resilience when it is measured and provide information on strategic indicators. While dynamic determinants are useful for finding correlations between all variables and help to develop strategic issues. "Every year we measure, analyze and monitor the progress of Indonesia's national resilience," Dadan continued.

"Lemhannas RI is trying to simulate if there will be major changes in the future. With this system, Lemhannas RI can develop the formulation of recommendations needed by the government," Dadan said in the closing of his presentation in front of the Royal Thai Navy delegation.

The PPRA 59 Participants conduct the 48th Olah Sismennas

The Olah Sismennas (national management system simulation) aims to transform the government administration mindset into a comprehensive mindset by using the Archipelago Insights and National Resilience approach," Deputy for National-Level Leader Education of Lemhannas RI Major General Karsiyanto said in the opening ceremony of the 48th Olah Sismennas, Tuesday (30/7).
