He said the issuance of the general policy concerns with the readiness of Lemhannas RI to become a world class institution.

"The most fundamental issue with the issuance of the general policy is that we must be ready to implement it so that it will allow us to achieve the goal of becoming a world class institution", he explained.

Prof. Budi Susilo Soepandji also asserted before the plenary session participants that the Governing Board will monitor and evaluate the implementation of general policies that has been issued.

The results of monitoring, evaluation and actual development, added the Chairman of the Governing Board, are important as input in formulating future general policies.

It is expressly stated that the general policy issued in the form of book is used for planning, organizing, implementation and supervision of programs and activities of Lemhannas.

The general policy material covers policies in the field of national-level leadership education program, strategic studies and strengthening of national values. It also includes secretariat, inspectorate, organizational strengthening and budgeting issues.

Lemhannas RI and ANRI sign MoU

Law Enforcement at Sea not yet Optimal

The Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. said that the state of security and law enforcement at sea today are not yet optimal.

He made the statement at a roundtable discussion held on the Trigatra Building of Lemhannas RI on Jl. Medan Merdeka Selatan in Central Jakarta, Tuesday (29/5).

According to Prof. Budi Susilo Soepandji, some factors contribute to the situation, including the vast maritime territory of Indonesia and the suboptimal and non-synergic maritime safeguarding.

“The maritime safeguarding has yet to be carried out synergistically. Its implementation and coordination have not yet been conducted in an integrated manner”, he said while pointing out the limited facilities and infrastructure owned by the safeguarding forces.

The maritime security issues, said Prof. Budi Susilo Soepandji, are not merely related to sovereignty and law enforcement. According to him, the sea should also be safe and free from threats, either for the users or in its utilization.

Therefore, it is said that the government has issued various policies to safeguard the Indonesian territorial sea.

One of which was to establish the Maritime Security Coordinating Board (Bakorkamla) through the Presidential Decree No. 81 of 2005. The board was formed to address the increasing nonmilitary threats at sea.

As a coordinating board,

Bakorkamla’s 13-member tasks are restricted to only coordination.

He mentioned that many parties carry out activities in Indonesian maritime territory, and some of which are violating the country’s sovereignty and laws and put it at a disadvantage.

The situation, therefore, he added, has posed the Indonesian sea to a high level of vulnerability.

The roundtable discussion, which raised the theme “Managing the Maritime Territory Security Arrangement in Order to Maintain Stability and Sovereignty of the Unitary State of the Republic Indonesia”, was attended by the Deputy Governor Lt. Gen. Moeldoko, S.I.P., the Secretary of Governing Board Dr. Ardi Partadinata, MH, M.Si. and the Principal Secretary Drs. Chandra Manan Mangan, M.Sc.

The roundtable discussion was also attended by the deputies, expert lecturers, expert analysts, and expert professionals of Lemhannas. The resource persons at the discussion were the Deputy Assistant for Operations to the Navy Chief of Staff Commodore Hendricus Semiring Arie and Prof. Dr. Etty R. Agoes, S.H., LL.M. of the Faculty of Law from the University of Padjajaran.

The Head of Legal information and Cooperation Center of Bakorkamla Commodore Drs. Tri Yuswoyo, M.Sc., M.Eng., and Vice Dean of the University of Indonesia’s Faculty of Social and Political Sciences Dr.

Eddy Prasetyono also acted as speakers.

Neglect of Pancasila

Nowadays Pancasila has been neglected as a result of changes in system, norms and amendment to the 1945 Constitution. The statement was conveyed by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. citing the results of the third Pancasila congress held by the University of Airlangga (Unair) Surabaya from May 31 to June 1, 2011.

The results of the congress about the neglect of Pancasila were revealed in a roundtable discussion on the understanding of national alertness values in the Astagatra Building of Lemhannas RI on Jl. Medan Merdeka Selatan, Central Jakarta, Wednesday (30/5).

The fact was raised in the discussion in the context of increasing national alertness, involving relevant staff members from Lemhannas RI and lecturers from state and private universities.

According to Prof. Budi Susilo Soepandji, the national alertness needs to be monitored from early on.

“National alertness must be based on ideological beliefs and strong nationalism. It also needs to be monitored from early on and continuously,” he said.


The early and continuous monitoring, he said, needs to be done in light of the ever changing situation and conditions, both at home and abroad.

On the occasion, he also conveyed the view of President Dr. H. Susilo Bambang Yudhoyono about the need for the reactualization and revitalization of Pancasila in the life of the nation.

The president’s view was delivered at the Commemoration of Bung Karno June 1, 1945 Speech at the House of People’s Consultative Assembly in Jakarta on Wednesday (1/6) last year.

Furthermore, Prof. Budi Susilo Soepandji said that the national alertness is a subject that needs to be implemented by the people at all levels as the citizens of the nation.

The roundtable discussion was a follow-up to a series of research activities conducted by the Office of the Deputy for the Strengthening of National Values with a locus in 12 provinces in Indonesia.



The brainstorming activities featured resource persons expert professional in the Field of Geopolitics and Strategy Maj. Gen. (Ret.) E. Imam Maksudi, S.E. and Professional Expert in Domestic Government Dr. Kausar AS, M.Sc.

Other resource persons included the Expert Professional in National Resilience Maj. Gen. (Ret.) Lumban Sianipar, S.I.P., and Expert Professional in National Alertness Maj. Gen. (Ret.) I Putu Sastra Wingarta, S.I.P., M.Sc.

Creative Economy

Promotes Utilization of Resource Reserves

The creative economy promotes the utilization of renewable resource reserves as well as the unlimited resources, such as ideas, talent and creativity, said the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A.

It was conveyed by the governor during a roundtable discussion on the development of creative economy in creating jobs and alleviating poverty in the context of national resilience in Lemhannas RI, Jakarta.

At the event held in the Trigatrabuilding on Thursday (31/5), he stated that the economic value of a product is no longer determined by its raw materials.

“The economic value of a product is no longer determined by its raw materials or production system, but it depends on the use of creativity and innovation through the technological developments” he said.

In front of the participants of the roundtable discussion, he suggested that the price and product quality factors are not always reliable in the competitive market.

“In general, the industry can no longer compete in the global market by relying only on price or product quality, but on innovation, creativity and imagination,” he said in his argument.

The current economy, he expressed, is greatly influenced by globalization. The products of globalization, among others, include intellectual property rights, as the capitalization of human intellectuals.

Those with a unique idea, he added, will be able to protect their ideas and prevent others from using it.

On the occasion, he also revealed the development of creative industries in Indonesia that contribute significantly to the national economic growth.

It is said that the creative industries allow the creation of new jobs for the people.

By stimulating the creative industries in Indonesia, local manufacturing industries will be able to reduce their dependence on licenses paid for foreign products.

The creative economy is expected to be able to overcome the employment issues, and furthermore, it should also be able to push the nation's economic growth.

Acting as resource persons at this event are

the Director General for Arts and Culture-based Creative Economy from the Ministry of Tourism and Creative Economy Ukus Kuswara, the Director General for Worker Development and Placement from the Ministry of Manpower and Transmigration Reyna Usman, Prof. Togar M. Simatupang, Ph.D., and Aviliani, S.E., M.Sc.

The Lemhannas officials attended the discussion included the Deputy Governor Lt. Gen. Moeldoko, S.I.P., the Secretary of Governing Board Dr. Ardi Partadinata, MH, M.Si., and the Principal Secretary Drs. Chandra Manan Mangan, M.Sc.

The Deputy for Strategic Studies Inspector General (Police) Herry Haryanto, expert lecturers, expert analysts and expert professionals as well as structural officials of Lemhannas RI also attended the event.



Economic Development in Border Regions to be Prioritized

The concept of economic development of border regions requires high priority level and specific, clear and firm legal supports, said the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A.

He conveyed the statement during a national seminar themed "Developing Economic Development of Indonesian Border Regions" at the Borobudur Hotel in Jakarta, Thursday (31/5).

According to him, the accelerated socio-economic development in border regions, needs to be carried out in all areas. "The efforts to accelerate socio-economic development in border areas must be carried out in all areas, including in public services and infrastructure", he said.

Concerning the priorities, Prof. Budi Susilo Soepandji, who is keen on building communication through mass media, said that the development needs to be carried out in the provision of the needed basic infrastructure as well as defense and security facilities and infrastructure.

In line with that view, he stressed on the importance of establishing and enhancing the role of community institutions that promote the creation of strong familial relationship, feeling of togetherness and spirit of nationalism.

Opening job opportunities is also deemed as a priority, whether in the field of agriculture, trade and fishing. In building the economic centers in the border regions, he expressed, we need to take into account the local cultural characteristics, resources and economy.

In order to optimize such efforts, he deemed it necessary to develop cooperation with neighboring countries in accordance with the prevailing regulations.

When presenting his paper on "Strengthening the Economy of Indonesian Border Regions in the Context of National Resilience", Prof. Budi Susilo Soepandji focused on land areas that directly border with neighboring countries.

At the seminar, he stressed on the importance of understanding national resilience in a comprehensive manner.

The national resilience, he continued, is the ability of national life system in maintaining its survival. It also means the ability to develop the national life in the face of strategic environment's dynamics.

Integrating Interests

The development of border regions is not a stand-alone program. Prof. Budi Susilo Soepandji asserted that it is actually an integral part of national development, requiring integration of various interests.

"The interests of security and people's welfare need to be integrated while promoting the principle of balance between the mental/spiritual and physical/material aspects, intergroup and interregions relations", he further explained.

Furthermore, the top leader of Lemhannas RI also brought up other unresolved issues, such as border dispute negotiations, lack of infrastructure and uneven distribution of population. In addition, the slow pace of development, unoptimal implementation of the grand design of border region development, and the national strategic spatial plan which has yet to be applied in the strategic spatial plan of the border regions.

Hope was born in that seminar that the economic strengthening of the region will be based on the Public Works Ministry plans to develop the Integrated Autonomous City in the border regions in an integrated development concept. It is deemed to improve the quality of life.

It was also said that the efforts to strengthen the economy of the border regions would lead to the regions having autonomous resilience, which in turn will contribute significantly to the development of national

resilience.

The seminar held in cooperation between Telstra IKAL and Bank Indonesia featured the Deputy Governor of Bank Indonesia Ronald Waas and contributor from the IKAL Chairman Gen. (Ret.) Agum Gumelar, M.Sc.

Lemhannas RI and CDSS Australia Discusses Maritime Security Issues

The National Resilience Institute (Lemhannas RI) and the Australian Center for Defence and Strategic Studies (CDSS) discussed maritime security issues in the Trigatra Building of Lemhannas on Jl. Medan Merdeka Selatan in Central Jakarta, Monday (5/6).

The discussion concerning the maritime security was aimed at broadening the CDSS participants' point of view on social, economic, political and security issues in the same region.

In the courtesy call, the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. was accompanied by Deputy Governor Lt. Gen. Moeldoko, S.I.P., the Principal Secretary and Expert Lecturer in International Relations Brig. Gen. Avianto Saptono. Meanwhile the Australia's CDSS was led by Colonel Colin Richardson.

Regarding the maritime security issue, it was revealed that Indonesia's understanding on the matter is based on the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS), while Singapore and other Asian countries base it on the definition provided by International Maritime Bureau (IMB).

While appreciating the naval cooperation between the two countries, it was conveyed that the maritime

security issue for Indonesia is not only related to the navy, but it also concerns with sea transportation, fishing and marine agribusiness.

The discussion moderated by the Expert Lecturer in International Relations Brig. Gen. Avianto Saptono also addressed the issue of human trafficking and intelligence sharing.

Regarding the maritime cooperation, Indonesia last month signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with China, covering the area of intelligence sharing.

The discussion was also attended by the Expert Analyst in the Field of Geography Maj. Gen. Endang Chaeruddin, Professional Expert in Diplomacy Rear Admiral (Ret.) Robert Mangindaan, Head of Public Relations Bureau Brig. Gen. Sahat Aritonang, Head of Cooperation Bureau Brig. Gen. Danu Nawawi, six representatives of the 47th Regular Educational Course Program participants, one of whom is a foreign participant from Singapore.

Meanwhile, there were also foreign participants from New Zealand, China, Japan, Pakistan and the Philippines among the group members of CDSS. Hopefully, the partnership of both institutions will improve the relations and cooperation between Indonesia and Australia.
