



Harmony in Nationalism



A team from Lemhannas RI conducted a roadshow with the theme "Harmony in Nationalism" in Manado, North Sulawesi on Wednesday (21/12).

The program was organized by the Public Relations Bureau of Lemhannas RI in cooperation with local RRI and TVRI stations.

A dialogue on nationalism was held by Lemhannas RI in RRI Manado station at 9 a.m. The 90-minute event featured Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Lt. Gen. Moeldoko as a resource person, Expert Analyst in the Field of Strategy Maj. Gen. (Ret.) Abdul Chasib, Assistant Rector IV for Cooperation from Samratulangi University Prof. David A. Kaligis, a

representative of North Sulawesi provincial government Dr. Ir. Alex J. Wowor, M.Si., Manado Vice Mayor Harley Mangindaan, Deputy Chief of Sulawesi Utara Police Commands Sr. Comr. Kartono and Rector of De La Salle University Revi Rafael H.M. Tanod, S.S., S.E., M.A.

The arrangement which requires native sons to fill the top position in the local regions should be addressed wisely and prudently. That kind of policy should be implemented in accordance with local values upheld by society. Such an issue was developed during the dialogue.

Another issue discussed in this dialogue was the harmonious way of life that needs to be maintained.

The North Sulawesi local government itself has been able to address the differences that exist in the community, where people can sit side by side despite of their differences. Harmonious life carried on North Sulawesi is expected to serve as an example for other regions.

Later in the evening, Lemhannas RI held a talk show in the TVRI Manado station with the theme "Harmony in Nationalism". The Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Lt. Gen. Moeldoko, Military Area Commander 131/STG Brigadier General Jhoni Lumban Tobing and a representative from North Sulawesi provincial government Dr. Ir. Alex J. Wowor, M.Si. served as resource persons at the event.

It was revealed at the discussion that people are longing for the New Order era when the Pancasila was so highly respected. But in the reform era today, democracy is understood as freedom without limits which makes the noble values of Pancasila are often overlooked.

During the talk show, hopes were placed on Lemhannas RI to develop

a broad understanding of nationalism among the people.

It is mentioned that future leaders are expected to attend educational course on nationalism in Lemhannas RI before they run for leadership in their respective regions.

In addition, Lemhannas RI is expected to be able to restore Pancasila as the glue that holds Indonesia together. It needs to conceive the ways to reapply Pancasila as the philosophical foundation of the nation in order to restore the national image.

PMPRB, Online Bureaucratic Reform Self-Assessment Instruments

On Monday (26/11), Lemhannas RI held a program to raise awareness of the online Bureaucratic Reform Self-Assessment (PMPRB) on the 3rd floor, East wing of Trigatra building of Lemhannas RI, Jakarta.

The event was opened by the Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI Lt. Gen. Moeldoko and was attended by representatives from each work unit, either from those under the Office of Principal Secretary or Deputies Offices of Lemhannas RI. Serving as the key resource persons in introducing the PMPRB was Deputy for Program of the Ministry of State Apparatus Empowerment and Bureaucratic Reforms (PAN & RB) Dr. Ismail Mohammad. The implementation of online applications of PMPRB was conducted by a team from the Ministry of PAN & RB.

In a speech read by the Deputy Governor of Lemhannas RI, the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. stated that PMPRB is a follow-up of a series of bureaucratic reforms that has been implemented in Lemhannas RI.

“The Bureaucratic Reform Self-Assessment is an instrument to self-

assess the progress of bureaucratic reforms carried out by ministries/ institutions and local governments,” he further explained.

The Bureaucratic Reform Self-Assessment itself aims to, first, facilitate ministries/institutions and local governments to provide information on the progress of bureaucratic reform implementation and corrective measures need to be taken by the concerned ministries/ institutions and local governments; and second, to provide data/ information to the Ministry of State Apparatus Empowerment and Bureaucratic Reforms in order to construct a national profile for the implementation of bureaucratic reforms.

Bureaucratic reform is a necessity to achieve a good governance through three main pillars, namely, organizational structuring, business process improvement and enhanced discipline as well as human resource management. The grand design of the bureaucratic reform has been regulated in Presidential Regulation Number 81 of 2010.

In his explanation, the Deputy for Program from the Ministry of State Apparatus Empowerment and Bureaucratic Reforms conveyed that the implementation of Bureaucratic Reform Self-Assessment itself consists of two major components, namely: 1) Enablers and 2). Result. The online PMPRB ensures and connects achievement at institutional levels (ministry/institution and local government) to that of national target of 2014 bureaucratic reform. The bureaucratic reform indicators and targets until the year 2014 can be seen in the table below:

Developing National Identity Values Based on Local Wisdom



“Local wisdom is national asset and capital to strengthen social bonds among the people and the citizens”.

The above statement was made by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. when serving as a resource person in National Congress on Belief in God Almighty, Tradition and Customary Law Communities on Thursday (26/11) in Surabaya.

The congress organized by the Directorate for Guidance on the Belief in God Almighty and Tradition of the Directorate General for Culture of the Ministry of Education and Culture was held from 25 to 28 November 2012.

Every nation has its own value system which derives from religion, local wisdom, literature and science. Indonesia’s value system is based on Pancasila, the 1945 State Constitution, the Unitary State of the Republic

of Indonesia, and Unity in Diversity principle (*Bhinneka Tunggal Ika*).

The governor of Lemhannas RI conveyed that developing national values and characters requires a reformulation of values of social life, religious tolerance, strengthening of culture and local wisdom as well as legislation.

On the occasion, he said that the local wisdom which is laden with values of solidarity, tolerance and mutual cooperation should be passed down to the next generation through formal and informal education, both inside and outside the family as well as in the educational environment.

The congress, which lasted for four days, was attended by 750 participants, including the representatives of believers in God Almighty, tradition and customary law communities from 33 provinces in Indonesia.

Signing of Memorandum of Understanding between Lemhannas RI - BIG and Lemhannas RI - BPS



On Tuesday (11/12) the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. and Head of the Central Agency on Statistics (BPS) Dr. Suryamin signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on the 3rd Floor, West Wing of Astagatra Building of Lemhannas RI.

The two institutions have agreed to establish a cooperation through the MoU in which the provisions have been jointly agreed.

The MoU aims at improving and strengthen relations between Lemhannas RI and BPS in terms of education and training, study and research as well as strengthening of national values and utilization of statistical data and information.

On the same opportunity, the governor of Lemhannas RI also signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Head of the Geospatial Information Board (BIG) Dr. Asep Karsidi, M.Sc.

Similarly, the MoU between Lemhannas RI and BIG covers the areas of education and training, study and research, strengthening

of national values and utilization of geospatial information for national resilience.

"... This memorandum of understanding documents should be immediately followed up with concrete measures, starting with the utilization of statistical data and information, so that it will strengthen the data of Lemhannas RI's Labkurtannas in terms of validity and legitimacy of data ...", said the governor of Lemhannas RI.

Both MoUs that were already signed by the governor Lemhannas RI will be implemented for five years from the date of signing and will be jointly reviewed thereafter, at a minimum, once a year.

The Deputy for Strengthening of National Values of Lemhannas RI and Labkurtannas, Geospatial Information Board as well as the Central Bureau on Statistics are expected to immediately draw up and prepare work plan, so that the activities can be carried out in 2013.

Cooperation Agreement between Lemhannas RI and BIG

With the signing of the MoU between Lemhannas RI and BIG, the two institutions also signed a cooperation agreement on the same opportunity as a follow-up of the agreed MoU. The cooperation



agreement was signed by the Principal Secretary of Lemhannas RI Dr. Chandra Manan Mangan and the Principal Secretary of BIG Ir. Budhy Andono Soenhadi, M.C.P.

The jointly agreed cooperation will be carried out in accordance with the duties and functions of both institutions which, among others, cover the areas of education, analysis, strengthening of national values and utilization of geospatial information. The cooperation is very important for knowledge building and national resilience..



Improving Maritime Insight, Human Resources Quality, Science and Technology

“As a state think-tank, Lemhannas RI needs to thrust itself into the pioneering role of giving insight and making action in order to improve maritime culture and insight of all national components”.

The statement was made by the Governor of Lemhannas RI Prof. Dr. Ir. Budi Susilo Soepandji, D.E.A. when serving as the Inspector of Ceremony on the commemoration of the 13th Archipelago Day (Hari Nusantara), held at Lemhannas RI in Jakarta.

The world’s view of the Indonesian maritime boundaries has changed since the inception of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS) after Indonesian Prime Minister Ir. R. Djoeanda Kartawidjaja declared new Indonesian maritime claims

on December 13, 1957. After a long struggle, the world, through UNCLOS meetings in 1982, accepted and incorporated the declaration in the UN Convention on the Law of the Sea. As a result, Indonesia has been recognized as an archipelagic nation.

With the world’s recognition of the Djuanda Declaration, the maritime boundaries between islands in Indonesia, which were formerly only 3 nautical miles from the coastline have extended to 12 nautical miles as an Exclusive Economic Zone while the continental shelf has been extended as far as 300 miles. There has been a paradigm shift since then that the sea is not a separator, but rather as a connector which unifies the nation.

In his speech, the governor of Lemhannas RI urged all the

ceremony participants to understand more deeply the importance of Archipelagic Day that has been commemorated annually since December 13, 1999. The Archipelagic Day commemoration should not only be just a ceremonial event, but it should inspire us as well. In fact, it should encourage us to produce realistic ideas and programs.

“Let us use this momentum to strengthen our nationalism for the sovereignty and integrity of the unitary state of the Republic of Indonesia,” urged the Governor Lemhannas RI.

Furthermore, the governor of Lemhannas RI asked all the ceremony participants to enhance maritime knowledge and improve the quality of human resources as well as science and technology so as to benefit the Indonesian people.

The ceremony which raised the theme “Improving Maritime Culture and Insight as well as Human Resources and Science and Technology”, was attended by the Deputy Governor, Secretary of the Governing Board, Principal Secretary, Expert Lecturers, Expert Analysts, Expert Professionals, Structural Officials as well as all civil and military members of Lemhannas RI.
